2ND HALF

Since the All-Star break the Redlegs are 8-10, lead the National League in **batting average** (.295) and **slugging percentage** (.497) while ranking second in **on-base percentage** (.355)...rank second in the NL and fourth in the majors in second-half **runs scored** (105, 6.000 r/g)...Reds pitchers rank 14th in the NL in second-half **ERA** (5.40; Col 15th, 6.87).

FIRST WATCH

In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in **runs scored** (85), **HR** (30), **RBI** (82), **batting average** (.305), **slugging percentage** (.580) and **on-base percentage** (.369)...have outscored opponents in the first frame, **85-53**, and are **25-8** when leading after the first inning...5 times this season scored at **least 4 runs** in the first...**3B Eugenio Suárez** is hitting **.341** in the first frame, leads the Major Leagues with **10 HR** that inning while ranking T2nd with **20 RBI**...in **2018**, Reds batters produced **22 HR** and **77 runs** in the first inning.

Eugenio Suárez leads the team with **28 HR**, tied for seventh-most in the Major Leagues, and joins National Baseball Hall of Famer **Tony Pérez** as the only Reds third basemen ever to produce at **least 25 home runs in 3 seasons or more**...Suárez hit **34 HR** last season and **26 HR** in 2017.

TODAY'S GAME: Is **Game 3** (1-1) of a 3-game series vs **Jim Trdinich's Pirates** and **Game 6** (3-2) of a 6-game homestand that included a **2-1 series win** vs the **Rockies**...beginning tomorrow night, the Redlegs will visit **Atl's SunTrust Park** (4g) before returning to **Great American Ball Park** for a 7-day, 6-game homestand vs the **Angels** (2g) and **Cubs** (4g).

SERIES NOTES: The Reds are **48-48** since the bench-clearing incident on **4/7 at PNC Park** that led to the ejections of **David Bell**, **Amir Garrett** and **Yasiel Puig**...from **4/4-4/7** the Pirates swept a **4-game series** from the Reds for the first time since **7/11-7/14, 1991** at **Riverfront Stadium** and did it in **Pittsburgh** for the first time since **8/22-8/24, 1969** at **Forbes Field**...from **3/31-4/5** the Reds were shut out by the Pirates in **3 consecutive games** (5-0, 2-0, 2-0) for the first time since **7/31-8/2, 1931** (5-0 & 1-0 losses at Pit, 3-0 loss at Cin)...last season the Reds lost 8 of their last 9 and 10 of their last 12 games vs the Pirates, including a **7-game losing streak** from **7/20-9/28**...was Cin's longest losing skid vs Pit since a **9-game losing streak** from **5/1-7/19, 1991**.

BRAVES UP NEXT: The Redlegs lead the season series, 2-1 (4/23-4/25 at GABP)...haven't lost a season series to the Braves since **2014** (2-5) and since then are **4-0-1** in **5 season series** and **17-13** in **30 games**...the Reds went **2-1** in both of their series in Atlanta at **SunTrust Park**, including a 5-3 win on **8/18/17** in their inaugural game at the new park...from **1997-2016** Cin went **27-42** at **Turner Field** and didn't win a series there after **9/4-9/6, 2009** (**0-3-4** in 7 series, **8-14** in 22 games)...in the final 2 exhibition games of 2019 spring training, the Braves earned 8-5 and 7-5 wins at **SunTrust Park**.

CATCH A BREAK: The Reds have used **5 catchers** this season, including **Tucker Barnhart**, **Curt Casali**, **Kyle Farmer**, **Juan Graterol** and **Ryan Lavarney**...the **3 catchers** on the club's **Opening Day roster** - **Barnhart** (IL), **Casali** (IL) & **Farmer** (concussion) - simultaneously were unable to play for **8 days** (7/18-7/25) until **Barnhart** came off the injured list prior to Fri night's game...**Barnhart** and **Farmer** have returned to the active roster...**Barnhart** on Fri filled the roster spot vacated by **Graterol**, who went on the **7-day concussion list**...**Farmer** was reinstated from the 7-day concussion list prior to Sun's game...he replaced **Lavarney**, who was designated for assignment...per @EliasSports, the Reds used **6 catchers** in a season just **7 times** in their history, most recently in **1992** (**Troy Afenir**, **Scott Bradley**, **Joe Oliver**, **Jeff Reed**, **Dan Wilson**, **Rick Wrona**)...also used **6 catchers** in **1963**, **1961**, **1937**, **1925** and **1895**...the **1909 Reds** used a club-record **8 catchers** (**Tommy Clarke**, **Tom Downey**, **Emil Haberer**, **Mike Konnick**, **Larry McLean**, **Si Pauxtis**, **Duck Pearce**, **Frank Roth**).

2-WAY PLAYER: **RHP Michael Lorenzen** has appeared in 65 of the Reds' 105 games so far this season, including 44 times solely as a **pitcher**, twice as a **pinch hitter/pitcher**, once as a **pitcher/LF/RF** (7/22 at Mil), once as a **pitcher/LF** (6/2 vs Wsh), 3 times as a **CF**, 3 times as a **LF**, 7 times solely as a **pinch runner**, once as a **pinch runner/CF** (3/28 vs Pit, CF), once as a **pinch runner/LF** (5/9 at Oak) and once as a **pinch runner/RF** (5/24 at Chi) and once as a **CF/P** (7/17 at Chi)...**9 times** in his career, including twice this season (4/9 vs Mia, 4/15 at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch...5 times in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including twice as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...**Lorenzen** this year became the **first player in Reds history**, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in **each of the first 6 games of a season** (PR/CF, P, PR, P, PR, P).

PITCHER OF THE MONTH: **RHP Luis Castillo** was the National League's **Pitcher of the Month for March/April**...in 7 starts he went **3-1**, **1.45** while ranking second in the National League and third in the Major Leagues in **ERA**, second in the NL and sixth in the majors in **strikeouts** (50) and third in the NL and T6th in the majors in **innings pitched** (43.1)...is the first Reds player to win a monthly award since **2B Scooter Gennett** won it in **May** of last year, the first Reds pitcher to win it since **LHP Denny Neagle** in **September 1999** and the first Reds righthanded starter recognized since **Jose Rijo** in **September 1992**.

Today's Pitcher - #58 Luis Castillo, RHP

RED HOTS

Luis Castillo in his third **Major League** season at just **26 years old**, is a **2019 National League All-Star**...per *Baseball America*, his **changeup** was voted by managers, scouts and executives the **best in the National League**...in his career he has allowed **13 HR** in the **first inning**, his highest total in any inning and including **3 HR** in the **first frame** this year...in the third inning on **7/15** at **Wrigley Field** allowed a 2-out, solo HR to **Kyle Schwarber** than snapped his **career-high 14.2-inning scoreless streak**...produced 8 starts in which he threw at least 5.0 innings while allowing 2 hits or fewer and 2 runs or fewer, a single-season franchise record...selected by his peers, he joined **RHP Sonny Gray** as the first pair of **Reds starting pitchers** named to the **All-Star team** since **Johnny Cueto** and **Alfredo Simon** in **2014**...threw a perfect fourth inning in the National League's 4-3 loss at Cle's **Progressive Field** (struck out **Carlos Santana**, struck out **J.D. Martinez**, **Alex Bregman** 4-3)...**Gray** did not pitch...was the National League's **Pitcher of the Month** for **March/April** (7gs, 3-1, 1.45)...through his first 7 starts of this season led the Major Leagues in ERA (1.45)...made his first career **Opening Day start**, but in the 5-3 win vs Pit was the victim of a blown save...became the fifth straight different **Opening Day** starter for the Reds (**Johnny Cueto** 2012-2015, **Raisel Iglesias** 2016, **Scott Feldman** in 2017, **Homer Bailey** in 2018)...is the longest stretch of different **Opening Day starting pitchers** since a **6-year stretch** from **2001-2006** (**Pete Harnisch** 2000-2001, **Joey Hamilton** 2002, **Jimmy Haynes** 2003, **Cory Lidle** 2004, **Paul Wilson** 2005, **Aaron Harang** 2006)...since his **Major League debut** in 2017, leads the Reds' pitching staff in almost every statistical category, including **wins, starts, innings pitched** and **strikeouts**.

- Made 37 starts at 2B (last, 7/22 at Mil), second-most on the team (Derek Dietrich, 40gs)...made 14 starts at SS (last, Sat vs Col), also second-most on the team (José Iglesias, 91gs).
- Made 10 starts in the outfield, including 8 starts in LF (last, 6/14 vs Tex) and 2 starts in CF (6/9 at Phi, 6/22 at Mil).
- After Eugenio Suárez was ejected by HP umpire Carlos Torres between the first and second innings on 7/19 vs StL, made his first Major League appearance at 3B...made his second appearance at that position on 7/23 at Mil.
- Because of Scooter Gennett injury, spent most of this season playing primarily 2B and occasionally CF or LF, while José Iglesias has been the starting SS.

15 NICK SENZEL, cf 2nd Half: 14g, 11gs, 16-46 (.348), 3 2b, 2 3b, 2rbi, 1sb

- Last name is pronounced sen-ZELL.
- Hit safely in 9 of his 14 second-half apps.
- Is the only player in franchise history, and 1 of only 21 players in Major League history, to produce 3 HR in his first 4 Major League apps.
- Went hitless on 6/2 vs Wsh, snapping a 9-game hitting streak (14-41, .341, 5 2b, 1hr, 5rbi, .378obp) and a 20-game on-base streak (26-86, .302, 6 2b, 2 3b, 1hr, 8rbi, 4sb, .358obp)...is the longest hitting streak by any Reds batter this season and ties Joey Votto's for the longest on-base streak by a Reds hitter.
- Began the season on Louisville's injured list with a right ankle sprain suffered on 3/25 during a spring training game in Goodyear...came off the IL on 4/23 and in 8 apps for the Bats prior to his 5/3 promotion hit .257 (1 2b, 1hr, 2rbi).

7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf 2nd Half: 18g, 19-62 (.306), 8hr, 15rbi

- First name is pronounced AY-you-hay-nee-oh.
- Since the All-Star break leads the National League in slugging percentage (.742) while ranking among the NL's second-half leaders in HR (8, 2nd), BA (.306, 14th), RBI (15, T6th) and extra-base hits (10, T8th).
- In the first inning, leads the Major Leagues with 10 HR while ranking T2nd with 20 RBI...also in the first frame ranks 12th in the National League in hitting .341 (28-82).
- Beginning 6/30, homered in 10 of his last 25 apps (12hr, 24rbi).
- Twice this season homered in 3 consecutive plate apps (7/1-7/12, 7/22-7/23).
- Joins Tony Pérez as the only third basemen in franchise history to hit 25 or more HR in 3 or more seasons...his 11 HR this month are the most by a Reds batter in July since Adam Dunn hit 12 HR in July 2008...no Reds batter has hit more than Dunn's 12 HR in July since Frank Robinson hit 13 HR in July 1961.

17 JOSH VANMETER, inf/of 2nd Half: 12g, 7gs, 13-30 (.433), 2 2b, 4hr, 6rbi

- In his last 11 apps beginning 7/19 is hitting .448 (13-29, 2 2b, 4hr, 6rbi, .931slg, .500obp)...from Wed-Sat homered in 3 straight apps, a streak snapped in Sun's 3-2 win vs Col...was the third Reds player to homer in 3 straight games this season (Derek Dietrich, Eugenio Suárez twice).
- On 7/18 was promoted from Louisville as 1 of 7 roster moves...since then has made 12 apps (13-30, .433, 2 2b, 4hr, 6rbi, .900slg, .500obp), including 5 starts in LF, 1 start at 2B and 1 start at 3B.
- Is his fourth stint on the Reds' roster...from 5/5-5/16, in his first Major League apps, went 2-for-14 (1rbi) in 8 apps and 2 starts...from 5/21-6/18 made 20 apps, including 5 starts (7-27, .259, 2 2b, 2rbi, .375obp)...in his third stint, from 7/4-7/7 went 1-for-4 with a 2-run double in 2 apps (PH, PH-LF-2B-1B-LF).
- Has made 13 starts for the Reds (9gs in LF, 2gs at 3B, 1gs at 2B, 1gs at DH).
- His solo HR off RHP Jhoulys Chacin on 7/24 at Mil traveled 463 feet per Statcast, the longest by a Reds batter this season and the second-longest by any player at Miller Park in 2019 (Travis Shaw, 465 feet, 6/23 vs Cin)...was the longest home run by a visiting player at Miller Park since StL's Marcell Ozuna hit a 479-foot HR on 4/3/18.
- Is a 2019 International League All-Star...in 49 apps for the Bats hit .348 (14 2b, 1 3b, 14hr, 43rbi, 8sb, 1.097ops)...started at 1B (10g), 2B (20g), 3B (10g) and LF (3g).
- In April was the organization's Minor League Player of the Month and the International League's Player of the Month...in April hit .358 and led the IL in games (26), hits (34), runs (24), HR (11), RBI (28), total bases (24), slugging percentage (.758) and OPS (1.204)...his 11 HR and 28 RBI are RiverBats/Bats records for April (since 2000).
- In spring training came over from minor league camp to make 10 apps for Reds (1-13).
- Is a native and resident of Ossian (AH-see-in), Indiana, a town of about 3,400 located near Fort Wayne...graduated from Norwell High School.

19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b 2nd Half: 18g, 19-75 (.253), 4 2b, 2hr, 11rbi

- For the fifth straight season, was voted by managers, scouts and executives the batter with the best strike zone judgment in the National League.
- Has at least 1 RBI in 6 of his last 8 apps (8rbi) and in 8 of his last 12 apps (10rbi).
- In his last 53 apps beginning 5/24 is hitting .311, raising his season BA from .208 (64-206, 14 2b, 6hr, 25rbi, .378obp).
- From 5/8-6/4 reached base safely in 20 consecutive games, a season-high that ties Nick Senzel's (5/10-6/1) for the longest by a Reds batter this season.
- Beginning 5/8 made his last 63 starts batting second in the order...made 15 starts this season batting leadoff (last, 5/7 at Oak)...entered this year with 1 career start batting leadoff (6/18/08 vs LAD).
- In his career has hit 63 HR on the first pitch.

33 JESSE WINKER, of 2nd Half: 18g, 16-51 (.314), 3 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 8rbi

- Among National League leaders since the All-Star break ranks seventh in on-base percentage (.426) and 12th in batting average (.314).
- In his last 12 apps is hitting .342 (13-38, 3 2b, 1hr, 5rbi, .500slg, .444obp).
- Hit safely in 10 of his 13 starts and in 11 of his 18 apps in the second half.
- In the 4-3 win on 6/18 vs Hou hit his second career leadoff HR (off Justin Verlander).
- Has 14 HR, a new single-season career high (7hr, 2017 & 2018)...his career high for RBI in a season is 43 (2018).
- Hit his eighth HR, his new career high, in his 28th appearance and 23rd start.
- Has made 78 starts, including a team-high 53 starts in LF (15gs in CF, 9gs in RF, 1gs at DH).
