METSELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Cubs, 6-3, last night...The Mets have won three straight, six of their last seven games and eight of their last 10...The Mets are a season-high 10-games above .500 for the first time this season...The team has not been 10 games above .500 since the end of the 2019 season (also, 10 games)...They have not been more than 10 games over .500 since the end of 2016, when they were 12 games above .500...The Mets have been in first place since Saturday, May 8... The team is 5.0 games above in the division, equaling their largest lead this year... This is their longest streak atop the NL East since the end of the 2015 season...The Mets earned their 12th series win of the season and their eighth series win at home. Tonight, the team finishes a seven game homestand (5-1) against the Padres (2-1) and $\label{lower} Cubs \, (3\hbox{-}0) \dots Following \, this \, series, the \, Mets \, head \, to \, the \, nation's \, capital \, for \, four \, games \, in \, three \, days \, against \, the \, Nationals.$

HOW SWEEP IT IS: The Mets are seeking their fifth sweep of the season today...The Mets are looking for their first four-game sweep of the Cubs since June 30-July 3, 2016 in New York...That was also the last time the Mets swept the Cubs in a series of any length.

REVOLUTION NINE: The Mets have struck out at least nine batters in a franchise-record 10 straight games, dating back to June 5...The Mets have struck out 120 batters in that time frame...The old franchise record was eight, done five times previously.

WHEN YOU'RE FIFTEEN: The Mets struck out 16 batters last night...The team has struck out 15 batters in back-to-back games...Last night marked the 11th time this season the Mets have struck out 15 or more batters in a game this year, the most in the majors...The Padres are second with six such games...The Mets own a 10.22 strikeout per 9 IP ratio, the fourth-best mark in the majors and the third-best mark

DON'T GET ME STARTED: Mets starters own a 1.70 ERA (27 earned runs/143.1 innings) in 26 home games this season...The Mets starting rotation owns a 2.69 ERA (90 earned runs/301.1 innings) this season, the best mark in the major leagues... deGrom leads the major leagues with a 0.54 ERA, while Taijuan Walker is seventh with a 2.12 ERA...Marcus Stroman is 13th in the majors with a 2.33 mark.

TOTAL DOMINATION: Dominic Smith is 4-9 with four runs, a double, two home runs. three RBI, two walks, a .583 OBP, a .1.222 SLG and a 1.806 OPS over his last four games...In 13 career games against the Cubs, Smith owns a .289.372.658 slash line with seven runs, two doubles, four home runs, six RBI, three walks and a 1.030 OPS... His four home runs against the Cubs are tied with Arizona for the most outside the NL East

deGOAT: The Mets have won Jacob deGrom's last six starts, which is the third-longest such streak since his debut in 2014...The Mets won eight consecutive starts by deGrom in 2017 (June 12-July 24) and 2015 (July 8-August 24)...Despite pitching only 3.0 innings, deGrom had eight strikeouts, including seven in a row to conclude his outing...He extended his scoreless streak to 25.0 innings and lowered his ERA is 0.54 (four earned runs/67.0 innings)...He recorded an RBI single in the second inning and now has six RBI this year, which matches his career high (also, 2019)...Overall, he is batting .423 (11-26) this season...That is the highest batting average as a pitcher this year.

THE AMAZING JONATHAN: Jonathan Villar has reached base safely in six straight games...Over his last 15 games, Villar is batting .333 (18-54) with 13 runs, five doubles, two home runs, three RBI, nine walks, a .438 OBP and a .537 SLG...He owns a .269/.395/.403 slash line in 23 games at home...He has hit in the leadoff spot in 21 games this year, batting .269/.360/.487 with 17 runs, five doubles, four home runs, five RBI and 10 walks when batting first...He owns a .524 OBP in the first inning this year...That ranks eighth in the major leagues (min. 10 PA).

Seaver passed away on August 31, 2020 at age 75...Seaver won 311 games, had a 2.86 ERA and struck out 3,640 batters over a 20-year major league career that spanned from 1967-1986, earning 12 All-Star selections in the process...He won three Cy Young Awards with the team in 1969, 1973 and 1975 as well as the NL Rookie of the Year Award in 1967.

STROMAN NEWS & NOTES

LAST START: Will make his 14th start of the season and seventh at Citi Field today...Will be his third career start against Chicago-NL and second with the Mets...In his last start, Stroman pitched 6.1 innings, giving up one run, earned, on six hits against the Padres at Citi Field...He did not yield a run through his first six innings before giving up a home run to the first batter he faced in the seventh...Struck out a season-high-tying eight batters and walked just one in the Mets' 4-1 win over San Diego... Earned his sixth win this season and third in as many decisions...It was his seventh consecutive start of at least 6.0 innings, the longest streak of his career.

A GOOD RUN: Stroman's 2.33 ERA (20 earned runs/77.1 innings) through 13 starts this season is his best 13-start stretch by that measure in his career...He has allowed two earned runs or fewer and pitched 5.0 innings or more in 10 of his 13 starts this year, tied for the fifth-most in the NL.

FEELING SIX-Y: Stroman has completed at least 6.0 innings in each of his last seven starts...That is the longest streak of his career...Stroman has a 2.49 ERA (12 earned runs/43.1 innings) over this stretch.

EXTRA, EXTRA: Stroman has allowed only 12 extra-base hits in 77.1 innings, the second-fewest among the 55 pitchers in the majors who have thrown at least 70.0 innings this season...Only Brandon Woodruff (10) has allowed fewer...Ranks 14th in the majors and 10th in the NL in opponent slugging (.325)...He has four starts this season in which he's pitched at least 5.0 innings without allowing a single extra-base hit, tied for the second-most in the majors.

KEEP IT ON THE GROUND: Stroman currently ranks second in the majors and leads the NL with a 54.8 percent ground ball rate...He is 15th in the NL with a 0.93 HR/9 ratio.

STAY HOT: Stroman has earned three wins in his last five starts, posting a 1.74 ERA (six earned runs/31.0 innings)...He has allowed only two home runs in the stretch while walking eight and striking out 32...The Mets are 4-1 in those games.

VS. CHICAGO-NL: Making his third career start against the Cubs...Has gone 1-1 against Chicago in those two starts with a 2.40 ERA (four earned runs/15.0 innings)...In his last start against the Cubs on August 27, 2019, Stroman suffered the loss, tossing 6.0 innings and allowing four runs, earned, on six hits...Struck out seven batters and walked two in the Mets' 5-2 loss at Citi Field...Stroman allowed a two-run homer in both the fifth and sixth innings...In his only other start vs. the Cubbies, he threw his first career complete game shutout.

LET'S GO STREAKING: Stroman did not allow a run in his 14.1 innings until giving up a run in the seventh inning at Colorado on April 18...This scoreless streak extended from the last 2.0 innings of his first start on April 6, his 0.1 innings on April 11, his 6.0 scoreless innings on April 13 and his 6.0 scoreless innings on April 18...He fell 1.2 innings shy of tying his career-best streak (16.0 IP).
