It was announced during the Mariners 50 Seasons weekend that Rick Rizzs will be inducted into the Mariners Hall of Fame during the 2027 season, becoming the 12th member and joining long-time broadcast partner Dave Niehaus as the only non-uniformed members of the Mariners Hall of Fame...Rizzs is in his 41st and final season as voice of the Mariners.

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue the 9-game road trip with the 2nd of 3 games against the New York Yankees (0-1)...the Mariners will also travel to Houston to face the Astros (3 G, 8/14-16) and to Milwaukee to face the Brewers (3 G, 8/18-20) on the road trip...tonight's game will be televised and streamed live on **ESPN** with **Karl Ravech**, **Eduardo Perez**, **David Ross** and **Buster Olney** on the call...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Gary Hill Jr.** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call.

ODDS & ENDS...the Mariners dropped yesterday's series opener to the Yankees by a 4-1 final score...the Mariners are 41-15 (.732) when they score at least 4 runs in a game and 35-8 (.814) when they score at least 5 runs.

- **Quality Check** - The Mariners starting pitching staff has recorded 54 quality starts this season, the most in the American League and 2nd-most in MLB behind only the Dodgers (63 G).
- **Vargas on Rehab** - **Carlos Vargas** continued his rehab assignment last night with Triple-A Tacoma, tossing a scoreless inning with 2 hits allowed...on Saturday, Vargas tossed a 1-2-3 inning with High-A Everett...in 70 appearances in 2025, Vargas went 5-5 with a 3.97 ERA (34 ER, 77.0 IP), 23 walks and 54 strikeouts.
- **50 Seasons, 50 Greatest Mariners** - The Mariners unveiled the 50 greatest Mariners players in franchise history on Saturday, selected based on a combination of fan vote, and input from Mariners alumni, Mariners baseball operations and longtime Mariners front office and Seattle media...visit [Mariners.com/Top50](#) to view the full list.

RICK RIZZS TO BE INDUCTED TO MARINERS HOF IN '27...the Mariners announced on Saturday that legendary broadcaster **Rick Rizzs** will be the 12th inductee into the Mariners Hall of Fame during the 2027 season...Rizzs is in his 41st and final season as a Mariners broadcaster, as he previously announced his plans to retire following the season...Rizzs will join his friend and long-time broadcast partner Dave Niehaus as the only non-uniformed members of the Mariners Hall of Fame.

BIG TEX IN THE BIG APPLE...in 14 appearances (13 starts) this season, **Bryce Miller** owns a 3.08 ERA (27 ER, 79.0 IP) with 15 walks and 79 strikeouts...among pitchers in MLB with at least 70.0 IP this season, he ranks 4th in walks-per-9 innings (1.71), 5th in walk rate (4.9%), 7th in strikeout-to-walk rate (5.27) and T-7th in WHIP (0.95).

J-ROD PUTTING ON A SHOW...**Julio Rodríguez** has reached base safely in his last 10-consecutive games (7/31-c), batting .314 (11x35) with 3 runs, 2 home runs, 5 RBI, 7 walks and 2 stolen bases, reaching base at a .429 clip and slugging .486 for a .915 OPS during the span...Julio is approaching his 5th-consecutive 20+ homer season and with 2 more home runs would become the 9th player since 2022 to record 5 seasons with 20+ home runs, joining Pete Alonso-NYM/BAL, Rafael Devers-BOS/SF, Manny Machado-SD, Matt Olson-ATL, Shohei Ohtani-LAA/LAD, Kyle Schwarber-PHI, Juan Soto-3Tms and Christian Walker-AZ/HOU...he would also join Hall of Famer Ken Griffey Jr. and Alex Rodriguez as the only Mariners players to accomplish the feat at age 25-or-younger.

DOUBLE TROUBLE...**Randy Arozarena** last night hit his 15th home run of the season and has been solid offensively all season long, batting .276 (114x413) with 74 runs, 24 doubles, 1 triple, the 15 homers, 50 RBI, 45 walks and 20 stolen bases in 112 games...since his breakout season in 2021, Randy has hit 125 home runs and stolen 145 bases, becoming one of 5 players in the Majors to record 125+ homers and 125+ stolen bases during that span along with Shohei Ohtani-LAA/LAD (259 HR, 143 SB), José Ramírez-CLE (168 HR, 189 SB), **Julio Rodríguez** (130 HR, 131 SB) and Trea Turner-3Tms (128 HR, 161 SB).

BRENDAN AND THE BRONX...**Brendan Donovan** last night went 1-for-3 and over the course of his career has been an excellent hitter against the Yankees, batting .406 (13x32) with 2 doubles, 2 home runs, 6 RBI and 4 walks, reaching base at a .500 clip and slugging .656 for a 1.156 OPS in 10 games...among active players with at least 35 plate appearances against the Yankees, Donovan's OPS ranks 3rd, trailing only James Wood-WSH (1.218) and Ezequiel Duran-TEX (1.193).

YOUNG & DANGEROUS...in 22 games since the All-Star Break, **Cole Young** is batting .300 (27x90) with 9 runs, 1 double, 2 triples, 3 home runs, 9 RBI and 6 walks, reaching base at a .351 clip and slugging .456 for an .807 OPS over 97 plate appearances...Young ranks as the best second baseman in the American League this season by *Baseball-Reference* wins above replacement (34.0).

GIMME! GIMME! GIMME! (A MUÑ AFTER MIDNIGHT)...closer **Andrés Muñoz** has recorded three consecutive 20+ save campaigns, joining Kazuhiro Sasaki (2000-02) as the only Mariners with three consecutive 20+ save seasons...Muñoz also has 98 saves in his career, inching closer to becoming the 40th pitcher in MLB history to record 100 saves by age 27-or-younger...97 of his 98 saves have come with the Mariners (1 with San Diego), 3 saves shy of becoming the fourth pitcher in Seattle history with 100+ saves, joining Sasaki (129 SV), Edwin Díaz (109) and J.J. Putz (101).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...the Mariners starting pitching staff has been solid this season, combining for a 3.76 ERA (287 ER, 687.0 IP) with a 1.14 WHIP that ranks 5th in MLB, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...Seattle is one of only 3 teams in the Majors to have 5 individual starting pitchers with 70.0+ IP and a WHIP of 1.30-or-lower this season?...**Logan Gilbert** (139.1 IP; 0.998 WHIP), **Emerson Hancock** (121.0 IP; 1.116 WHIP), **George Kirby** (132.0 IP; 1.273 WHIP), **Bryce Miller** (79.0 IP; 0.949 WHIP) and **Bryan Woo** (132.1 IP; 1.103 WHIP) join the Red Sox and Dodgers pitching staffs as the only teams with 5 starters to reach the marks.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - AUGUST 12

- **1986** - The Mariners turn the fifth triple play in their history...Carney Lansford lined to 3B Domingo Ramos who threw to 2B Harold Reynolds to force Gary Pettis...Reynolds relayed to 1B Ken Phelps to put out Dave Kingman (5-4-3).
- **1998** - Alex Rodriguez blasts his 100th career home run making him the fourth youngest player ever to reach that goal.
- **2009** - Ken Griffey Jr. picks up his 9th career walk-off hit as the Mariners record their first ever 1-0 win in extra innings...the game marked the first time in Mariners history to remain scoreless through 14 innings.
- **2015** - Hisashi Iwakuma threw the 5th no-hitter in Mariners history in a 3-0 win over Baltimore...Iwakuma becomes the 2nd Japanese-born pitcher to throw an MLB no-hitter (Hideo Nomo, 2x)...first no-hitter in the American League since Félix Hernández's perfect game in 2012...the Mariners had thrown the last 3 no-hitters in the AL...Iwakuma's no-hitter was also his first career complete game.
- **2017** - The Mariners retired the jersey number 11 in honor of Edgar Martinez...he became the second Mariners player to receive this honor in the history of the franchise.
- **2018** - Edwin Díaz recorded his fourth save of the four-game sweep of the Astros, winning the final game 4-3 in the 10th inning... it was the first time the Mariners have swept the Astros in a four-game series in club history.
- **2024** - Mariners and **OF Victor Robles** agree to 2-year contract extension through the 2026 season with a club option for 2027.

ABOUT BRYCE MILLER...

- The 27-year-old right-handed pitcher is set to make his 15th appearance (14th start) of the season and the 89th (88th start) of his career...it marks his 4th career start against the Yankees and 1st of the season.
- Is in his 4th season with Seattle; selected by Seattle in the 4th round (113th overall) of the 2021 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Derek Miller on July 20, 2021.
- Played 3 seasons at Texas A&M from 2019-21.
- Was born in Mount Pleasant, Texas and attended New Braunfels High School in New Braunfels, Texas.

LAST TIME OUT...L#6 on August 6 vs. the Tigers, tossed 5.0 innings and allowed 4 runs (4 ER) on 5 hits (1 HR) with 2 walks and 5 strikeouts...he threw 93 pitches (62 strikes)...following an RBI-single with 2 outs in the 2nd inning, he retired the next 10 consecutive batters and did not allow another run through his final 3.1 innings of work

AGAINST THE YANKEES...is making his 4th career start against the Yankees and his first since Sept. 18, 2024 at T-Mobile Park when he threw 6.0 innings and allowed 1 run (1 ER) on 2 hits with 4 walks and 8 strikeouts...is making just his 2nd ever start at Yankee Stadium (last: 5/22/24).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN...is making his 8th appearances (7th start) on the road this season...has allowed 2-or-fewer earned runs across 5.0+ innings in 4 of his 7 road appearances this season...the Mariners are 3-1 over those 4 games...on June 25 at PIT, matched his career-high in strikeouts with 11 and in his June 12 start at WSH, tossed a career-high 8.0 innings...across 7 road games this season, he owns a 1.141 WHIP, a 8.26 SO/9, ranking 10th-best in MLB, and a 1.79 BB/9, which ranks T-9th-best (min. 40 IP).

KING OF THE HILL...among American League leaders this season (min. 75 IP), he ranks 5th in WHIP (0.949), 4th in SO/BB (5.27), 4th in BB/9 (1.7), and 4th in BB% (4.9%), just ahead of **Bryan Woo** (5.2%) and **George Kirby** (5.2%) despite making his season-debut mid-May...among AL pitchers since 2023 (min. 400 IP), he ranks 6th in WHIP (1.098), 7th in opp. BA (.228), 10th in BB% (6.2%), 10th in BB/9 (2.2), and 10th in SO/BB (3.69).

LIKE PLAYING CATCH...allowed only 3 hits over 5.1 innings of work in his July 31 start vs. MIN for his 6th such outing of the season...his 6 games of 3-or-fewer hits allowed over 5.0+ innings this season are tied for the 3rd most in MLB since he made his season debut on May 13...Miller has allowed 2-or-fewer hits over 5.0+ IP in 4 outings this season, T-2nd most since he made his season debut, and has recorded 5.0+ IP with a single hit allowed in 3 appearances to lead the league in appearances with 1-or-fewer hits over 5.0+ IP since May 13...this season marks the first in which he has recorded multiple games of 5.0+ innings with 1-or-fewer hits allowed...his league-leading 3 such outings are also tied for the 2nd most recorded by a Mariners pitcher in a single season, joining Luis Castillo (2023) and Roy Thomas (1985) and just trailing Bryan Woo's 4 outings in 2025.

KEEPING THE PATHS 'CLEAN'...owns a career 10.14 baserunners-per-nine, which ranks 11th in MLB since 2023 (min. 400.0 IP)...his 8.66 BR/9 this season is 3rd-lowest in MLB in 2026 (min. 75.0 IP)...his 23 career games with 4-or-fewer base runners allowed over 5.0+ IP (last: 7/2 vs. LAA) rank 4th in MLB since 2023, trailing **Logan Gilbert** (25), **Bryan Woo** (26) and **Tarik Skubal-DET/LAD** (26)...he is 1-of-6 pitchers with 6+ such games this season...his 23 such outings, with his most recent being recorded in his 83rd career game, are the 3rd most through a players first 83 outings in MLB history.

CRACKING THE WHIP...ranks 8th in MLB with a 0.949 WHIP in 2026 (min. 75.0 IP)...ranks 3rd among Mariners all-time WHIP leaders (min. 400.0 IP) with a 1.098 WHIP...his 120 walks are the 6th fewest through a starting pitchers first 88 games with the Mariners (min. 400.0 IP) while his 408 hits allowed are T-3rd fewest, trailing **Bryan Woo's** 400 hits allowed and **Paul Abbot's** 366...has recorded 3 outings of 2-or-fewer hits and 1-or-fewer walks over 5.0+ IP this season (last: 7/2 vs. LAA)...he is 1-of-6 pitchers in the AL to have 3+ such games, along with **Logan Gilbert** (3 G).

STELLAR STRETCH...is 1-of-8 pitchers in MLB this season to record 79+ strikeouts to 15-or-fewer walks through their first 14 games of the season...is just the 3rd Mariners pitcher in franchise history to record 79+ SO with 15-or-fewer walks through a player's first 14 games of a season, along with **Logan Gilbert** (2023), **Hisashi Iwakuma** (2013, 2014).

GETTING THE JOB DONE...In his last start on Aug. 6 vs. TB, recorded 4 innings of 16-or-fewer pitches after a 40-pitch 1st inning, going on to complete a full 5.0 innings in his 14th consecutive start this season...ties for the 14th longest streak in MLB this season and is 1-of-8 active streaks...the 14-game streak of 5.0+ IP is his longest such streak in his career (prev. 10 G, 4/29-6/18/24).

HITS DIFFERENT...has dominated right-handed hitters across his career...ranks 5th in WHIP (0.960) and 12th in K/BB (5.48), just trailing **Logan Gilbert** (5.53), against right handed batters among MLB pitchers since 2023 (min. 200.0 IP)...ranks 9th in WHIP (0.873) and 6th in K/BB (7.8), just trailing **George Kirby** (8.57) in MLB against RHH this season (min. 35.0 IP)...is also performing well against lefties this season with a 1.016 WHIP, ranking 10th in MLB and a 4.0 K/BB ranking T-13th in MLB (min. 40.0 IP)...also ranks 12th in the AL (min. 40.0 IP) in opponent batting average (.214) against left handed hitters.

- **On Call Often** - His 56 relief appearances this season leads the Mariners bullpen and ranks T-6th in MLB...his 129 appearances since 2025 are T-4th in MLB across that span.
- **Hold Me Closer** - Earned his 22nd hold of the season on 8/6 vs. Detroit...his 22 holds this year rank T-4th in MLB.
