**TODAY'S TILT**...the Mariners finish up the 6-game homestand (4-1) with the last of 3 games against the Toronto Blue Jays (1-1) after sweeping the Los Angeles Angels (3-0)...following today's finale, the Mariners travel to face the Miami Marlins (3 G, 7/7-7/9) and Tampa Bay Rays (7/10-7/12) on their final road trip before the All-Star Break...this afternoon's game will be televised live **exclusively on Peacock** with **Aaron Goldsmith, Angie Mentink and Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs and Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

**ODDS & ENDS**...the Mariners beat the Blue Jays in convincing fashion yesterday, 11-0, as Seattle cruised to its sixth consecutive Independence Day victory...**Randy Arozarena** hit the second July 4 grand slam in Mariners history, joining Paul Sorrento (July 4, 1996 at Texas).

- **High Quality Stuff** - Mariners starting pitchers have 42 quality starts this season, most in the American League and 2nd-most in the big leagues behind the Dodgers (50 QS).
- **Dynamic Duo Sets Sights on Futures Game** - LHP **Kade Anderson** and RHP **Ryan Sloan** were both named to the All-Star Futures Game roster, set for Sunday, July 12 at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia.
- **Bird Hunting** - **Cal Raleigh** hit a 3-run homer yesterday...it marked his 11th regular season homer against Toronto, his most vs. any non-AL West opponent...in 26 games against the Blue Jays, Cal has a .984 OPS and .641 slugging percentage in 105 plate appearances.
- **Challenger Little League Game** - Today at 12:10 p.m., Mariners players will take part in the Challenger Little League Game, a program for individuals with physical and intellectual challenges.

**AROZARENA NAMED AMERICAN LEAGUE ALL-STAR**...MLB announced yesterday that outfielder **Randy Arozarena** was selected to the American League roster for the 2026 MLB All-Star Game on July 14 at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia...Arozarena is batting .287 (86x300) with 54 runs, 21 doubles, 1 triple, 9 home runs, 41 RBI, 32 walks and 19 stolen bases, getting on base at a .376 clip, slugging .453 with an .829 OPS in 82 games this season...he is a three-time All-Star (2023, '25-'26) and has made the Midsummer Classic in each of the last two seasons with Seattle...he is the 15th player in Mariners history to make multiple All-Star teams with the club, joining Ken Griffey Jr. (10x), Ichiro Suzuki (10x), Edgar Martinez (7x), Félix Hernández (6x), Randy Johnson (5x), Alex Rodriguez (4x), Robinson Canó (3x), Nelson Cruz (3x), Julio Rodríguez (3x), Bret Boone (2x), Freddy García (2x), Andrés Muñoz (2x), Harold Reynolds (2x) and Kazuhiro Sasaki (2x)...Randy is one of two players with 20+ home runs and 20+ stolen bases in each of the last five seasons (2021-25), along with Cleveland's José Ramírez.

**WHAT'S EATING GILBERT GREAT**...Mariners starting pitcher **Logan Gilbert** was dominant yesterday, tossing 7.1 scoreless innings with 1 hit allowed (only baserunner) and 7 strikeouts...over his last 8 starts (5/22-c), Gilbert is 5-1 with a 1.78 ERA (10 ER, 50.2 IP) with 57 strikeouts and 10 walks...in a pair of career Independence Day starts, Logan has not allowed a run across 16.1 innings, previously throwing a complete game shutout on July 4, 2023 at San Francisco.

**LAST EIGHT HAVE BEEN GREAT**...the Mariners pitching staff has a 2.31 ERA (18 ER, 70.0 IP) with 59 strikeouts and 15 walks over its last 8 games (6/26-c), best ERA in the Majors...Mariners starters **George Kirby, Bryan Woo, Bryce Miller, Luis Castillo** and **Logan Gilbert** have dialed up 5 consecutive quality starts since June 29, with today's starter **Emerson Hancock** tossing 5.2 innings with 1 run allowed in his last outing on June 28...the bullpen also goes into today's game having tossed 6.2 consecutive scoreless innings...overall this season, the Mariners pitching staff ranks 5th in ERA (3.59), 2nd in WHIP (1.17), 1st in fewest walks-per-9 innings (2.53), 1st in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.49) and 1st in fewest home runs allowed per 9 innings (0.90).

**'DOM'INANT**...**Dominic Canzone** went 2-for-4 with a home run, 3 RBI and a walk yesterday...his 14 home runs are tied with **Luke Raley** and **Julio Rodríguez** for most on the team...over his last 31 games (5/25-c), Canzone is batting .316 (30x95) with 17 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 10 home runs, 18 RBI and 10 walks, getting on base at a .387 clip, slugging .695 with a 1.082 OPS.

**HE'S FROM TEXAS**...in 9 appearances (8 starts) this season, **Bryce Miller** has posted a 1.71 ERA (10 ER, 52.2 IP) with 62 strikeouts and just 5 walks allowed...he leads all Major League pitchers (min. 50.0 IP) in strikeout-to-walk ratio (12.40), 1st in WHIP (0.66) and ranks 1st in walk rate (2.7%)...he also ranks 2nd in ERA, 2nd in opponent batting average (.165), and 3rd in strikeout rate (33.2%).

**YOUNG MAN'S GAME**...in 22 games since June 10, **Cole Young** is batting .296 (24x81) with 12 runs, 3 doubles, 5 home runs, 10 RBI and 12 strikeouts, reaching base at a .329 clip and slugging .519 (.848 OPS)...on Monday, Young recorded his first career multi-homer game, becoming the 10th player in Mariners history age 22-or-younger with a multi-homer game, and the first since **Julio Rodríguez** (3x, 9/11/22 vs. ATL, 7/25/23 at MIN and 9/5/23 at CIN).

**AS YOU MAY KNOW**...the Mariners put together a masterful pitching performance in yesterday's 11-0 win...**Logan Gilbert** tossed 7.1 innings and allowed just 1 hit (only baserunner) with 7 strikeouts, retiring 22 of 23 batters faced...in relief, **Cole Wilcox** tossed 1.2 scoreless innings with a strikeout, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...it marked just the sixth time in franchise history that Seattle's pitching staff combined to allow no more than 1 baserunner in a game?...it was the first time it happened since a 7-0 Mariners win on Sept. 15, 2024 vs. the Texas Rangers when **George Kirby** (7.0 IP), **Trent Thornton** (1.0 IP) and **Eduard Bardo** (1.0 IP) combined to allow just 1 hit...the other 4 times it happened were Sept. 27, 1983 vs. the Royals, April 20, 1990 at the Athletics, July 6, 2009 vs. the Orioles, and Aug. 15, 2012 vs. the Rays (Félix Hernández's perfect game)...in 5 of the franchise's 6 no-hitters (all except for Félix's perfect game), more baserunners were allowed in those games than yesterday's 11-0 win.

### ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - JULY 5

- **1995** - **Edgar Martínez** is named AL Player of the Month for June. Martínez hit .402, with 24 runs, 8 HR, 32 RBI, 28 walks, a .761 slugging percentage and a .537 on base percentage in the 28 games during the month.
- **2011** - **Jamey Wright** earned his first career save in his 500th career appearance in the Mariners 4-2 win over the A's in 10 innings. It is the 2nd most career appearances to notch a first career save, trailing only Frank Tanana, who had his first save in his 530th career appearance.
- **2014** - The Mariners beat the White Sox 3-2 in 14 innings. **Félix Hernández** notched his 10th consecutive start of 7.0 or more IP while allowing 2 or fewer runs, the longest single-season streak since Houston's Mike Scott (12 G) in 1986.
- **2022** - **Julio Rodríguez** named AL Player of the Week.
- **2025** - The Mariners won by a score of 1-0 in the 2nd game of the 3-game series against the Pirates, marking the team's second consecutive shutout and extending a scoreless innings streak to 20.0 frames.

ABOUT EMERSON HANCOCK...

- The 27-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 17th start of the season and the 47th of his career...this will be his 53rd career appearance, including the 6 relief appearances he made throughout the 2025 regular season... it will mark his 1st start of the season and 2nd career start against the Blue Jays.

LAST TIME OUT...ND on June 28 at Cleveland, tossed 5.2 innings with 1 run (1 ER) allowed on 5 hits and 3 walks with 6 strikeouts...threw 98 pitches and 58 strikes...marks his 7th start with 1-or-fewer runs allowed over 5.0+ IP, tied for the 7th most such starts in the AL this season.

HOME TURF...across 8 home starts this season, owns a 3.38 ERA (17 ER, 45.1 IP), 9 walks and 54 strikeouts for a 6.00 K/BB and a .926 WHIP...ranks 8th in WHIP in MLB (min. 40.0 IP) while his 31.6 K% in home games ranks 7th best and his K/BB ranks 9th best in MLB this season (min. 40.0 IP)...is 1-of-7 pitchers this season to have allowed 3-or-fewer runs over 5.0+ IP in each of their first 7 home games of the season...is the 7th Mariners pitcher all-time to do so (last: J.A. Happ, 2015)...has had 4 home starts with 2-or-fewer runs and 6+ strikeouts over 6.0+ IP...Hancock and Bryan Woo are 2-of-11 pitchers with 4+ such games this season.

SOMETHING ABOUT THE SUNSHINE...will be making his 6th day start of the season in today's game...the Mariners are 3-2 over those 5 starts and are 8-4 since 2025 when Hancock gets the start in a day game...has tossed 5.0+ innings with 2-or-fewer runs allowed in 4-of-5 day starts with 2 being quality starts...in his first day start of the season on March 29 vs. Cleveland, did not allow a hit, walked only 1 batter and struck out 9 over 6.0 innings of work to become 1-of-8 pitchers to allow 1-or-fewer base runners over 6.0+ IP this season.

QUALITY CONTROL...has recorded a quality start in 8 of his 16 starts this season...is 1-of-6 pitchers in 2026 to have 6+ quality starts with 1-or-fewer walks and 5+ strikeouts...the Mariners are 11-6 when Hancock logs a quality start since 2023 and are 9-4 since the start of 2025...4-of-8 home starts this season have been quality starts with 6+ strikeouts and 1-or-fewer walks...his 4 such starts are tied with Bryan Woo and Jacob Misiorowski-MIL for 3rd most in MLB this season.

CAREER STRETCH...is 1-of-7 pitchers this season, along with Logan Gilbert, to have 87+ strikeouts, 22-or-fewer walks and 73-or-fewer hits through their first 16 starts of the season...among those 7 pitchers has the 4th most innings pitched (90.2), trailing Drew Rasmussen-TB (92.0), Logan Gilbert (93.0) and Cam Schlichter-NYY (95.0).

SWING BATTER BATTER SWING...earns a first pitch swing from the batter 37.7% of the time for 7th highest in the league...in at-bats where the 1st pitch is swung at, Hancock has 33 strikeouts to 3 walks (11.0 K/BB) with a 0.897 WHIP...holds the season-high for swinging strikeouts in a single game with 12 recorded in his May 2 start vs. KC, tied with Jacob Misiorowski (6/12 vs. PHI).

CROSS FIRE...owns a 1.06 WHIP against left-handed batters, ranking 12th best in MLB (min. 40.0 IP) while ranking T-11th in K/BB (3.8)...has thrown his cutter the 2nd most against left-handers (148 times) behind his 4-seam, owning a .150 (3x20) opponent batting average on the pitch to rank 4th lowest among pitchers with at least 100 cutters thrown to lefty batters...his whiff rate (33.9) on his cutter to LHB ranks 2nd and his K% (26.1) ranks 4th best (min. 100 cutters).

SWITCHING UP THE MIX...over his first 16 starts of the season, Hancock has increased his 4-seam usage by 10.8 percentage points since 2025 and increased his sweeper usage by 15.4...his cutter usage increased 11.9 points from his 0.1% use last season...he owns a 31.0 whiff rate and a .179 opponent batting average (5x28), the 3rd lowest of any of his pitches thrown, on his cutter...his 36.0 whiff rate on the sweeper, now his 3rd most used pitch, ranks 9th highest in AL (min. 200 sweepers thrown)...owns a .191 opponent batting average or better on his cutter (.179), 4-seam (.191), and sweeper (.125)...is 1-of-9 AL pitchers to have a .200 avg or better on 3 different pitches (min. 100 pitches of each pitch type).

TRAFFIC CONTROL...his 101 base runners allowed over 90.2 innings in his first 16 starts, are tied for the 4th fewest among pitchers in 2026 through their first 16 games, along with Logan Gilbert (min. 90.0 IP)...owns a baserunners-per-9 of 9.83, ranking 8th among qualified AL pitchers in 2026... is 1-of-8 pitcher to log multiple starts with 2-or-fewer base runners allowed over 6.0+ IP.

NO FREE PASSES...is 1-of-2 pitchers this season to have allowed 3-or-fewer walks over 5.0+ IP in each of their first 13 starts (3/29-6/8), along with Parker Messick-CLE...has allowed 2-or-fewer walks over 5.0 IP in 12-of-16 appearances...his 2.2 BB/9 is 11th best in the AL (min. 90.0 IP)...has contributed 8 starts with 6.0+ IP and 2-or-fewer walks to a Mariners pitching staff that has the 2nd most such games (45) in 2026.

CAN'T TOUCH THIS...has thrown 6.0+ innings with 1-or-fewer hits in 2 starts this season (5/26 at ATH and 3/29 vs. CLE)...is 1 of 13 players with multiple such starts this season, joining teammate Bryan Woo (5/6 vs. ATL, 4/3 at LAA)...the Mariners have combined for 6 such starts this season, tied for the most in MLB...is 1-of-10 pitchers to have recorded back-to-back starts of 6.0+ IP with 2-or-fewer walks and 2-or-fewer hits allowed (5/26-6/1) in 2026.

WHAT THE NUMBERS SAY...through 16 outings this season, is posting career-high marks in strikeout rate (24.2) and whiff rate (22.9), and matching his career-high walk rate (6.1), while his 2026 WHIP (1.048) is sitting .285 lower than his previous career-high WHIP of 1.333 recorded in 2023...on June 1 vs. Mets, eclipsed his career-high 64 strikeouts recorded in 2025 and in his last start on June 28 surpassed his career-high of 90.0 innings pitched last season.

UP TO BIG UNIT STANDARDS...on May 2, followed up Mariners legend Randy Johnson's Number Retirement Ceremony with a performance of his own, tossing a career-high 14 strikeouts, and becoming the 4th player with 14+ strikeouts and no walks allowed in Mariners franchise history, joining Randy Johnson (done 2x), George Kirby (done 2x) and Mark Langston.
