RAY MATTER—The Rays have won four straight and are 11-2 in their last 13 games to reach a season-high 12 games over .500...at 23-11, the Rays hold the best record in the AL for the first time (ties excluded) since the end of play on May 7, 2019 (23-12), and they hold the 2nd-best record in the majors behind the Dodgers (25-10)...the Rays are 17-3 in their last 20 games, their best 20-game stretch since Aug 19-Sep 10, 2018 (17-3) and tied for the 2nd-best 20-game stretch in club history behind June 29-July 22, 2013 (18-2)...since winning the second game on Aug 8 vs. NYY, the Rays are 4-3 against the Blue Jays and 13-0 against all other opponents.

- With a win today, the Rays would tie 2010 for the best 35-game start in franchise history...it would also match their best 21-game stretch (18-3) overall, done most recently from July 5-30, 2013.
- A win today would give the Rays a 5-game winning streak for the 17th time since the start of 2018, compared to once from 2015-17.
- + The Rays have won 11 of their last 12 road games following an 0-5 start...over the last two seasons, the Rays are 59-39 (.602) on the road. 3rd in the majors since then behind the Twins and Dodgers.
- + The Rays have the easiest remaining schedule in the AL, with a weighted opponents' winning pct. of .448...this is the 2nd-easiest remaining schedule in all of the majors, behind the Braves (.423).
- + The Rays have LH Dietrich Enns, C Ronaldo Hernández, INF Nate Lowe and RH Sam McWilliams on the taxi squad for this 6-game road trip to Miami and the Bronx...following this road trip, the Rays are scheduled for four off days in the final 25 days of the season.

WHERE WE STAND—For a second straight day, the Rays have a 4-game lead in the AL East, the 2nd-largest cushion among division leaders behind the Dodgers (+5.0)...this is their largest lead since they were 14-6 through games of April 19, 2019 (+4.5)...this is the fourth season the Rays have built a lead this large and they won the division in two of the previous three (2008, 2010) and clinched a Wild Card spot in the other (2019).

- + The Rays were a season-high 4.5 GB of the Yankees through games of Aug 5, but since then they have gone 18-4 and the Yankees have gone 8-11...the Rays have gained 8.5 games over the last 24 days.
- + The Rays were under .500 through Aug 8 but are 16-3 since.

SEEKING SWEEP—Today the Rays have a chance to complete their fifth sweep of the season, fourth in the last six series and second consecutive... their previous sweeps were July 27-28 vs. ATL (2-0), Aug 10-13 at BOS (4-0), Aug 18-20 at NYY (3-0) and Aug 25-26 vs. BAL (2-0)...the Rays are attempting to sweep the Marlins in a series of 3 games (or more) for the seventh time in club history, first since Sep 29–Oct 1, 2015 at home (3-0)...they are attempting to sweep them in a road series of 3 games (or more) for the third time, following June 8-10, 2012 (3-0) and June 24-26, 2008 (3-0).

THROWING BLANKS—The Rays enter today's game on a scoreless streak of 20 IP, starting with the 8th inning on Wed vs. BAL...the Rays have pitched back-to-back shutouts for the 15th time in club history, first since May 14-15, 2019 at MIA, ninth time on the road...it is the sixth time since the start of the 2018 season they have recorded consecutive shutouts, after doing so nine times in the franchise's first 20 seasons (1998–2017).

- + For the record, never in club history have the Rays pitched *three* consecutive shutouts, and the last team in the majors to do that within the same season was the Indians from Aug 25-27, 2017.
- + Last night the Rays recorded their third shutout of the season and 15th since the start of last season, 2nd in the AL behind the Indians (21)...the Rays have eight road shutouts since the start of last season and four of them have come in their 4 games at Marlins Park.
- + According to Stats LLC, the Rays are the third team in the live-ball era (since 1920) to have four consecutive shutouts at any road ball-park, joining the 1981-82 Orioles (4) at Exhibition Stadium (Blue Jays) and 1969-70 Mets (5) at Connie Mack Stadium (Phillies)...the Rays have a scoreless streak of 36 IP at Marlins Park, the longest streak of scoreless innings at any ballpark in franchise history.

RAYS vs. MARLINS—Since July 22, 2018, the Rays have won seven consecutive games over the Marlins, the 2nd-longest winning streak against them in franchise history behind May 22, 2011–June 15, 2012 (8)...today is the third of 6 games between the two clubs this season, all over a span of 10 days, with a 3-game series from Sep 4-6 at Tropicana Field...last season the Rays went 4-0 against the Marlins, the third time in club history they swept a season series when playing multiple series against a club, following 2018 against the Royals (7-0) and 2013 against the Marlins (4-0)... the Rays are 63-56 (.529) all-time in the "Citrus Series" (32-25 at home, 31-

31 on the road), including 42-22 (.656) since becoming the Rays in 2008.

+ Five of the 28 players on the Marlins active roster were previously in the Rays organization: 1B Jesús Aguilar, RH Brad Boxberger, OF Corey Dickerson, OF Matt Joyce and OF Jesús Sánchez.

INTERLEAGUE INTRIGUE—The Rays are 4-2 in interleague play this season (2-0 at home, 2-2 on the road) and 18-8 (.692) since the start of last season, 2nd in the majors over that stretch behind the Mets (19-8)...over the last two seasons, the Rays have a majors-best 2.43 ERA (237-IP, 64-ER) in interleague games...the Rays are 135-101 (.572) in interleague play since 2008—3rd-best in the majors since then—and 209-205 (.505) all-time.

+ Blake Snell enters today's game on an interleague scoreless streak of 32.2 IP, longest in IL history ahead of TOR/MIA Henderson Alvarez III (31 IP) from June 18, 2012–Aug 27, 2014...Snell has yielded 2 runs (or fewer) in 12 of his 13 career interleague starts.

NEXT MAN UP—Since Aug 9, the Rays have seen their injured list grow from three to 12 players but they are 16-3 over that stretch, best record in the majors...since the start of summer camp, the Rays have had 11 pitchers sidelined due to injury, including three of their season-opening starting rotation (Chirinos, Morton, Yarbrough), seven of their planned Opening Day bullpen (Alvarado, Anderson, Beeks, Drake, Kittredge, Poche, Roe) and their top pitching prospect (McKay)...six of these 11 pitchers are out for the season (Beeks, Chirinos, Kittredge, McKay, Poche, Roe).

- + The Rays have used 24 pitchers this season, tied for 3rd in the AL, on the heels of a franchise-record 33 pitchers used last season...the Rays have used 11 starting pitchers, tied for most in the majors.
- + The Rays have 10 pitchers with a save, one shy of tying the club record (2019)...this is two shy of the major league record set by the 1973 Rangers...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the Rays are the fastest team—since saves became an official stat (1969)—to have 10 pitchers with a save, ahead of the 1973 Brayes (97th game).

PITCHING PROPERLY—The Rays rank 4th in the majors in ERA (3.62), 7th in starter ERA (3.64) and 6th in bullpen ERA (3.60)...the Rays ranked 16th in the majors in ERA through Aug 17 (4.28), but since then their 2.32 ERA (101-IP, 26-ER) is best in the majors ahead of the Indians (2.88)...the Rays have yielded 3 runs (or fewer) in seven of 11 games since Aug 18.

- + Rays starters haven't allowed an earned run in their last 19.1 IP, and Rays relievers haven't allowed an earned run in their last 14.2 IP.
- + Rays pitching hasn't allowed a home run in their last 35 IP.
- + Rays relievers have covered 52.3 pct. of the team's innings this season and rank 2nd in the majors with 157.1 IP (Red Sox, 159.1 IP).
- + In their last 13 games, Rays opponents are batting .141 (12-for-85) with RISP, compared to .297 (52-for-175) through 21 games.

ABOUT THE OFFENSE—The Rays are tied for 4th in the majors with 171 runs scored behind the Dodgers (197), Padres (192) and Astros (176)...the Rays lead the AL with 67 2B and rank 2nd in the AL with 116 XBH, 146 BB (tied) and a .334 OBP...since setting a single-series club record with 42 runs from Aug 10-13 at BOS, the Rays have scored 64 runs in 14 games (4.57 R/G)...they have scored 5 runs (or fewer) in eight straight games (6-2 over that stretch) and 4 runs (or fewer) in five consecutive games (4-1).

- + All 6 runs scored by the Rays this series have come with 2 outs... the Rays have 65 2-out runs this season, tied for 6th in the majors.
- + Last night was the 10th time this season the Rays won without hitting a home run, most in the majors ahead of the Indians (6).
- + Last night **Joey Wendle**'s 2-run double in the 8th inning was the club's first *extra-base hit* with the bases loaded since Sep 14, 2019 at LAA (double), going 6-for-30 with 6 1B, 2 BB and 3 SF in between.
- + Over their last 12 road games, the Rays have hit 20 HR and are averaging 6.83 R/G, batting .294 (127-for-432) during that stretch.
- + Rays pinch-hitters are batting .333/.459/.444 (9-for-27) with 3 2B, 13 RBI and 8 BB...they rank among ML leaders in avg. (2nd), onbase pct. (2nd), doubles (tied for 1st), RBI (1st) and walks (1st).

UP NEXT: YANKEES—The Rays enter tomorrow's game with a 5-game winning streak over the Yankees, tied for 2nd-longest in club history... the Rays are 6-1 against them this season and have clinched the season series for the first time since 2014 (11-8)...the Rays took over first place in the AL East with a 3-game sweep from Aug 18-20 in the Bronx, ending the Yankees run of 22 consecutive days in first...it was the third time in franchise history the Rays swept a series of 3 games (or more) at Yankee Stadium, following June 30–July 2, 2014 (3-0) and Sep 24-26, 2013 (3-0).

LAST START—On Mon vs. TOR, took no decision despite season-highs in innings pitched (5.2), strikeouts (9) and pitches (101), his most of each since July 21, 2019 vs. CWS...threw 28 pitches in the 1st inning but only 9 pitches in the 2nd before allowing an RBI double to **Vladimir Guerrero Jr.** in the 3rd...retired his next 9 BF, including 6 SO over that stretch, before allowing a 2-out homer to **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** in the 6th, his last batter faced...recorded 12 swings-and-misses: 4 fastballs, 4 curveballs and 4 sliders...his line: ND, 5.2 IP, 4 H, 2 R/ER, 1 BB, 9 SO, 1 HR, 101 pitches, 66 str.

vs. MARLINS—Made his only start against the Marlins on May 3, 2017 at Tropicana Field, taking no decision after allowing 2 runs in 5 IP...held the Marlins scoreless through his first 3 IP before allowing 2 runs in the 4th inning, on a **Marcell Ozuna** homer and **Adeiny Hechavarria** RBI double...averaged 21.8 pitches per inning.

INTERLEAGUE—Hasn't allowed a run in interleague play since May 8, 2018 vs. ATL (Ronald Acuña Jr. solo homer), with an interleague scoreless streak of 32.2 IP since then—longest in IL history ahead of TOR/MIA **Henderson Alvarez III** (31 IP) from June 18, 2012–Aug 27, 2014...is 7-2 with a 1.43 ERA (75.2-IP, 12-ER) in 13 career interleague starts, the best interleague ERA in the majors since 2016...has yielded 2 runs or fewer in 12 of these 13 starts. 1 run or fewer in 10 starts and 0 runs in 8 starts.

+ Last season, allowed only 3 hits in 15 scoreless innings during IL play.

BUMP IN THE ROAD—Has won in two straight road starts following a 6-game road winless streak...since the start of last season, is 4-5 with a 5.48 ERA (64-IP, 39-ER) in 15 starts on the road...won his first road start of last season on April 8 at CWS, but after that went 1-5 with a 6.40 ERA (45-IP, 32-ER) in 11 starts, with the only other win coming on June 9 at BOS...in his career, is 18-17 with a 4.01 ERA (262.2-IP, 117-ER) in 54 starts on the road and 22-11 with a 2.46 ERA (267-IP, 73-ER) in 49 starts at home.

BRINGING THE HEAT—His 12.33 SO/9 IP ratio since the start of last season ranks 7th in the majors and 4th in the AL (min. 100 IP)...his avg. fastball velocity last season was 95.6 mph, 2nd in the AL (min. 100 IP) behind HOU **Gerrit Cole** (97.2), according to FanGraphs, and is 95.1 mph this season...threw first-pitch strikes to 67.7 pct. of batters faced last season, 4th in the AL...17.7 pct. of his pitches were swings-and-misses, best rate in the majors.

- + Has a career-best 4.57 SO/BB ratio (32-SO, 7-BB) this season and has walked a career-low 7.3 pct. (7 of 96) of batters faced.
- + His career .223 opp avg. is the lowest in franchise history (min. 300 IP)...this ranks 2nd among AL lefties since his rookie season behind BOS Chris Sale (.211)...ranks 2nd in club history in ERA (3.23), 6th in strikeouts (617) and is tied with Hellickson, Niemann and Odorizzi for 6th in wins (40).
- + Has only allowed 1 hit to left-handed hitters in 20 AB this season compared to a .261 opp avg. (18-for-69) against right-handed hitters...has held lefties to a .288 opp SLG and .203 opp avg. (72-for-354) in his career, the 3rd and 8th-lowest marks in the AL since 2016 (min. 350 BF).

HELP IS ON THE WAY—Has recieved 17 runs of support in his last 3 starts, compared to 14 runs of support in his previous 13 starts (June 14, 2019–Aug 7, 2020)...min. 5 starts, his 7.23 R/9 IP of run support is 11th-highest in the AL this season, after his 3.62 R/9 IP last season would have been the lowest in the AL if he qualified...the Rays gave him 1 run (or fewer) of support in 14 of his 23 starts last season.

2019 IN REVIEW—His season following his AL Cy Young Award winning campaign was shortened due to a pair of trips to the injured list...missed a start while on the 10-day IL from April 14-24 (fractured right fourth toe) and nearly two months toward the end of the season...underwent arthroscopic surgery to remove loose bodies from his left elbow on July 29, performed by Dr. Koco Eaton in St. Petersburg...despite the injury-riddled season, his 12.36 SO/9 IP ratio and 3.68 SO/BB ratio were both career bests...his 8 losses tied for the team lead and the Rays went 12-11 (.522) in his starts.

POSTSEASON—Started Game 2 of the ALDS at HOU and took the loss, and pitched in relief in Games 4 and 5...in Game 4 vs. HOU, entered with 1 out in the 9th inning and the potential game-tying run at the plate, and got a **Yordan Álvarez** swinging strikeout and **Yuli Gurriel** groundout for the save...became the second Rays pitcher to record his first career save in the postseason, following **David Price** in Game 7 of the 2008 ALCS vs. BOS.

GAMING FOR GOOD—Snell won the inaugural *MLB The Show* Players League with a 3-game sweep in the championship series against CWS **Lucas Giolito...**he won 5-1 in Game 1, 3-2 in Game 2 and 6-0 in Game 3...in the best-of-three quarterfinals and semifinals, he defeated LAD **Gavin Lux** (2-0) and NYM **Jeff McNeil** (2-1), respectively...Snell's win resulted in a \$30,000 donation to the Boys & Girls Clubs of the Suncoast by MLB, the MLBPA and Sony Interactive Entertainment...each contestant had \$5,000 donated to his local affiliate initially, and the winning player got an extra \$25,000 donated.

CY ZILLA—Named the 2018 AL Cy Young Award winner by the BBWAA...totaled 169 points in the 7-4-3-2-1 scoring system to win the award over HOU Justin Verlander (154)...became the second Cy Young winner in club history, following David Price (2012)...finished the 2018 season at age 25, the young-est Cy Young winner since LAD Clayton Kershaw (25) in 2013 and youngest AL Cy Young winner since SEA Félix Hernández (24) in 2010.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RH TYLER GLASNOW (1-1, 5.14 ERA)

- + On Tues vs. BAL, recorded a career-high 13 SO, the most by a Ray since Blake Snell (13) on April 2, 2019 vs. COL...recorded a career-high 24 swings-and-misses, most by a Ray since Snell (25) on July 21, 2019 vs. CWS—and Snell (5x) is the only Ray with more swings-and-misses in a game in the pitch-tracking era (2008)...retired his last 11 BF including nine of his last 10 BF on strikeouts...according to Stats LLC, became the first pitcher in club history to strike out nine batters in 10 PA (single-game span)...allowed a solo homer to Renato Núñez in the 1st inning and a second run on three straight 1-out singles in the 4th...threw 48 curveballs, 47 fastballs and 1 changeup...his line: W, 7 IP, 5 H, 2 R/ER, 1 BB, 13 SO, 1 HR, 96 pit, 72 str.
- + His 48 SO ranks 5th in the AL and his 15.43 SO/9 IP ranks 1st in the majors (min. 25 IP)...has struck out 39.3 pct. (48 of 122) of his batters faced.
- + Is 0-2 with a 4.91 ERA (18.1-IP, 10-ER) in four career starts against the Yankees...has already faced them twice this season, both opposite Gerrit Cole, going 0-1 with a 6.48 ERA (8.1-IP, 6-ER)...last faced them on Aug 19 at NYY, his first career outing at Yankee Stadium, and yielded 2 runs in 5.2 IP of a no-decision...allowed a solo homer to Luke Voit in the 3rd inning and the tying run on a triple (Hicks) and sacrifice fly (Urshela) in the 6th.

#16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- + Is in his sixth season as Rays manager...is the fifth manager in Rays history and already the 2nd-longest-tenured behind Joe Maddon (2006-14).
- Is baseball's 3rd-longest-tenured manager with his current team behind OAK Bob Melvin (9th full season) and CLE Terry Francona (8th season).
- Last year was his second straight 3rd-place finish in AL Manager of the Year voting...finished behind MIN Rocco Baldelli and NYY Aaron Boone.

Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, joining Al Lopez (HOF), Tony La Russa (HOF), Lou Piniella, Dave Miley and John Hart.

- + Has been ejected 10 times as Rays manager (last Aug 23, 2020 vs. TOR), 3rd in club history behind Joe Maddon (37) and Larry Rothschild (15).
- + On Oct 9, 2018, agreed to a contract extension through the 2024 season including a club option for the 2025 season.
