Aug. 3, 1959: In the second All-Star game of the 1959 season, Yogi Berra connects for his first and only All-Star Game home run, helping lead the AL to a 5-3 win at Los Angeles' Memorial Coliseum.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

Aug. 4, 2010: Alex Rodriguez becomes the seventh (and youngest) player in MLB history to hit 600 home runs, accomplishing the feat at 35 years, 8 days old in a 5-1 win vs. Toronto off Shaun Marcum.

Aug. 4, 2007: Alex Rodriguez hits his 500th career home run off Kansas City's Kyle Davies in a 16-8 Yankees victory. At 32 years, 8 days old, Rodriguez becomes the youngest player ever to reach the 500HR plateau.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees finish their seven-game homestand today with the final game of a three-game set vs. Seattle (1-1 thus far)...went 3-1 in their four-game set vs. Kansas City...after an off-day on Thursday, the Yankees will embark on a nine-game road trip to St. Louis (8/5-7), Seattle (8/8-10) and Boston (8/12-14).

- Are 70-35 (.667) to start the season, the best record in the American League and second-best record in the Majors (Los Angeles-NL: 70-33, .680)...their 70 wins are tied with the Dodgers for the most in the Majors...marks just the second time in the last 65 seasons (since 1958) the Yankees have won at least 70 of their first 105 decisions (went 77-28 in 1998).
- Their 29 comeback wins are the most in the AL and the second-most in the Majors (Los Angeles-NL-30).
- Their +210 run differential is the best in the Majors (next: Los Angeles-NL +205).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees fell to the Mariners, 8-6, on Tuesday vs. Seattle at Yankee Stadium...**RHP Jameson Taillon** (4.2IP, 2H, 6R/5ER, 4BB, 6K, 2HR) started and did not record a decision...his 6R allowed tied his season high...**C Jose Trevino** (2-for-4, 1R, 1 double, 1HR, 2RBI) homered in his second straight game, hitting a two-run HR in the fourth inning...**1B Anthony Rizzo** (1-for-3, 2R, 1HR, 1RBI, 2BB) homered in his career-high-tying fourth straight game, hitting a solo HR in the sixth inning...**3B Josh Donaldson** (2-for-3, 2R, 1 double, 1HR, 3RBI, 1BB) hit an RBI double in the fourth inning and a game-tying two-run HR in the sixth inning...**DH Aaron Judge** (0-for-2, 3BB) recorded a season-high 3BB...**RF Matt Carpenter** (1-for-3, 1R, 1BB) reached base twice...**2B DJ LeMahieu** (2-for-5, 1 double) and **SS Isiah Kiner-Falefa** (2-for-4) each picked up multi-hit games...**RHP Scott Effross** (0.2IP, 1H) and **RHP Lou Trivino** (0.2IP, 1K) both made their Yankees debuts...**LHP Lucas Luetge** (1.2IP, 3H, 1ER, 1HR) took his fourth loss of the year after allowing a go-ahead HR to Sam Haggerty in the seventh.

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters lead the Majors with 184HR this season...their 184HR are 24HR more than second-place Atlanta (160) and 38HR more than third-place Houston (146).

- **Their 184HR are their most HR through 105 games of a season in franchise history and the second-most by any Major League team through their first 105 games of a season**, trailing only the 2019 Minnesota Twins (205HR).
- **Have homered in a season-high 18 straight games (since 7/13)**, their longest streak since their 19-game streak from 9/8-28/21...**their 18-game home run streak is their fourth-longest streak in franchise history**...trails only a Major League-record 31-game streak from 5/26-6/30/19, a 25-game streak from 6/1-29/41 and a 19-game streak from 9/8-28/21...have hit 38HR over their home run streak.
- Have hit at least 3HR in a Major League-leading 28 games this season.
- Lead the Majors in runs (564), runs per game (5.37), SLG (.449) and walks (418), rank second in OBP (.332) and OPS (.780).

SEEING DOUBLE: C Jose Trevino and INF Josh Donaldson both hit their 10th home run of the season on Tuesday vs. Seattle...the Yankees have had a Major League-leading nine different players reach double-digit home runs this year.

SEA-ING CLEARLY: The Yankees have won their last nine completed series vs. the Mariners (since 8/22/16) and 12 of their last 13 completed series since 6/10/14.

- Overall, are 24-7 in the last 31 matchups vs. the Mariners (since 8/23/16).
- **OF Aaron Judge** has 6HR in his last 13G vs. the Mariners.

HOME SWEET HOME: The Yankees are 41-14 (.745) in 55 games at home this season, the best home record in the Majors...**have clinched their 31st straight winning season at home (since 1992)...according to Elias, is the Majors' longest current streak and the longest streak by any team since a Major League-record 47-year streak for the Yankees from 1918-64**.

- Are 26-7 in their last 33 home games...are 38-11 in their last 49 home games.

CLOSE CALLS: The Yankees have had 31 of their 35 losses decided by 3R-or-fewer...24 of their 35 losses have been by 2R-or-fewer.

OH MY JOSH: INF Josh Donaldson hit an RBI double in the fourth inning and a game-tying two-run HR in the sixth inning on Tuesday vs. Seattle...five of his 10HR this season have either tied the game (one) or given the Yankees the lead (four).

MILESTONE MAN: **Manager Aaron Boone has 398 managerial wins and needs two wins to reach 400... would be just the ninth Manager in Yankees history to accomplish the feat**, joining Joe McCarthy (1,460-867), Joe Torre (1,173-767), Casey Stengel (1,149-696), Miller Huggins (1,067-719), Ralph Houk (944-806), Joe Girardi (910-710), Billy Martin (556-385) and Clark Griffith (419-370).

- Under his helm since 2018, the Yankees have posted the third-best record (398-253, .611) in the Majors during that span, trailing only the Los Angeles Dodgers (417-233, .642) and Houston Astros (401-250, .616).
- Boone has recorded 398 wins in 651 decisions...is seeking to become the fourth-fastest Yankees Manager to reach the milestone...according to *Elias*, Casey Stengel reached the mark in 644 decisions, Joe McCarthy did so in 635 decisions, Joe Torre accomplished the feat in 647 decisions and Ralph Houk reached the mark in 674 decisions.

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge recorded a season-high 3BB on Tuesday vs. Seattle...has 7BB in his last four games and 10BB in his last nine games...**has reached base multiple times in 14 of his last 15 games and 15 of his last 17 games**.

- **Is just the second Yankee (third time) and the fourth Major League player (fifth time) to hit at least 43 home runs through his club's first 105 games of a season**... joins Barry Bonds (45HR in 2001 with SFG), Mark McGwire (45HR in 1998 with STL) and Babe Ruth (44HR in 1921 with NYY and 43HR in 1928 with NYY).
- **Has 5HR in his last six games, 7HR in his last nine games, 10HR in his last 12 games, 12HR in his last 15 games and 13HR in his last 17 games**.
- Has homered against 17-of-18 opponents faced this season...the only team he has faced and hasn't homered against is Texas (0HR in 3G).
- In his last 15 games (since 7/16), is batting .444/.565/1.167 (24-for-54) with 20R, 3 doubles, 12HR, 27RBI, 13BB, 2HP and 2SB.
- Has 11RBI in his last six games, 23RBI in his last 12 games and 27RBI in his last 15 games.
- Is hitting .354/.471/.747 (28-for-79) with 4 doubles, 9HR, 49RBI, 20BB, 1HP and 4SF with RISP...marks the second-highest OPS (1.218, first in AL), fifth-highest SLG (third in AL), fifth-highest OBP (second in AL) and ninth-highest BA (fifth in AL) with RISP in the Majors.
- His 43HR lead the Majors...no other player has more than 33HR...also leads the Majors in RBI (93), runs scored (89), and SLG (.676), ranks second in OPS (1.062, second in AL), and XBH (60, first in AL) and tied for third in multi-hit games (35, first in AL) and walks (56, tied for first in AL).

NOBODY BEATS THE RIZZ: INF Anthony Rizzo hit his 27th home run of the season with a solo HR in the sixth inning on Tuesday vs. Seattle...**has homered in a career-high-tying four straight games** (also 4G from 7/29-8/1/15)...marks the longest HR streak by a Yankee this season and the longest since Giancarlo Stanton's four-game stretch from 9/24-28/21...the last Yankee to homer in five straight games was Luke Voit (5G from 8/17-26/20).

- **Has 5HR in his last seven games**.
- **His 27HR lead Major League first baseman this season** (min. 80% of games at 1B).
- His 27HR are tied for the fifth-most in the Majors and are the third-most in the AL.

LEMACHINE: INF DJ LeMahieu has reached base multiple times in 19 of his last 22 starts (since 7/5), batting .368/.474/.495 (35-for-95) with 22R, 3 doubles, 3HR, 10RBI, 18BB, 1HP and 2SB in those starts...over that span, ranks second in the Majors in OBP (first in AL), third in BA (first in AL) and walks (second in AL).

- Has reached base multiple times in 51-of-95 games this year...has reached base at least three times in 25 games this season, tied with Xander Bogaerts and Paul Goldschmidt for the third-most in the Majors, trailing only Freddie Freeman (29) and Juan Soto (26).
- His 56BB this year are tied for the most in the AL and tied for the third-most in the Majors...also ranks fourth in the AL and seventh in the Majors in OBP this season (.394).

HIP HIP JOSE: C Jose Trevino hit a two-run HR in the fourth inning on Tuesday vs. Seattle...**has homered in back-to-back games for the first time in his career...has 3HR in his last two games**.

- Has a career-high 10HR in 75 games (217PA) this season after hitting 9HR in 156 games (519PA) over his first four seasons.
- His 10HR this season are tied for the fifth-most by a player as a catcher this season.
- Has multiple hits in each of his last two games.
- Is hitting .327/.351/.582 (18-for-55) with 8R, 5 doubles, 3HR, 8RBI, 2BB and 1SB in his last 14 starts (since 7/7).

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP GERRIT COLE (9-3, 3.30 ERA)

RHP Gerrit Cole will make his 22nd start of the season in today's series finale vs. Seattle...the 31-year-old will pitch on regular four days' rest...last pitched on Friday vs. Kansas City and did not record a decision in the Yankees' 11-5 win (6.0IP, 7H, 5ER, 0BB, 9K, 1HR)...is 9-3 with a 3.00 ERA (114.0IP, 38ER) and 150K in his last 18 starts...**has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 12 of his last 18 starts and one-or-zero runs in nine of those starts...needs one strikeout to reach 500 strikeouts as a Yankee**...ranks second in the Majors in strikeouts (162) and third in K/9.0IP (11.63)...in 63 starts with the Yankees, is 32-14 with a 3.18 ERA (379.2IP, 134ER) and 499K...in his second year with the Yankees in 2021, finished second in American League Cy Young Award voting after going 16-8 with two complete games and a 3.23 ERA (181.1IP, 151H, 69R/65ER, 41BB, 243K, 24HR) in 30 starts...his 243K in 2021 were the second-most by a Yankee in a single season in club history, trailing only Ron Guidry's 248K in 35GS in 1978...the five-time All-Star (2015, '18-19, '21-22) has finished in the top-five of Cy Young Award voting five times (second in 2021, fourth in 2020, second in 2019, fifth in 2018, fourth in 2015)...his career 10.49 K/9.0IP ratio (1,835K/1,574.2IP) is the eighth-highest in Major League history (min. 1,000.0IP)...since 2018, leads the Majors in wins (67), strikeouts (1,101) and K/9.0IP (12.51), ranks second in innings pitched (792.1IP), third in winning percentage (.736, 67-24, min. 50 decisions), opponents' BA (.202) and WAR among pitchers (22.7- FanGraphs), fourth in WHIP (0.99) and ERA (2.92)...was originally selected by the Yankees in the first round (28th overall) of the 2008 MLB First-Year Player Draft but did not sign and went on to play at UCLA for three seasons (2009-11)...UCLA announced in July that Cole will be inducted into the UCLA Athletic Hall of Fame this fall...was the first overall pick of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft, the 15th pitcher (and 11th right-hander) to be chosen first...is the fifth player selected first overall to play for the Yankees, joining Alex Rodriguez, Darryl Strawberry, Tim Lincecum and Ron Blomberg...signed a nine-year contract extending through the 2028 season with a player opt-out following the 2024 season on 12/18/19.

LAST START: Did not record a decision in the Yankees' 11-5 win vs. Kansas City on Friday (6.0IP, 7H, 5ER, 0BB, 9K, 1HR) ...marked just the fifth time this season he allowed more than 3R...marked his 10th start with at least 9K...did not surrender a walk for the fifth time this season...allowed all 5R in the fifth inning on a two-run single to Whit Merrifield and a three-run HR to Salvador Perez.

ON A ROLL: Is 9-3 with a 3.00 ERA (114.0IP, 38ER) and 150K in his last 18 starts after posting a 6.35 ERA (11.1IP, 8ER) in his first three starts of the season...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 12 of his last 18 starts and one-or-zero runs in nine of those starts...has allowed 1R-or-fewer in six of his last 12 starts.

- Has gone 4-2 with a 2.93 ERA (58.1IP, 19ER) and 78K in his last nine starts (since 6/14)...has held opponents to a .200 BA (42-for-210) in that span.

2022: Is 9-3 with a 3.30 ERA (125.1IP, 46ER) and 162K in 21 starts this season...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 16 of his 21 starts...has allowed 2R-or-fewer in 13 of his last 19 starts and one-or-zero runs in nine of his last 18...is second in the Majors in strikeouts (162) and third in K/9.0IP (11.63).

- The Yankees have gone 15-6 in his 21 starts this season.
- Has received 3R-or-fewer of support in 14 of 21 starts.
- Has gone 9-3 with a 3.00 ERA (114.0IP, 38ER) in his last 18 starts.
- Has held left-handers to a .152/.218/300 slash line...owns the second-lowest opponents' BA vs. lefties in the Majors this season.
- Has tossed at least 7.0IP and allowed 2R-or-fewer in six starts this season.
- After recording the shortest start of his career on 4/19 at Detroit (1.2IP), has tossed at least 6.0IP in 17 of 18 starts since then.
- Has recorded at least 10K in two of his last four starts and in six of his last 16 starts...his six double-digit strikeout games this season are tied with Carlos Rodon for the third-most in the Majors, trailing only Shohei Ohtani (nine) and Corbin Burnes (eight)...has recorded at least 7K in 13 of his last 18 starts.
- Has tossed five scoreless starts this season (0R in 7.0IP on 7/12 vs. Cincinnati, 0R in 6.0IP on 6/14 vs. Tampa Bay, 0R in 7.0IP on 6/3 vs. Detroit, 0R in 6.0IP on 4/30 at Kansas City and 0R in 6.2IP on 4/24 vs. Cleveland).
- Has allowed 4H-or-fewer in 11 of his 21 starts this season, including seven of his last 12 starts.
- Tossed at least 6.0 no-hit innings to begin two of his June starts (6/3 vs. Detroit and 6/20 at Tampa Bay)...did not allow a hit to his first 24BF on 6/20 at Tampa Bay before allowing a lead-off single to Isaac Paredes in the eighth inning...tossed 6.2 perfect innings on 6/3 vs. Detroit before allowing a two-out single to Jonathan Schoop...with RHP Jameson Taillon tossing 7.0 perfect innings to open Game 2 on 6/2 and RHP Gerrit Cole tossing 6.2 perfect innings to open the game on 6/3, the Yankees were the first team in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to open back-to-back games with 6.0-plus perfect innings (credit - Elias).

VS. SEATTLE: Is 6-2 with one complete game, a 1.86 ERA (63.0IP, 13ER) and 81K in nine career starts vs. the Mariners...seven-of-nine starts have been quality starts...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in eight of nine starts.

- Has won four straight games vs. Seattle (since 4/14/19)...recorded at least 10K in each of those starts.
- His 11.57 K/9.0IP ratio (81K/63.0IP) against the Mariners is the fourth-highest K/9.0IP ratio by any pitcher vs. Seattle (min. 50.0IP), trailing only Frankie Montas (12.62), Chris Sale (12.29) and Pedro Martinez (11.97).
- Has tossed at least 7.0IP in six of nine career starts against Seattle.
- Has not faced the Mariners since 2019 when he went 4-0 with a 1.29 ERA (28.0IP, 4ER) and 50K in four starts vs. Seattle...struck out 15 batters on 9/8/19 at Minute Maid Park, 1K shy of matching his single-game career high (16K, 5/4/18 at Arizona)...last faced the Mariners on 9/24/19 at T-Mobile Park, recording 14K over 7.0 scoreless innings (2H).

IN PINSTRIPEs: In 63 starts with the Yankees, is 32-14 with a 3.18 ERA (379.2IP, 134ER) and 499K...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 50-of-63 starts...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 42 starts as a Yankee, the second-most such starts in the AL and the sixth-most in the Majors in that stretch.

- Has recorded 13 scoreless starts as a Yankee, tied for the most scoreless starts by any AL pitcher since 2020.
- His 18 double-digit strikeout games with the Yankees are the fourth-most by a pitcher in franchise history, trailing only Ron Guidry (23), David Cone (21) and CC Sabathia (20)...his seven games with at least 12K are the second-most in franchise history (Al Downing-10G).
- His 32 wins since 2020 are the most in the AL and the second-most in the Majors over that stretch (Julio Urias: 33-9)...his 499K in that span are the most in the Majors...his 11.83 K/9.0IP ratio is the second-best in the Majors and the best in the AL (min. 300.0IP), trailing only Corbin Burnes (12.31).
- Has finished in the top-five of Cy Young Award voting in each of his first two seasons in pinstripes (second in 2021, fourth in 2020).

STRIKEOUT MACHINE: Has notched at least 7K in 13 of his last 18 starts...his 162K are the most in the AL and the second-most in the Majors...his 11.63 K/9.0IP ratio (162K/125.1IP) is the third-highest in the Majors this season...has recorded six double-digit strikeout games this season: 12K on 7/17 vs. Boston, 11K on 7/12 vs. Cincinnati, 12K on 6/20 at Tampa Bay, 10K on 5/28 at Tampa Bay, 11K on 5/23 vs. Baltimore and 10K in Game 1 on 5/8 vs. Texas...only Shohei Ohtani (nine), Corbin Burnes (eight) and Carlos Rodon (six) have recorded as many this season...has recorded double-digit strikeouts in 39 games since the start of 2019, the most in the Majors over the span (next: Max Scherzer-26)...his 47 games with at least 10K since the beginning of 2018 are also the most in the Majors in that span (next: Max Scherzer-44)...has recorded at least 7K in 43-of-63 starts as a Yankee.

- His career 10.49 K/9.0IP ratio (1,835K/1,574.2IP) is the eighth-highest in Major League history (min. 1,000.0IP).

HOME SWEET HOME: Is 4-2 with a 2.55 ERA (70.2IP, 20ER) and 95K in 11 home starts this season...has allowed 1R-or-fewer in six of his 11 home starts...is 3-1 with a 1.80 ERA (40.0IP, 8ER) in his last six home starts.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: Was named to his fifth career All-Star team via the player ballot, his fourth as a member of the American League and second with the Yankees (also 2015 with Pittsburgh, 2018-19 with Houston and 2021 with the Yankees)...did not pitch in the AL's 3-2 win in Los Angeles.

EVERYTHING IS UNDER CONTROL: Has recorded at least 10K and 0BB in two starts this season: 7/17 vs. Boston (12K and 0BB) and 5/23 vs. Baltimore (11K and 0BB)...his eight such games as a Yankee (since 2020) are the most in franchise history...his 21 games with at least 10K and 0BB are tied with Clayton Kershaw for the second-most in the Majors since 2014 (Max Scherzer-24)...his 19 such games since the start of 2018 are the most in the Majors (next: Justin Verlander-12 and Max Scherzer-12)...his 21 such games are tied with Roger Clemens for the fifth-most in Major League history, trailing only Randy Johnson (36), Max Scherzer (28), Curt Schilling (27) and Clayton Kershaw (26).
