METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Fish, 2-1, yesterday...The Mets have outscored their opponents 79-56 in 16 games this month...New York is in a stretch of 17 straight games without an off-day (6-5)...The Mets head out on their final road trip of the year, a seven-game trip (1-0) to Miami (1-0) and Philadelphia (four games).

DOWN ON THE FARM: Tonight, the Rumble Ponies will begin the postseason against the Somerset Patriots in the best-of-three Northeast Division Championship Series at Mirabito Stadium...First pitch is set for 6:35 p.m....All Binghamton Rumble Ponies playoff games are free to watch on the Bally Live app and on the MiLB.TV platform...RHP Christian Scott is set to make the start for the Ponies...He made 12 starts at Double-A this year where he went 4-3 with a 2.47 ERA (17 ER/62.0 IP) with eight walks and 77 strikeouts...In 19 starts between three levels, Scott went 5-4 with a 2.57 ERA (25 ER/87.2 IP) with 12 walks and 107 strikeouts...Scott was a fifth round selection in the 2021 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Florida...RHP Dominic Hamel will start game two.

DINGERS!: The Mets feature eight players who have recorded at least 10 home runs this year...The team record is 10 players with 10 or more home runs, done in 2017...The 2019 team feature nine players, which the 2007 and 2005 teams feature eight players as well...The Mets have socked 197 home runs this season...That is tied for the fifth-most in the National League...The 2022 Mets hit 171 home runs...The team's 197 home runs are the sixth-most in a single season in franchise history...Next up is the 2000 team, which hit 198 in the season...Four teams in franchise history have cracked 200+ home runs in a single year 2019 (242), 2017 (224), 2016 (218) and 2006 (200).

EL JEFF-E: In 45 games since the start of August, Jeff McNeil is batting .294 (53-180) with 28 runs, seven doubles, one triple, seven home runs, 19 RBI, seven walks with four steals, a .333 OBP and a .461 SLG...McNeil has an .837 OPS in 16 games this month, recording seven-extra base hits.

ON LOAN: Francisco Lindor has played 22 career games at the home of the Marlins...He is a .301 (25-83) hitter with 13 runs, seven doubles, three home runs, 13 RBI, 12 walks with a .398 OBP and a .494 SLG...Pete Alonso has posted a .619 SLG in 33 career games in Miami...He has recorded five doubles, one triple, 12 home runs, 22 RBI and 22 walks in that span.

X MARK'S THE SPOT: In 17 games since his return from the 10-Day IL, Mark Vientos is batting .267 (16-60) with nine runs, one triple, three home runs, seven RBI, three walks with a .323 OBP and a .450 SLG...Over his last seven games, Vientos is bating .333 (9-27) with four runs, one home runs, four RBI, one walk with a .357 OBP and a .444 SLG.

DOING THE SPLITS: Brandon Nimmo is batting .285 with 42 runs, 12 doubles, three triples, 10 home runs, 33 RBI, 35 walks with a .364 OBP and a .454 SLG in 72 games on the road this season...This compares to a .247/.346/.452 slashline in 72 games at Citi Field...Francisco Lindor has posted a .283/.353/.529 slashline with 54 runs, 23 doubles, two triples, 15 home runs and 26 walks in 75 games on the road in 2023...He has posted .213/.311/.375 slash in 73 games at Citi Field...Pete Alonso is slashing .240/.349/.573 with 24 home runs and 51 RBI in 71 road games...He is batting .202/.302/.473 at Citi Field.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Brandon Nimmo has safely hit in 17 of his last 19 games... Since August 28, Nimmo is batting .309 (25-81) with 11 runs, six doubles, one triple, five home runs, nine RBI, five walks with a .356 OBP and a .593 SLG...He has socked a career-best 23 home runs this season...Nimmo has recorded 60 RBI in 2023...His career-best is 64, which he recorded in 2022.

SENGA GENESIS: Kodai Senga has recorded 191 strikeouts...That is the second-most strikeouts by a rookie in franchise history...He is 10-7 with a 2.95 ERA (51 ER/155.1 IP) with 72 walks and 191 strikeouts in 27 starts this season...His 2.95 ERA ranks fourth in the majors and third in the National League...His 191 strikeouts are the seventh-most in the NL...With nine more strikeouts, he would become the 13th pitcher in franchise history to record 200 or more strikeouts in a season...Jacob deGrom and Noah Syndergaard were the last pitchers to do so...Tom Seaver owns the franchise record with nine such seasons.

MARLINS-METS NOTES: The Mets are 55-47 at loanDepot Park...New York has won six of its last seven contests in Miami.

GOT TO GO TO MO'S: Ronny Mauricio has safely hit in 11 of his first 14 career games...He is batting .308 (16-52) with three runs, two doubles, one home run, seven RBI, three walks and six steals in his first 14 career games...He is one of five players in franchise history to record a hit in each of his first five career major league games.

STEAL THIS ALBUM: The Mets lead the major leagues with a 90.2% success rate in stolen bases this season...The team has stolen 111 bases out of 123 attempts...It's the highest success rate in franchise history...The previous high was 82.3% which was accomplished in 2004.

I DON'T WANT TO ROCK, DJ: Over his last 26 games, DJ Stewart is batting .305 (29-95) with 16 runs, six doubles, 10 home runs, 23 RBI and a 1.050 OPS...In 49 games this year, Stewart is batting .265 (35-132) with 19 runs, eight doubles, 11 home runs, 26 RBI, 12 walks, a .344 OBP and a .566 SLG...Stewart recorded a career-high 12 home runs in 100 games with Baltimore in 2021.

191: Pete Alonso became the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI (120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry also recorded three seasons each...Alonso's 492 RBI since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues...He is second in the majors and in the NL with 112 RBI.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has recorded his second season with 45 or more home runs, becoming the only player in franchise history to do so...He recorded his third season with 40 or more home runs...He became the fifth player in major league history with three or more seasons of 40 or more homers in their first five years, joining Ralph Kiner (four), Ryan Howard (three), Albert Pujols (three) and Eddie Mathews (three)...He is the only player in franchise history with multiple seasons of 40 or more home runs...He is tied for second in the majors and is second in the National League with 45 home runs...Alonso's 191 home runs since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues.

30-FOR-30: Lindor has recorded 33 doubles and 26 home runs this season... He is looking to become the 12th player in franchise history to record a 30/30 season...The last player to accomplish that feat was Pete Alonso in 2019...He has stolen 27 bases this year...He is looking to become the fourth player in franchise history to record 30 doubles, 30 home runs and 30 steals in a single-season... He would join David Wright (2007), Howard Johnson (1991 & 1989) and Darryl Strawberry (1987).

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 2007, David Wright became the first player in franchise history to record three consecutive seasons with 100 or more RBI...The Captain finished the year appearing in 160 games and in fourth place in NL MVP voting...He batted .325/.416/.545 with 113 runs, 42 doubles, one triple, 30 homers, 107 RBI, 34 steals with a .963 OPS and a 149 OPS+...He was named an All-Star that year and earned his first career Gold Glove and Silver Slugger awards.

LUCCHESI NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Earned the win after throwing a career-high-tying 7.0 innings on September 13 against the Diamondbacks at Citi Field...Allowed one unearned run on five hits and three walks while striking out two batters in a 7-1 Mets victory.

SLINGIN' IN SYRACUSE: Lucchesi has made 15 appearances, 14 of which were starts, this season for Triple-A Syracuse...In those appearances, he has pitched to a 4.74 ERA (43 ER/81.2 IP) and has tallied 75 strikeouts...Lucchesi earned International League Pitcher of the Week for the week of June 12-18 after tossing 6.2 scoreless innings against the Buffalo Bisons on June 13, during which he allowed two hits while striking out six batters...In his most recent start, Lucchesi threw 4.0 innings on September 6 with Syracuse against the Rochester Red Wings, allowing three earned runs on six hits and three walks while striking out three batters in a 7-6 Syracuse walk-off victory in 10 innings.

FUEGO TAKES ON MIAMI: Lucchesi will face the Marlins for the first time this season and for the first time since 2021...Has pitched to a 1-0 record with a 0.87 ERA (1 ER/10.1 IP) in two starts against Miami in his career...Holds a 1-0 record with a 1.42 ERA (1 ER/6.1 IP) at home compared to a 0-0 record with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER/4.0 IP) on the road against the Marlins...In his last appearance against Miami on May 22, 2021 at loanDepot park, Lucchesi tossed 4.0 scoreless, allowing one hit while striking out eight Marlins batters in a 3-1 Mets loss.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT RECAP: Made two appearances with Brooklyn (A+) as part of his rehab assignment after being placed on the 7-day IL, both against the Aberdeen IronBirds...Threw 52 pitches in his first rehab start on August 8, allowing one earned run on four hits and a walk while striking out five...On August 13, threw 4.2 scoreless innings, allowing one hit and one walk while fanning three batters in a 63-pitch outing.

CAN'T WAIT TO GET ON THE ROAD AGAIN: In four away starts in the majors this season, Lucchesi has pitched to a 2.41 ERA (5 ER/18.2 IP), tallying 15 strikeouts, and earned his first two wins of the season on the road (April 21 @ SF, August 18 @ STL)...In three home starts this season, Lucchesi has pitched to a 3.31 ERA (6 ER/16.1 IP).

PUTTING UP GOOSE EGGS: Dating back to June 13, 2021, Lucchesi tossed 18.1 straight scoreless innings, a career-best scoreless streak, which came to an end on April 27 against the Nationals...Among starting pitchers, Lucchesi's scoreless streak was the third-longest active scoreless streak in the majors at the time, behind Zac Gallen (28.0 innings) and Gerrit Cole (20.0 innings)

JOEY FUEGO: Made his major league debut on March 30, 2018 while with San Diego in a start against Milwaukee...Played for the Padres for three season before coming to the Mets in 2021...As a Met, Lucchesi-who adopted the nickname "Fuego" while in college-made eight starts in 11 appearances in 2021, pitching to a 4.46 ERA (19 ER/38.1 IP) and racking up 41 strikeouts before his season was cut short after undergoing "Tommy John" surgery...Made his Mets debut in relief on April 7, 2021 at Philadelphia, tossing 2.0 scoreless innings...Pitched to a 1.19 ERA (3 ER/22.2 IP) with 24 strikeouts over his last five outings of the 2021 season before his season-ending injury.

TROUBLE WITH THE CHURVE: Has gained attention throughout his career for a pitch he created, called the "churve"...Developed from a basic changeup, Lucchesi holds the ball deep in his palm and tinkered with his wrist action and position to throw the pitch in a similar nature to a breaking ball...Since then, it is a go-to weapon for Lucchesi...In 2019, his curve had an average 8.9 vertical drop, per Statcast, which was the most movement of any pitcher's changeup by more than a full inch...According to Baseball Savant, Lucchesi's pitch arsenal also featured a sinker, curve, cutter and change the last time he was in the majors.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP KODAI SENGA (11-7, 2.95)

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 6.0 scoreless innings against Arizona at Citi Field on September 14...Allowed two hits and two walks...Fanned 10 Diamondbacks batters in an 11-1 Mets victory.

HARD TO HIT: This season, Senga has three starts of 7.0 or more innings and two or fewer hits allowed, tied for the second-most such starts in the majors this season and tied with Dwight Gooden for the most such starts by a Mets rookie in a single season...Only Nolan Ryan (4, 1970) and Jacob deGrom (5, 2015) have had more such starts in a single season in franchise history.

- Has three doubles, a home run and five RBI in his last five games...Left the game on September 10 at Minnesota after being hit by a pitch...X-rays on his right hand were negative...Homered in his next appearance on September 12.
- Went deep on September 5 at Washington, his first long ball since August 1...Had three RBI, two runs scored and his first career stolen base in that game.
