MILLER TIME

1b Joey Votto has reached base safely in each of the last **27** games he's played at **Miller Park**, dating back to **8/12/16** (.354, 34-96, 5hr, 24bb, .484obp)...it's the longest such active streak at this ballpark...Votto is currently riding a **6-game** hitting streak vs the Brewers, dating back to 6/22 (9-21, .429).

FIRST IMPRESSION

According to @EliasSports, in Fri's 12-11 loss vs StL **C Ryan Lavarney** became the **first player** with **2 HR** in his first game with the Reds, the first player with **more than 3 RBI** in his first game with the Reds and only the **fourth Major League player**, since RBI became a statistic in 1920, to produce in his debut for a team at least **3 hits, 2 HR and 6 RBI** (list below).

FIRST WATCH

In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in **runs scored** (78), **HR** (28), **RBI** (75), **batting average** (.302, 119-394), **slugging percentage** (.576) and **on-base percentage** (.368)...have outscored opponents in the first frame, **78-45**, and are **2-7** when leading after the first inning...**Eugnio Suárez** leads the Major Leagues with **9 HR** in the first inning (26-75, .347, 18rbi).

AGE

RHP Luis Castillo in his last **25 apps** beginning **9/1/18** is **12-4** and in that span ranks second among all Major League starting pitchers with an ERA of **2.09** (LAD's **Hyun-Jin Ryu**, 1.71)...this season Castillo ranks among the National League leaders in **wins** (T7th), **ERA** (3rd), **strikeouts** (T6th) and **strikeouts per 9 innings** (5th, 10.53)...since the distance from the pitching rubber to home plate was set at 60 feet, 6 inches in 1893, only 3 times in Major League history has a pitcher made 3 consecutive starts in a season with at least 8 strikeouts and no more than 2 hits allowed in each game (list below)...**Castillo's streak**, to open this season, was snapped in the 4-3 walkoff loss on 4/15 at LAD (5ip, 4h, 2er, 5bb, 7k)...no pitcher ever has done it in 4 consecutive starts.

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 1** of a brief 3-game road trip, all at Mil's **Miller Park**, and **Game 7** (2-4) in a stretch of **10 straight games** vs **NL Central Division** rivals (1-2 at Chi, 1-2 vs StL, 0-0 at Mil)...the Redlegs are coming off a **3-1 series loss** vs the Cardinals...following this series and Thu's off day, return to **Great American Ball Park** for a 6-game homestand vs the **Rockies** (3g) and **Pirates** (3g).

SERIES NOTES: The Reds and Brewers are meeting for the fifth time this season and for the third time at **Miller Park**...the Reds' **3-1 series win** at **Great American Ball Park** from 7/1-7/4 was their first series win vs Mil since **9/4-9/6, 2017** (3-0 at GABP) and their first 4-game series win vs Mil since **4/30-4/23, 2015** (3-1 at Miller Park).

ROCKIES UP NEXT: This weekend at **Great American Ball Park**, the Reds and Rockies will meet for the second time this season...coming out of the All-Star break, the Reds suffered a **2-1 series loss** at **Coors Field**...that series included a **17-9 win** in which the Reds became the first Major League team in the **modern era** to produce in a game at least **5 triples** and at least **3 HR**...beginning in **2002** and with a minimum of 40 games played, the Reds' **.345 winning percentage** at **Coors Field** (20-38) is their lowest at any current road ballpark in that span...Cin's **3-1 series win** from **5/30-6/2, 2016** is its only series win at **Coors Field** since **8/27-8/29, 2012**.

REHABBING: **LHP Alex Wood** is scheduled to make his fourth rehabilitation start tonight for **Chattanooga** at **Birmingham** (85-90 pitches)...in his **3 rehab starts** for **Louisville** went **0-1, 5.06** (5.1ip, 8h, 4r, 3er, 2bb, 7k)...made his 3 rehab apps for the Bats on **7/6 at Columbus** (1.1ip, 2h, 1er, 1bb, 2k, 31 pitches), **7/12 vs Toledo** (2ip, 4h, 3r, 2er, 0bb, 2k, 51 pitches) and **Wed at Pawtucket** (2ip, 2h, 0r, 1bb, 3k, 38 pitches)...has been on the Reds' injured list all season with a **lower back injury**...has been on the 60-day IL since **5/31**...made 1 start for the Reds in spring training, on **2/25 at Sea** (1ip, 2h, 3er, 1bb, 0k, 1hr).

2-WAY PLAYER: **RHP Michael Lorenzen** has appeared in 61 of the Reds' 97 games so far this season, including 41 times solely as a **pitcher**, twice as a **pinch hitter/pitcher**, once as a **pitcher/LF** (6/2 vs Wsh), 3 times as a **CF**, 3 times as a **LF**, 7 times solely as a **pinch runner**, once as a **pinch runner/CF** (3/28 vs Pit, CF), once as a **pinch runner/LF** (5/9 at Oak) and once as a **pinch runner/RF** (5/24 at Chi) and **once as a CF/P** (7/17 at Chi)...**9 times** in his career, including twice this season (4/9 vs Mia, 4/15 at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch...5 times in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including twice as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...**Lorenzen** this year became the **first player in Reds history**, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in **each of the first 6 games of a season** (PR/CF, P, PR, P, PR, P)...is the first Reds player with more than 300 career innings pitched (378.0) to play center field since **Hal Jeffcoat** in **1958**...**Ron Mahay** was the last Major League pitcher with at least 300 innings also to play CF...**Mahay** played in 5g in CF for the Red Sox in 1995 and then pitched his 300th inning in 2006 for the Rangers.

BLACK & BLUE: **Derek Dietrich** has been hit by a pitch **22 times**, the most in the Major Leagues and third-most in Reds history (Shin-Soo Choo, 26, 2013 & Jason LaRue, 24, 2004)...was hit **4 times** in a 3-game series at Chi from **7/15-7/17** and was hit by a pitch **6 times** in the 4-game series at Mil from **6/20-6/23**...he is the only player in **modern Major League history** to get hit by a pitch **6 times** in a series of any length...was hit by a pitch twice in that series opener vs the Brewers, a 7-1 Reds win...in the 11-7 win in Game 2 became the first Reds batter in the modern era to be **hit by a pitch 3 times** in a game, tying the **Major League record** accomplished many times, and the first Reds batter ever to be hit at least twice in consecutive apps...in 9 apps this season vs the Brewers, **Dietrich** has been **hit by a pitch 8 times**...he has been hit by a pitch **115 times in his career**...notes courtesy Elias Sports Bureau.

PITCHER OF THE MONTH: **RHP Luis Castillo** was the National League's **Pitcher of the Month** for **March/April**...in 7 starts he went **3-1, 1.45** while ranking second in the National League and third in the Major Leagues in **ERA**, second in the NL and sixth in the majors in **strikeouts** (50) and third in the NL and T6th in the majors in **innings pitched** (43.1)...is the first Reds player to win a monthly award since **2B Scooter Gennett** won it in **May** of last year, the first Reds pitcher to win it since **LHP Denny Neagle** in **September 1999** and the first Reds right-handed starter recognized since **Jose Rijo** in **September 1992**.

150th CELEBRATION: During the 2019 season the Reds are celebrating the **150th anniversary** of professional baseball, which began with the formation of the **1869 Red Stockings**...this season, the team will wear **15 uniforms** from various periods throughout the team's history...the Reds already wore uniforms from **1902, 1911, 1912, 1919, 1935, 1936, 1939, 1956** and **1961**...**Sun vs Col** will wear replica uniforms from **1967**...the Reds are 2-7 wearing **throwback uniforms**...as part of the season-long celebration, the **Reds Hall of Fame and Museum** underwent a comprehensive modification, while the **1869 Pavilion** at the southwest corner of the ballpark was dedicated on **May 4**, the **150th anniversary** of the **Red Stockings'** 45-9 win over the Cincinnati Great Westerns in the first professional baseball game...more than **20 anniversary park benches**, featuring Reds mascots wearing the **15 throwback uniforms**, are on display at locations across **Greater Cincinnati** and **Northern Kentucky**.

AND THIS ONE BELONGS....: Hall of Fame broadcaster **Marty Brennaman** is in his 46th and final season calling Reds games for **700 WLW Radio**...joined the Reds radio team in **1974** and for **31 seasons** (1974-2004) shared the 700 WLW Radio booth with Reds Hall of Fame pitcher **Joe Nuxhall**, tying LA's **Vin Scully** and **Jerry Doggett** for the longest running broadcast duo in baseball history...is only the eighth Major League Baseball broadcaster to work for the same team for at least 46 seasons, joining **Scully** (67 seasons, 1950-2016), **Ralph Kiner** of the Mets (52, 1962-2013), KC's **Denny Matthews** (51, 1969-2019), Mil's **Bob Uecker** (49, 1971-2019), **Jack Buck** (48, 1954-2001) & **Mike Shannon** (48, 1972-2019) of the Cardinals and LAD's **Jaime Jarrin** (47, 1973-2019).

Tonight's Pitcher - #54 Sonny Gray, RHP

RED HOTS

Sonny Gray is a **2019 National League All-Star**...tonight is making the fifth start of his career and fourth of the season vs the Brewers, his third career appearance at **Miller Park**...has made **4 consecutive quality starts**, the longest streak by a Reds pitcher this season (**2-1, 1.65**)...in Wed's 5-2 loss at Wrigley Field retired 18 of his 20 batters, including each of his last 13 hitters...allowed only solo HR to **Kris Bryant** in the first inning and to **Addison Russell** in the second...with the completion of the second inning reached **1,000 career innings pitched**...on 7/12 at Col, his strikeout of **Charlie Blackmon** to end the fifth inning was the **900th strikeout** of his career...in his 3-0 win on 7/3 vs Mil, threw 8.0 shutout innings and tied his career high with 12 strikeouts...the 8.0 innings and 12 strikeouts are the most by a Reds pitcher in a game this season...was added to the **National League All-Star** roster to replace Wsh's **Max Scherzer**...was **Gray's** second **All-Star** selection...he was an **American League All-Star** in 2015 but did not pitch in the game at Cin's **Great American Ball Park**...he joined **RHP Luis Castillo**, selected by his peers, as the first pair of **Reds starting pitchers** named to the **All-Star team** since **Johnny Cueto** and **Alfredo Simon** in **2014**...**Gray** did not pitch in the NL's 4-3 loss at Cle's **Progressive Field**, but **Castillo** threw a perfect fourth inning...began the season with 9 starts without a win, the longest such streak of his career to begin a season...was bothered in spring training by stiffness in his right elbow and made just 3 exhibition starts, but he started the Reds' second game of the season...hasn't missed a turn since.

- Went hitless on 6/2 vs Wsh, snapping a 9-game hitting streak (14-41, .341, 5 2b, 1hr, 5rbi, .378obp) and a 20-game on-base streak (26-86, .302, 6 2b, 2 3b, 1hr, 8rbi, 4sb, .358obp)...is the longest hitting streak by any Reds batter this season and ties Joey Votto's for the longest on-base streak by a Reds hitter.
- Began the season on Louisville's injured list with a right ankle sprain suffered on 3/25 during a spring training game in Goodyear...came off the IL on 4/23 and in 8 apps for the Bats prior to his 5/3 promotion hit .257 (1 2b, 1hr, 2rbi).

7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf 2nd Half: 10gs, 9-33 (.273), 1 3b, 4hr, 6rbi

- First name is pronounced AY-you-hay-nee-oh.
- Scored at least 1 run in 10 of his last 17 apps (13 runs), including 6 of his 10 apps since the All-Star break.
- Has hit safely in 8 of his 10 apps since the All-Star break, homered 4 times and produced an RBI in 5 of the 10 second-half games.
- This season has homered in the first inning 9 times, T1st in the Major Leagues w/ Bal's Trey Mancini...in the first inning is hitting .347 (26-75).
- Beginning 6/30, homered in 7 of his last 17 apps (8hr, 15rbi).

17 JOSH VANMETER, inf/of 2nd Half: 4g, 2gs in LF, 3-9, 1hr, 2rbi, 1.132ops

- Thursday was promoted from Louisville as 1 of 7 roster moves...since then has made 3 apps (3-6, .500, 1hr, 2rbi, 2bb), including 2 starts in LF.
- Is his fourth stint on the Reds' roster...from 5/5-5/16, in his first Major League apps, went 2-for-14 (1rbi) in 8 apps and 2 starts...from 5/21-6/18 made 20 apps, including 5 starts (7-27, .259, 2 2b, 2rbi, .375obp)...from 7/4-7/7 went 1-for-4 with a 2-run double in 2 apps (PH, PH-LF-2B-1B-LF).
- Has made 9 starts for the Reds (7gs in LF, 1gs at 3B on 6/2 vs Wsh, 1gs at DH on 5/8 at Oak).
- As a pinch hitter is 5-for-15 (.333, 2 2b, 2rbi, 3bb, .500obp).
- Is a 2019 International League All-Star...in 49 apps for the Bats hit .348 (14 2b, 1 3b, 14hr, 43rbi, 8sb, 1.097ops)...started at 1B (10g), 2B (20g), 3B (10g) and LF (3g).
- In April was the organization's Minor League Player of the Month and the International League's Player of the Month...in April hit .358 and led the IL in games (26), hits (34), runs (24), HR (11), RBI (28), total bases (24), slugging percentage (.758) and OPS (1.204)...his 11 HR and 28 RBI are RiverBats/Bats records for April (since 2000).
- In spring training came over from minor league camp to make 10 apps for Reds (1-13).
- Is a native and resident of Ossian (AH-see-in), Indiana, a town of about 3,400 located near Fort Wayne...graduated from Norwell High School.

19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b 2nd Half: 10g, 9gs, 8-42 (.190), 3 2b, 3rbi, .244obp

- In his last 45 apps beginning 5/24 is hitting .306 (53-173, 13 2b, 4hr, 17rbi, .376obp).
- Beginning 5/8 has reached base safely in 48 of his last 57 apps (62-222, .279, 13 2b, 1 3b, 5hr, 19rbi, .356obp), including a season-high on-base streak of 20 games (5/8-6/4) that ties Nick Senzel's (5/10-6/1) for the longest by a Reds batter this season.
- Beginning 5/8 made his last 55 starts batting second in the order...made 15 starts this season batting leadoff (last, 5/7 at Oak)...entered this year with 1 career start batting leadoff (6/18/08 vs LAD).

33 JESSE WINKER, of 2nd Half: 10g, 7gs, 9-29 (.310), 2 2b, 1 3b, 5rbi, .444obp

- Hit safely in 6 of his 7 starts and in 7 of his 10 apps in the second half.
- Hit safely in 15 of his last 19 starts (25-71, .352, 5 2b, 2 3b, 3hr, 13rbi).
- In the 4-3 win on 6/18 vs Hou hit his second career leadoff HR (off Justin Verlander).
- Has 13 HR, a new single-season career high (7hr, 2017 & 2018)...his career high for RBI in a season is 43 (2018).
- Hit his eighth HR, his new career high, in his 28th appearance and 23rd start.
- Has made 72 starts, including a team-high 49 starts in LF (13gs in CF, 9gs in RF, 1gs at DH).
