METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Giants, 4-1, yesterday... New York is 7-18 over their last 25 games...Tonight, the Mets continue a seven-game homestand (2-4) against the Brewers (1-3) and Giants (1-1)...Following this homestand, the Mets head out on the road one final time before the All-Star break...The team heads west to Arizona (three games) and San Diego (three games).

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: Tonight, the Mets are seeking their first series win since their three-game sweep of the Phillies from May 30 - June 2...New York has lost or split each of their last eight series.

RUBBER BAND MAN: The Mets are 3-7 in rubber games this year.

ATTABOY ALVAREZ: Yesterday, Francisco Alvarez hit his 13th home run of the season, tying Travis d'Arnaud's franchise record for most home run by a rookie catcher set in 2014...Among MLB rookies, Alvarez is tied for third in home runs and seventh in SLG with a .467 clip...Alvarez's 13 home runs is the fourth-most in a season by a catcher in his age-21 season or younger behind Johnny Bench (26, Age 21, 1969), Darrell Porter (16, Age 21, 1973) and Johnny Bench (15, Age 20, 1968)...Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

HOME RUN HAPPY: This season, the Mets have hit 103 home runs through their first 83 games, the seventh-most in franchise history during that span...Last season, the Mets had 81 home runs through their first 83 games...The Mets have homered three or more times in a game 13 times this season, surpassing their total from 2022.

HE SLAYS GIANTS: In 33 games against San Francisco, Jeff McNeil owns a career slashline of 350/.391/.525 (42-120)...Among active players, his .350 average ranks third (min. 100 at-bats) behind former Met and current Giant Wilmer Flores (.387) and Matt Carpenter (.363)...McNeil's .917 OPS vs. SF ranks seventh among the 91 players who have 100 or more career AB against the club...Pete Alonso has eight career home runs and 23 RBI in 26 appearances vs. the Giants.

ABSENCE OF PROOF: The New York Mets are teaming up with the national non-alcoholic pop-up Absence of Proof to bring a fun non-alcoholic experience to Citi Field...Fans ages 21 and up can enjoy a ballgame at Citi Field while sipping on refreshing craft mocktails and other non-alcoholic beverages during this special experience...The event, presented by Cadillac and Dunkin', continues its run in the Piazza Club on the Excelsior level for the entirety of this series against the San Francisco Giants.

PHAM-TASTIC: Tommy Pham has gone 9-14 (.643) over his last four contests with two home runs, three RBI and three runs scored...Over his last 27 games (since May 28), Pham is batting .362 (34-94) with 16 runs, nine doubles, six home runs, 24 RBI, nine walks, six steals and a 1.083 OPS...He ranks among MLB leaders in average (fourth), slugging percentage (.670, fifth) and OPS (third) in that span.

WHEN YOU'RE IN SCORING POSITION, YOU'RE PHAMILY: Tommy Pham leads the Mets with a .350 (14-40) average with runners in scoring position...Since May 18, has 12 hits in 24 at-bats with RISP...He leads the NL in average (.500), slugging percentage (1.000) and OPS (1.567) and is tied for the league lead in OBP (.567) with RISP over that timeframe.

BACK IN THE CITI: The Mets are 19-19 at home this year and have posted a 3.91 ERA...The Mets went 28-15 at home before the All-Star break last season.

GIANTS-METS NOTES: The Mets are seeking to take the season series from the Giants for the second consecutive year...The Mets have won the season series against the Giants in four of the last six seasons they've matched up against each other.

GIRL DAD POWER: Over the last 14 games, Francisco Lindor is batting .304 (14-46) with 11 runs, two doubles, five home runs, 11 RBI, seven walks, three steals with a .393 OBP and a .674 SLG...Over the last 24 games, Lindor has posted a .936 OPS, batting .263 (21-80) with 16 runs, four doubles, seven home runs, 15 RBI, 13 walks, five steals with a .361 OBP and a .575 SLG...He has posted a 2.5 fWAR this year, which ranks 15th in the National League...His 36 extra-base hits are tied for the 11th most in the National League.

FIRST IS THE BEST: The Mets are 24-11 (.686) when scoring first this season...The Mets are 13-35 (.271) when their opponent scores first.

FIRST IS THE WORST: The Mets have been outscored 59-23 in the first inning this year...New York has posted a 5.86 ERA (54 ER/83.0 IP) in the first inning this season...That is the sixth-highest first inning ERA in the majors...Last year, the Mets posted a 4.39 ERA (79 ER/162.0 IP) in the first frame.

INVADER NIM: Brandon Nimmo has recorded six home runs over his last 14 games, posting a .947 OPS in that span...Nimmo is batting .317 (32-102) with 10 extra-base hits against left-handed pitchers this year...His .317 average is the seventh-highest mark by a lefty against southpaws this season...It is fourth in the National League behind Miamis Luis Arraez (.375), Chicago's Cody Bellinger (.323) and Philadelphia's Bryson Stott (.321).

FINALLY CAUGHT ME: Starling Marte was caught stealing on Friday, ending a franchise-record run of 35 consecutive stolen bases without being caught...The last time a Mets player was thrown out attempting a stolen base before last night was on May 10 (Francisco Lindor at second)...The Mets are first in the major leagues with a 89.7% stolen base success rate this season...Starling Marte has swiped 21 bags this year, tied for sixth in the majors and third in the National League...His 335 career stolen bases rank second among active players...Elvis Andrus is the active leader with 341 steals.

DR. ROBERTSON: David Robertson has posted a 2-2 record with 11 saves, and a 2.00 ERA (8 ER/36.0 IP) in 32 appearances this season...He has walked 10, while striking out 42...He is tied for 12th in ERA among relievers...He is tied for 21st in the NL with 42 punchouts...He is holding left-handed hitters to a .191 (13-68) average this year.

WHAT A PERFORMANCE!: Congrats to Head Performance Coach Dustin Clarke who will manage the NL's strength and conditioning at the 2023 All-Star Game in Seattle, WA...Clark is in his ninth season as the head performance coach and his 13th season in the organization.

THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT: RHP Mike Vasil was named to the National League 2023 SiriusXM Futures Game roster...The 23-year-old has made 12 starts between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse where he has combined to go 1-3 with a 4.37 ERA (28 ER/57.2 IP) with 13 walks and 66 strikeouts...He was selected by the Mets in the eighth round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Virginia.

PETERSON NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 6.0 innings and allowed no runs on five hits with three walks and five strikeouts for the Mets in their 7-2 win at Citi Field against Milwaukee on 6/27.

DAVID VS. GOLIATH: Tonight, Peterson will face the Giants for the third time of his career and the first time this season...He has made two starts in his career against San Francisco...He's posted a 7.36 ERA (9 ER/11.2 IP) in those starts.

A MINUTE IN THE MINORS: Peterson was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse on April 29, was recalled on May 9, then optioned again on May 16...In his first start with Syracuse following his May 16 option, he dealt 8.0 shutout innings, allowed just two hits and struck out nine...For his effort, he as named International League Pitcher of the Week...All told, he has made seven starts for the Syracuse Mets this season...Has a 1-2 record with a 4.86 ERA (20 ER/37.0 IP).

LETHAL LEFTY: Peterson has limited lefties to a .237 (54-228) average in his career...He whiffed 32 of the 96 left-handed batters he faced last year, a 33 percent strikeout rate that ranked fourth among all left-handed pitchers to face a minimum of 90 LHB in 2022.

SLIP 'N' SLIDE: Peterson held batters to a .175 (24-137) average with his slider last season and 78 of his 126 strikeouts came on the pitch...His 52.0 slider-strikeout percentage was the second-highest in MLB (min. 150 PA) behind only teammate Edwin Díaz (54.7) and his 47.9 whiff percentage with the pitch was the third-highest in the majors behind only Díaz (54.7) and Seattle's Andres Muñoz (50.8).

FOUR-HIT WONDER: Peterson has allowed five or more hits in all nine of his major league starts this season, the longest streak of his career...Before this stretch, he had only allowed more than four hits in consecutive starts four times in his career...The southpaw allowed four hits or fewer in 12 of his 19 starts and 21 of his 28 appearances overall last season...He held the opposition to four hits or fewer in 39 of his 53 career games entering 2023.

STRIKE 'EM OUT, STRIKE 'EM OUT: Peterson struck out at least five batters in 11 straight starts from June 20-September 9 last season, the second-longest streak by a left-handed starter last season...It was the sixth-longest streak by a Mets left-handed starter in franchise history...Peterson had 82 strikeouts across 58.2 innings during that span (13 G/11 GS) good for a 12.58 K/9 ratio.

2022 RECAP: Set career-high marks in wins (seven), games (28), starts (19), innings (105.2), and strikeouts (126) last season...Went 7-5 with a 3.83 ERA for New York...Appeared mostly as a starter until mid-September...His final five appearances of the season came out of the bullpen...Went 6-5 with a 3.86 ERA (39 ER/91.0 IP) as a starter...In nine relief appearances, Peterson went 1-0 with a 3.68 ERA (6 ER/14.2 IP).

- His walk-off home run on May 17 was his fourth career extra-inning long ball...He is a .417 (10-24) hitter in extra innings with a 1.442 OPS in his career.
- Ranks fifth on the Mets all-time home run list with 170 homers...Howard Johnson (192) is next.
- Ranks 12th in franchise history with 435 career RBI...Up next: Kevin McReynolds (456) and Keith Hernandez (468).
