### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**May 20, 1979:** Tommy John tosses a two-hit shutout at Fenway Park (9.0IP, 0BB, 5K) to improve to 9-0 on the season. John would finally suffer his first loss of the season six days later at Cleveland.

**May 20, 1948:** Joe DiMaggio hits for his second of two career cycles in a 13-2 Yankees win at the White Sox, going 5-for-6 with 2HR and 6RBI.

### TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

**May 21, 2021:** The Yankees record a 2-1 win over Oakland after Gleyber Torres hits a "walk-off" single in the bottom of the ninth. In the top of the inning, the Yankees turn a 5-4-3 triple play, their first triple play since 4/17/14 at Tampa Bay.

**May 21, 1930:** Babe Ruth hits 3HR in a 15-7 loss at Philadelphia-AL. It marks his only regular season three-homer game as a Yankee, though he accomplishes the feat twice in the World Series and once at the end of his career with the Boston Braves.

**May 21, 1923:** Colonel Jacob Ruppert buys out Colonel Tillinghast L'Hommedieu Huston for \$1.5 million, taking sole control of the New York Yankees franchise until his death in 1939.

**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees continue their six-game homestand tonight with the first game of a three-game set vs. the Rangers (through Thurs.)...are 2-1 on their current homestand after winning two-of-three against the Mets this past weekend...following this homestand, will embark on a nine-game, 10-day road trip, featuring three-game sets at Colorado (Fri.-Sun.), Los Angeles-AL (5/26-28) and Los Angeles-NL (5/30-6/1).

- Have won eight of their last 11 games (since 5/6) and each of their last four series (since 5/5).
- Are a season-high-tying 8G over .500 (also 26-18 on 5/16).
- Their 27-19 (.587) record is tied for the second-best in the AL, trailing only Detroit (31-17, .646).
- Their +90 run differential this season is the highest in the Majors.

**WHERE WE LEFT OFF:** The Yankees clinched a series win over the Mets with an 8-2 victory on Sunday at Yankee Stadium...**LHP Max Fried** (6.0IP, 3H, 2R/ER, 2BB, 8K, OHR, 1WP) started and allowed only 2R/ER over 6.0IP in a no-decision...**LF Cody Bellinger** (3-for-3, 1R, 1 double, 1HR, 6RBI, 2BB) recorded a career-high-tying 6RBI and reached base a career-high-tying five times, including a go-ahead two-run double in the first inning and his ninth career grand slam in the eighth inning...**1B Paul Goldschmidt** (1-for-4, 2R, 1RBI, 1BB) hit an RBI single in the eighth inning...**RHP Jonathan Loáisiga** (1.0IP, 1BB, 2K) tossed a scoreless seventh inning in relief...**RHP Devin Williams** (1.0IP, 1K) earned his second win of the season after tossing a scoreless eighth inning in relief...**LHP Tim Hill** (1.0) tossed a scoreless ninth inning.

**FAN-TASTIC: The Yankees have averaged 42,501 fans per home gate this season, their highest average attendance through their first 23 gates of a season since 2010 (45,047).**

- **Own the highest average home attendance in the American League and the second-highest in the Majors,** trailing only Los Angeles-LF (50,431).

**SAVED BY THE BELL: INF/OF Cody Bellinger recorded a career-high-tying 6RBI and reached base a career-high-tying five times on Sunday vs. the Mets,** including a go-ahead two-run double in the first inning and his ninth career grand slam in the eighth inning (his first since 7/15/23 vs. Boston with Chicago-NL).

- Six of his last 9H (since 5/13) have gone for extra bases (5 doubles, 2HR).
- **Has hit safely in a career-high-tying 13 straight games** (since 5/3), batting .377/.450/.679 (20-for-53) with 11R, 4 doubles, 4HR, 12RBI, 7BB and 1SB over that span...also recorded a 13-game hitting streak from 6/24-7/7/23...is the longest active hit streak in the Majors and marks the second-longest by a Yankee this season, trailing only Aaron Judge's 14-game streak from 4/19-5/4.
- Over his last 19 games (since 4/27-G1), has hit .444/.500/.889 (8-for-18) with 2 doubles, 2HR, 13RBI, 3BB and 1SF with RISP.
- Is batting .387/.432/.677 (12-for-31) with 3 doubles, 2HR and 4BB vs. left-handed pitching this season.

**GOT YOUR NUMBER: INF DJ LeMahieu has hit .379/.419/.793 (22-for-58) with 3 triples, 6HR and 4BB in his career against Texas' LHP Patrick Corbin...his 6HR are his most vs. any pitcher and mark the most by any batter against Corbin...** INF/OF Cody Bellinger has hit .400/.478/.450 (8-for-20) with 1 double and 3BB against Corbin.

**GOOD AS GOLD: INF Paul Goldschmidt hit an RBI single in the eighth inning on Sunday vs. the Mets...** has hit .457/.509/.609 (21-for-46) with 4 doubles, 1HR, 20RBI, 5BB/2IBB, 1HP and 1SF with RISP this year, ranking second in the Majors in hits (first in AL), fourth in BA (third in AL) and ninth in OBP (fourth in AL).

- Has reached base safely in 36 of his 46 games this season, batting .339/.389/.489 (59-for-174) with 30R, 11 doubles, 5HR, 25RBI, 13BB/2IBB, 2HP, 1SF and 3SB.
- **Is hitting .541/.614/1.000 (20-for-37) with 5 doubles, 4HR, 6BB and 1HP vs. left-handed pitching this year,** ranking first in BA and OBP, and second in SLG (second in AL) and OPS (1.614, second in AL).
- Ranks second in the Majors in multi-hit games (20, second in AL) and fourth in hits (third in AL) and BA (third in AL).

**BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters** have hit 79HR this year, their most home runs through their first 46 games of a season in franchise history (previous: 75HR in 2018)...are just the 11th team in the Modern Era (since 1900) to hit as many HR through their first 46 games of a season.

- Have scored 266R this season, marking just the second time in the last 22 seasons (since 2004) that the Yankees have scored as many runs through their first 46G of a season (also 268R in 2018).
- The Yankees have eight players with at least 20RBI this season, tied with the Cubs for the most in the Majors.
- Lead the Majors in runs per game (5.78), OBP (.347) and walks (192), rank second in HR (79, first in AL), SLG (.475, first in AL), OPS (.822, first in AL), XBH (172, first in AL), times on base (628, first in AL) and total bases (747, first in AL), third in runs scored (266, first in AL) and fourth in BA (.261, first in AL).

**ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge** reached base three times on Sunday vs. the Mets...**has reached base in 43 of his 46 games this year,** batting .401/.490/.751 (71-for-177) with 43R, 13 doubles, 2 triples, 15HR, 41RBI, 30BB/8IBB, 2HP, 1SF and 3SB.

- **Leads the Majors in BA by 33 points, OBP by 40 points, SLG by 79 points and OPS by 154 points.**
- **Has reached base multiple times in 30 of his last 37 games (since 4/7), 33 of his last 41 games (since 4/3) and 35 of his 46 games this year...** his 35 games of reaching base multiple times this season are the most in the Majors.

► **Is one of three Yankees (seventh time) in franchise history to reach base multiple times in 35 of the club's first 46 games of a season,** joining Babe Ruth (5x: 37G in 1927, 36G in 1924, and 35G in 1921, 1923 and 1926) and Lou Gehrig (35G in 1936).

- Is one of five Major League players (seventh time) in the last 68 years (since 1958) to reach base at least 103 times through his team's first 46 games of a season, joining Frank Thomas (114 TOB in 1994, 109 TOB in 1995 and 106 TOB in 1997), Wade Boggs (106 TOB in 1986), Joey Votto (103 TOB in 2013) and Barry Bonds (103 TOB in 2002).

► His 133 total bases are the most by any Major League player through his club's first 46 games of a season since Iván Rodríguez recorded 135 in 2000.

- With 15HR and a .401 BA, is one of just seven players in the Modern Era to record as many home runs and as high of a BA in their club's first 46 games of a season, joining Los Angeles-NL's Cody Bellinger (16HR and .404 BA in 2019), Boston's Manny Ramirez (15HR and .401 BA in 2001), Colorado's Todd Helton (15HR and .406 BA in 2000), the Yankees' Mickey Mantle (21HR and .407 BA in 1956), Philadelphia-AL's Jimmie Foxx (20HR and .408 BA in 1932) and Philadelphia-NL's Chuck Klein (16HR and .414 BA in 1930).

► Is only the second Major League player in the last

- **Over his last 37 games (since 4/7), has hit .421/.509/.714 (59-for-140) with 29R, 10 doubles, 2 triples, 9HR, 24RBI, 25BB/6IBB, 1HP, 1SF and 1SB.**

► **Has hit 7HR in his last 17 games (since 4/29) and 8HR in his last 19 games (since 4/27-G2).**

- Has hit .441/.565/.765 (15-for-34) with 2 doubles, 3HR, 25RBI, 10BB/7IBB, 1HP and 1SF with RISP this year.
- Is hitting .464/.595/.1.214 (13-for-28) with 3 doubles, 6HR and 9BB/6IBB vs. left-handed pitching.

**FOR STARTERS: Yankees starting pitchers have posted a 2.89 ERA (168.0IP, 54ER) over their last 31 starts (since 4/14)...** have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 26 of their last 31 starts, 2ER-or-fewer in 23 of those starts and one-or-zero ER in 15 starts...over that span, lead the Majors in opponents' BA (.202), rank second in ERA (2.89, second in AL), opponents' OBP (.275, second in AL), opponents' SLG (.322, second in AL) and opponents' OPS (.597, second in AL), and third in WHIP (1.10, third in AL).

**PITCH PERFECT: Yankees pitchers** have allowed 3R-or-fewer in a season-high-tying five straight games (since 5/13), posting a 1.96 ERA (46.0IP, 10ER) and 56K over that span.

- Have not allowed a HR in a season-high five straight games, their longest streak since a five-game streak from 6/12-16/24...their last longer streak was an eight-game streak from 7/10-20/11.
- Have posted a 3.00 ERA (276.0IP, 92ER) over their last 31 games (since 4/14), the fourth-lowest ERA in the Majors over that span, trailing only Minnesota (2.88), Texas (2.94) and Kansas City (2.97).
- Rank first in the Majors this season in opponents' BA (.205), opponents' SLG (.329) and opponents' OPS (.619), second in K/9.0IP (9.46, first in AL), third in strikeout rate (25.3%, second in AL), fourth in opponents' OBP (.290, fourth in AL) and sixth in HR/9.0IP (0.86, second in AL).

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP WILL WARREN (2-2, 4.61 ERA)

**RHP Will Warren** will make his 10th start of the year in tonight's series opener vs. Texas...the 25-year-old will pitch on extended five days' rest due to Monday's team off day...last pitched on Wednesday at Seattle, recording a career-high 9K over 5.0IP (ND, 4H, 2R/ER, 1BB, 0HR, 1HP)...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in seven of his nine starts this season, including 2ER-or-fewer in six of those starts...saw his first Major League action with the Yankees in 2024, going 0-3 with a 10.32 ERA (22.2IP, 33H, 27R/26ER, 10BB, 29K, 5HR) in six games (five starts) over five stints with the club (7/30, 8/7, 8/14, 8/21-31, 9/28)...spent the majority of last season with Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, going 6-5 with a 5.91 ERA (109.2IP, 114H, 79R/72ER, 39BB, 136K, 19HR) in 23 starts...was tied for fourth among Yankees minor leaguers in strikeouts...following the season, was tabbed by *Baseball America* as the Yankees' No. 8 prospect and as having the "Best Control" and "Best Slider" among Yankees farmhands...was also tabbed by MLB Pipeline as the Yankees' No. 5 prospect...over parts of three minor league seasons in the Yankees organization (2022-24), has gone 25-18 with a 4.31 ERA (367.2IP, 342H, 209R/176ER, 140BB, 410K, 44HR) in 76 career appearances (74 starts)...was selected by the Yankees in the eighth round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft out of Southeastern Louisiana University.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Last pitched on Wednesday at Seattle, recording a career-high 9K over 5.0IP (ND, 4H, 2R/ER, 1BB, 0HR, 1HP).  
✦ Marked his third straight start with at least 7K, the longest-such streak of his career.

**ON A ROLL:** Is 1-1 with a 3.18 ERA (17.0IP, 15H, 8R/6ER, 5BB, 24K, 1HR) over his last three starts (since 5/4)...has allowed 3ER-of-fewer in each of those starts.  
✦ Has recorded at least 7K in each of those starts, including a career-high 9K on Wednesday at Seattle.  
✦ Has allowed just 1HR to 74BF over that span.

**2025:** Has gone 2-2 with a 4.61 ERA (41.0IP, 21ER) and 50K in nine starts this season...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer seven of his nine starts this season, including 2ER-or-fewer in six of those starts.  
✦ Has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in all five of his starts with at least 5.0IP this season.  
✦ Is holding right-handed batters to a .186/.222/.322 (11-for-59) slash line.  
✦ Has allowed 2BB-or-fewer in seven of his last eight starts (since 4/6).  
✦ Made his season debut on 4/1 vs. Arizona and did not record a decision...allowed only 2R/ER in 5.0IP (1H, 4BB, 4K, 1HR)...allowed his only hit on a two-run HR to Corbin Carroll in the third inning.  
✦ Earned his first Major League win on 4/12 vs. San Francisco after allowing only 2R/ER in 5.0IP (2H, 2BB, 6K, 1HR)...after allowing a two-run HR to Wilmer Flores in the second inning, retired his next 10BF and 11 of his final 12BF.  
✦ Did not record a decision in the Yankees' 3-2 loss on 4/22 at Cleveland (5.0IP, 3H, 2R/ER, 1BB, 5K, 0HR)...after allowing a leadoff single in the first inning, did not allow a hit to his next 17BF (1BB)...exited the game with two runners on...Mark Leiter Jr. came on in relief and allowed both inherited runners to score.  
✦ Allowed just 1R/ER over a career-high 7.1IP (4H, 1BB, 7K, 0HR) on 5/9 at the Athletics...retired 15 of his first 17BF (1H, 1BB)...marked his first career road win.

**161ST STREET STATION:** Will make his fourth home start of the season tonight...is 1-1 with a 4.30 ERA (14.2IP, 7ER) in three home starts this year.  
✦ Will mark his eighth career appearance (seventh start) at home...is 1-4 with a 9.00 ERA (27.0IP, 27ER) and 36K in seven games (six starts) at Yankee Stadium.

**2024:** Saw his first Major League action with the Yankees last season, going 0-3 with a 10.32 ERA (22.2IP, 33H, 27R/26ER, 10BB, 29K, 5HR) in six games (five starts) over five stints with the club (7/30, 8/7, 8/14, 8/21-31, 9/28)...opponents batted .340/.404/.608 (33-for-97, 5HR); LH .349/.442/.581 (15-for-43, 2HR); RH .333/.368/.630 (18-for-54, 3HR).  
✦ Recorded at least 6K in three of his five starts.  
✦ Made his Major League debut on 7/30 at Philadelphia and did not record a decision (5.1IP, 4H, 4ER, 2BB, 6K, 1HR, 1HP)...struck out Bryce Harper (swinging) in the first inning for his first Major League strikeout...retired 12 of his final 14 batters faced (1H, 1HP).  
✦ Spent the majority of the season with Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, going 6-5 with a 5.91 ERA (109.2IP, 114H, 79R/72ER, 39BB, 136K, 19HR) in 23 starts...was tied for fourth among Yankees minor leaguers in strikeouts.  
✦ Over his final 13 starts with the RailRiders from 6/1-9/18, allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 10 of his 13 starts, 2ER-or-fewer in nine of those starts and one-or-zero earned runs in six starts...posted a 2.91 ERA (21.2IP, 14H, 9R/7ER, 6BB, 30K, 2HR) in four starts with Scranton/Wilkes-Barre during the month of July.  
✦ Following the season, was tabbed by *Baseball America* as the Yankees' No. 8 prospect and as having the "Best Control" and "Best Slider" among Yankees farmhands...was also tabbed by MLB Pipeline as the Yankees' No. 5 prospect.

**VS. TEXAS:** Will be making his first career appearance vs. Texas tonight.
