**RECENT REDBIRDS:** The St. Louis Cardinals begin their final homestand of the season with the opener of a three-game series with the division-rival Cincinnati Reds tonight at Busch Stadium ... The Milwaukee Brewers visit St. Louis for three games on Fan Appreciation Weekend ... The Redbirds suffered a 1-5 road trip through Seattle (0-3) and Milwaukee (1-2), and were walked off twice in extra innings ... However, St. Louis picked up a half game in the Wild Card race in the process.

**GOTTA BEAT THE BEST TO BE THE BEST:** St. Louis enters tonight in 4th place in the NL Central, and 4.0 games behind New York (77-73) for the final Wild Card position ... The Cardinals final 12 games are against four teams fighting for Postseason positioning (Reds-3, Brewers-3, Gi-anta-3, & Cubs-3), including nine against divisional opponents ahead of them in the standings.

**ARENADO ACTIVATED:** Prior to tonight's homestand opener, the Cardinals activated Platinum Glover 3B **Nolan Arenado** from the 10-Day Injured List and optioned INF José Fermín to Memphis (AAA) .... The eight-time All-Star, who has been sidelined for 40 games since August 1 with a right shoulder strain, was 1-for-13 (.143) with a hit-by-pitch in four injury rehab games with Springfield (AA).

**SEEING RED:** With a win tonight, the Cardinals will have recorded a .500 or better home record against the Reds for the 18th straight season (2007-25) ... The only time St. Louis lost a home season series to Cincy was Busch Stadium III's first year in 2006 ... The Cardinals have beaten both the Reds and Pirates 102 times at Busch III, the most of any visitor.

**MLB CELEBRATES ROBERTO CLEMENTE DAY:** Coinciding with the start of Hispanic Heritage Month (Sept. 15-Oct. 15), Major League Baseball celebrates the legacy of Hall of Famer **Roberto Clemente** tonight ... 2025 Roberto Clemente Award nominee **Brendan Donovan** will be honored for his Clemente Award nomination (1st career) during a pregame ceremony tonight.

- All Clemente Award nominees and previous Award recipients will have the option to wear "21" as their uniform number, joining players from Puerto Rico and others who wore the number during previous commemorations of Roberto Clemente Day ... Those tonight at Busch Stadium include Cardinals Donovan and **Lars Nootbaar**, and Cincinnati's **Brent Suter**, **Hunter Greene**, **Emilio Pagán**, and **Jose Trevino**.
- Previous Cardinals to win the Roberto Clemente Award also include **Adam Wainwright** (2020) **Yadier Molina** (2018), **Carlos Beltrán** (2013), **Albert Pujols** (2008), **Ozzie Smith** (1995), and **Lou Brock** (1975), with the six total being the most of any Major League organization.
- St. Louis is 8-13 (6-6 at home, 4-7 at Busch III) on Roberto Clemente Day since it was first observed by Major League Baseball in 2002 ... The Redbirds and Reds have only played once, a 3-2 loss in St. Louis in 2022.

**FANTASTIC FINISHES:** St. Louis needs a 9-3 finish to end with a winning mark, above .500 ... The Cardinals have had winning marks in 25 of their past 31 seasons since joining the NL Central Division in 1994 and in 23 of their 25 seasons played since 2000 ... The last time St. Louis posted two losing seasons over a three-year span was 1997 (73-89) and 1999 (75-86).

**THIS DATE IN CARDINALS HISTORY (September 15, 1967):** **Steve Carlton** hurls a two-hit shutout while striking out eight in a 4-0 win over Cincinnati Reds at the Crosley Field ... **Mike Shannon** provides the damage with a three-run homer in the 4th inning, as Carlton limits the Reds to a pair of singles.

#### CINCINNATI CONNECTIONS

Late Reds Executive Advisor **Walt Jocketty** served as the Cardinals GM for 13 seasons (1995-2007)...during tenure, St. Louis compiled seven NL Central Division championships (1996, 2000-02, '04-06), two NL Championships ('04, '06), and one World Series Championship ('06).

**Terry Francona** played in 86 games in 1990 with the Louisville Redbirds (AAA), including five at pitcher...his father, **Tito Francona**, played parts of two seasons (1965-66) with St. Louis...became a Cardinal via trade by Cleveland in exchange for a player to be named (Dec. 15, 1964)...originally signed by the St. Louis Browns before the 1952 season (MLB debut for Baltimore in 1956).

Reds pitching coach **Derek Johnson** played baseball & coached at Eastern Illinois Univ. (1991-94)...coached at Southern Illinois Univ.(1995-97)...was **Sonny Gray's** pitching coach at Vanderbilt Univ.

Hall of Famer **Scott Rolen** played his final four seasons with the Reds (2009-12)...won the 2010 Gold Glove and was a two-time All-Star (2010-11).

**Sonny Gray** pitched three seasons with Cincinnati (2019-21)...named a 2019 NL All-Star.

**Riley O'Brien** made his MLB debut with Cincinnati (Sept. 28, 2021 at Guaranteed Rate Field).

Reds Bullpen Coach **Matt Tracy** was born in St. Louis...graduated from Christian Brothers College HS.

**Julio Rangel** served as Bullpen Coach for the Reds in 2019.

Cardinals FanDuel TV broadcaster **Mark Sweeney** played outfield for both the Cardinals (1995-97) and Reds (1999).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Vince Coleman** played in 33 games for Cincinnati in 1996.

Reds Senior Advisor to the GM **Cam Bonifay** played two minor league seasons with the Cardinals...worked for St Louis as a professional scout and special assistant.

Reds President of Baseball Ops **Nick Krall** previously interned for the New Jersey Cardinals of the NY Penn League (SS).

Reds broadcaster **Jeff Brantley** pitched in 48 games for St. Louis in 1998.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Jim Edmonds** played 13 games for the Reds in his final season (2010).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Julián Javier** played in 44 games for the Reds during his final 1972 season.

Reds Senior Advisor to the GM **Eric Davis** played two seasons (1999-2000) for St. Louis.

Reds Special Assistant to the GM **John Morris** played five seasons for St. Louis (1986-90).

Cardinals Principal Owner and Chief Executive Office **William DeWitt Jr.** was a prior owner of the Reds and shareholder of the Cincinnati Bengals...his father, **William O. DeWitt**, was a sole owner of the Reds from 1961-67.

Reds CEO **Robert Castellini**, Chairman **W. Joseph Williams Jr.** and Vice Chairman **Thomas Williams** were Cardinals investors from 1995-2006...interests were sold as a condition of their acquisition of a controlling ownership stake of the Reds.

TONIGHT'S GAME:

- Southpaw will be making his 28th start of the season and 52nd career (119th career appearance).
  - Is trying to put together a 2nd straight win at Busch Stadium after winning 5-1 vs. ATH in his last Home start on 9/3; he started the season with a 3-game Home win streak from 4/7 thru 5/6 after taking a no-decision in his 2025 Home debut.
  - Surpassed 5.0 IP threshold in his 9/3 start (5.1 IP) vs. ATH for the first time since 6/29 at CLE (6.0 IP); he had gone 9-straight starts pitching 5.0 IP or less, the longest in-season streak by a Cardinals starting pitcher and set the franchise record for those uninterrupted by a relief appearance passing Mark Mulder (2006-07)
  - His last win in a road game came on 6/29 in a 7-0 win over Cleveland at Progressive Field.
  - Struck out four batters in his 8/28 start at CIN giving him his first career 100 strikeout season.
  - Leads STL starters in ERA (4.35) and ranks 3rd in wins (7), 2nd in strikeouts (110), and 4th in IP (140.2) - all career single-season highs.
  - Has worked 140.2 IP this season, 9.0 innings shy of his season high innings of 149.2 combined in 2022 between St. Louis (34.2 IP) and AAA-Memphis (115.0 IP).
  - Allowed a home run in five straight games from 8/6 to 8/29, his career-long streak; T-4th longest streak by a Cardinals pitcher this season.
  - Tonight marks his 10th start since the All-Star Break. Was given a 14-day extended pause/rest combined with benefit of the All-Star break between his starts on July 11 & July 26.
  - Over his initial 13 starts of 2025, limited left-handed batters to a .190 BA (11-58) with one extra base hit (Sal Frelick double on 4/25).
  - Held the opposition to two runs or fewer in eight straight starts (April 13-May 24), longest streak by a Cardinal since **Jack Flaherty** ran off nine straight in 2019 (7/7-8/23).
  - Is 5-5 with a 4.18 ERA (64.2 IP) in 12 home starts this season & 2-7 with a 4.50 ERA (76.0 IP) in 15 road starts.
  - Has worked 6.0 innings or more in 11 of his 27 starts this season (last 6.0-inning start was June 29 at CLE). His May 1 start at CIN was cut short (3.0 IP) by a lengthy rain delay.

ST. LOUIS SOUTHPAWS

- His 28th start tonight is the most by a Cardinals left-hander since **Jaime García** (30 in 2016). At age 25, Libby's 28 starts are the most by a St. Louis southpaw at age 25 or younger since the 24-year-old García made 32 starts in 2011.
  - Among MLB lefties age 25 or younger this season, only Washington's 25-year-old **Mitchell Parker** (29 starts) has made more than Liberatore.
  - His 7 wins this season are the most by a Cardinals lefty starter since **Jaime Garcia** (10 in 2016).
  - Boasts the 2nd most wins (7) in MLB among lefty starters age 25 or younger this season, trailing only the Nationals **Mitchell Parker** (8).
  - Is the youngest Cardinals lefty starter to win 7 games since 23-year-old **Jaime Garcia** (13 wins in 2010).

**LAST TIME OUT (Tuesday, Sept. 9 at Mariners):** Posted scoreless innings in the 1st & 2nd innings before the Mariners knocked him out after 4.0 IP with 5 runs, including a pair of homers. Took the 5-3 loss as he fell to 2-7 in road games in 2025, including a 3-game road losing streak dating back to June.

2025 HIGHLIGHTS:

- Has established single season-highs in wins (7), losses (12), starts (27), strikeouts (110), and innings pitched (140.2) this season.
  - Cards won each of his 4 starts (6/17-7/5) scoring 35 runs over those games. Held opposition to 2 runs or fewer in each start (3-0, 2.25 ERA).
  - Ran a career-high win streak to three games after recording three-straight winning decisions to close out the month of June.
  - Held the opposition to two runs or fewer in a career-best eight straight starts from April 13-May 24.
  - Was dazzling in a 2-1 win over the Pirates and Paul Skenes on May 6 at Busch Stadium as matched his career high in strikeouts with 8 and limited the Buccos to just 3 hits while he logged a season-high 7.0 IP (99 pitches); It was his 4th consecutive winning decision in a Home start dating to last season (3-0 in 2025).
  - Pitched 6.0 innings allowing three runs for a quality start in his first start of the 2025 season vs. LAA (4/1); surrendered all his runs in the 3rd inning vs. LAA after retiring the first eight batters of the game.

CAREER:

- Is a career 12-21 with a 4.98 ERA in his 51 career starts opposed to 3-3 with a 3.89 ERA in 67 career relief appearances.
  - Lifetime 9-9 with a 3.99 ERA (112.2 IP/50 ER) in 22 career starts at Busch Stadium. The Cardinals are 10-12 in his starts there.

LIBERATORE vs. CINCINNATI:

- Making his third start of the season vs. CIN, with the 1st two both taking place at Great American Ballpark (5/1 & 8/29).
- Is 0-1 with 5.63 ERA (8.0 IP/5 ER) in his two starts against the Reds this season, allowing 3 HR's.
- Started the day game on May 1 at GABP, the final game of a four-game series, which was delayed causing him to exit after 3.0 innings allowing two runs in a loss.
- His lone career win vs. CIN came at GABP in his first appearance, a 1.1 inning relief outing on 9/8/23 in a 9-4 Cardinals victory.
- Is a career 1-1 with a 4.35 ERA over 9 appearances (2 starts) vs. the Reds; is 0-0, 0.00 ERA with 0 hits allowed in his 3 career appearances (3.0 IP all in relief) vs. CIN at Busch Stadium.
