Central Focus The Brewers' magic number to clinch the NL Central is 4.....any combination of Brewers victories and Cubs losses totaling 4 gives Milwaukee the division title for the fifth time in the last six seasons and fourth season in a row.

Brewing History The Brewers need to go 6-8 in their last 14 games to break the franchise record for wins in a season, a mark set last season at 97-65.....the team needs to go 8-6 to secure the first 100-win season in franchise history.											
Top of the Mountain The Brewers (92-56) are a franchise-record 36 games over .500 for the first time ever.											
We're Going Streaking! The Brewers are looking for their third season-high 5-game winning streak with a win tonight.....the team won 5 in a row from 5/6-5/12 and 6/21-6/26.											
What's the Difference? Following last night's 20-0 win, the Brewers have a run differential of +192 this season, best in the majors.....the franchise record for run differential in a season is +174 in 1982, the year in which the Brewers made their only World Series appearance.											
Counting to 20 The Brewers last night became the first team in Major League history to have at least two shutout wins of at least 20 runs in a season.....the team also won 22-0 on 8/18 vs. Seattle.....the Brewers have scored 20+ runs in a game six times in franchise history.											
Grand Opening Garrett Mitchell belted his first career grand slam last night and the first by a Brewer in 2026.....the team had gone through an entire season without a grand slam three times in franchise history (1976, 1986 and 2006).											
Action Jackson In his last 23 games, Jackson Chourio is batting .379 (39-for-103) with 6 HR and 18 RBI.....during this stretch, he has a .404 OBP/.621 SLG/1.025 OPS.											
The Jackson Four Jackson Chourio last night notched his sixth 4-hit game of the season, tying the Cubs' Pete Crow-Armstrong for most in the majors.....he produced a career-high 4 hits for the 10th time in his career.											
Don't Mess with Bill In his last 22 games, William Contreras is batting .356 (32-for-90) with 5 HR and 24 RBI.....during this stretch, he has a .408 OBP/.611 SLG/1.019 OPS..... he had a career-high 6 RBI last night.											

THIS EVENING'S GAME: Is the fifth game [4-0] of a 6-game, 7-day homestand against Chicago-NL (3-0) and Cincinnati (1-0).....following this homestand and an off day on Monday, the team takes its final road trip of the season with 9 games in 10 days against Pittsburgh (3g), Baltimore (3g) and Philadelphia (3g).

IN THE TRAINER'S ROOM: RHP Grant Anderson (right biceps), LHP Brian Fitzpatrick (left elbow), RHP Quinn Priester (right thoracic outlet), RHP Bryse Wilson (low back), RHP Brandon Woodruff (right shoulder), LHP Rob Zastryzny (left trapezius) and LHP Angel Zerpa (left forearm) are on the injured list....Fitzpatrick, Priester, Woodruff, Zastryzny and Zerpa are on the 60-day IL.

MANAGER: Pat Murphy (472g, 292-190, .597) is in his third season as Brewers manager.....he was voted NL Manager of the Year in 2024 and 2025.....he is one of four managers ever to win Manager of the Year in consecutive seasons, joining the Braves' Bobby Cox (2004-05), Rays' Kevin Cash (2020-21) and Guardians' Stephen Vogt (2024-25).....Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell.....he signed a multi-year contract extension on 2/20/26.

COACHES: Offense & strategy coordinator Jason Lane (11th season/1st in current role), pitching coordinator Jim Henderson (5th season/1st in current role), field coordinator Néstor Corredor (4th season/3rd in current role), pitching coach Chris Hook (8th season), assistant pitching coach Juan Sandoval (1st season), bullpen coach Charlie Greene (3rd season), lead hitting coach Eric Theisen (2nd season/1st in current role), hitting coach Guillermo Martinez (1st season), hitting coach Daniel Vogelbach (1st season), first base coach Spencer Allen (1st season), third base coach Matt Erickson (3rd season/1st in current role).

IN THE STANDINGS (170 days): The team has spent the following number of days alone or tied at each spot in the NL Central standings: **FIRST:** 132, **SECOND:** 10, **THIRD:** 8, **FOURTH:** 13, **FIFTH:** 7.....the Brewers are in first place, leading the second-place Cubs by 10.0 games (plus the tiebreaker).....the team has held first place for the last 116 days.

AT HOME: The Brewers are a Major League-best 51-25 (.671) at home, going 19-4-1 in series play.....the team has won its last 10 home series.....after a 7-7 start, the Brewers have gone 44-18 (.710) at home.....the team has a pair of season-high 5-game winning streaks coming from 4/30-5/12 and 5/25-6/2.

ON THE ROAD: The Brewers are 41-31 on the road, going 13-8-2 in series play.....had season-high 5-game winning streaks from 5/31-6/8 and 6/21-7/3.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The Brewers have made 39 replay challenges this season, going 27-12.....their last challenge (lost) came on 9/8 vs. Chicago-NL as a hit by pitch involving Miguel Amaya stood.

BREWING SUCCESS: Including 2026, the Brewers have qualified for the postseason eight times in the last nine seasons and four seasons in a row.....the team was just two games away from making the postseason in 10 straight seasons (2017-26), missing out in both 2017 and 2022 by only a single game.....Milwaukee looks to win the NL Central for the fifth time in the last six seasons and fourth season in a row.

BREWING CONSISTENCY: The Brewers and Dodgers are the only Major League teams with 86+ wins in each of the last nine full seasons (2017-26).....the Dodgers' streak is since 2012.....this does *not* include the shortened 2020 season.....the Brewers have 855 wins since 2017, which ranks fourth in the majors behind the Dodgers (943), Astros (881) and Yankees (873).

DROHAN AT A GLANCE: Shane Drohan, 27, will be making his 29th appearance and 18th start of the season.....Drohan last pitched on 9/4 in a start at Cincinnati and had no decision in the Brewers’ 10-7 win (4ip, 5h, 6r, 6er, 2bb, 5k, 2hr, 78 pitches).....he is 5-5 with a 4.83 ERA as a starter (87.2ip, 47er) and 2-0 with a 1.69 ERA as a reliever (26.2ip, 5er).....the team is 10-7 in his starts.....he has 5 quality starts.....opponents are batting .255 (111-for-435, 12hr).....he made his MLB debut in a start on 4/8 at Boston.....he also went 1-1 with a 3.29 ERA in 3 games/ 2 starts this season at Triple-A Nashville (13.2ip, 14h, 6r, 5er, 7bb, 17k, 2hr).....Drohan was acquired from Boston with LHP Kyle Harrison and INF David Hamilton on February 9 for INF Caleb Durbin, INF Andruw Monasterio, INF/C Anthony Seigler and a 2026 Competitive Balance Round B selection.....name is pronounced “DROH-ehn.”

LAST SEASON: Drohan went 5-1 with a 2.27 ERA in 12 games/11 starts at Triple-A Worcester.....he held International League opponents to a .185 AVG with 67 strikeouts in 47.2 innings while posting a 1.01 WHIP.....he was on Worcester’s injured list from 5/13-8/25 with left forearm inflammation.

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER: Is 32-22 with a 4.25 ERA in 107 games/91 starts (425.1ip, 387h, 226r, 201er, 212bb, 489k, 51hr) while pitching in the Boston (2021-25), Chicago-AL (2024) and Milwaukee (2026) organizations.....he was originally selected by Philadelphia in the 23rd round of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft but did not sign.....he was then selected by Boston in the fifth round of the 2020 First-Year Player Draft.....Drohan went from Boston to Chicago-AL in the 2023 Rule 5 Draft and returned to the Red Sox in June 2024.....he underwent left shoulder surgery 2/22/24, performed by Dr. Nikhil Verma, and missed most of the 2024 season.

AT HOME: Is 3-3 with a 3.99 ERA in 18 games/9 starts (67.2ip, 30er).....**ON THE ROAD:** Is 4-2 with a 4.24 ERA in 10 games/8 starts (46.2ip, 22er).

vs. REDS: Is 0-0 with a 5.14 ERA in 3 starts (14ip, 16h, 8r, 8er, 6bb, 17k, 3hr).

ODDS & ENDS: Drohan graduated from Cardinal Newman (FL) High School, where he played three years of football [quarterback] in addition to baseball.....he went on to attend Florida State University.....his father, Bill, pitched in the Royals organization from 1987-90 at the Rookie and Class-A levels.....Drohan enjoys watching football and basketball and playing video games.....he is a fan of the Miami Dolphins and Miami Heat.
