RAY MATTER—The Rays have lost three consecutive games, their longest losing streak since April 29–May 1 (3) and tied for their 2nd-longest this season behind April 3-7 (4)...they have seen two consecutive games end in walk-off losses, the ninth time in club history they have lost back-to-back games in walk-off fashion and first since July 22-23, 2016 at OAK... the Rays enter tonight's game tied with the Athletics for the 2nd-best record in the AL, a ½-game back of the White Sox...the Rays have been alone in first place in the AL East since the end of play on May 24, but the ½-game lead over Boston is their smallest since games through May 29.

- + The Rays are 7-1-2 in their last 10 series beginning May 14-16.
- + The Rays are 8-7 in June after going 16-1 from May 13-31 and 22-6 in May, which set a club record for wins in a calendar month.
- + Their 43-27 record represents the best 70-game start in franchise history, passing a 42-28 record in both the 2010 and 2019 seasons... with 92 games left, the Rays are on pace to finish 99-63, which would set a franchise record for wins in a season (97-65 in 2008)...it would be the 2nd-best winning pct. in club history (40-20 in 2020).
- + The Rays are 24-8 since May 13, 30-12 since May 2 and 38-19 since April 16—each are the best records in the majors over those spans... the Rays were .500 (19-19) as late as the end of play on May 12, but since then their .750 winning pct. is the best in the majors—and the highest for any other AL club since then is the Red Sox (.645).
- + During this 24-8 stretch the Rays have outscored opponents, 191-107 (+84), and their 8 losses have been by a combined 12 runs...this includes five 1-run losses, two 2-run losses and one 3-run loss...one has been in 10 innings, and two others have come in 11 innings.
- + The Rays have 19 come-from-behind wins this season, tied with the Indians for 2nd-most in the majors behind the Red Sox (24).
- + Since 2019, the Rays are an AL-best 179-113 (.613), which ranks 2nd in the majors over that stretch behind the Dodgers (190-100).

ABOUT THE OFFENSE—The Rays rank 4th in the majors with 345 runs scored behind HOU (382), LAD (352) and BOS (349)...the Rays are coming off an 8-7 loss on Wed at CHW and a 6-5 loss last night, the first time they scored 5 runs (or more) in back-to-back games and lost both since June 2-4, 2019 (2)...the Rays have averaged 4.93 runs per game despite a .231 avg. that ranks 22nd in the majors and 11th in the AL...from 1900–2020, 513 teams averaged 4.93 R/G but none did it with an avg. as low as the Rays—the lowest for a team scoring 4.93 R/G was .244 by the 2017 Rangers.

- + The Rays lead the AL and rank 2nd in the majors with 273 BB behind LAD (289)...they rank 7th in the AL with a .317 OBP, 6th with 213 XBH and 8th with 84 HR...their .231 avg.—which would be the lowest in club history (.238, 2020)—includes .233 with RISP and .224 with RISP and 2 outs, which rank 24th and 17th in the majors, respectively...the Rays have 719 PA with RISP, 3rd in the majors.
- + The Rays have struck out a major-league-most 735 times, ahead of the Tigers (697)...the Rays are on pace for 1,701 SO, which would be a major league record ahead of the 2019 Tigers (1,595)...the Rays have a majors-most 48 games of reaching double-digit strikeouts.
- + The Rays are 38-14 (.731) when hitting a homer and 16-4 (.800) when hitting multiple homers...54.8 pct. (46 of 84) of their homers have come with runner(s) on base, which would pass 2005 (47.1) for the highest rate in franchise history...this is the highest rate in the majors this season, ahead of the Giants (53.0) and Nationals (49.2).

PITCHING PROPERLY—The Rays have pitched to a 3.31 ERA (636.1-IP, 234-ER) this season, which ranks 6th in the majors and 2nd in the AL behind the White Sox (3.26)...the Rays have allowed 3 runs (or fewer) 41 times, tied with the Padres for most in the majors, and are 32-9 when doing so.

- + The Rays have allowed 14 runs over their last 2 games, their most in a 2-game span since April 21-23 (14)...they have yielded 6+ runs in back-to-back games for the first time since May 18-19 at BAL.
- + Rays pitching had a 4.85 ERA through the first 13 games of the season but since then have a 2.96 ERA (517.2-IP, 170-ER) in 57 games since April 16, best in the majors over that stretch (NYM: 3.14).
- + Rays starters have pitched to a 3.61 ERA (339-IP, 136-ER), 9th in the majors and 3rd in the AL behind CHW (3.07) and HOU (3.49).

WHAT A RELIEF—The bullpen has an AL-best 2.97 ERA (297.1-IP, 98-ER) this season, 3rd in the majors behind the Cubs (2.52) and Padres (2.76)... the bullpen has a 1.86 ERA (145.1-IP, 30-ER) in 35 games since May 9, 2nd in the majors since then behind the Cubs (1.30)...more recently, their 0.99

ERA (54.2-IP, 6-ER) in 14 games since June 2 leads the majors since then.

- The Rays bullpen ranked 26th in the majors with a 5.07 ERA thru
 April 21. but since April 22 their 2.17 ERA ranks 2nd in the majors.
- + Last night's game-tying hit in the 9th inning snapped the bullpen's streak of 28.1 IP without allowing an *earned* run...it was their first run allowed in regulation since June 9 vs. WSH (5th inning).

KING OF THE ROAD—The Rays have lost three consecutive road games for only the second time this season, following April 3-7 (4) to end the first trip...they are 1-3 on this 7-game trip and would need to win the remaining three to extend their streak of four consecutive winning road trips...at 24-13, the Rays own the 3rd-best road record in the majors behind the Red Sox (22-10) and Athletics (18-9)...the Rays lead the majors with 214 runs scored and 124 XBH

on the road and rank 3rd with 53 HR, while their 3.63 ERA ranks 3rd in the AL...the Rays are 7-3-1 in road series and 8-4 in road series openers, and their four road sweeps are tied with Boston for most in the majors.

- + The Rays are 22-9 since a 2-4 start and have outscored opponents, 191-116 (+75) in these 31 games...all nine of these losses have been by 3 runs (or fewer), including six 1-run losses and two straight.
- + The Rays have scored 6+ runs in 18 road games, most in the majors...their 11 road games of 8+ runs are tied for 1st in the majors.
- + Six of the 13 losses have been in walk-off fashion...the six walk-off losses are most in the AL and 3rd in the majors behind the Giants (7) and Marlins (7), and 2nd-most through 70 games in club history behind 2000 (7)...said another way, the Rays have been tied or leading in the 9th inning of 30 of their 37 road games (81.1 pct.).

FASHIONABLY LATE—In the 8th inning and later, the Rays have outscored opponents, 100-60 (+40), and 82-37 (+45) when excluding extra innings...the +40 run differential over these frames is the highest in the majors, ahead of the Padres (30) and Indians (28)...the 100 runs scored in the 8th inning or later lead the majors, ahead of the Astros (93)...their 50 runs in the 8th lead the majors, 32 runs in the 9th rank 2nd behind the Astros (33) and 18 runs in extras are tied for 2nd behind the Reds (21).

WEB GEMS—According to Sports Info Solutions, the Rays lead the majors with 54 Defensive Runs Saved, ahead of the Astros (44) and Nationals (38)...their outfield leads the majors with 18 Runs Saved, ahead of MIL (15), and the infield (1B, 2B, 3B, SS) ranks 1st with 33 Runs Saved ahead of HOU (28)...the Rays have saved 14 runs on infield shifts, T-2nd in the majors... according to StatCast, the Rays lead the majors at 25 Outs Above Avg.

RAYS vs. MARINERS—Last night was the first meeting between the two clubs since Aug 21, 2019, going 665 days in between...it was the 10th time in franchise history the Rays lost in walk-off fashion to the Mariners, first since June 1, 2018 when Mitch Haniger hit a solo homer off Matt Andriese...tonight is the second of 7 games in the season series, with three games at Tropicana Field from Aug 2-4...the Rays went 4-2 against them in 2019, winning the season series for the first time since 2012 (6-4).

- + Since the start of 2018, 11 of the 14 games between the clubs have been decided by 2 runs (or fewer), including nine 1-run games.
- + The Rays are 3-10 at T-Mobile Park since the start of 2016.

THE GREAT RANDINO—Last night Randy Arozarena hit his 10th homer and recorded his 11th SB...he is the only rookie in the majors with at least 10 HR and 10 SB this season and one of five players overall, along with SD Fernando Tatís Jr., LAA Shohei Ohtani, ATL Ronald Acuña Jr. and WSH Trea Turner...he became the fourth rookie in club history to reach double-digits in each category before the All-Star break, joining Steven Souza Jr. in 2015, Delmon Young in 2007 and Rocco Baldelli in 2003.

MEDICAL MATTERS—RH Chaz Roe (right shoulder strain) was removed from his rehab assignment with Triple-A Durham after experiencing right shoulder discomfort in his outing yesterday...he flew back to St. Petersburg and underwent a MRI this afternoon with Dr. Koco Eaton, who administered an injection into the right biceps...his timeline will be updated in the next 2-3 days based off the improvement from injection.

LAST START—On Sun vs. BAL, opened and took no decision, allowing 1 run in 2 IP of a 7-1 win...escaped a 2-on, 0-out jam in the 1st inning, but yielded a run in the 2nd on a leadoff walk, sacrifice bunt and **Pat Valaika** RBI single...his line: ND, 2 IP, 2 H, 1 R/ER, 1 BB, 0 SO, 1 HBP, 28 pit, 17 str.

- + Since returning from the 10-day IL on May 23, his longest app is 3 IP (May 27 vs. KC, relief)...hasn't gone 5 IP since April 27 vs. OAK.
- + Is 1-1 with a 3.18 ERA (28.1-IP, 10-ER) and 2 HR in his 7 starts...has a 7.94 ERA (11.1-IP, 10-ER) and 4 HR in his four relief apps.

CHANGEIT UP—Has thrown his changeup for 24.9 pct. of his pitches this season, according to StatCast...has induced a 34.7 pct. whiff rate on the changeup, which ranks 10th in the AL (min. 40 PA), and his .195 opp avg. (8-for-41) in at-bats ending with the pitch is his best since 2018 (.172).

+ Threw his changeup for 29.2 pct. of pitches last season (with NYM) and posted a 40.8 pct. whiff rate, 9th in the majors (min. 50 PA).

HARD HIT—Has allowed an avg. exit velocity of 91.3 mph and a 45.8 pct. hard-hit rate this season, according to StatCast, both the 10th-highest rates in the AL (min. 100 batted balls)...has given up 14 barrels in 11 apps (7 starts) this season after allowing 9 barrels in 8 apps (7 starts) last season (with NYM)...has yielded 8.8 barrels/PA, the 5th-highest in the majors.

+ Entering the season, his highest hard-hit rate in a season was 43.6 pct. (2020) and his highest avg. exit velocity was 88.2 mph (2019).

vs. MARINERS—Is 0-1 with a 6.48 ERA (8.1-IP, 6-ER) in two career starts against Seattle...took no decision on July 4, 2019 at T-Mobile Park (with STL), his only career start there, yielding 4 runs on 6 hits and 2 BB in 3.1 IP, and did not record a strikeout...allowed a solo homer to J.P. Crawford in the 1st inning, 2 runs in the 3rd (Crawford RBI groundout, Daniel Vogelbach RBI single) and a solo shot to Tim Beckham leading off the 4th.

+ Took the loss on Sep 14, 2013 at Busch Stadium (with STL)

CONTROLLING THE ZONE—Has thrown first-pitch strikes to 66.3 pct. (106 of 160) of batters faced this season and is averaging 14.8 pitches/IP...

+ In 2020, recorded a career-high 9.79 SO/9 IP ratio and career-high 5.29 SO/BB ratio (37-SO, 7-BB)...his previous highs were 8.58 SO/9 IP and a 2.87 SO/BB ratio in 2017...his 1.85 BB/9 IP ratio ranked 9th in the NL (min. 30 IP) and was the lowest mark of his career.

LEFTIES BEWARE—Has limited left-handed batters to a .238/.308/.365 (381-for-1,603) slash line in his career, compared to .275/.330/.450 (551-for-2,007) against righties...min. 1,000 BF since 2013, his .365 opp SLG against lefties is the 9th-best rate in the majors among right-handed pitchers.

ON THE MEND—Will be making his sixth app (fourth start) since being reinstated from the 10-day IL on May 23 after missing 18 games due to right hamstring tightness...was his sixth career stint on the injured list, most recently last season with right shoulder inflammation...began throwing sides on May 11 and progressed to a simulated game on May 19.

SPRING FLING—Allowed 1 run in five Grapefruit League apps (4 starts) spanning 15 IP...min. 15 IP, his 0.60 ERA tied Paul Wilson in 2001 for the lowest in Rays spring training history...it ranked 3rd in the Grapefruit League behind MIN Kenta Maeda (0.49) and MIN Randy Dobnak (0.57).

2020 IN REVIEW—In his lone season with the Mets, went 1-4 with a 6.62 ERA (34-IP, 25-ER) in 8 apps (7 starts)...spent time on the 10-day IL with a right shoulder strain...won his first start on July 27 but lost his next four decisions spanning 7 apps (6 starts)...according to FanGraphs, his swingand-miss rate of 11.3 pct. was his highest since 2013 (11.4) and he generated swings on a career-high 34.3 pct. of pitches outside the strike zone.

Made his last start of the season on Sep 23 vs. TB, going a seasonhigh 6 IP, but took the loss as the Rays clinched the AL East title... yielded a go-ahead, 2-run homer to Randy Arozarena in the 6th.
