AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their nine-game road trip tonight with the first game of a three-game series at Texas (through Wed.)...are 5-1 on the road trip after sweeping the Red Sox in a three-game set and winning two-of-three games at Houston...following this road trip, will return home for a seven-game homestand, featuring a four-game set vs. Baltimore (5/1-4) and a three-game series vs. Texas (5/5-7).

- ▶ **Their 18-10 (.643) record is the best in the American League and tied for the fourth-best in the Majors...** their 18 wins are the most in the AL and tied for the third-most in the Majors.
- ▶ Had their season-high eight-game winning streak snapped on Sunday (4/17-25)...matched their longest single-season winning streak in the last four seasons since 2023 (also 8G from 9/20-28/25 and 5/29-6/6/24)...was tied for the second-longest winning streak in the Majors this season, trailing only the Cubs' 10-game streak from 4/14-24 (the Padres also had an eight-game streak from 4/8-16).
- ▶ **Have won nine of their last 11 games (since 4/15) and 10 of their last 13 games (since 4/13).**
- ▶ Have won or split seven of their nine series this season (6-2-1), including each of their last four (3-0-1)...have also won four of their five road series this year.
- ▶ **The Yankees are 14-3 this season when scoring first.**
- ▶ The Yankees' +47 run differential this season is the best in the AL and the third-best in the Majors.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees had their season-high eight-game winning streak snapped with a 7-4 loss against the Astros on Sunday at Daikin Park...**RHP Luis Gil** (4.0IP, 5H, 6R/ER, 3BB, 0K, 2HR, 1HP, 1WP, 1PO) started and took the loss...**RF Aaron Judge** (1-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI) homered for the third time in his career on his birthday, hitting his 10th home run of the year with a solo shot in the sixth inning...**1B Paul Goldschmidt** (2-for-4, 1R, 2 doubles, 1RBI) and **C J.C. Escarra** (1-for-4, 1R, 1 double, 1RBI) each hit RBI doubles in the ninth inning...**3B Ryan McMahon** (1-for-4, 1RBI) hit an RBI single in the ninth inning...**2B Jazz Chisholm Jr.** (2-for-4, 1R, 1SB) recorded his fourth multi-hit game in his last six games.

ALL THAT JAZZ: INF Jazz Chisholm Jr. recorded two hits on Sunday at Houston...has recorded multiple hits in three of his last four games (since 4/23) and four of his last six games (since 4/21), batting .375/.423/.625 (9-for-24) with 6R, 2HR, 6RBI, 2BB and 1SB over that six-game stretch.

McMAHON OF THE HOUR: INF Ryan McMahon hit an RBI single in the ninth inning on Sunday at Houston...has hit safely in each of his last four games (since 4/23), batting .357/.357/.571 (5-for-14) with 2R, 1HR and 3RBI over that span.

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters lead the Majors this season in walks (134) and PA/BB (7.96), rank second in home runs (43, first in AL), are tied for second in stolen bases (31, first in AL), fourth in SLG (.429, second in AL) and pitches per PA (4.01, third in AL), fifth in OPS (.760, second in AL) and runs per game (5.21, first in AL), sixth in runs scored (146, second in AL) and XBH (90, third in AL), tied for sixth in stolen base percentage (81.6%, third in AL) and ninth in OBP (.331, fifth in AL).

FOUR SCORE: Yankees batters have scored at least 4R in each of their last 11 games (since 4/15) and 14 of their last 15 games (since 4/11)...their 11-game streak with at least 4R is their second-longest streak in the last seven seasons (since 2020), trailing only a 12-game streak from 6/29-7/11/25...the Yankees are 16-5 this season when scoring at least 4R.

RICE RICE BABY: C/INF Ben Rice has hit .326/.450/.733 (28-for-86) with 25R, 8 doubles, 9HR, 21RBI, 20BB/21BB, 1HP, 2SF and 1SB in 27 games this season...17 of his 28H this season have gone for extra bases (8 doubles, 9HR)...**has reached base safely in 21-of-23 starts.**

- ▶ **Has hit 5HR in his last 10 games (since 4/16).**
- ▶ **Ranks second in the Majors in OBP (.450, second in AL), SLG (.733, second in AL) and OPS (1.182, second in AL),** third in XBH (17, second in AL), tied for fourth in runs scored (25, second in AL), tied for fifth in HR (nine, tied for fourth in AL), sixth in PA/BB (5.45, fourth in AL) and seventh in BA (.326, fifth in AL)...also ranks fourth in the AL in RBI (21), and tied for eighth in doubles (eight) and walks (20).

PITCH PERFECT: Yankees pitchers allowed 7R on Sunday after allowing only 10R total over their previous six games (4/19-25)...**have posted a 2.36 ERA (80.0IP, 21ER) over their last nine games (since 4/17)**...have allowed 1ER-or-fewer in five of those nine games.

LAND OF THE FRIED: LHP Max Fried will make his seventh start of the season in tonight's series opener at Texas...**in six starts this season, has gone 3-1 with a 2.40 ERA (41.1IP, 11ER)**...has held opponents to a .155/.219/.218 (22-for-142) slash line this year...**has allowed 3R-or-fewer in five of his six starts and has not allowed a run in three of his starts.**

- ▶ Is tied for first in the Majors in innings pitched (41.1, first in AL) and starts (six, tied for first in AL), ranks second in opponents' OPS (.438, second in AL), third in opponents' SLG (.218, second in AL) and HR/9.0IP (0.22, first in AL), fourth in opponents' OBP (.219, second in AL) and WHIP (0.77, second in AL), fifth in opponents' BA (.155, second in AL) and tied for 10th in wins (three, tied for fourth in AL)...also ranks sixth in the AL in ERA (2.40).
- ▶ Has tossed at least 6.0IP in five of his six starts, tied for the most in the Majors...his three starts of at least 7.0IP and two with at least 8.0IP are also tied for the most in the Majors.
- ▶ **As a Yankee, has made 18 starts after a Yankees loss and has gone 12-1 with a 1.82 ERA (118.2IP, 24ER) in those starts**...has tossed at least 6.0IP in 16 of those starts and has not allowed an ER in eight of them...the Yankees have gone 13-5 when Fried starts after a loss.
- ▶ Has gone 3-0 with a 0.92 ERA (29.1IP, 3ER) on the road this season...three of his four road starts this season have been scoreless.
- ▶ Has gone 9-1 with a 1.95 ERA (87.2IP, 19ER) over his last 13 starts (since 8/22/25)...has allowed 1R-or-fewer in eight of those 13 starts...has tossed at least 6.0IP in 11 of those 13 starts and at least 7.0IP in eight of those starts.
- ▶ As a Yankee, has gone 22-6 with a 2.78 ERA (236.2IP, 73ER) and 221K in 38 starts...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 25 of his 38 starts and 1ER-or-fewer in 18 of those starts.

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge celebrated his 34th birthday on Sunday and hit his 10th home run of the season with a solo shot in the sixth inning...marked his third career HR on his birthday: also hit a two-run HR at Boston on his 25th birthday in 2017 and hit a solo HR vs. Baltimore on his 30th birthday in 2022...in seven career games on his birthday, has hit .320/.452/.800 (8-for-25) with 6R, 3 doubles, 3HR, 8RBI and 6BB.

- ▶ His HR on Sunday tied Matt Williams (378) for 77th place on the all-time home runs list.
- ▶ Has reached base multiple times in five of his last six games (since 4/21) and seven of his last nine games (since 4/17)...has reached base in 21 of his last 22 games (since 4/3).

FAST AND FURIOUS: Yankees baserunners have recorded 31SB this season, the most in the AL and tied for the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Milwaukee (36SB)...their 81.6 stolen base percentage is the third-best in the AL and tied for the sixth-best in the Majors.

- ▶ Marks the Yankees' most stolen bases through their first 28 games of a season in the last 25 years (since 2002)...the last time they recorded more was 2001 (34SB).
- ▶ **INF/OF José Caballero** (115B) is tied for first in the AL and tied for second in the Majors in stolen bases...**INF Jazz Chisholm Jr.** (95B) is tied for third in the AL and tied for sixth in the Majors in stolen bases.
- ▶ **INF/OF José Caballero** and **INF Jazz Chisholm Jr.** are only the third pair of Yankees teammates in the last 111 years (since 1916) to each record at least 9SB through the club's first 28 games of a season (also Chuck Knoblauch-115B and Alfonso Soriano-95B in 2001, and Mickey Rivers-145B and Willie Randolph-115B in 1976).

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starters have posted a 2.90 ERA (161.1IP, 52ER) and 159K in 28 starts this season...have allowed 2R-or-fewer in eight of their last nine starts (since 4/17), posting a 2.02 ERA (58.0IP, 13ER) over that span.

- ▶ Have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 24 of their 28 starts this season.
- ▶ Have allowed 2R-or-fewer in 17 of their 28 starts, tied for their third-most through their first 28 games of a season, trailing only their 23 starts in 2022 and 18 starts in 1958.
- ▶ **Lead the Majors in opponents' OBP (.262), opponents' OPS (.593), WHIP (1.00) and K/BB (3.98),** rank second in ERA (2.90, first in AL), strikeouts (159, second in AL), opponents' BA (.205, first in AL), opponents' SLG (.331, first in AL) and BB/9.0IP (2.23, second in AL), third in innings pitched (161.1, second in AL) and strikeout rate (24.8%, second in AL), sixth in HR/9.0IP (0.89, third in AL) and 10th in K/9.0IP (8.87, sixth in AL).

HIP HIP JOSÉ: INF/OF José Caballero owns a season-high 11-game on-base streak (since 4/15), tied for the second-longest on-base streak of his career, trailing only a 12-game streak from 3/28-4/12/24 (also 11G from 9/10-26/25)...is batting .400/.442/.600 (16-for-40) with 7R, 2 doubles, 2HR, 5RBI, 2BB, 1HP and 5SB over that span...had his career-high-tying seven-game hitting streak snapped on Sunday.

- ▶ Has recorded multiple hits in three of his last four games (since 4/23), four of his last eight (since 4/18), five of his last 10 (since 4/16) and seven of his last 15 (since 4/11).
- ▶ Is batting .357/.390/.589 (20-for-56) with 9R, 4 doubles, 3HR, 10RBI, 2BB, 1HP and 6SB over his last 15 games (since 4/11).
- ▶ Has hit .333/.400/.444 (6-for-18) with 2 doubles, 7RBI and 2BB with RISP this year.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP MAX FRIED (3-1, 2.40 ERA)

LHP Max Fried will make his seventh start of the season in tonight's series opener at Texas...the 32-year-old will pitch on regular four days' rest...last pitched on Wednesday at Boston and earned his third win of the season in the Yankees' 4-1 victory after tossing 8.0 scoreless innings (3H, 2BB, 9K)...in six starts this season, has gone 3-1 with a 2.40 ERA (41.1IP, 11ER)...went 19-5 with a 2.86 ERA (195.1IP, 164H, 73R/62ER, 51BB, 189K, 14HR) in 32 starts in his first season with the Yankees in 2025, setting career highs in wins, starts, innings pitched, strikeouts and pickoffs (eight)...over 10 Major League seasons with the Atlanta Braves (2017-24) and Yankees (2025-26), has gone 95-42 with six complete games (four shutouts) and a 3.01 ERA (1,121.0IP, 969H, 416R/375ER, 307BB, 1,084K, 91HR) in 206 career games (189 starts)...among Major League pitchers since 2020 (min. 700.0IP), ranks first in ERA (2.80), wins (76), winning percentage (.710) and pickoffs (27), is tied for first in shutouts (four), second in HR/9.0IP (0.64), opponents' SLG (.326) and opponents' OPS (.605), third in groundball percentage (53.6%) and groundball/flyball ratio (2.14), sixth in opponents' OBP (.279) and WHIP (1.08), and tied for sixth in complete games (five)...his 93 wins since 2019 are the most in the Majors...the three-time All-Star (2022, '24-25) and four-time Gold Glove Award winner (2020-22, '25) has finished in the top-five of Cy Young Award voting three times in his career (second in 2022, fourth in 2025 and fifth in 2020)...the Santa Monica, Calif., native was originally selected by San Diego in the first round (seventh overall) of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft...was acquired by Atlanta along with INF Jace Peterson, OF Dustin Peterson and OF Mallek Smith in exchange for OF Justin Upton and RHP Aaron Northcraft on 12/19/14...was signed by the Yankees to an eight-year contract extending through the 2032 season on 12/17/24.

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his third win of the season on Wednesday at Boston in the Yankees' 4-1 victory after tossing 8.0 scoreless innings (3H, 2BB, 9K)...retired his final 14BF...marked his longest scoreless start as a Yankee and his longest since 9/27/24 vs. Kansas City with Atlanta (8.2IP)...marked the longest scoreless start by a Yankee since Carlos Rodón tossed 8.0 scoreless innings on 7/11/25 vs. Chicago-NL...his 8.0IP matched his season high (also 8.0IP on 4/11 at Tampa Bay) and his 9K marked a season high.

2026: In six starts this season, has gone 3-1 with a 2.40 ERA (41.1IP, 11ER)...has held opponents to a .155/.219/.218 (22-for-142) slash line this year...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in five of his six starts...three of his six starts have been scoreless.

- ★ Is tied for first in the Majors in innings pitched (41.1, first in AL) and starts (six, tied for first in AL), ranks second in opponents' OPS (.438, second in AL), third in opponents' SLG (.218, second in AL) and HR/9.0IP (0.22, first in AL), fourth in opponents' OBP (.219, second in AL) and WHIP (0.77, second in AL), fifth in opponents' BA (.155, second in AL) and tied for 10th in wins (three, tied for fourth in AL)...also ranks sixth in the AL in ERA (2.40).
- ★ Has tossed at least 6.0IP in five of his six starts, tied for the most in the Majors...was only the second Yankees starting pitcher in the last 12 seasons (since 2015) to toss at least 6.0 innings in each of his first four starts of the season, joining Gerrit Cole (first four starts in 2023).
- ★ Has tossed at least 7.0IP in three starts, tied for the most in the Majors...his two starts of at least 8.0IP are also tied with Miami's Sandy Alcantara for the most in the Majors.
- ★ His three scoreless starts of at least 6.0IP are tied with Los Angeles-AL's José Soriano for the most in the Majors.
- ★ Has allowed only 1HR to 156BF this season.
- ★ Has allowed 3H-or-fewer in four of his six starts.
- ★ Has allowed 3BB-or-fewer in each of his starts.
- ★ **Posted a season-opening 13.1 scoreless inning streak from 3/25-31...was tied for the third-longest by a Yankees starter to begin the season in the last 15 years** (since 2012), trailing only Luis Gil's 18.2 scoreless inning streak in 2021 and Cam Schlichtler's 13.2 scoreless inning streak to begin this season (Nestor Cortes also had a 13.1 scoreless inning streak in 2022).
- ★ Was only the seventh pitcher in franchise history to toss at least 6.0 scoreless innings in each of his first two appearances of a season, joining Ray Caldwell (first 3G in 1914), Mel Stottlemire (first 2G in 1967), Bob Turley (first 2G in 1958), Allie Reynolds (first 2G in 1947), Bob Shawkey (first 2G in 1922) and Slow Joe Doyle (first 2G in 1906)...was the 10th pitcher in franchise history to toss at least 6.0 scoreless innings in each of his first two starts of a season (also George Mogridge's first three starts in 1916, Freddy Garcia's first two starts in 2011 and Lew Brockett's first two starts in 1909).
- ★ Made his fourth career Opening Day start and first as a Yankee in the club's 7-0 win on 3/25 at San Francisco...earned the win after tossing 6.1 scoreless innings (2H, 1BB, 4K, 1HP)...**was the first Yankees Opening Day starter to throw at least 6.1 scoreless innings since David Cone in 1996** (also OR in 7.0IP)...**was only the fifth Yankees starter in the Divisional Era (since 1969) to do so**, joining Cone, Rick Rhoden (SHO in 1988), Ron Guidry (OR in 9.0IP in 1980) and Catfish Hunter (OR in 7.0IP in 1977)...**was only the fourth pitcher in franchise history to toss more than 6.0 scoreless innings and allow 2H-or-fewer on Opening Day**, joining David Cone (2H and OR in 7.0IP in 1996), Ron Guidry (2H and OR in 9.0IP in 1980) and Mel Stottlemire (2H in SHO in 1967)...retired his final 8BF, 15 of his last 16BF and 18 of his final 20BF.

ON A ROLL: Has gone 9-1 with a 1.95 ERA (87.2IP, 19ER) over his last 13 starts (since 8/22/25)...has allowed 1R-or-fewer in eight of those 13 starts...has tossed at least 6.0IP in 11 of those 13 starts and at least 7.0IP in eight of those starts.

- ★ Has held opponents to a .181/.245/.236 (56-for-309) slash line over his last 13 starts.

VS. TEXAS: Has made only one career start vs. Texas...faced the Rangers last season on 8/4/25 at Globe Life Field and did not record a decision in the Yankees' 8-5 loss (5.0IP, 8H, 4R/ER, 3BB, 7K, 0HR).

- ★ **In 48 career starts vs. the American League, has gone 30-7 with a 2.22 ERA (304.0IP, 75ER)...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 36 of those 48 starts, including 22 of his last 30 starts (since 6/17/24), going 19-4 with a 2.15 ERA (193.0IP, 46ER) in that span.**

IN PINSTRIPES: As a Yankee, has gone 22-6 with a 2.78 ERA (236.2IP, 73ER) and 221K in 38 starts...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 25 of his 38 starts and 1ER-or-fewer in 18 of those starts...his 25 starts of 2ER-or-fewer are tied for the sixth-most in the AL and tied for the 10th-most in the Majors since 2025...his 18 starts of 1ER-or-fewer are also tied for the sixth-most in the AL and tied for the 10th-most in the Majors in that span.

- ★ Since 2025, leads the Majors in wins (22) and winning percentage (.786), ranks second in pickoffs (nine, first in AL), third in HR/9.0IP (0.57, second in AL), fourth in opponents' SLG (.315, second in AL), sixth in opponents' OPS (.586, third in AL), seventh in ERA (2.78, fourth in AL), tied for seventh in starts (38, tied for third in AL), and eighth in groundball/flyball ratio (1.83, third in AL) and groundball percentage (51.3%, third in AL)...also ranks seventh in the AL in opponents' OBP (.271) and WHIP (1.04), and eighth in opponents' BA (.212).
- ★ The Yankees are 25-13 in Fried's starts...his 25 team wins are tied for the third-most in the Majors since 2025 (tied for second in AL), trailing only Philadelphia's Cristopher Sánchez (26-12) and Boston's Garrett Crochet (26-12)...the Yankees are 9-3 in his last 12 starts (since 8/27/25).
- ★ Has tossed at least 6.0 innings in 26 of his 38 starts, tied for the fourth-most in the AL and tied for the sixth-most in the Majors...has tossed at least 7.0 innings in 16 of his starts, the most in the Majors over that span.
- ★ Has left only five of his 38 starts trailing.
