PITTSBURGH PIRATES (59-99) vs. ST. LOUIS CARDINALS (92-66) OCTOBER 2, 2022 at BUSCH STADIUM, ST. LOUIS, MO -- GAME #159/ROAD #81 RHP ROANSY CONTRERAS (5-5, 3.72 ERA) vs. RHP ADAM WAINWRIGHT (11-11, 3.51 ERA)

THE PIRATES: Dropped the second game of this three-game set in St. Louis last night by a score of 13-3...Went 4-3 on their seven-game homestand against the Cubs (1-3) and Reds (3-0)...Have won three of their last five and four of their last seven games...Are in the final four games of a stretch that has the team playing each of the last 13 games against the NL Central to close out the year.

IT'S IN THE CARDS: This marks the final road game of the season for the Pirates here in St. Louis...Following today's game at Busch Stadium, the teams will meet at PNC Park for the final three games of the 2022 campaign from October 3-5...It will mark the first time the Bucs and Cards face each other in six consecutive games since July 15-18, 1943 (special thanks to the Elias Sports Bureau).

YESTERDAY'S TRANSACTION: Prior to last night's game at St. Louis, the Pirates recalled RHP **Junior Fernández** from Triple-A Indianapolis and placed RHP **Wil Crowe** on the 15-day Injured List with right elbow inflammation.

DAY MAN, FIGHTER OF THE NIGHT MAN: Today, **Roansy Contreras** will be making his eighth appearance and seventh start in a day game this season, during which he's gone 2-0 with a 1.95 ERA (7 ER in 32.1 IP) with 32 strikeouts...Over his last five starts during the day since June 4, he's posted a 1.05 ERA (3 ER in 25.2 IP) with a .189 opponents average.

- The last Major League rookies to post a 1.95 ERA or better during the day were NYM Steven Matz (1.29) and DET Michael Fulmer (1.78) in 2016 [min. 5 games started].
- The last Pirates starter to post a 1.95 ERA or better during the day [min. 5 GS] was Denny Neagle in 1996 (1.94)...The only Pirates rookie starter to have a better ERA during the sunlight hours was Al Mamaux in 1914 (1.71).

67 BUCS: **Junior Fernández** made his debut for the Pirates last night, making him the 67th different player to be used by the Pirates this season, extending their club record for players used in a single season (64 in 2021)...Entering play today, the Pirates lead the Majors in players used this season, ahead of the Cincinnati Reds (66).

- 67 players used is tied with the 2019 Seattle Mariners for the second-most in Major League history, behind only the 2021 Chicago Cubs (69).

GOLD AT THE CORNER: Ke'Bryan Hayes enters today ranked first among all third basemen in MLB in Outs Above Average (17) according to Baseball Savant...According to The Fielding Bible, Hayes' 23 Defensive Runs Saved are the second most in baseball, regardless of position, behind only COL Brendan Rodgers (24)...Among third basemen, he leads the Majors in DRS by a wide margin, four runs ahead of nine-time defending Gold Glove Award winner Nolan Arenado (19) (See chart on the right).

LET THE KIDS PLAY: The average age of the Pirates' current 28-man roster is 25.8 years old, featuring just two players over the age of 30 (Manny Banuelos - 31; Ben Gamel - 30)...The Buccos roster currently has 11 players 24 years old or younger, as well as seven 23 or younger.

- Pittsburgh has 10 rookies on the active 28-man roster (7 position players, 3 pitchers): Jack Suwinski, Diego Castillo, Oneil Cruz, Cal Mitchell, Jason Delay, Jose Godoy, Ji Hwan Bae, Roansy Contreras, Miguel Yajure and Luis Ortiz.
- The Pirates now have four players 24 years old or younger with 10+ homers (Castro, Suwinski, Cruz, Castillo), their highest single season total in franchise history, besting the three they had in 2010, 1971 and 1970...this is the highest total in the Majors this season, and the highest since the Blue Jays had a Major League record six such players do so during the 2019 season (Bichette, Biggio, Guerrero Jr., Jansen, McKinney, Tellez).

DOWN ON THE FARM: Pittsburgh's minor league system ended the 2022 season with a .517 winning percentage...The only three National League organizations to post a better winning percentage were the Rockies (.549), Dodgers (.454) and Padres (.522)...In addition, Pittsburgh had six players named among Baseball America's Top 100 prospects from earlier this month: Termarr Johnson (#44), Quinn Priester (#64), Liover Peguero (#76), Henry Davis (#80), Mike Burrows (#98) and Endy Rodriguez (#100) represent the Pirates in the new rankings.

YOUNG BUCS: Pirates rookies have totaled 55 home runs this season, the second-most in all of baseball behind Kansas City (73)...the 55 home runs by rookies this season are already the most in a single season by Pirates rookies.

- **Jack Suwinski** leads all Pirates rookies with 18 home runs this season, followed by **Oneil Cruz** (17) and **Diego Castillo** (11)...This is the first time in franchise history that the Pirates have had three different rookies with 10+ home runs in a single season (source: Elias Sports Bureau).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

October 2, 1979: (NLCS, Game 1) Willie Stargell's three-run home run in the 11th inning powered the Pirates to a 5-2, extra-inning victory over the Cincinnati Reds at Riverfront Stadium. Pittsburgh jumped out to an early 2-0 lead, but Cincinnati responded with two runs of their own in the fourth.

MITCH KELLER: The 26-year-old righthander will make his 29th start (31st appearance) tomorrow night at PNC Park...He allowed one run in 5.0 innings but had a no-decision in his last start; a 4-1 win Tuesday vs. the Reds ...Has gone 3-6 with a 2.65 ERA (78.0ip/23er) over his last 14 outings since July 11...Has allowed three or fewer earned runs in 18 of his last 21 starting assignments since returning to the rotation on 5/31.	
VS. ST. LOUIS: 2-1 with a 3.35 ERA (37.2ip/14er) in seven career starts...Is 0-1 in three starts this season; suffered a 6-2 loss on 4/9 at Busch Stadium (4.0ip/4er), was in line for the win (5.1ip/2r) but had a no-decision in a 7-5 loss at Busch on 6/13 and tossed 7.0 scoreless innings but had a no-decision in a last at-bat loss on 9/11 at PNC Park...Went 1-0 in two starts in 2021; pitched 5.0 scoreless innings in a combined 4-0 shutout at Busch Stadium on 8/20 and gave up seven runs in 5.1ip on 8/26 at PNC Park (no-decision).
