DRY HEAT

- The Colorado Rockies continue their six-game road trip today with the final game of a three-game set against the Arizona Diamondbacks at Chase Field ... travel to St. Louis for three games against the Cardinals to conclude the trip.
- Today's game is the third in a stretch of 17-straight days with a game for the Rockies, their longest string of games without an off-day this season.
- The Rockies lost 6-5 last night in their sixth walk-off loss of the season ... are looking to avoid their 14th sweep of the season, which would be tied for the second-most in franchise history with the inaugural 1993 team (most: 15 sweeps, 2023).
- Colorado's 30-86 record is the worst in the Majors, 11 losses more than the Chicago White Sox (42-75) ... the Rockies need to win 12 of their final 47 games to avoid matching the 2024 White Sox's modern record of 121 losses.
- The Rockies' -322 run differential is the largest in the Majors, 171 runs greater than the next-worst differential (-151, Washington) ... their 114 games are the fewest to reach a -300 run differential since 1900, surpassing the 1911 Boston Rustlers (118 games).

DEBUTS

- INF Kyle Karros, the Rockies No. 8 prospect, became the 12th Rockie to make their debut when he started at third base on Friday ... the 12 debuts are tied for the most in franchise history with the 2024, 2016 and 2014 clubs.
- Karros is the 17th player age 24 or younger to debut for the Rockies in the past two seasons and the 11th age 23 or younger ... with an average age of 26.8, the Rockies are the third-youngest roster in the Majors behind Chicago-AL (26.2) and Miami (26.6).
- 12 of their 14 positional players and 21 of their 26 active roster players have less than four full years of service time.

CACTUS BLOOM

- Colorado has lost six in a row since August 3rd, their longest losing streak since losing eight in a row May 24-June 1, one of four eight game losing streaks by the club this season ... had been 8-6 in the second half prior to this stretch.
- The Rockies have gone 8-12 post All-Star break, going 6-6 at home and 2-6 on the road ... have won three series since the break, all at home, after winning just two series total prior to the All-Star break, both on the road (June 2-4 at Miami and June 16-19 at Washington).

FROM SALT RIVER FIELD TO THE BIGS

- INF Kyle Karros recorded an RBI single in his first plate appearance on Friday, the first Rockie to do since Corey Dickerson on June 22, 2013 ... first Rockie to record an RBI in their debut since Hunter Goodman did Aug. 27, 2023.
- Infielder Warming Bernabel was named the National League Player of the Week for July 28-Aug. 3, his first full week in the Majors ... slashed .462/.462/.923 (12-for-26) over six games with four doubles, one triple, two home runs and seven RBI ... first Rockie to win the award since Brenton Doyle on July 8, 2024 and the first Rockies rookie to win the honor since Nolan Jones on Oct. 2, 2023.
- Bernabel has hit safely in 11 of his first 13 games overall ... his 18 hits are the fourth-most in franchise history by a Rockies player in their first 13 Major League games, trailing David Dahl (20, 2016), Rafael Ynoa (19, 2014) and Juan Pierre (19, 2000) ... his eight extra-base hits are the second-most through 13 games in franchise history, trailing only Trevor Story (10, 2016).

MONSOON SEASON TROUBLES

- Rockies starters have allowed at least five earned runs in their last six starts and have not logged a winning decision in their last 14 starts with only one quality start in that span (since July 25).
- Rockies pitchers have posted a league-leading 8.21 ERA (174.1 IP, 159 ER) since the break, an 8.17 ERA (93.2 IP, 85 ER) by the starters and 8.26 ERA (80.2 IP, 74 ER) by the bullpen ... have allowed a league-leading 242 hits and 43 home runs in the second half.
- Over the past 14 games since July 25, the Rockies have a team ERA of 9.87 (120.1 IP, 132 ER) with 181 hits and 36 home runs allowed while going 4-10 as a team ... are the first team since the 1999 Chicago Cubs to allow that many hits and earned runs over a 14-game span and the first team in the Modern Era to allow that many earned runs, hits and home runs over any 14-game span.

RELIABLE LIKE A SONORAN HOT DOG

- Since May 30, INF/OF Tyler Freeman has reached base in 52 of 55 games, including 51 of 52 starts ... slashing .316/.399/.420 with 15 doubles, one triple, one home run, 18 RBI, 23 walks, 18 strikeouts and 11 stolen bases ... ranks sixth in the Majors in batting average and eighth in OBP through this span.

DESERT HEAT

- In 41 games since June 6, OF Mickey Moniak is slashing .329/.367/.686 (1.052 OPS) with 10 doubles, two triples, 12 home runs and 30 RBI ... over that span, ranks second in the Majors in slugging and OPS while is third in batting average (min. 150 PA).

OLD TOWN BUSY

- Catcher Hunter Goodman has homered in three of his last six and four of his last nine ... his team-leading 22 home runs rank 11th in the NL and are the second-most by a catcher in franchise history, trailing Wilin Rosario's 28 home runs in 2012.
- His 46 extra-base hits are tied for 11th in the NL and are one shy of tying Rosario's franchise record in 2012.
- Leads all qualified NL catchers in hits, home runs, triples, extra-base hits, total bases slugging percentage, and OPS (.848) and is tied for first in doubles.
- Slashing .291/.337/.634 with 15 home runs and 33 RBI in 45 games since June 1 ... ranks second in the Majors in slugging and sixth in OPS (.971) over that span (min. 170 PA).

SHINING SUN

- LHP Ben Shields, acquired by the Rockies in exchange for RHP Jake Bird allowed one run on two hits in five innings with one walk and six strikeouts in his second start with the Yard Goats ... allowed two runs in five innings in his first start.
- LHP Stu Flesland III tossed five scoreless innings with a career-best 10 strikeouts for High-A Spokane ... the Organizational Pitcher of the Month in July has not allowed an earned run over his last four starts since July 20 (21.0 IP), walking two with 21 strikeouts.

GORDON, TANNER GORDON

- The Champaign, Ill., native will be making his seventh Major League start of 2025 ... his fourth during his current stint on the active roster.
- Recalled from Triple-A Albuquerque on July 23, his third stint on the Rockies active roster including a run as the 27th man ... called up as the 27th man on May 8 and made his season debut as the starter in game two against Detroit ... recalled again on May 23 and made two starts before being placed on the injured list on June 3 with a strained left oblique ... reinstated and optioned to Triple-A on July 1.
- Acquired by Colorado from Atlanta, along with RHP Victor Vodnik, in exchange for RHP Pierce Johnson on July 24, 2023 ... originally selected in the sixth round of the 2019 First-Year Player Draft out of Indiana University (Bloomington).

THE YEAR IS 2025

- In his last start on Aug. 4 vs. Pittsburgh, allowed a career-high 11 hits and tied his career-high with seven earned runs (also: Sept. 11 at Detroit) ... has allowed seven runs in back-to-back starts with a 20.65 ERA (5.2 IP, 13 ER) ... posted a 3.13 ERA (23.0 IP, 8 ER) in his first four starts prior to this stretch.
- Earned his first Major League win in his start on May 23 vs. New York-AL at Coors Field ... pitched six innings and allowed two runs on five hits with two walks and five strikeouts ... allowed one home run to Aaron Judge.
- Has spun at least six frames in three of six starts this season, tied for the third-most six-inning outings on the club this season.

SNAKE BITE

- Has made one career start against the Diamondbacks on Aug. 14, 2024 at Chase Field ... was his shortest start of his career (0.2 IP), allowing four runs (three earned) on three hits with two walks and no strikeouts ... only start of his career where he threw fewer than an inning.
- Is 0-2 with a 5.68 ERA (12.2 IP, 8 ER) in his three career starts against NL West foes.

AAALBUQUERQUE

- Has made 12 starts for Triple-A Albuquerque this season, going 1-4 with a 5.25 ERA (58.1 IP, 34 ER) with 11 walks and 47 strikeouts ... has tossed at least five innings in nine of his 12 starts with the Isotopes.
- Struck out a season-high 10 batters in his last Triple-A start on July 10 at Round Rock, his most in a game since striking out 14 on April 16, 2022 while with the Rome Braves (High-A).

DOING THE SPLITS

- Has posted a 5.57 ERA (32.1 IP, 20 ER) with six walks and 24 strikeouts in his six career starts at Coors Field ... has received 14 total runs of support (3.90 RSA) while pitching at least six innings in four of his six home starts.
- Has made eight career starts on the road, going 0-7 with a 9.98 ERA (30.2 IP, 34ER) ... has received five total runs of support (1.47 RSA) in his road starts.

SPING FLING

- Made three appearances for the Rockies during Spring Training in 2025 ... did not allow a run over 6.2 innings, walking two and striking out five.

INTO THE DEEP END IN 2024

- Made his Major League debut on July 7, 2024 vs. Kansas City at Coors Field ... took the loss after allowing five earned runs through 6.1 innings.
- Struck out the first two batters he faced (Frazier, Witt Jr.), the first Rockies starter in franchise history to strike out the first two batters he faced in his Major League debut.
- Was the longest outing by a Rockies pitcher in their first Major League start since Peter Lambert on June 16, 2019 at Chicago-NL (7.0 IP) ... sixth Rockies pitcher to pitch 6.1 innings or more in their debut at Coors Field (last: Tyler Anderson, June 12, 2016 vs. San Diego).
- Became the first Rockies pitcher since Antonio Senzatela (April 6-22, 2017) to pitch six or more innings in three of their first four career starts.
- Made eight starts for the Rockies in his first Major League season, going 0-6 with an 8.65 ERA (34.1 IP, 33 ER).
- Had four stints on Colorado's active roster, including on July 27 as the Rockies' 27th man.
- Began the season on the IL with right elbow inflammation and missed the first seven weeks for the season.

2023 AND ME

- Spent time with both Double-A Mississippi and Triple-A Gwinnett in Atlanta's organization before being acquired by Colorado ... made 17 combined outings (16 starts), going 5-9 with a 5.86 ERA (86.0 IP, 56 ER), 25 walks and 76 strikeouts.
- Joined Double-A Hartford for four starts following the trade before a promotion to Triple-A Albuquerque, where he went 1-1 with a 4.31 ERA (31.1 IP, 15 ER) in six starts ... overall on the season, posted an 8-12 record in 27 games (26 starts) and a career-high 140 innings pitched.

WHO'S YOUR STARTER

- Started 16 games on the mound for the Indiana Hoosiers in his junior year (2018), posting a record of 6-6 with a 3.81 ERA (87.1 IP, 37 ER) and 90 strikeouts, the ninth-most strikeouts in a single season in Indiana history.
- Allowed three hits or fewer in seven of his 16 starts ... recorded a career-high 12 strikeouts on March 23, 2019 in a win vs. Iowa, allowing just three hits over 7.0 IP en route to earning Big Ten Player of the Week Honors.
- Was the 97th player in Indiana school history to get selected in the Draft ... was a member of a Hoosier draft class that included a school-record and Big Ten-leading 10 players.

HI, I'M TANNER

- Son of Bob and Jody Gordon ... has two brothers, Quinton and Tray.
- Played at Champaign Central High School (Ill.), where he was a two-year letter winner ... was a First Team All-State selection his senior year ... won conference titles as a sophomore, junior, and senior.
- Attended John A. Logan College in Carterville, Ill. for two years before moving on to Indiana ... posted a 6-0 record his freshman year, striking out 52 batters in 49.2 IP ... owned a 2.06 ERA as a sophomore, striking out 104 batters in 70.0 IP, only allowing 16 earned runs in his sophomore campaign.
