METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets returned to action last night and defeated the Reds, 5-4...The Mets have won three of their last four and nine of their last 16... They are in a stretch of 10 straight games (1-0) and in 16 games in 17 days (1-0)... The Mets are in the midst of their penultimate road trip of the season, a 10-game trip (3-1) against Detroit (2-1), Cincinnati (1-0) and Philadelphia (four games).

WE WILL MISS YOU: The Mets are saddened to learn of the passing of David "Davey" Johnson...John, the manager of the Mets from 1984-1990 was a bold leader who transformed the Mets into winners after seven straight losing seasons...In 1986, his club won 108 regular season games en route to the World Series Championship...He finished his Mets career with the best managerial record in franchise history (595-417)...From 1984-1990, the Mets averaged more than 95 victories and captured a second division crown in 1988 with 100 wins...He was inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame in 2010.

STEAL THIS BASE: The Mets have stolen at least one base in seven straight games, recording 16 steals in that span...It's their longest streak since they record a seven-game stretch from April 9-16, 2023...The last time they had a londer streak was when they tied a franchise record with a steal in 11 straight games from April 23-May 10, 2009...Overall, the Mets have stolen 127 bases this season, which ranks fifth in the majors and third in the National League...The team's 89.4 stolen base percentage is the best in The Show and the highest in franchise history...The team's 127 steals is their most since they stole 130 in 2011.

HIS NAME IS JONAH: Jonah Tong is set to make his second career start tonight in Cincinnati...In his first start on August 29 vs. Miami, he allowed four runs, one earned over 5.0 innings in his Major League and joined Jim McAndrew, Tyler Yates, Nino Espinosa and Jon Matlack as the only pitchers in franchise history to throw 5.0 or more innings and issue zero walks in their Major League debut...Tong's six strikeouts were the most among the group...He became the fifth-youngest Mets starter to earn the win in their Major League debut and the youngest since Julio Valera who earned the win in his Major League debut on September 1, 1990 at 21 years and 323 days...He also joined Dwight Gooden as the only Mets pitchers age 22 or younger to throw at least 5.0 innings and allow one or zero earned runs in the Major League debut...Lastly, he became the eighth Canadian-born to pitch in a game for the Mets and the third this season (also: Jared Young and Zach Pop)...Became the third Canadian-born Met ever to start for the Mets (also: Ken MacKenzie and Ray Daviault in 1962).

RETURN OF THE MARK: Mark Vientos has safely reached base in 17 of his last 18 games since August 17...He is batting .324 (22-68) in that span with 16 runs, five doubles, nine homers, 24 RBI, six walks, a .397 OBP and a .794 SLG...In 35 games following the All-Star break, Vientos is batting .285/.331/.585 with 19 runs, nine doubles, 10 home runs, 32 RBI and seven walks...He hit .223/.280/.361 with six homers and 24 RBI in 66 games prior to the break.

GIVE ME A BREAK: In 44 games following the All-Star break, the Mets are batting .268/.346/.465...They rank third in the majors in average and OBP and are fourth SLG...Their 70 home runs following the break are the fifth-most...The Mets have scored 253 runs in the second-half, the third most in the majors behind the Blue Jays (271) and Brewers (265)...Their 5.57 runs/game is also third in the majors.

IT'S BEEN TWO WEEKS: Juan Soto has safely reached base in 14 straight games...He is batting .388 (19-49) in that span with one double, one triple, six homers, 20 RBI, 18 walks, eight steals, a .559 OBP and an .816 SLG...He has safely reached base in 31 of his last 32 games, batting .302/.457/.638 in that span with one double, one triple, 12 homers, 30 RBI, 32 walks, 13 steals and a 1.095 OPS

FIRST TIME SO GOOD: Allowed four runs, one earned over 5.0 innings and earned the win in his Major League debut on August 29 against Miami...Joined Jim McAndrew, Tyler Yates, Nino Espinosa and Jon Matlack as the only pitchers in franchise history to throw 5.0 or more innings and issue zero walks in their Major League debut...Tong's six strikeouts were the most among the group...Tong became the fifth-youngest Mets starter to earn the win in their Major League debut and the youngest since Julio Valera who earned the win in his Major League debut on September 1, 1990 at 21 years and 323 days...Joins Dwight Gooden as the only Mets pitchers age 22 or younger to throw at least 5.0 innings and allow one or zero earned runs in the Major League debut.

GOT THE CALL: Tong was ranked the number 44 prospect in baseball and the number four prospect in the Mets system when he was called up according to MLBPipeline.com...He became become the seventh player (sixth pitcher) to make his MLB debut with the Mets this season, joining Hayden Senger, Alex Carrillo, Justin Hagenman, Jonathan Pintaro, Blade Tidwell, and Nolan McLean...He is also the 44th pitcher the Mets have used this season which is a franchise record...The previous high was 42 in 2021....They are only trialing the 2024 Miami Marlins by one (45) for the most pitchers used by a team in a single season.

YOUNG MAN'S GAME: At 22 years old and 71 days he became the youngest pitcher to start for the Mets since Jenrry Mejia (20 years old and 339 days) on September 15, 2010 and the youngest Mets starting pitcher to make their Major League debut since Jon Niese (21 years old and 311 days) made his debut on September 2, 2008...He is one of 12 pitchers in franchise history to make his Major League debut as a starter at age 22 and 71 days or younger...Was the third-youngest starter at the time of their debut in the Majors this season and will only be older than Chase Petty and Didier Fuentes were.

THE GREAT TONG: In 22 starts between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse, he has posted a 1.43 ERA (18 ER/113.2 IP) and has recorded a Minor League-leading 179 strikeouts...His 1.43 ERA is the best among qualified full-season minor leaguers...He ranks first in batting average against (.148, 58-392) and third in WHIP (0.92) among qualified full-season minor leaguers...He has given up one or zero earned runs in 12 of his last 13 starts dating back to June 4 and he has a 0.90 ERA (7 ER/69.2 IP) with a 13.82 K/9 over that span.

TONG 'EH': He was born in Markham, ON and he is the 12th player born in Canada to play a game for the Mets...He is the eighth Canadian to pitch for the team in franchise history and the third this season (Jared Young 6/15 and Zach Pop 7/6)...He became the third Canadian to start a game for the Mets and the first since 1962 (also: Ray Daviault, 1962 and Ken MacKenzie, 1962)...He became the 22nd player born in Canada to play in the majors this season...He is the youngest Canadian-born player to make their Major League debut since Josh Naylor debuted at 21 years old and 336 days on May 24, 2019.

SWING AND A LOT OF MISS: Tong is the Minor League strikeout leader and through his two starts in Triple-A he has generated a 21.9% whiff rate...His whiff rate is tied for the eighth-most among Triple-A pitchers who have thrown at least 100 pitches...23 of his 39 swing and misses were generated by his fastball...This season he has a K/9 of 14.17 and for his career it sits at 13.70...His arnsenal contains a four-seam fastball, a changeup, a slider, a curveball, and a cutter.

CAREER NOTES: Tong was selected in the seventh round of the 2022 MLB Amateur Draft out of Georgia Premier Academy in Statesboro, GA...Across three minor league seasons he has posted a 2.54 ERA (70 ER/247.2 IP) over 57 appearances (53 starts) and recorded 377 strikeouts...While with Double-A Binghamton this season he was named EAS Pitcher of the Week twice (week of 5/11 and the week of 5/17) and EAS Pitcher of the Month twice (May and June).

- Recorded his 26th save of the season on September 5 at Cincinnati (1.0 IP, H, 2 K, 2 BB)...He threw 30 pitches which is tied for his second-most in an outing this season.
- Earned his 250th career save after recording the final four outs on September 1 vs. Detroit (1.1 IP, 2 K)...He is the 39th pitcher in Major League history to reach the milestone and he is only one of four active relievers who have reached the milestone (also: Kenley Jansen, Craig Kimbrel, Aroldis Chapman).
- Allowed multiple earned runs in an outing for just the third time this season on August 30 vs. Miami (1.0 IP, 3 H, 2 ER, 3 K, BB)...Was the first time he's allowed multiple runs in an outing since April 11 at the Athletics...He has recorded multiple strikeouts in six of his last
- Earned his career-high-tying sixth win of the season after getting the final five outs against Philadelphia on August 26 (1.2 IP, 4 K)...Struck out a season high four of the five batters he faced...His four strikeouts were his most in a game since September 22, 2024 vs. Philadelphia.
- Earned his 24th save of the season after tossing 2.0 innings on August 16 vs. Seattle (2 H, ER, 2 K, HR)...It was his fourth career sixout save and second of the season (also: July 12 at KC)... Has allowed two home runs over his last five outings after going 34 consecutive games without allowing a home run (from 4/23-8/4)...The homer marked the first home run he had given up to a right hander in 160 at-bats.
- Had 19 consecutive appearances without allowing an earned run from 6/6-8/4, which was tied for the tenth-longest single-season streak in Mets history and his longest such streak since his 21-game span from 6/22-8/17/22.
- Has allowed just five earned runs over his last 42 games, posting a 1.02 ERA (5 ER/44.1 IP) with 14 walks and 68 strikeouts since
- April 23...During that span, his 1.02 ERA is the third-best in the majors and his .162 opponents' BA is the fifth best (min. 30.0 IP). Among qualified relievers this season, is fourth in K/9.0 IP (13.83, first in NL), fifth in ERA (1.83, second in NL), tied for eighth in saves (26, tied for third in NL), and tied for 11th in opponents' BA (.171, fourth in NL)...Among qualified NL relievers is seventh in opponents' OPS (.535), sixth in opponents' SLG (.262), and tied for sixth in wins (6)...Among pitchers who have thrown at least 40.0 innings this season, his 41.1 swing and miss percentage is the best in the National Leagues and fourth-best in the majors.
- Over 52 games this season, has gone 6-2 with 26 saves, a 1.83 ERA (11 ER/54.0 IP), 20 walks and 83 strikeouts...The Mets are 40-12 in games that Díaz has pitched in...Hitters have posted a .171 (32-187) average against Díaz this season...He has recorded six saves this season of four outs or more, which are the most such games in the majors this season...His six saves this season with three-plus strikeouts are tied with Mason Miller and Jeff Hoffman for the most such games in the majors...He has 57 career saves with three or more strikeouts are the most since his debut in 2016...Josh Hader is second with 44.
- On August 4, was named as the NL Reliever of the Month for July after going 2-0 with seven saves and a 0.00 ERA (11.0 IP) over 10 appearances...His 10 Reliever of the Month Awards (five as a Met) are the most by any player since the honor was established in 2005...Was also named the NL Reliever of the Month for May...He is the only pitcher to win a monthly award multiple times this year.
- Among relievers in franchise history, he ranks second in strikeouts (523), third in saves (142), eighth in appearances (323) and tied for seventh in wins (24).
- Became the 11th pitcher in Major League history to record at least 20 saves in at least seven of their first nine seasons (since saves became an official stat in 1969), joining Craig Kimbrel, Jonathan Papelbon, Troy Percival, Trevor Hoffman, Bruce Sutter, Aroldis Chapman, Kenley Jansen, Huston Street, Mariano Rivera and Robb Nen.

Was named to the 2025 National League All-Star team after going 3-0, 15-for-16 in save opportunities with a 2.22 ERA (7 ER/28.1 IP) in 28 first half appearances...It marks the third time in his career he's gone to the Midsummer classic and the second time as a member of the Mets (also 2022)...Named the Trevor Hoffman NL Reliever of the Year in 2022...Finished ninth in the NL Cy Young Award balloting.
