### TONIGHT'S GAME:

- Is Game 2 (0-1) of a 3-game series vs **Tom McCarthy's Phillies** and the second game (0-1) of a 7-day, 6-game homestand that includes an upcoming 3-game weekend series vs **Mil**.
- Thu's off day will be the club's first since 7/24...will have played 20 consecutive days without a rest...were scheduled off on 8/3 but instead finished the suspended **Speedway Classic** vs **Atl** in **Bristol, TN**.
- Following Sun's game vs **Mil**, will hit the road for a 9-game trip at **LAA** (8/18-8/20), **AZ** (8/22-8/24) and **LAD** (8/25-8/27)...it will be their first of 2 consecutive trips out west (at **Padres**, **A's**, and **Cardinals** next month).
- Are coming off a 4-3 road trip at **Chc** (2-1) and **Pit** (2-2).

**HARD TO SWALLOW:** The Reds have lost 27 games this season in which they held a lead, including yesterday vs **Phi** (up 1-0, lost 4-1).

- Have been held to 1 run or none 26 times this season, including last night vs **Phi**...it's the most such games by a Reds team through their first 120 games of a season since 2015 (27g).
- Have scored fewer than 2 runs in 41 of their 120 games this season, including last night vs **Phi**...it's the most such games by a Reds team through their first 120 games of a season since 2009 (also 41g).
- Have scored 33 runs in 10 games this month, matching the **Rays** for third-fewest in the majors (**Bal** 23, **Chc** 29)...this includes the 14 runs Cin scored on Sun at **Pit**.
- Yesterday's was Cin's ninth loss of the season when leading after 6 innings and its sixth loss when leading after the 7th inning.

**NO ROOM FOR THE BROOM:** The Reds have not been swept in any of their first 38 series of 2025, including the recently-completed 4-game set at **Pit** (2-2).

- This 38-series, in-season streak without being swept is the longest run in club history, eclipsing the 1970 National League championship team, which opened its season with 32 straight series without getting swept.
- Cin is the only Major League team not to have been swept this season.
- On 6 occasions avoided being swept with a win in the final game of a set (4/23 at **Mia**, 5/15 vs **CWS**, 6/22 at **StL**, 7/2 at **Bos**, 7/23 at **Wsh**, 7/30 vs **LAD**).
- Cin hasn't been swept in a series of at least 2 games since 9/24-9/25, 2024 at **Cle** (2g), a span of 39 straight series...per *Elias*, that ranks T4th for longest streaks of sweepless series in team history (see below).

**TOUGH ROAD AHEAD:** The Reds are in the midst of a final 59-game stretch in which 38 games have been/will be played against opponents with records at or above .500 (3-0 vs **TB**, 1-2 vs **LAD**, 2-1 at **Chc**, 0-1 vs **Phi**, 3g vs **Mil**, 3g at **LAD**, 3g vs **StL**, 3g vs **Tor**, 3g vs **NYM**, 3g at **SD**, 3g at **StL**, 4g at **Chc**, 3g at **Mil**).

- As of today, the Reds have the toughest remaining schedule in the Major Leagues, based on opponents' winning percentage (.535).
- NYM** has the ninth-toughest remaining schedule (.508) while **Chc** (.479) and **SD** (.469) have the third- and second-easiest remaining schedules in the league, respectively.

**SERIES NOTES:** The Reds and **Phillies** are facing off for second and final time this season...**Phi** won 2 of 3 at **Citizens Bank Park** 7/4-7/6...that series included a complete-game 1-hitter by **Zack Wheeler** on 7/6 (3-1 **Phi** win).

- Cin is 31-32 vs the **Phillies** since 2015 and 9-16 since 2022...the Reds have lost 4 of the last 5 meetings and are 1-2-2 over the last 5 series.
- The 7-0 **Phillies** win on 4/22/24 took 2 hours and 2 minutes...it was the quickest 9-inning game at **Great American Ball Park** since 9/5/06, when the Reds blanked the **Giants**, 3-0, also in 2 hours and 2 minutes..

**TONY TIME:** RHP **Tony Santillan** last night vs **Phi** appeared in his Major League-leading 60th game of the season to become the first Reds pitcher since **LHP Bill Bray** in 2011 to appear in at least 60 of the team's first 120 games...**Santillan** is aiming to become the first Reds pitcher to lead the majors in apps since **LHP Rob Murphy** in 1988 (76g).

**DEADLINE DEALS:** Cin made 3 trades leading up to the 7/31 deadline:

- 7/31: Acquired from the **Athletics** INF/OF **Miguel Andujar** (ahn-DOO-har) in exchange for **RHP Kenya Huggins**.
- 7/30: Acquired from the **Pirates** 3B **Ke'Bryan Hayes** (key-Bryan, #3) in exchange for **LHP Taylor Rogers**, **SS Sammy Stafura**, and cash considerations.
- 7/30: Acquired from the **Rays** RHP **Zack Littell** (lih-TELL, #52) in exchange for **LHP Adam Serwinowski** and **RHP Brian Van Belle**.

**CHASING HISTORY:** In Fri's 3-2 loss at **PIT**, RHP **Chase Burns** produced his fourth 10-strikeout game of his young career to become the first Major League pitcher since 1893 with at least 10 strikeouts in 4 of his first 8 apps.

- Is also just the third Major League pitcher since 1893 with double-digit strikeouts in 4 of his first 8 career starts, joining **Fernando Valenzuela** (1981) and **Bob Feller** (1936)...*courtesy Elias*.
- Is the first Reds pitcher to begin his career with at least 57 strikeouts over his first 8 games since **Gary Nolan** (60k, 1967).

**MAN OF STEAL:** **SS Elly De La Cruz** stole his 30th base of the season in the 8/2 **MLB Speedway Classic**, becoming the ninth Major Leaguer in the live-ball era (since 1920) with at least 30 steals in each of his first 3 career seasons, the first since **KC's Bobby Witt Jr.** (2022-24).

- His 133 career stolen bases are fifth-most by any Major Leaguer through their first 3 career seasons in the live-ball era (since 1920), behind only **Vince Coleman** (326, 1985-87), **Rickey Henderson** (189, 1979-81), **Delino DeShields** (144, 1990-92), and **Kenny Lofton** (138, 1991-93).

**LAST TIME OUT:** Opposed Paul Skenes and suffered the 7-0 loss at Pit on 8/7 (3.2ip, 6h, 4r/4er, 4bb, 2k, 1hr, 86TP).

- Threw 36 pitches in the 1st inning, 9 pitches in the 2nd inning, 20 pitches in the 3rd inning, and 21 pitches in the 4th inning before he was lifted for reliever Sam Moll.

**AUGUST 1 vs ATL:** Earned the 3-2 win on 8/1 vs Atl (6.0ip, 4h, 0r, 1bb, 10k, 97TP).

- Season-high 10 strikeouts...was his fifth career double-digit strikeout game (last: 10k, 3/31/24 for KC vs Min).
- Struck out all 3 batters he faced in the 1st inning, the 10th time he's done that in his career (last: 7/22/23 at NYY).
- Fanned Eli White in the 2nd inning for his 750th career K.
- Eclipsed the 800.0-inning mark for his career.
- Was his second straight quality start.
- Was his second scoreless start of the season (also: 3/31).

**JULY 27 vs TB:** Earned the 2-1 win on 7/27 vs TB (7.1ip, 3h, 1r/1er, 1bb, 8k, 1hr, 97TP).

- 7.1ip marked his longest start since 6/26/24 for KC vs Mia (also 7.1ip).
- Was his sixth start of the season in which he allowed 3 hits or fewer.
- Marked his eighth quality start of the season, the 57th of his career.
- Is approaching career milestones in innings pitched (5.0 shy of 800), strikeouts (4 shy of 750), and starts (5 shy of 150).

**JULY 21 at WSH:** Suffered the 10-8 loss at Wsh on 7/21 (2.1ip, 5h, 7r/7er, 2bb, 1k, 1hr, 1hbp, 57TP).

- Matched his shortest start of the season (also: 5/10 at Hou).
- Allowed 4 runs in the 1st inning (25TP)...pitched a perfect 2nd inning (11TP)...gave up a home run to lead off the 3rd followed by a lineup, single, and hit-batter (21TP) before he was pulled for reliever Lyon Richardson...Richardson allowed both inherited runners to score.

**JULY 12 vs COL:** Didn't factor in the decision in the Reds' 4-3 walkoff win vs Col on 7/12 (6.1ip, 7h, 3r/3er, 1bb, 9k, 1hr, 93TP).

- Was his seventh quality start of the season.
- His 9 strikeouts matched a season-high (also: 6/25 vs NYY).

**JULY 7 vs MIA:** Suffered the 5-1 loss vs Mia on 7/7 (5.0ip, 7h, 2r/2er, 1bb, 3k, 1hb, 96TP).

- Entered the game having not allowed a hit to any of his previous 32 batters on which he reached 2 strikes...that streak was snapped at 39 by Kyle Stowers' full count single in the 4th inning.
- Held Mia scoreless through 4 and until Agustín Ramírez' 2-out RBI-double in the 5th inning...the next batter, Liam Hicks, singled home Ramirez...Kyle Stowers popped out to end the inning...Stowers was Singer's last batter faced.

**PERSONAL:** Played collegiately at the University of Florida where he was named 2018 SEC Pitcher of the Year and winner of the Dick Howser Trophy...was named *Baseball/America* College Player of the Year in 2018 and a finalist for the Golden Spikes Award...helped lead the Gators to the school's first NCAA College World Series championship in 2017...struck out 12 vs LSU in Game One of the CWS finals, the most strikeouts in the championship round since at least 2003...was teammates at Florida with another 2018 first-round pick, Jonathan India, for whom he was traded in 2024...Graduated from Eustis High School (FL), the same school attended by 1972 Nobel Prize winner John Robert Schrieffer, former NASA astronaut David Walker, and former Reds catcher Chris Okey.
