TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 2** (0-1) of a 3-game series vs **Zach Weber's** first-place **Mets** and **Game 5** (0-4) of a 10-day, 9-game homestand that included a **3-0 series sweep loss** to the **Brewers** and features an upcoming off day followed by 3-game series vs the **Cardinals**...the Reds are **8 games** (3-5) into a streak in which they will play a **first-place team** in 10 consecutive games (3-1 at Mil, 0-3 vs Mil, 0-1 vs NYM)...leading into the **All-Star break**, **Steve Lewis' Redlegs** played **33 games** in **34 days** (20-13), including **18 games** (12-6) over the **last 18 days** of the first half... following this homestand, the Reds' first road trip of the second half will take them to Chi's **Wrigley Field** (4g) for the second time this season and, for the first time since **2019**, to NYM's **Citi Field** (3g).

TRANSACTION: The Reds today released Louisville **OF Scott Heineman** so that he could pursue opportunities in **Japan**...this season he went 3-for-30 (2hr, 3rbi) in 19 apps and 7 starts for the Reds and hit .279 (1hr, 4rbi) in 17 apps for the Class AAA Bats.

SERIES NOTES: At **.636** (35-20) the Mets have the highest winning percentage at **Great American Ball Park** of any team in the National League, including the Reds (**742-708-1**, **.512**)...beginning **9/24/13**, the Reds are **11-31 vs NYM** (0-2 in 2013, 2-4 in 2014, 0-7 in 2015, 0-6 in 2016, 3-4 in 2017, 3-3 in 2018, 3-4 in 2019, 0-1 in 2021), including a **14-game losing streak** from **9/7/14 - 9/7/16** that ranks as Cin's **longest ever** vs the Mets and its longest vs any team since a **16-game skid vs Ari** from **5/8/01 - 8/13/03**...dating back to **1962**, the **7-0 series win** by the Mets in **2015** was the **first season series sweep** by either team, followed by NYM's **6-0 series win** in **2016**.

BETTER LATE THAN NEVER: The Reds rank fourth in the Major Leagues and second in the National League with **25 come-from-behind wins** (Bos 29, TB 28, Mil 26)...**after the sixth inning**, Reds batters rank among the National League leaders with **167 runs** (2nd), **41 HR** (3rd), **.260 BA** (1st), **.433 slugging percentage** (2nd) and **.345 on-base percentage** (2nd)... from **7/1-7/5** the Reds trailed in 5 consecutive games but won all 5...was their longest such streak since **1918**.

HISTORIC: **Joey Votto** has **1,968 career hits**, **306 HR** and **1,007 career RBI**...he is trying to become only the second Major League player ever to record in the same season his **2,000th hit**, **300th home run** and **1,000th RBI**...**Billy Williams** did it in **1971**...**Votto** recorded his **300th HR** on **4/30 vs Cubs** (2-run off **Jake Arrieta**) and his **1,000th RBI** on **6/30 vs SD** (solo HR off **Joe Musgrove**)...courtesy @EliasSports.

TOP OF THE ORDER: Reds batters in the top 3 spots in the starting lineup combine to lead the National League in **hits** (332, 1st in ML), **doubles** (71, T1st ML) and **total bases** (569, 2nd ML)...in the Reds' **last 39 games** beginning 6/5, **Jonathan India**, **Jesse Winker** and **Nick Castellanos** **30 times** batted first, second and third, respectively, in the lineup...the Reds went **19-11** (.633) in those games.

BONUS BASEBALL: The Redlegs have played **13 extra-inning games** (8-5), including a season-high **12 innings** in a **6-5 win** on **5/15 at Col** and a **7-5 loss** on **6/21 at Min** that snapped their 6-game extra-innings winning streak...the Reds scored the runner on second base in 14 of the 19 extra innings while being outscored by the opponents, **29-26**...in extra innings, the Reds are hitting **.358** while posting a staff **ERA** of **8.84**.

DOT, DOT, DOT...: At a luncheon earlier this afternoon, Florida State University **C Mat Nelson** received his **Johnny Bench Award** as the best collegiate catcher in the country...**Nelson** was selected by the Reds with their third pick (35th overall) in last week's first-year player draft...the Reds went **14-11-6** in their **31 completed series**, including **7-6-3 at GABP** and **7-5-3 on the road**...have **5 series sweep wins** (3g vs Pit, 4g at StL, 3g vs Col, 3g at Mil, 3g vs Cubs) and **5 series sweep losses** (3g vs Ari, 3g at StL, 4g vs SF, 4g at SD, 3g vs Mil).

MOUSTAKAS UPDATE: **3B Mike Moustakas** (right heel contusion) returned from a rehabilitation assignment after 1 appearance at Class AAA Louisville...on 6/15 he went 1-for-3 at Omaha, then returned to Cincinnati with soreness in his right foot...**Moustakas** last played for the Reds on **5/18 vs SF** and last started on **5/14 at Col**.

ALL-STARS: In LF **Jesse Winker** and RF **Nick Castellanos**, the Reds placed **2 starters** in the **All-Star Game's** starting lineup for the first time since **2013** (**1B Joey Votto**, **2B Brandon Phillips**) and had **2 starting outfielders** in the lineup for the first time since **1956** (**Gus Bell**, **Frank Robinson**)...**LHP Nick Lodolo** and **IF Jose Barrero** represented the Reds in the **SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game**.

DRAFT DAY: In last week's Major League Baseball first-year player draft, the Reds selected **SS Matt McLain** (UCLA) with the **17th overall pick**, **CF Jay Allen** (John Carroll High School, Fort Pierce, FL) with the **30th selection** (compensation for the loss of free agent **RHP Trevor Bauer**) and **C Mat Nelson** (Florida State, Johnny Bench & Buster Posey Awards winner) with the **35th pick** (competitive balance pick).

Tonight's Pitcher - #22 Wade Miley, LHP

RED HOTS

- Tonight is making his first start of the second half...will be his fifth career start vs the Mets, his first since 2015.
- Will enter tomorrow night's game with a season-high scoreless streak of 12.2 innings, the 10th-longest active streak in the Major Leagues...the longest scoreless streak of his career is 14.0 innings (7/26-8/5, 2018).
- With a 1.23 ERA so far in July, ranks second in the National League (Corbin Burnes, 0.84) and ranks fourth in the Major Leagues.
- From 5/21-5/30 was in the 10-day injured list with a left foot sprain...in 8 starts since his return is 3-0, 2.22 (52.2ip, 13er, .251oba).
- In his last start before the All-Star break, a 2-0 win on 7/9 at Mil, threw 8+ shutout innings...in the seventh inning produced his sixth career double and first since 2013, then scored the run on Jesse Winker's double that increased the Reds' lead to 2-0.
- Started 3 of the Reds' 5 shutout wins...Sonny Gray started the other 2.
- Reds batters scored at least 10 runs in 5 of his starts...the Reds went 5-0 in those 5 starts.
- In the 3-0 win on 5/7 at Cle threw his first career no-hitter, third career complete game and second career shutout...was the 17th no-hitter in Reds history and fourth in Major League Baseball on the 2021 season's 37th day, the second-fastest ever to 4 no-hitters in a single season (4 no-hitters in the first 25 days of the 1917 campaign)...the longest no-hit bids of his career had been 6.0 innings (7/17/15 for Bos at LAA, 7/30/16 for Sea at Cubs)...allowed 2 baserunners...Amed Rosario reached second base on a double error by 2B Nick Senzel with 1 out in the bottom of the sixth inning, and Cesar Hernandez walked 1 out later...at 34 years, 175 days old is the oldest Reds pitcher to throw a no-hitter (Tom Seaver 33 years, 211 days in 1978)...the Reds broke the scoreless tie with 3 runs in the top of the ninth inning...the start of the game was delayed 1 hour, 23 minutes by weather.
- Following his no-hitter was named National League Player of the Week, his first weekly award.
- In the 9-6 loss on 5/14 at Col, his first start after his no-hitter, allowed a season high 11 hits and 8 runs, his highest totals since he allowed 12 hits and 9 runs on 6/2/16 for Sea at SD...allowed a leadoff triple to Garrett Hampson.
- Joined Anthony DeSclafani as the only Reds pitchers since 1893, when the pitcher's mound was moved to its current distance from home plate, to begin a season with consecutive starts of at least 5.0 scoreless innings...DeSclafani did it last season (5ip/3h, 6ip/2h)...courtesy @EliasSports.

RED HOTS

- Tomorrow is expected to be reinstated from the 10-day injured list (sore right shoulder) to make his first appearance for the Reds since 5/26.
- From 6/22-7/7 made 4 rehab starts for Louisville (0-0, 1.76, 15.1ip, 11h, 4r, 3er, 3bb, 11k, 2hr), followed by Fri's start for Dayton in a game eventually suspended by rain (3ip, 5h, 4er, 1bb, 5k, 3hr, 63 pitches).
- With 1 out in the bottom of the second inning of the 5-3 loss on 5/26 at Wsh, left the game with a sore right shoulder...the next day, after an examination in Cincinnati and before that suspended game resumed in the bottom of the fourth inning, went on the 10-day injured list with a right shoulder impingement...was replaced on the active roster for the completion of the suspended game by LHP Cionel Pérez.

- In the eighth inning of the 10-inning, 3-2 win on 4/17 vs Cle recorded the first 2 outs of the Reds' 31st triple play, their first since 7/25/2017 at NYY...Josh Naylor lined into the 3-3-5 triple play...Votto also participated in the July 2017 triple play.
- In the first inning of the 7-5 loss on 6/19 at SD was ejected after arguing a check-swing strikeout...was the 13th ejection of his career, his first this season...singled on the first pitch of his first plate appearance the next day.
- In the eighth inning of the 4-3 win on 7/10 at Mil was ejected after arguing a check-swing strikeout...was the 14th ejection of his career, his second of the season.
- On 6/30 vs SD homered off Joe Musgrove for his 1,000th Major League RBI...was his 1,821st career appearance.
- Made his 14th Opening Day roster...appeared in his 13th Opening Day game, fifth-most in Reds history, 1 game behind Johnny Bench and 4 games behind all-time franchise leaders Barry Larkin and Pete Rose (17).
- Is the 2010 National League Most Valuable Player and Hank Aaron Award winner, a 6-time NL All-Star, a *Sporting News* NL All-Star and the only Reds first baseman ever to win a Rawlings Gold Glove Award.
