THE PIRATES:...have lost a season-high six straight games...Were swept in their three-game series this past weekend by the Red Sox...Began the season 5-0 for the first time since 1983...Swept a season-opening four-game series on the road for the first time since doing so in 1903 in Cincinnati.

KEEPING UP WITH THE JONES': Jared Jones has seven or more strikeouts in each of his four career games...The only other Pirate to debut since 1893 to begin his career with four straight appearances with seven-plus strikeouts was Jose DeLeon, who did so in five straight from July 23 to August 10, 1983...Overall, Jones is the fourth Major League player since 1893 to accomplish this feat and the first since Masahiro Tanaka did so in five straight games to open his career from April 4-27, 2014.

ABOUT TONIGHT'S STARTER: Jared Jones has an active streak of 17.1 innings without allowing a walk dating back to the final inning of his Major League debut on March 30 at Miami...That's the longest such streak by a Pirates pitcher in his first four career games since Gerrit Cole had an 18.0-inning streak to open his career in 2013.

FILL THE ZONE: Jared Jones threw 50 of his 59 pitches ( 84.7 percent strike rate) in his 5.0 scoreless innings in his last start Tuesday against the Mets... Since pitch data started being kept in 2000, no Major League pitcher has ever thrown 60 or fewer pitches in a game and thrown 50 or more strikes...Since 2000, only five other pitchers threw 50 or more pitches in a game, with 84 percent or more being strikes...Prior to Jones, the last pitcher to accomplish it was Kevin Gausman on May 30, 2021 ( 62 of 72, 86.1 percent).

AND THE WHIFF: The Pirates struck out a season-high 14 batters yesterday
against the Red Sox (the previous high was 13 on Opening Day against the Marlins)...Aroldis Chapman struck out three batters in his 1.0 inning of work and now has 14 this season, which are tied for the seventhmost among National League relievers.

PLAYERS WHOSE 300TH CAREER home run came as a plpate
WHAT'S BREWING: Tonight the Pirates open a four-game series against the
Brewers, which will be their first series against a National League Central team this season...The Pirates went 25-27 against their own division in 2023.

CRUZING FOR A BREWZING: Oneil Cruz will face the Brewers for the first time since the 2022 campaign when he hit six home runs in 50 at-bats against the Crew...Cruz became one of just two rookies in Pirates history to hit six-plus home runs vs. an opponent in a season along with Ralph Kiner, who hit seven vs. St. Louis in 1946 in seven games.

NOTHING BREWING AGAINST AROLDIS: Aroldis Chapman has been scored upon twice in 45 career appearances against the Brewers...Chapman has made 23 straight scoreless appearances against the Crew since allowing two runs as a member of the Reds on August 16, 2013...In Chapman's 45 appearances against Milwaukee, he is $5-1$ with 21 saves, an 0.63 ERA (43.0ip/3er), 79 strikeouts and .081 batting average against (11-for-136).

KEEPING UP WITH CUTCH'S HITS: Andrew McCutchen enters today's action with 999 career singles with the Pirates...Among his 1572 hits with the Bucs, 313 have been doubles, 44 have been triples and 216 have been home runs... Arky Vaughan is 10th on the club's all-time list with 1,218 singles.
