TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners wrap up the road trip today with the last of 3 games against the Cleveland Guardians (1-1)...Seattle is coming off a 3-game series at Pittsburgh Pirates (1-2) on the trip...Seattle returns home starting tomorrow for a 7-day, 6-game homestand against the Los Angeles Angels (3 G, 6/29-6/30 & 7/2) and Toronto Blue Jays (3 G, 7/3-7/5)...today's game will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call and **Brad Adam** as the field reporter... the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Gary Hill Jr.** and **Shannon Drayer** on the call.

ODDS & ENDS...the Mariners dropped last night's middle game to the Guardians by a 4-3 score, after winning Friday night's opener by a 3-1 advantage.

- **Leading the West** - The Mariners (42-42) are in first place in the American League West Division, a half-game ahead of the Texas Rangers (41-42).
- **Rubber Soul** - Seattle owns a 5-7 record in series rubber matches heading into today's tilt.
- **On Guard** - The Guardians, the team **Josh Naylor** spent parts of 5 seasons (2020-24) with, are 1 of 2 MLB teams that Naylor has yet to homer against, along with the Dodgers.
- **Futureeee** - Major League Baseball is set to announce its All-Star Futures Game rosters on Wednesday, July 1 at 8:30 a.m. PT...the game will be played in Philadelphia on Sunday, July 12.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR...Major League Baseball is set to announce its All-Star rosters on Saturday, July 4 at 4:30 p.m. PT on FOX for the 96th Midsummer Classic...the 2026 MLB All-Star Game takes place on Tuesday, July 14 at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia.

OHIO!...Zanesville, Ohio native **Colt Emerson** hit a solo home run in the 3rd inning of Friday night's opener against the Guardians, his first plate appearance in his home state...at age 20 years and 341 days old, Emerson became the youngest Ohio-born visiting player to hit a home run in the state of Ohio, and the second youngest player born in Ohio to hit a home run in his home state, trailing only Clyde Vollmer (20 years, 249 days old), who hit a home run in a home game for the Cincinnati Reds on May 31, 1942, the first game of Vollmer's big league career.

YESTERDAY'S ROSTER MOVES...yesterday the Mariners recalled left-hander **Josh Simpson** from Triple-A Tacoma...right-hander **Alex Hoppe** was optioned to Triple-A Tacoma...Simpson has made 20 appearances with the Rainiers this season, recording one save with a 2.08 ERA (5 ER, 21.2 IP)...the left-hander has 24 strikeouts and 10 walks, registering 10.0 strikeouts-per-9 innings.

DOM CANZONE, EVERYBODY!...in 22 games this month, **Dominic Canzone** is batting .323 (21x65) with 11 runs, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 5 home runs, 10 RBI and 7 walks in 73 plate appearances...his 1.028 OPS ranks 5th among American League batters with at least 60 plate appearances this month.

ARAZARENA: AN ALL-STAR WORTHY BLAST...last night **Randy Arozarena** hammered a 3-run homer in the 8th inning, a 427-foot blast to left-center field...in 76 games this season, the Mariners left fielder is batting .288 (80x278) with 48 runs, 19 doubles, 1 triple, 8 homers, 36 RBI, 30 walks and 19 steals, posting a .376 on-base percentage, .450 slugging and .826 OPS...among American League outfielders this season, he ranks 7th in bWAR (2.5), 8th in OBP, 4th in doubles and T-1st in stolen bases.

RARE AIR FOR WOO...right-hander **Bryan Woo** (0.992 career WHIP) is 1 of 4 starting pitchers in Major League history to have a sub-1.00 WHIP and at least 400 innings pitched, along with Hall of Famer Addie Joss (0.968 WHIP), who pitched for Cleveland from 1902-10 and threw the second perfect game (1908) in American League history after Cy Young (1904)...joining Woo and Joss are active hurlers Jacob deGrom-TEX (0.988) and Paul Skenes-PIT (0.952).

MUÑOZ MOVES UP LEADERBOARD...on Friday night, **Andrés Muñoz** pitched a scoreless 9th inning with 2 strikeouts, notching his 400th career strikeout and recording his 15th save of the season...it marked his 93rd career save (92nd with Seattle), tying Aurelio López for the 3rd-most saves by a Mexican-born pitcher...he now trails only Roberto Osuna (155 SV) and Joakim Soria (229 SV)...Muñoz's 92 saves with the Mariners also rank 5th in franchise history, behind Mike Schooler (98 SV), J.J. Putz (101 SV), Edwin Díaz (109 SV) and Kazuhiro Sasaki (129 SV).

HOMESTAND HIGHLIGHTS...tomorrow the Mariners will begin a 7-day, 6-game homestand against the Los Angeles Angels (3 G, 6/29-6/30, 7/2) in a series that features a rare mid-series off-day, and the Toronto Blue Jays (3 G, 7/3-7/5)...highlights on the homestand include **Cal Raleigh 3-day Pop! Collectible Giveaway** during each game of the Angels series, **Patriotic Fireworks Night** on July 3, **Fourth of July Patriotic Bucket Hat Giveaway** on July 4 and Kids Run the Bases on July 5.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...today's starting pitcher **Emerson Hancock** has faced the Guardians 3 times in his career, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...Hancock is 3-0 in those starts with a 1.47 ERA?...he's made starts against Cleveland once in 2024, once in 2025, and so far once in 2026, slated to face them again and for the first time since Seattle's opening series of the season at T-Mobile Park...across those 3 outings, the right-hander has 14 strikeouts and 3 walks, surrendering just 6 hits spread over 18.1 innings pitched, which is good for a 0.491 WHIP...that marks the 4th-lowest WHIP by an active starting pitcher against any opponent (min. 3 starts)...**Bryce Miller's** 0.560 WHIP in 4 starts against the Detroit Tigers ranks 7th on that list.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - JUNE 28

- **1988** - Glenn Wilson chased a ball hit by Texas' Jeff Kunkel which travels into the Mariners bullpen. With the game ball trapped under the bullpen bench, Wilson stops at the ball bag, takes a ball out and hurls it into the game. When asked to comment, Wilson says, "I grabbed the first ball I saw."
- **1996** - The Mariners tie the club record with 19 runs as they clobber Texas at the Kingdome, 19-8.
- **2005** - In a game against the Athletics, the Mariners battery consists of a pair of 42-year olds as Jamie Moyer throws to backstop Pat Borders. It marks the first time in major league history that two players 42 years or older have been the starting pitcher and catcher for a team.
- **2012** - Félix Hernández tied his career-high with 13 strikeouts and threw a CG shutout in the Mariners 1-0 win over the Boston Red Sox. John Jaso delivered a pinch-hit, walk-off single with one out in the bottom of the 9th inning to score Casper Wells with the winning run.

ABOUT EMERSON HANCOCK...

- The 27-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 16th appearance of the season and the 53rd of his career...it will mark his 2nd appearance of the season against Cleveland and 4th career appearance.
- Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (6th overall) of the 2020 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Scott Hunter on June 25, 2020.
- Spent 3 seasons at the University of Georgia, 2018-20...in 2020, was named Vince Dooley Athlete of the Year as the top male student-athlete at the University of Georgia.
- Was named to CoSIDA Academic All-America First Team in 2020.

LAST TIME OUT...L#4 on June 20 vs. Red Sox, tossed 5.1 innings with 5 runs (5 ER) allowed on 4 hits and 2 walks with 6 strikeouts...threw 76 pitches and 46 strikes...marks his 7th outing with 4-or-fewer hits and 2-or-fewer walks allowed over 5.0+ IP this season...is 1-of-9 pitchers with 7+ such starts in 2026, along with **Bryan Woo** (8 G) and **Logan Gilbert** (7 G).

GUARDING HOME PLATE...made his 2026 season debut against the Guardians, going 6.0 innings with no runs allowed on no hits and 1 walk with 9 strikeouts to become 1-of-2 pitchers in MLB this season with 9+ strikeouts and no hits in a start (also: Shota Imanaga, 4/10)...also became 1-of-2 Mariners pitchers to accomplish the feat (also: Félix Hernández 8/15/12)...is 3-0 in 3 starts against Cleveland with back-to-back scoreless starts over 6.0 IP...is 1-of-6 pitchers in MLB all-time to log back-to-back outings against the Guardians with no runs and 2-or-fewer hits allowed over 6.0+ IP.

OUT OF THE PEN...will make an appearance out of the pen to tail **Logan Gilbert**'s start for his his 7th career relief appearance and 1st of the season...made 6 relief appearances over his last 7 outings of the 2026 season, posting a 2.08 ERA (2 ER, 8.2 IP) with only 1 walk for a 4.00 K/BB over 8.2 innings of relief...allowed 1-or-fewer earned runs in all 6 appearances and no runs in 4-of-6 with 2 being 1.2+ innings...recorded 2 perfect outings, tossing 2.0 perfect innings to earn the win on Sept. 5 vs. Cardinals and closing out Sept. 16's game at Kansas City with 1.0 spotless inning.

QUALITY CONTROL...has recorded a quality start in 8 of his 15 starts this season...is 1-of-6 pitchers in 2026 to have 6+ quality starts with 1-or-fewer walks and 5+ strikeouts...the Mariners are 11-6 when Hancock logs a quality start since 2023 and are 9-4 since the start of 2025...4-of-7 road starts this season have been quality starts with 2-or-fewer walks.

CAREER STRETCH...is 1-of-6 pitchers this season to have 81+ strikeouts, 19-or-fewer walks and 68-or-fewer hits through their first 15 starts of the season...among those 6 pitchers has the 3rd most innings pitched (85.0), trailing **Drew Rasmussen-TB** (86.0) and **Cam Schlichtler-NYY** (89.0).

EARLY BIRD...throws a first pitch strike 64.3% of the time, 11th highest among qualified AL pitchers in 2026...earns a first pitch swing from the batter 37.8% of the time for 6th highest in the league...in at-bats where the 1st pitch is swung at, Hancock has 30 strikeouts to 3 walks (10.0 K/BB) with a 0.861 WHIP.

CROSS FIRE...owns a 1.04 WHIP against left-handed batters, tied for 11th best in MLB (min. 40.0 IP) while ranking T-8th in K/BB (4.3)...has thrown his cutter the 2nd most against left-handers (124 times) behind his 4-seam, owning a .176 (3x17) opponent batting average on the pitch to rank 4th lowest among pitchers with at least 100 cutters thrown to lefty batters...his whiff rate (33.3) on his cutter to LHB ranks 2nd and his K% (21.1) ranks 10th best (min. 100 pitches).

SWITCHING UP THE MIX...over his first 15 starts of the season, Hancock has increased his 4-seam usage by 10.9 percentage points since 2025 and increased his sweeper usage by 15.8...his cutter usage increased 11.0 points from his 0.1% use last season...he owns a 30.2 whiff rate and a .200 opponent batting average (5x25), the 3rd lowest of any of his pitches thrown, on his cutter...his 36.0 whiff rate on the sweeper, now his 3rd most used pitch, ranks 7th highest in AL (min. 200 sweepers thrown)...owns a .200 opponent batting average or better on his cutter (.200), 4-seam (.174), and sweeper (.130)...is 1-of-9 AL pitchers to have a .200 avg or better on 3 different pitches (min. 100 pitches of each pitch type).

TRAFFIC CONTROL...his 92 base runners allowed over 85.0 innings in his first 15 starts, are 6th fewest among pitchers in 2026 through their first 15 games (min. 85.0 IP)...owns a baserunners-per-9 of 9.64, ranking 9th among qualified AL pitchers in 2026.

NO FREE PASSES...was 1-of-2 pitchers this season to have allowed 3-or-fewer walks over 5.0+ IP in each of their first 13 starts (3/29-6/8), along with **Parker Messick-CLE**...has allowed 2-or-fewer walks over 5.0 IP in 12-of-15 appearances...his 2.0 BB/9 is T-7th best in the AL (min. 80.0 IP)...has contributed 8 starts with 6.0+ IP and 2-or-fewer walks to a Mariners pitching staff that has the 2nd most such games (40) in 2026.

CAN'T TOUCH THIS...has thrown 6.0+ innings with 1-or-fewer hits in 2 starts this season (5/26 at ATH and 3/29 vs. CLE)...is 1 of 11 players with multiple such starts this season, joining teammate **Bryan Woo** (5/6 vs. ATL, 4/3 at LAA)...the Mariners have combined for 6 such starts this season, tied for the most in MLB...his 3 games with 6.0+ IP and 2-or-fewer hits (last: 6/1 vs. NYM) are tied for 3rd most in MLB this season, along with **Woo**...is 1-of-10 pitchers to have recorded back-to-back starts of 6.0+ IP with 2-or-fewer walks and 2-or-fewer hits allowed (5/26-6/1) this season.

UP TO BIG UNIT STANDARDS...on May 2, followed up Mariners legend Randy Johnson's Number Retirement Ceremony with a performance of his own, tossing a career-high 14 strikeouts, and becoming the 4th player with 14+ strikeouts and no walks allowed in Mariners franchise history, joining **Randy Johnson** (done 2x), **George Kirby** (done 2x) and **Mark Langston**.
