• Beauden is being celebrated for his inspirational recovery from a rare and aggressive staph infection, at just 3 years old, that led to septic shock, months in intensive care and more than 20 surgeries, including the amputation of both legs...his story caught the team's attention in January during his visit to MLB Network with Challenged Athletes Foundation...today, he plays baseball at Lake Havasu Little League using prosthetic legs.

• Joe, an Arizona clarinetist born blind and autistic...completely self-taught, he learns and performs music entirely by ear and has memorized hundreds of pieces, and dreams of performing alongside Andrea Bocelli.

• **Geraldo Perdomo's** 18-game on-base streak dating back to Sept. 9, 2025 is the Majors' second longest active on-base streak, behind Shohei Ohtani/LAD (32 since Aug. 24, 2025).

• **Ryne Nelson**, D-backs 2025 Pitcher of the Year by the Arizona BBWAA, will make his fifth career start vs. Dodgers and second @ Dodger Stadium...in his last start vs. Dodgers, on Sept. 24, 2025, had a career-high-tying 9 strikeouts in a quality start (3 ER in 6.0 IP, 7 H).

• In 4 career starts vs. Dodgers, has gone 1-0 with a 2.74 ERA (7 ER in 23.0 IP), opponent .198 AVG, 5 walks and 20 strikeouts.

• Ranked among NL starting pitchers since May in hits allowed (6th, 103), win pct. (T-6th, .667), earned runs allowed (9th, 45), earned runs per game (9th, 1.96), WHIP (9th, 1.08) and ERA (10th, 3.16).

• The D-backs lost 8-2 @ Dodgers last night.

• **Geraldo Perdomo** went 2-for-4 with 1 homer and 2 RBI...became the second D-back shortstop all-time to homer on Opening Day (also: Stephen Drew on April 5, 2010 vs. Padres) and is the only D-back all-time with 3 consecutive Opening Day's with 1+ hits and 1+ RBI.

• **Nolan Arenado** went 1-for-3 and has reached safely in 11 of his 13 career Opening Day starts... his 13 consecutive Opening Day starts rank tied for the most among active third basemen with Manny Machado/SD.

• **Ketel Marte** made his team-record seventh start at second base and franchise-record ninth straight Opening Day start (7 2B, 2 CF), ahead of Luis Gonzalez (8 from 1999-2006) and Paul Goldschmidt (7 from 2012-18).

• **Carlos Santana** made his 16th consecutive Opening Day start, second most among active players, behind Andrew McCutchen/TEX (17).

• **Jordan Lawlar** became the seventh D-back all-time to log an extra-base hit in their first career Opening Day plate appearance, joining Tim Lincecum (2021), Yasmany Tomás (2016), Jake Lamb (2015), Paul Goldschmidt (2012), Jeff Salazar (2008) and Damian Miller (2000) [source: Elias Sports Bureau].

CARRY OVER TRENDS: Geraldo Perdomo, since Sept. 9, 2025, has hit safely in 17 of his last 18 regular season games, hitting .368 (25-for-68)/1.137 OPS with 6 doubles, 1 triple, 4 homers, 11 RBI and 11 walks (11 strikeouts).

• **Jordan Lawlar**, over his last 18 regular season games since Sept. 2, 2025, is hitting .310 (13-for-39)/.925 OPS with 8 doubles.

NL bWAR LEADERS SINCE 2024: Since 2024, **Ketel Marte's** 11.1 bWAR and **Geraldo Perdomo's** 10.5 bWAR rank fourth and fifth respectively among NL position players, behind Shohei Ohtani/LAD (15.7), Francisco Lindor/NYM (12.7) and Matt Chapman/SF (11.2).

• **Torey Lovullo's** 10 seasons as Manager rank him as Arizona's second professional sports manager/head coach to reach double-digits (Cardinals, Coyotes, Mercury, Suns), joining the Suns' John MacLeod (14 seasons, 1974-87).
