**METSSELLANEOUS:** The Mets blanked the Diamondbacks, 5-0, on Sunday, earning their way to their third series victory of the season...The Mets have won four of their last five games...Today, the Mets continue their first homestand of the year, a seven-game stand against the Arizona Diamondbacks (2-1) and the San Francisco Giants (four games)...Following this series, the Mets head to Arizona (three games) and St. Louis (three games).

**DOUBLE DOUBLE:** The Mets are set to play their first doubleheader of the season today...Last year, the Mets played 14 doubleheaders...According to Elias, the last time a team played 14 or more doubleheaders in a season was in 1979, when the Mets played 19 doubleheaders and the Expos played 15...The Mets went 11-3 in the first game of a doubleheader and 6-8 in the second game...This will mark the first doubleheader between these two teams since April 23 2012...The Mets lost both games.

**BLANK STREET:** The Mets posted their third shutout win of the season on Sunday...It is the fourth time New York has had three shutouts in its first 10 games of a season (also, 1968, 1985 and 1988).

**STARTING OFF:** The Mets starting staff has gone 6-0 with a 1.07 ERA (six earned runs/50.1 innings) with 11 walks and 59 strikeouts...That is the best 10-game start since the advent of the earned run in 1913, per *Sportradar*...New York's starter has allowed one or no runs in eight straight games...According to *Elias*, that is tied for the longest streak in team history (also, May 20-28, 2010)...The starting staff leads the majors in ERA, opponent's batting average (.158) and isthird with 59 strikeouts...Their 50.1 innings rank sixth.

**THRIVE AT 5.0:** Tylor Megill has thrown at least 5.0 innings, allowed no runs and yielded three hits or fewer in each of his last three starts since October 1, 2021...Only three pitchers have ever put up a comparable line in four consecutive starts: Joe Musgrove (September 20, 2020-April 9, 2021), Michael Fulmer (May 27-June 12, 2016) and Jake Arrieta (September 22, 2015-April 4, 2016).

**LET'S GO STREAKING:** Megill has won three straight starts, marking the first time he has won consecutive outings in his career...His scoreless streak currently sits at 16.1 innings going back to his September 24, 2021 start at Milwaukee...It is the second-longest scoreless streak of his career, behind 17.2 scoreless innings from July 10-28, 2021...This is the second time Megill has produced at least two straight scoreless starts (also, 6.0 IP on both July 17 at Pittsburgh and July 23 vs. Toronto last season).

**MAXIMUM OVERDRIVE:** Max Scherzer has won 13 consecutive decisions, tied for the longest winning streak of his career (he also won his first 13 decisions of his 2013 Cy Young Award-winning season with Detroit)...His teams have won each of his last 16 regular season starts...He is unbeaten in his last 21 starts (more on this below), going 13-0 since June 4, 2021 with a 2.60 ERA (35 earned runs/121.0 innings) to go along with 154 strikeouts and just 26 walks in that span.

**WIN, WIN, WIN:** Scherzer has not suffered a loss in any of his last 21 starts...That is tied for the 16th-longest streak of starts without a loss in modern MLB history...Tonight, he aims to tie his opposing starter, Logan Webb, who is currently on a 22-start streak without taking a loss...Roger Clemens (30 straight) holds the all-time mark...The last pitcher before Scherzer and Webb to have a streak this long was Walker Buehler, whose 23-start unbeaten streak lasted from 2019-2021.

**HE SLAYS GIANTS:** Scherzer gone 3-1 with a 1.98 ERA (eight earned runs/36.1 innings) over his last six appearances, a span that includes five quality starts, against San Francisco going back to the 2016 season...The last time he faced the Giants, June 11, 2021, he left the game after 0.1 inning, tossing just 12 pitches before exiting with an injury and hitting the IL with groin inflammation.

**STRONG METS DEBUT:** Scherzer has won each of his first two starts with the Mets...Tonight, he aims to become the first Mets hurler since Jorge Sosa (2007) to start and win his first three games with New York.

**UNDER THE CITI LIGHTS:** Tonight, Scherzer makes his first home start with the Mets...He has started 14 games here as a visitor, going 10-2 with a 2.14 ERA (22 earned runs/92.2 innings)...He has won eight consecutive decisions at Citi Field, posting eight quality starts in nine outings during that unbeaten stretch since July 9, 2016.

**THAT'S OFFENSIVE:** The Mets have blasted 12 home runs this year...That is tied for fifth in the majors and tied for second in the National League...They lead the majors with a .358 OBP, tied for third with 44 walks, are fourth with 51 runs and are sixth in the majors with a .253 batting average...Though 10 games this year, the Mets have outscored their opponents 51-25.

**GIANTS-METS NOTES:** The Mets have lost the season series against the Giants in each of the last two years...New York won the series, in the prior three seasons (2017-2019).

**MOVING ON UP:** Pete Alonso hit his 109th career home run on Sunday vs. Arizona... That breaks his tie with Jose Reyes for sole possession of 13th on the team's all-time list...Ed Kranepool (118) is next, followed by Edgardo Alfonzo (120)...Alonso has socked 47 home runs at Citi Field...That is fourth in Mets history...David Wright is third with 49, followed by Michael Conforto (66) and the franchise leader, Lucas Duda (71).

**FOR PETE'S SAKE:** Alonso has an NL-leading 14 RBI through the Mets' first 10 games, equaling his start to his rookie campaign in 2019 and tied for the fourth-most RBI through 10 team games in Mets history...He is batting .231 (9-39) with seven runs three doubles, three home runs, 14 RBI, a walk, a .538 SLG and an .827 OPS in 10 games this year...He is batting .357 (5-14) with five runs, two doubles, three homes, 11 RBI with a 1.500 OPS in three games as a designated hitter this year.

**LINDORLE:** Francisco Lindor has reached base safely in all 10 games this year... He is batting .273 (9-33) with nine runs, two doubles, three home runs, seven RBI, nine walks, a .442 OBP, a .606 SLG with a 1.048 OPS...He ranks eighth in the Senior Circuit in OBP.

**DOUBLE DARE:** Eduardo Escobar collected his fifth double of the season in the sixth inning yesterday...Six of Escobar's eight hits have gone for extra bases...He is tied for the NL lead with five doubles...He has drawn nine walks in nine games this year...Escobar drew a total of 48 walks in 146 games last season.

**EL JEFF-E:** In nine games this year, Jeff McNeil is batting .344 (11-32) with four runs, a home run, four RBI, five walks, a steal, a .447 OBP, a .438 SLG and an .885 OPS...He has reached base safely in eight of his nine games...He has collected four multi-hit games this year, which is tied for the eighth-most in the majors and tied for sixth-most in the NL.

**OPS, I DID IT AGAIN:** J.D. Davis owns a lifetime OPS of .890 OPS at Citi Field...It is the highest total in franchise history (min. 100 PA)...Jeff McNeil is second with an .875 OPS at the home of the Mets.

**OUCH:** The Mets have been hit by 12 pitches this year, which leads the majors... New York was plunked 94 times last year, which ranked fourth in the majors and third in the National League...Since 2018, the Mets have been hit by 319 pitches, the most in the majors...In his career, Pete Alonso has been plunked 42 times... That is the fourth-highest total in the majors since he entered the league in 2019... Teammate Mark Canha ranks second in that span with 56 HBP, while Starling Marte is fifth (40) in the last four seasons.

**THE CHARMING MAN:** In five games this season, Drew Smith has posted a perfect ERA, allowing only two hits, two walks and striking out seven in 5.2 innings of work...He owns a career record of 4-3 with a 2.96 ERA (27 earned runs/82.0 innings) with 26 walks and 73 strikeouts...Smith was acquired by the Mets from the Tampa Bay Rays on July 27, 2017 in exchange for Lucas Duda.

**NEED FOR SPEED:** The Mets have totaled nine stolen bases through 10 games... The Mets did not record their ninth steal until May 12 last season in the team's 32nd game...Overall, the Mets stole a total of 54 bases in 2021...The Mets are tied for second in the majors in stolen bases this year.

**ED, EDD AND EDDY:** Edwin Diaz has record 65 saves as a member of the Mets... That places him tied for 10th with Skip Lockwood on the franchise's all-time list... Next up is Neil Allen who recorded 69 as a member of the Mets...He has recorded 174 saves in his career, which places him sixth on the active list...Since arriving in New York, Diaz is 9-14 with 65 saves, a 3.95 ERA (66 earned runs/150.1 innings) with 61 walks and 245 strikeouts...His 245 strikeouts as a reliever in that span is the third-highest total in the majors...Only Liam Hendriks (281) and Josh Hader (277) have struck out more...Additionally, his 245 strikeouts are the 14th most by a reliever in franchise history...Turk Wendell is 13th with 259.

**THAT'S SHOW BUSINESS:** Buck Showalter became the first manager in Mets history to win each of his first three contests...Showalter has 20 years of managerial experience with four different teams: Yankees (1992-1995), Diamondbacks (1998-2000), Rangers (2003-2006) and Orioles (2010-2018)...A three-time AL Manager of the Year winner (1994, 2004, 2014), Showalter ranks fourth among active managers in career managerial wins with 1,558.

**100 KLUB:** Megill punched out César Hernández looking, his first batter faced, on April 7 at Washington for the 100th strikeout of his career...He is the seventh Mets hurler who began his career with New York to record 100 or more strikeouts in his first 19 career starts with the club...He is the first to accomplish the feat since Steven Matz in 2016.

**VS. SAN FRANCISCO:** Has faced the Giants twice in his career, taking the loss in his most recent start on August 24, 2021...Posted a 7.45 ERA (eight earned runs/9.2 innings) across the two starts...Is 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA (11 earned runs/14.2 innings) in three career starts against the NL West.

**2021 RECAP:** Had his contract selected on June 23 and remained with the Mets for the rest of the season...Went 4-6 in 18 starts with a 4.52 ERA (45 earned runs/89.2 innings), 27 walks and 99 strikeouts...Among pitchers to make their first 18 career starts with the Mets, his 99 punchouts rank seventh...Posted a major league-leading 1.04 ERA in July (min. 25.0 IP), one of three pitchers in Mets history to post an ERA of 1.04 or lower in the month of July...Held right-handed batters to a .200 average, the 10th-best mark in the National League (min. 175 batters faced)...His .244 opponents' OBP against righties ranked fourth in the NL.

**2021 RECAP:** Signed with the Mets on December 1, 2021...Was traded from Washington to the Dodgers on the day of the trade deadline last season...Led the majors in WHIP (career-best 0.86) and opponent batting average (.185)...Had the second-best ERA (career-best 2.46) in the majors and ranked fourth in strikeouts (236)...Notched his ninth career 200-strikeout season...Started the NL Wild Card Game for LA, throwing 4.1 innings of one-run ball in a 3-1 win over St. Louis...Made two appearances in the NLDS against the Giants and recorded the final out of the decisive Game 5 in that series to earn his first career MLB save...Made one start in the NLCS against Atlanta...Finished third in the NL Cy Young vote, his sixth career top-3 finish.

### TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CHRIS BASSITT (2-0, 0.75)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Extended his season-opening scoreless streak to 11.0 innings before allowing a solo home run in the sixth in his April 15 start against Arizona in the Mets' home opener...Allowed just that one run over 6.0 innings, yielding just two hits with two walks and six strikeouts.

**VS. SAN FRANCISCO:** Is set to face the Giants for the fourth time in his career...The first three starts he's made against them were as a member of the A's as part of the Bay Bridge rivalry...He has not allowed more than two runs in a start against the Giants and owns a lifetime 1.96 ERA against the club.
