Combination of Rays wins and Yankees losses needed to win the AL East title for the fifth time in franchise history and the first since earning back-to-back division crowns from 2020-21.

RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their final homestand of the season, a nine-game stretch against the Astros (3-0), Athletics (1-0, two play), and Red Sox (three to play), tonight at Tropicana Field...have won four straight, six of seven, eight of 10, 13 of 18, and 15 of their last 21 games to improve to a season-high 32 games over .500 for the first time since finishing 2023 at 36 games above the mark (99-63)...have won back-to-back sets, are 4-1-1 in their last six series, and 10-5-1 in their last 16...are an MLB-best 35-17 across their last 51 games (July 20–pres.)...following this series, each of their final three opponents currently occupy a postseason spot (vs. BOS, at NYY, at PHI)...have qualified for the postseason for the 10th time in 29 seasons and sixth time in the last eight years (2019–pres.)...are attempting to finish a season with the AL's best record for the fifth time, joining their division titles in 2021, 2020, 2010, and 2008...lead the second-place Yankees by 3.5 games in the AL East standings, holding an advantage of 3.0 games or more each day since Aug. 3...have led the division for 81 consecutive days (June 27–pres.) and spent a total of 121 days at the helm overall as well as 120 days with the AL's best winning pct., both of which are franchise records.

- ★ The Rays claimed their fourth straight win last night courtesy of **Junior Caminero's** second career walk-off PA, both of which have come on homers in the last four days (also: Sept. 11 vs. HOU; see "The Caminer-Show" below for more)...the club has recorded three walk-off wins in its last eight home games (Aug. 30–pres.) compared to two in its first 68 contests at Tropicana Field...only the Guardians (4) have more walk-off victories in that span, and 14 of the other 29 major league clubs have not recorded a walk-off victory in that timeframe.
- ★ This marks the first time the Rays have recorded multiple walk-off wins in a single homestand since Aug. 9-18, 2024, when they walked off the Diamondbacks twice in a three-game span (Aug. 16-18)...it's the fourth time they have launched multiple walk-off homers in a homestand, joining Sept. 4-10, 2023 (**Brandon Lowe & Yandy Diaz**), Sept. 20-25, 2019 (**Nathaniel Lowe & Ji-Man Choi**), and May 12-21, 2006 (**Russell Branyan & Aubrey Huff**).
- ★ Rays pitchers have allowed 14 runs over the last seven games, turning in a majors'-best 2.03 ERA (62.0IP, 14ER) and 0.82 WHIP in that span (Sept. 8–pres.)...the rotation has yielded one or zero runs in six of those seven contests, pitching to a 1.12 ERA (40.1IP, 5ER)...Rays starters have gone 5.0 IP or more while yielding two runs or fewer in all seven games, tied for the fifth-longest streak in club history and their longest since July 23–July 2, 2024 (8GS)...the franchise record is 10 straight starts, established from Aug. 6-16, 2014.
- ★ Dating back to July 20, the Rays are 25-4 when scoring first and 10-13 when allowing the first run...the former mark is tied with the Yankees (25-4) for the best in MLB...they have played the opening run in back-to-back home games after going a season-high six straight games at Tropicana Field in which they permitted the first tally (Aug. 30–Sept. 12), their longest home streak since April 15-25, 2025.
- ★ Tonight, the Rays are seeking their seventh winning streak of five games or more, which would extend their major league lead and tie the second-most such streaks in team history (also: 2019, 2018, 2010), which would trail only the 2021 Rays (8).

THE CAMINER-SHOW—Between his walk-off homers last night and on Friday vs. HOU, **Junior Caminero** became the sixth Ray with multiple walk-off plate appearances in the same homestand and the first with multiple walk-off home runs (see table on the right), according to Elias...he joined **Brandon Lowe** (2023), **Johnny Damon** (2011), **Evan Longoria** (2011), and **Carl Crawford** (2003) as the only Rays to record multiple walk-off homers in a season...this marks the majors' first instance of a player recording multiple walk-off blasts in a homestand since **BAL Colton Cowser** turned the trick earlier this season from May 24-25 vs. DET...Caminero's homer last night came on an 0-2 pitch, the ninth such walk-off hit by a Ray (last: **Jonny DeLuca** triple on May 5, 2024 vs. NYM) and second home run, joining **Gabe Gross'** solo shot on June 1, 2008 vs. CWS...according to Baseball-Reference, it was the eighth opposite-field, walk-off homer in team history, first since **Yandy Diaz** on Sept. 9, 2023 vs. SEA.

★ He has gone deep four times in his last nine games to take sole possession of the AL lead with 41 HR, two ahead of second-ranked HOU **Yordan Alvarez** (39HR)...Caminero is attempting to join **Carlos Peña** (2009, 39HR) as the only Rays to earn at least a share of the AL home run crown...Peña's 39 bombs that season matched NYY **Mark Teixeira** for the Junior Circuit lead...Caminero would need 5 HR across the Rays final 12 games to match Peña's club record from 2007 (46HR).

★ He has gone deep 22 times at Tropicana Field, one shy of the most long balls at home in a season in Rays history, a mark set by Peña in 2007 (23HR).

VICTORY(Y) SCREECH—Reigning AL Player of the Week **Victor Mesa Jr.** has hit safely in nine of his last 10 games (Sept. 4–pres.), going 15-for-34 (.441) with 3 2B, 1 3B, 3 HR, 8 RBI, 4 BB, 10 R, 3 SB, and a 1.353 OPS in that span...the only AL hitter with a better OPS over that stretch is CLE **Travis Bazzana** (1.496)...min. 100 PA, Mesa Jr.'s .990 OPS over his last 41 games since July 7 is the highest in the AL.

THE COUNTDOWN—Several Rays are within reach of notable accomplishments:

- ★ **Chandler Simpson** (308) is two points behind AL Triple Crown candidate HOU **Yordan Alvarez** (310) for the AL batting title, attempting to join **Yandy Diaz** (2023) as the only Rays to pace the AL in average...he could become the sixth player in AL/NL history to win a batting title within their first two major league seasons and the third since 1942 alongside SEA **Ichiro Suzuki** (.350, 1st season - 2001) and Rays Hall of Famer BOS **Wade Boggs** (.361, 2nd season - 1983).
- ★ **Simpson leads the AL in singles (144), is 11st in stolen bases (41), and is 12nd in triples (6)—only four players (5x) in the modern era (since 1900) have paced the AL or NL in all three categories over a full season: LAD Maury Wills in 1962, NYY Snuffy Stirnweiss in 1944, SLB George Sisler in 1922, and DET Ty Cobb in both 1917 and 1911 (Elias)...no Ray has ever paced the AL in singles, and only Carl Crawford (4x, last: 2010) and Mallex Smith (2018) have had the most three-baggers...Crawford (4x, last: 2007) and José Caballero (2024) are the only Rays to lead the league in steals.**
- ★ With three singles last night vs. ATH, Simpson tied Crawford's club record from 2003 (145)...his 145 singles are already the most by an AL hitter since HOU **Jose Altuve** (145) and BOS **Dustin Pedroia** (149) in 2016.
- ★ **Bryan Baker** (40SV) is attempting to join **Alex Colomé** (2017, 47SV) as the only Rays to pace the majors in saves over a full season...he has converted 29 straight save opportunities and could become the 12th AL pitcher (13x) since saves became an official statistic in 1969 to record a streak of 30 consecutive saves or more within a single season and the second since 2017 along with CLE **Emmanuel Clase** (34) in 2024).
- ★ Between **Junior Caminero** (HR), **Simpson** (SB), and **Baker** (SV), the Rays could become the third club since 1969 to have the league leaders (AL or NL) in homers, stolen bases, and saves on the same team, joining Cleveland in 1995 (HR - **Albert Belle**; SB - **Kenny Lofton**; SV - **Jose Mesa**) and Cincinnati in 1970 (HR - **Johnny Bench**; SB - **Bobby Tolan**; SV - **Wayne Granger**), according to Elias.
- ★ The pitching staff leads the majors with a 1.14 WHIP, which would surpass the club record established in 2022 (1.15) and signal the lowest mark since the 2024 Mariners (1.08)...the Rays are attempting to post the majors' best WHIP for the third time, joining 2023 (1.18) and 2012 (1.17).
- ★ The Rays need to go 4-8 or better over their final 12 contests to record their sixth straight month with a .500 record or better...it would mark the first time in franchise history they have finished a full season with a .500 record or better in every month and tie the team record for consecutive such months (also: July 2019–Sept./Oct. 2020).
- ★ Diaz (.299) could become the second player in franchise history to finish back-to-back qualified seasons with a .300 average or better...only Crawford, who turned the trick twice in his career, has accomplished the feat as a Ray, doing so between 2005-07 and 2009-10...the pair are the only players in team history to have multiple qualified .300 or better seasons.

THE RAY WAY—With Sunday's win vs. HOU, the Rays clinched the 10th 90-win season in franchise history and fifth in their last eight non-shortened seasons since 2018—only the Dodgers (8) and Yankees (6, 2 wins shy of 7) have more in the timeframe...they have nailed down the 10th postseason berth in franchise history, first since 2023, and sixth in the last eight seasons (2019-26)...all 10 postseason appearances have come in the last 19 seasons since becoming the Rays in 2008...they clinched a postseason berth on Sept. 11, earliest in franchise history, surpassing 2023 and 2020 (both Sept. 17).

★ The Rays own the majors' third-best winning pct. since their 2008 rebrand (1,614-1,351/.544), trailing the Dodgers (.587) and Yankees (.572).

THE GREEN AND GOLD—The Rays and Athletics continue their second set of a six-game season series tonight after the Rays recorded a sweep from Aug. 10-12 in West Sacramento...the Rays have won seven of their last eight games against the Athletics (July 2, 2025–pres.) and won seven of the last 10 meetings at home...they are 5-1-2 in their last eight series against the A's (May 2, 2022–pres.)...they have gone 14-2 in their last 16 matchups with AL West opponents (July 29–pres.) after starting 6-7.

★ The Rays 9 HR in August's three-game series at ATH matched their fourth most in team history in a three-game series and were their most since April 7-9, 2023 vs. the A's at Tropicana Field (11HR).

★ **Chandler Simpson** has hit safely in each of his eight career games with a PA vs. the A's, going 16-for-29 (.552) with 5 SB.

DOWN ON THE FARM—Today, Minor League Baseball announced its High-A league award winners and All-Star teams...Class-A Bowling Green received several accolades in the South Atlantic League, with OF **Theo Gillen** earning MVP honors and RHP **Jacob Kisting**, who was traded to the Marlins on Aug. 3 as part of the return for **Liam Hicks**, being tabbed as Pitcher of the Year...four Hot Rods were named postseason All-Stars: Gillen, Kisting, DH **Ryan McCoy**, and RHP **Jacob Kmatz** (traded to LAD on Aug. 3).

TONIGHT'S START—Nick Martinez will make his 29th start of the season and 15th at home tonight...marks his 158th career start (309th appearance)...ranks first among qualified AL arms in winning pct. (.778/14-4), is tied for second in wins (career-high 14) with teammate **Drew Rasmussen**, and owns the sixth-best ERA (2.92)...the Rays are 21-7 in his starts, including 10-4 at home...has yielded three runs or fewer in 24 of 28 starts and two runs or fewer in 19 of 28...signed as a free agent on Feb. 10, 2026.

- ★ When pitching in the 1st inning this season, Martinez has posted a 1.61 ERA (28.0IP, 5ER) with 19 strikeouts and a .196 (20-for-102) opp. average...ranks highly among AL arms (min. 25G) in the 1st frame in ERA (5th), opp. OBP (6th, .248), WHIP (6th, 0.86), and opp. AVG (8th).
- ★ His club-leading 15 starts with one or zero runs allowed are tied for fourth in MLB and tied for second in the AL with three others behind NYY **Cam Schlitler** (21G).
- ★ Has logged four straight quality starts since Aug. 23, tied for his third-longest streak in his career (longest: 6G, April 28, 2025–May 26, 2025).

LAST TIME OUT—Logged his career-high 15th quality start of the year despite not factoring into decision on Sept. 10 at ATL (6.1IP, 2H, 0ER, 3SO)...allowed two hits or fewer across 6.0 innings or more for the third time this year...after allowing a two-out single to **Drake Baldwin** in the 1st inning, Martinez set down 14 straight batters and 16 of his final 17 faced before handing the ball over to the bullpen...17 of his 28 starts have been 6.0 innings or more, tied for the eighth-most such starts among AL arms.

- ★ Marked the 20th time in 28 starts he has yielded two extra-base hits or fewer.
- ★ Was the eighth time in franchise history a starter pitched 6.0 shutout innings or more, allowed two baserunners or fewer, and the team lost the game (last: **Ryan Yarbrough**, July 20, 2019 vs. CWS).

JUST THE AS—Martinez is set for his 18th career appearance (13th start) against the Athletics...owns a 5-5 record with a 2.58 ERA (83.2IP, 24ER) and 52 strikeouts...tonight marks his second outing against Athletics this season, joining his 9.0-inning complete game Aug. 11 at ATH (W, 9.0IP, 8H, 4ER, 5SO, HR)...see the note "I CAN GO THE DISTANCE" below for more...his teams have gone 10-8 in his 17 career outings vs. the Athletics.

- ★ He is set to make his sixth start of the season against an AL West club, posting a 4-0 record, a 2.45 ERA (33.0IP, 9ER), and 18 strikeouts in those starts...the Rays are 5-0 when he pitches against the AL West this year...across 61 career outings (41 starts) opposite AL West foes, he owns a 15-17 mark with a 3.04 ERA (278.2IP, 94ER), 174 strikeouts, and 19 quality starts...his teams are 30-33 in his career outings against the division.
- ★ When facing AL opponents this year, Martinez has gone 11-3, pitching to a 3.06 ERA (106.0IP, 36ER) with 57 strikeouts.

LOVE LETTER TO THE TROP—In 14 starts at home this season, Martinez is 7-3 with a 3.81 ERA (80.1IP, 34ER) and 51 strikeouts...has not earned a winning decision at the Trop since logging a quality start on July 25 vs. CLE (W, 6.0IP, 4H, 0ER, 5SO)...with a win tonight, he would become the sixth-oldest Rays starting pitcher (36.024) in franchise history to earn a win at Tropicana Field (oldest: **Rich Hill**, 41.104 - June 23, 2021 vs. BOS)...would also earn his eighth home win of the season, becoming the second-oldest pitcher to win eight games or more in a season at Tropicana Field behind **Charlie Morton**'s (36.317) eight wins in 2019.

SERIES-LY SPEAKING—Tonight marks Martinez's 13th start of the season pitching in a potential three-game-series-clinching contest, which will be tied for the fourth-most such starts in the majors this year and tied for the second most in the AL behind BAL **Shane Bieber** (14GS) in those starts, Martinez boasts a 6-0 record with a 1.91 ERA (75.1IP, 16ER) and an 0.89 WHIP, ranking second among AL qualifiers and sixth in the majors in ERA, while ranking third in the AL and sixth in the majors in WHIP...the Rays have gone 10-2 in Martinez's such starts this season.

- ★ Martinez and NYY **Cam Schlitler** (6-0) are the only two pitchers in MLB with six wins or more without a loss in three-game-series-clinching contests in 2026....the last pitcher to win six such games or more without a loss in a season was CLE **Corey Kluber** (8-0) in 2018...the only other Ray in club history to turn the trick under the same criteria was **Alex Cobb** (6-0) in 2013.

TURNING BACK THE CLOCK—Martinez has a chance to become the fifth AL pitcher (6x) in the Wild Card era (since 1995) to make 30 starts or more and record a sub-3.00 ERA in an age-35-or-older campaign (age as of June 30)...he would join **TEX Jacob deGrom** (30GS/2.97 ERA, 2025), **HOU Justin Verlander** (2018-19), **OAK Bartolo Colon** (30/2.65, 2013), and **TOR Roger Clemens** (33/2.65, 1998)...the right-hander's 14 wins are second most in franchise history during such a season behind **Corey Kluber** (16) in 2022 (age 35), and his 166.0 IP are fourth most, trailing **Charlie Morton** (2019, 194.2IP), **Bobby Witt** (180.1IP, 1999), and Kluber (180.1IP, 2022).

- ★ This season, Martinez became the fifth player in Rays history to earn an All-Star selection in an age-35-or-older season, joining Morton (2019, 35), **RHP Fernando Rodney** (2012, 35), **OF Greg Vaughn** (2001, 35), and **INF Fred McGriff** (2000, 36)...since 2020, the only AL pitchers to turn the trick are Martinez, Verlander (2026, 2022), and deGrom (2025).

I CAN GO THE DISTANCE—On Aug. 11 at ATH, Martinez recorded his first career 9.0-inning complete game, the third by a Ray since the start of 2017 along with **Zack Littell** on May 31, 2025 at HOU and **Ryan Yarbrough** on June 3, 2021 at NYY...he became oldest pitcher in franchise history (36.006) to record a 9.0-inning complete game and one of five pitchers since the start of 2020 to do so after turning 36 (9x), joining **AZ Merrill Kelly** (May 15, 2026 at COL - 37.213), **STL Adam Wainwright** (5x, last: Aug. 13, 2022 vs. MIL - 40.348), **HOU Zack Greinke** (June 4, 2021 at TOR - 37.226), and **WSH Max Scherzer** (May 2, 2021 vs. MIA - 36.279)...he became the eighth pitcher in franchise history (15x) to toss a 9.0-inning complete game on 101 pitches or fewer and the first since **Chris Archer** on Aug. 20, 2015 at HOU (98 pitches).

- ★ He was the first pitcher in the majors to toss a 9.0-inning complete game while allowing four earned runs or more since KC **Jordan Lyles** on May 9, 2023 vs. CWS and the first to turn the trick and earn the win since MIN **Bartolo Colon** on Aug. 4, 2017 vs. TEX...Martinez is the 10th pitcher in the modern era (since 1900) to earn the win in a 9.0-inning complete game while throwing 101 pitches or fewer and allowing four earned runs or more.
- ★ It marked his second career complete game overall, joining an 8.0-inning effort in a 1-0 loss on Sept. 27, 2024 at CHC as a member of the Reds.

CROSSING GUARD—Martinez currently leads the majors with a 3.5 pct. walk rate, outpacing rotation-mate **Drew Rasmussen** (4.5%)...he is attempting to become the third Ray to pace MLB in the category alongside **Corey Kluber** (3.0%) in 2022 and **David Price** (3.6%) in 2013...**Zack Littell** (4.2%) finished as the MLB leader last season, but he was dealt to the Reds ahead of the 2025 trade deadline...the 3.8 pct. walk rate would rank fifth in club history to Kluber in 2022, Price (3.3%) in 2014, **Zach Eflin** (3.4%) in 2023, and Price in 2013.
