METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets returned to action last night and fell to the Royals, 7-6...The Mets have won four of their last seven games...Tonight, the Mets continue a six-game road trip (0-1) to Kansas City (0-1) and Baltimore (three games).

EXPECTED ROSTER MOVES: The Mets are expected to add RHP Phil Bickford and INF Jonathan Araúz for tonight's game.

NATIONAL LEAGUE ROOKIE OF THE MONTH: Congrats to Francisco Alvarez who was named the National League Rookie of the Month for July...In 21 games last month, Alvarez batting .284 (21-74) with 16 runs, nine home runs, 18 RBI, six walks with a .354 OBP and a .649 SLG...He was fourth in the NL with nine home runs in July.

HERE'S THE CATCH: Francisco Alvarez has hit 21 home runs this season... He joins Pete Alonso (53, 2019) and Darryl Strawberry (26, 1983) as the only Mets rookies to have 20 or more home runs in a season...Alvarez leads all major league catchers with 19 home runs playing that position and is tied with Arizona's Corbin Carroll for the rookie lead in homers.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Alonso is third in the majors and second in the Senior Circuit with 31 home runs...He is third in the NL with 77 RBI...He is hitting .349 (15-43) with eight extra-base hits, 15 RBI, nine runs and a 1.187 OPS in his last 11 games...He was hitting .132 (12-91) with seven extra-base hits and a .549 OPS over his previous 25 games (since his return from the IL on June 18-19).

WE'RE NOT IN KANSAS ANYMORE: The Mets last played at Kauffman Stadium from August 16-18, 2019, taking two out of three games from the Royals...Overall, the Mets are 9-8 against the Royals in the regular season and 4-5 at The K...Pete Alonso has played four games at the ballpark and is 8-17 with four runs, two doubles, two home runs, six RBI and two walks there...Francisco Lindor has hit .290 (51-176) with 31 runs, eight doubles, one triple, 11 home runs, 35 RBI and 15 walks in 42 career games at the yard.

DOWN ON THE FARM: Last night, RHP Dominic Hamel tossed 6.1 scoreless innings as the Binghamton Rumble Ponies downed the New Hampshire Fisher Cats, 2-0...Hamel allowed two hits, walked three and struck out seven in the victory...Over his last nine starts, he has gone 3-2 with a 3.50 ERA (18 ER/46.1 IP) with 19 walks and 63 strikeouts...Overall, the 24-year-old has made 18 starts (19 games) at Double-A this year, going 5-5 with a 4.43 ERA (44 ER/89.1 IP) with 37 walks and 117 strikeouts...His 117 strikeouts are tied for fourth in all of Double-A...He leads the farm system in strikeouts, second in innings, tied for fifth in wins, eighth in the ERA and WHIP (1.32).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 24-33 on the road this year...They have posted a 4.77 ERA in away games...This compares to a 3.84 mark at home...New York has played 57 games on the road this year...That is the second-most in the majors...Only the Phillies have played more road games with 59.

ROYALS-METS NOTES: The Mets and Royals will face off for the first time since 2019...New York fell to the Royals 4-1 in the 2015 World Series.

LINSANITY: Francisco Lindor ranks 14th in the majors with a 14.7 fWAR... That is seventh-best in the National League...Over the last 36 games, Lindor is batting .288 (38-132) with 28 runs, six doubles, two triples, nine home runs, 21 RBI, 22 walks, 11 steals with a .392 OBP, a .568 SLG and a .961 OPS...Lindor has stolen 17 bases in 106 games this season, exceeding his total from 2022 (16 steals in 161 games)...His career-best is 25 steals in 158 games in 2018...The shortstop ranks third in the majors with a 94.4% success rate in steals...He has gone 17 out of 18 in stolen base attempts in 2023.

RETURN OF THE MARK: In eight games since he was recalled from Triple-A Syracuse, Mark Vientos is batting .280 (7-25) with two runs, two doubles, one home run, four RBI, one walk with a .321 OBP, a .480 SLG and an .801 OPS.

DOING THE SPLITS: Brandon Nimmo is batting .286 (63-220) with 30 runs, nine doubles, three triples, six home runs, 29 RBI, 30 walks, a .374 OBP and a .436 SLG on the road this season...This compares to a .218/.327/.425 slashline with 18 extra-base hits at home...Francisco Lindor is a .257 (57-222) with 40 runs, 15 doubles, two triples, 12 home runs, 43 RBI, 23 walks, a .336 OBP, a .505 SLG and an .840 OPS on the road in 2023...He is slashing .211/.314/.411 with 17 extra-base hits at Citi Field this year.

THEY'RE OUT OF MY LEAGUE: The Mets are in a stretch of 14 of 18 games against American League opponents...They are 4-5 in that span...The new schedule format has New York playing a total of 43 Interleague games in 2023, more than double their previous high for a single season (20)...The Mets are 14-15 against the American League this year...Overall, New York owns a 249-242 record in Interleague play...The team's .508 winning percentage is the second-best among National League clubs.

JEFF McHITS: Jeff McNeil has safely reached base in 13 of his last 14 games...Over that span that started on July 16, McNeil is batting .273 (15-55) with nine runs, three doubles, one triple, eight RBI with three walks and has posted a .344 OBP.

STEAL MY SUNSHINE: New York has recorded 79 steals in 87 attempts...The team's 90.8 percent success rate is the best in the majors...The Mets had a franchise-record run of 35 consecutive stolen bases without being caught from May 14-June 29...Overall, New York has been successful in 53 of their last 55 stolen base attempts.

INVADER NIM: Brandon Nimmo has hit 15 home runs in 104 games this season...Nimmo's career-high is 17 home runs, which he accomplished in 140 games in 2018...The left-handed hitter smacked 16 home runs in 151 games last season.

IF YOU START ME UP: The Mets are 32-8 when the starting pitcher throws at least 6.0 innings...New York has gone 14-1 when its starter pitches 7.0+ innings and are a perfect 5-0 when the starter completes 8.0 innings.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 1969, the Mets blanked the Braves, 1-0, in front of 37,442 at Shea Stadium...Jim McAndrew hurled 7.0 scoreless innings allowing only three hits, two walks and striking out seven...Tug McGraw earned his sixth save of the season hurling 2.0 scoreless to close it out...The Mets got their lone run in the bottom of the seventh thanks to an RBI single from Cleon Jones.

SENGA NEWS & NOTES

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: On July 8, Major League Baseball announced that Kodai Senga was added to the National League All-Star team, which took place on July 11 at T-Mobile Park in Seattle...Senga joined Pete Alonso (2019), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver as the only Mets rookies selected to an All-Star Game...He is the eighth Japanese-Born rookie ever to be selected to an All-Star Game joining Masahiro Tanaka (2014), Yu Darvish (2012), Kosuke Fukudome (2008), Hideki Okajima (2007), Hideki Matsui (2003), Ichiro Suzuki (2001) and Hideo Nomo (1995).

SENGA GENESIS: Has recorded 130 strikeouts through his first 19 career major league games, that is the third-most by a Mets pitcher in franchise history...Only Dwight Gooden (154), and Matt Harvey (138) have recorded more in their first 19 career starts...His 130 strikeouts are the fourth-most by a Japanese born pitcher through 19 career games...He trails only Hideo Nomo (175), Masahiro Tanaka (139) and Yu Darvish (138).

KODAI THE FRIENDLY GHOST: Senga's seven wins are tied for the most among all major league rookies this season and his 130 strikeouts are the most by any rookie... Among rookies with 50.0 or more innings pitched, Senga is third in the majors and first in the NL with a 11.14 SO/9 rate and third in the majors in opponent's average (.200).

PUTTING THE K IN FORK: Senga's "ghost fork" has accounted for 70 of his 130 strikeouts through 19 starts...The pitch has a 58.6 percent whiff rate and a 27.6 percent putaway rate...Opponents have managed just 12 hits in 102 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .118 batting average.

SHUT 'EM OUT: On May 30 against the Phillies, Senga became the 10th rookie in franchise history to throw 7.0 or more innings, while one hit or less and was the first Met since Steven Matz did so on August 14, 2016...Joins Jonathon Niese, who tossed a complete game shutout on June 10, 2010, as the only Mets rookie to accomplish the feat without allowing a walk.

ALL I DO IS WIN: Senga became the only Japanese-born pitchers to start their career 3-0 and is the fourth player in franchise history to earn the win in their first two career major league starts, joining Steven Matz, Mike Pelfrey and Gary Gentry...Additionally, he joins Kazuhisa Ishii, Hideki Irabu and Koji Uehara as the only Japanese-born pitchers to win each of their first two career major league starts...Senga fell just shy of becoming the second Mets starting pitcher ever to begin his career 4-0, a record held by Steven Matz.

MLB DEBUT NOTES: Senga became the 64th pitcher whose major league debut came in a start for the Mets...New York has had one pitcher make his MLB debut as a starter in each of the previous three seasons: José Butto in 2022, Tylor Megill in 2021 and David Peterson in 2020 (the Mets won each of those three games)...Senga allowed one run over 5.1 innings on three hits, three walks and eight strikeouts in his major league debut...His eight strikeouts were tied for the fourth-most by a Japanese-born pitcher in their major league debut and tied for the third-most by a Mets pitcher in their major league debut.

METS-JAPAN CONNECTION: Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.

NPB CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Prior to joining the Mets, Senga spent 11 seasons in Japan's NPB with the Fukuoka Softbank Hawks...During his NPB career he posted a 87-44 record with a 2.59 ERA (313 ER/1,089.0 IP) and 1,252 strikeouts (10.3 K/9.0)...He was also a three-time NPB All-Star (2013, 2017 and 2019), a two-time Pacific League Best Nine Award winner (2019 and 2020) and a two-time Mitsui Golden Glove Award winner (2019 and 2020).

INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION: Senga appeared in four games in the 2017 World Baseball Classic for Team Japan...He posted a 0.82 ERA, throwing 11.0 innings and allowing one run on seven hits with 16 strikeouts and one walk...He also pitched in two games during the Tokyo Summer Olympics, throwing a total of 3.0 scoreless innings as Japan won the gold medal on its home turf.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: CARLOS CARRASCO (3-5, 6.40)

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 2.1 innings against the Nationals at Citi Field on July 29, 2023...allowed six earned runs on eight hits and only allowed 1 walk while striking out two batters in a 11-6 Mets loss.

COOKIE N' ROYALS: Carrasco will face the Royals for the first this season...This will be his first match up against the Royals as a Met...In his last win against the KC Royals on July 26, 2020, Carrasco pitched 6.0 innings tallying ten strikeouts allowing only one walk and zero home runs.

Strawberry is the only other Met to have multiple in a single season (four in 1983).
