BACK WHERE IT STARTED: After sending four players to the All-Star Game in Philadelphia this week, the Detroit Tigers return to action in the same state in which they began their season, back on March 26 against the Padres. Tonight’s game against the Angels begins a two-city, six-game road trip that concludes with three games against the Cubs in Chicago.

- For the second consecutive year out of the Break, Detroit will play 13 games in 13 days...after this six-game road trip, the Tigers return home to Comerica Park for a seven-game homestand (four vs. KC, three vs. BAL) before getting a day off on July 30.
- Including this series against the Angels, four of the next five road series for the Tigers will be on the West Coast...after their homestand to end the month, they start a three-team, nine-game trip against Sacramento, Seattle and San Francisco.

HE’S AN ALL-STAR: Kevin McGonigle enters play tonight with 99 hits, tied with Rockies rookie TJ Rumfield for the most hits among rookies this season...he has 16 more than the next closest American League rookie, as Chase DeLauter of the Guardians recorded 83 hits before the All-Star Break.

- McGonigle’s 99 hits are tied for fourth (Aaron Judge, Rumfield) among rookies before the All-Star Break since 2004, behind only Jacob Wilson (112), Brian Anderson (109) and Corey Seager (105).
- To go along with 99 hits, McGonigle has also drawn 60 walks in his 93 games before the Break, joining Aaron Judge as the only rookies since rookie status began in 1947 to have 99+ hits and 60+ walks prior to the All-Star Game. His 60 walks are tied for eighth in MLB entering tonight’s game.
- Since 1947, only Dick Howser (63), Randy Milligan (61) and Judge (61) have drawn more walks as a rookie than McGonigle before the Break.

ON THE BUMP: Troy Melton makes his ninth start of the season tonight, entering play with a 5-1 record and 1.82 ERA. His 1.82 ERA is third amongst pitchers with at least eight starts this year, behind Jacob Misiorowski (1.62, 18 starts) and Shohei Ohtani (1.79, 14 starts). Melton has gone at least 6.0 innings and allowed two earned runs or less in five of his eight starts, giving up one earned run or less in six of his eight including each of his last four entering play tonight.

- Melton will make tonight’s start against the team he grew up rooting for, his first career start and second outing against the Angels. The right-hander, who was born in Newport Beach and grew up in Anaheim, earned a win against the Angels on August 8 last year, allowing one earned run on two hits over 3.1 innings of relief.

WHERE IT ALL STANDS: The Tigers start play tonight with a 44-52 record, currently 6.5 games out of first place in the A.L. Central behind the White Sox (50-45) and Guardians (51-46) who are tied at the top...they are 3.5 games out of the final Wild Card spot in the American League despite the fourth-best run differential in the American League, at +24.

- This time last year, Detroit had the best record in the majors (59-38) for the first time since 2006 and the seventh time in franchise history...their +87-run differential was second-best in the American League, behind only the New York Yankees (+111).

GET ON WITH IT: Kevin McGonigle reached base safely 162 times before the All-Star Break...since the advent of the All-Star Game in 1933, only two players 21-years-old or younger have reached base prior to the Break more than McGonigle: Mike Trout (170 times in 2013) and Mr. Tiger Al Kaline (169 in 1955).

- Entering play tonight, McGonigle has reached base safely in 17 straight games, the third-longest active streak in all of baseball, behind Home Run Derby runner-up Kyle Schwarber (19 games) and champion, Jordan Walker (18 games).

SERIES PREVIEW: Detroit won three of their last four series heading into the All-Star Break, with two of those three series wins coming on the road against the Yankees and Rangers. Before that road trip on June 29-July 5, the Tigers were just 2-10-1 in road series, doubling their series win total with a 5-1 trip.

- Before the Break, the Tigers won three series in a row before losing 2-of-3 to Philadelphia last weekend...it marked just the second time this season they won three series in a row, with the first coming on June 1-11 against Tampa Bay, Seattle and Minnesota.
- Detroit is 14-17 in series openers this year, but are 6-2 in their last eight series openers dating back to June 15 against Houston...the Angels are last in baseball with just nine wins in their 31 series openers this season.

AND FINALLY: Dating back to 1958, just two Tigers pitchers have had lower ERAs through the first eight starts (non-openers) of a season than Troy Melton’s 1.82 entering play tonight: Les Cain (1.40 ERA) in 1971 and Eduardo Rodríguez (1.57 ERA) in 2023.

- Has gone at least 6.0 innings and allowed two earned runs or less in five of his eight starts, giving up one earned run or less in six of his eight including each of his last four entering play tonight...Melton was born in Newport Beach and grew up in Anaheim.
- Dating back to 1958, just two Tigers pitchers have had lower ERAs through the first eight starts (non-openers) of a season than Troy Melton's 1.82 entering play tonight: Les Cain (1.40 ERA) in 1971 and Eduardo Rodríguez (1.57 ERA) in 2023.
- Earned his third win in four starts this year despite allowing four solo home runs over his 5.0 innings pitched...became the first pitcher in Tigers history to earn the win after allowing exactly four runs on four homers, the first to earn the win despite allowing four homers since Matthew Boyd on August 31, 2019, vs. Minnesota.
- Turned in the best start of his young major league career on June 3 against Tampa Bay, as he picked up his second win of the season, limiting the Rays to two runs on four hits and two walks in a career-best 8.0 innings pitched, the longest start by a Tigers pitcher this season...Melton retired his final 17 batters faced and at one point threw 22-consecutive strikes between the fifth and eighth innings.
- Allowed one run on six hits and a walk while striking out one over 7.0 innings on May 29 against Chicago-AL, his second straight outing of surrendering just one run to begin his season.
- Started the 2026 season on the 60-day injured list with right elbow inflammation...activated on May 24 and pitched that night, allowing just one earned run on two hits and three walks while striking out three over 5.2 innings.
- Made his Major League debut on July 23, 2025, against Pittsburgh...earned his first big league win on July 28 last year against Arizona in his first home start, tossing seven scoreless innings, allowing just five hits while also striking out five.
- Selected by Detroit in the fourth round (117th overall) of the 2022 MLB Draft out of San Diego State University.

- Was an emergency starter on June 15 against Houston, allowing just one earned run on two hits and two walks while striking out five over 2.2 innings pitched.
- Blew back-to-back save opportunities on May 29 and May 31 against Chicago-AL...allowed three earned runs on five hits over 1.1 innings between the two outings.
- Tossed 3.0 perfect innings and earned the win on May 27 against Los Angeles-AL...continued a stretch of 14.0 consecutive innings over five games dating back to May 13 in which he has not allowed an earned run...has allowed just five hits and four walks compared to 16 strikeouts over this span.
- Earned a six-out save on May 24 against Baltimore, striking out four over his two scoreless frames.
- Made the third big league start of his career on May 20 against Cleveland, his first since Aug. 7, 2021, with the Texas Rangers against the Athletics...tossed 4.2 scoreless frames, allowing just two hits and two walks while striking out a career-high seven batters.
- Earned his first win of the season and second of his major league career on April 30 against Atlanta, tossing 2.0 scoreless frames.
- Earned his first career major league save with 3.1 scoreless innings, allowing two walks while striking out two in a victory over the Marlins on April 11.
- Signed with Detroit on a one-year major league contract with a club option for the 2027 season on Dec. 16, 2025.
- Spent each of the previous two seasons with the SSG Langers of the KBO League...went 12-7 with a 2.25 ERA (43 ER/171.2 IP) in 30 starts for SSG last season, recording 245 strikeouts in his 171.2 innings pitched, an average of 12.8 strikeouts per nine innings.
- In his two seasons with SSG, went 23-10 with a 2.91 ERA (93 ER/287.1 IP) in 54 appearances (53 starts)...released by Detroit after nine appearances with Triple-A Toledo in 2024 prior to signing with the Langers.
- Has spent parts of five seasons with the Philadelphia Phillies (2017-19), Chicago White Sox (2020) and Texas Rangers (2021) prior to joining the Tigers this year...also pitched with Hiroshima in the NPB for the 2022-23 campaigns.

- Closed out a Tigers victory with 2.0 scoreless innings on July 10 against Philadelphia...allowed one hit while striking out one.
- Optioned to Triple-A Toledo on June 12 and recalled on July 1, replacing an injured Will Vest...allowed just one earned run over five games (6.1 innings) with the Mud Hens over that span...did not allow a hit in his last 3.2 frames.
- Saw his first major league action of the season on May 30 against Chicago-AL, allowing three earned runs on three hits (two home runs) and striking out three.
- Began the season on the 60-day injured list with a left adductor strain...rehabbed with Lakeland and Toledo in May, allowing four earned runs on six hits including two home runs while walking three and striking out five over 5.2 innings with Toledo.
- Made his first career Opening Day roster in 2025...pitched in 22 games (one start) to a 1-3 record and a 6.55 ERA.
- Pitched in 46 games (12 starts) for the Tigers in 2024, finishing with a 4-5 record, 3.59 ERA (27ER/67.2IP) and 69 strikeouts...set career-best marks in strikeouts, wins, holds (6), opponent batting average (.224), slugging percentage (.354) and OPS (.664).
- Started on Sept. 13 and 14 vs. Baltimore in 2024, becoming the first Tigers pitcher to start back-to-back team games, which were on consecutive days, since George Uhle on Aug. 4-5, 1929.
- Made his postseason debut on Oct. 1, 2024, at Houston, walking one in a scoreless two-thirds of an inning to pick up the save...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the first pitcher in franchise history to record a save in his first career playoff game.
- Started his postseason career with 5.1 no-hit innings with two walks and six strikeouts in his first four outings.
