METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets contest against the Phillies was postponed due to Weather on Friday...The Mets conclude the 2023 schedule with a six-game homestand (1-1) against the Marlins (1-1) and Phillies (three games).

SEE YOU SOON!: The Mets will open the 2024 regular season on Thursday, March 28 vs. Milwaukee at Citi Field...The Mets opening homestand continues Saturday and Sunday vs. the Brewers before Detroit visits New York, Monday, April 1-Wednesday, April 3..The Mets will open the 2024 Spring Training Grapefruit League schedule on Saturday, February 24 at Clover Park in Port St. Lucie vs. the St. Louis Cardinals....The Mets and Yankees will meet in Spring Training for the first time since 2018 with games on Tuesday, March 5 in Port St. Lucie and on Friday, March 22 in Tampa.

GIVE IT AWAY NOW: Yesterday's Mets Crossbody Bag presented by Citi giveaway will now take place on Sunday, October 1 for the first 15,000 fans in attendance of the 3:10 p.m. game.

FAN APPRECIATION: As part of Fan Appreciation Weekend, fans will receive concession discounts presented by Coke Zero Sugar from gates opening until scheduled first pitch, which includes \$4 Nathan's hot dog (gluten free and veggie options available), \$3 regular soft pretzel, \$3 popcorn box, \$3 21oz. fountain soda, and \$3 Dasani bottled water... Additionally, all fans will save $35 \%$ on regularly priced merchandise from the Team Store and save $25 \%$ from the Amazin' Memorabilia Store, excluding Grab Bag purchases and Day of Game items...Merchandise discounts are only available in stores and cannot be combined with any other offers...Additionally, there will be surprise-and-delight giveaways including an honorary first pitch, seat upgrades, gift cards and autographed alumni photos.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: The Mets are set to play their sixth doubleheader of the season today...The team split twinbills on May 1 vs. Atlanta and September 27 vs. Miami, were swept by the Tigers in Detroit on May 3 and against the Braves on August 12 and took two from the Guardians in New York on May 21...The Mets have played 29 double dips since 2021, more than any other team in the majors...The Mets have earned at least a split in 27 of those 29 twinbills over the last two years...New York has swept eight of their last 16 doubleheaders, including one this year and five DH sweeps last season.

IN THE CITI: The Mets conclude their final homestand of the season... New York is 40-37 at home this season...The team is 599-560 since Citi Field opened in 2009...The Mets have smashed 11 home runs at Citi Field this year...That is the third-most home runs at home in team history... Only the 2019 team (126) and 2016 team (112) have hit more at home.

JUST THE TWO OF US: The 2023 Mets are seeking to become the seventh team in franchise history with two players with 100 or more RBI...Francisco Lindor has 96 RBI, while Pete Alonso has recorded 117... Lindor and Alonso both recorded 100 RBI in 2022.

CONNECT FOUR: Francisco Lindor is four RBI from 100 this season...He is looking for his second season with 100 RBI in his career...He recorded 107 RBI last year, a career-best...He is seeking to become the ninth player in franchise history with $100+$ RBI in multiple seasons.

DINGERS!: The Mets feature eight players who have recorded at least 10 home runs this year...The team record is 10 players with 10 or more home runs, done in 2017...The 2019 team featured nine players, while the 2007 and 2005 teams feature eight players as well...Brett Baty is one home run to become the ninth player with 10 or more home runs this year...The Mets have socked 210 home runs this season...That is the fifth-most in the National League...The 2022 Mets hit 171 home runs... The 2023 team became the fifth team in franchise history record 200 or more homers in a year...The team's 204 home runs are the fourth-most in a single season in franchise history...They previous four years with 200 or more homers are: 2019 (242), 2017 (224), 2016 (218) and 2006 (200).

PHILLIES-METS NOTES: The Mets have dropped five straight to the Phillies.

100: Pete Alonso is three RBI away from 500 for his career... He would become the 10th player in Mets history to record 500 RBI...He has collected 117 RBI this season, tied with Bernard Gilkey (1996) and Johnson (1991) for the sixth-most by a Met in a single season...He became the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI (120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry also recorded three seasons each...Alonso's 497 RBI since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has recorded his second season with 45 or more home runs, becoming the only player in franchise history to do so... He recorded his third season with 40 or more home runs... He became the fifth player in major league history with three or more seasons of 40 or more homers in their first five years, joining Ralph Kiner (four), Ryan Howard (three), Albert Pujols (three) and Eddie Mathews (three)...He is the only player in franchise history with multiple seasons of 40 or more home runs... He is tied for second in the majors and in the National League with 46 home runs...Alonso's 192 home runs since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues.

30-FOR-30: Francisco Lindor became the fourth player in franchise history to collected 30 stolen bases and 30 home runs in a season...He joined join David Wright (2007), Howard Johnson $(1991,1989,1987)$ and Darryl Strawberry (1987)....He joine Barry Larkin (1996), Álex Rodríguez (1998), Jimmy Rollins (2007) and Hanley Ramírez (2008) as the only shortstops in major league history with a 30-30 season...In addition, joined Johnson, Rollins, José Cruz (2001), Carlos Beltrán (2004) and José Ramírez (2018) as the only switch hitters with a 30-30 season.

STEAL THIS ALBUM: The Mets lead the major leagues with a 89.2\% success rate in stolen bases this season...The team has stolen 116 bases out of 130 attempts...lt's the highest success rate in franchise history... The previous high was $82.3 \%$ which was accomplished in 2004.

STRIKE THAT: Senga recorded 202 strikeouts...That is the second-most strikeouts by a rookie in franchise history...Doc Gooden recorded 276 strikeouts in his rookie season in 1984...His 202 strikeouts are tied for the seventh-most in the NL...He is the 13th pitcher in franchise history to record 200 or more strikeouts in a season...Jacob deGrom and Noah Syndergaard were the last pitchers to do so...Tom Seaver owns the franchise record with nine such seasons.

SENGA GENESIS: Kodai Senga finished his first season in the major leagues going $12-7$ with a 2.98 ERA ( 55 ER/ 166.1 IP ) with 77 walks and 202 strikeouts... His 12 wins are tied for the most in franchise history in a single-season by a Japanese born player...Masato Yoshii also had 12 in 1999.... His 2.99 ERA ranks fifth in the majors and second in the National League...His 2.99 ERA is the seventh-lowest by a Japanese-born pitcher in MLB history (min. 100 innings).

## MEGILL NEWS \& NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed three runs over 6.0 innings in on September 22 against the Phillies at Citizens Bank Park...Allowed five hits, issued one walk and struck out six batters...Started his outing with 5.0 scoreless innings until giving up a three-run homer with two outs in the sixth to J.T. Realmuto.

PHILLY SPECIAL: Today, Megill will make his fifth career start against the Phillies and will face Philadelphia for the second time in as many starts...Through his first four career starts against Philadelphia, Megill is 2-1 with a 3.00 ERA (7 ER/21.0 IP)...In two career starts at Citizens Bank Ballpark, the right-hander is 1-1 with a 3.60 ERA (4 ER/10.0 IP)...In his only home start against Philadelphia, April 29, 2022 at Citi Field, Megill threw the first 5.0 innings of the team's combined no-hitter... It was the second no-hitter in team history (also, Johan Santana, June 1, 2012 vs. St. Louis).

THREE RUNS OR FEWER: Megill has allowed three runs or fewer in each of his last seven starts, tied for the longest such streak of his career...The right-hander also allowed three runs or fewer in his first seven starts as a big leaguer from June 23 - July 28, 2021.

NO PLACE LIKE NEW YORK: This season, Megill is 6-3 with a 3.41 ERA (27 ER/66.0 IP) in 12 home starts this season...In 12 road starts this season, Megill is $2-5$ with an 6.79 ERA (40 ER/53.0 IP)...In 28 career home games ( 26 starts), Megill is 10-6 with a 4.02 ERA ( 61 ER/136.2 IP) and in 29 career road games ( 25 starts), Megill is 6-10 with a 5.73 ERA ( $76 \mathrm{ER} / 119.1 \mathrm{IP}$ ).

2022 RECAP: Was the Mets Opening Day starter and earned the victory after tossing 5.0 scoreless innings against the Nationals...Did not allow a run over 5.1 innings and earned the victory in his following start against the Phillies on April 12...Started the Mets combined no-hitter against the Phillies on April 29 and threw 5.0 innings with three walks and five strikeouts...Struck out a season-high nine batters in his following start against the Braves on May 4...Was on the 15Day Injured List with right biceps inflammation from May 12 - June 10...Made two starts in his return from the IL before beginning another stint on the Injured List with a right shoulder strain on June 17...Was transferred to the 60-day IL on June 27 and returned to action on September 19...Made his final six appearances of the season in relief and allowed four earned runs over 6.0 innings in those appearances.

OPENOR: Last year, Tylor Megill was named the Mets Opening Day Starter...With 89.2 career innings pitched entering the 2022 season, Megill had the fewest major league innings of any Mets Opening Day starting pitcher in franchise history...Became the 28th different Opening Day starting pitcher in Mets history.

RUNS IN THE FAMILY: His brother, Trevor, is a pitcher in the Minnesota Twins organization...They both made their MLB debut in 2021..According to Elias, they are the fourth pair of brothers to make their major league debut in the same season since 2000 (2019, Scott \& Tyler Heineman, 2017, Joe \& A.J. Jimenez and 2012, Donovan \& Jhonatan Solano).

## QUINTANA NEWS \& NOTES

RECENTLY: Quintana made his first start with the Mets on July 20 against his former team, the Chicago White Sox....Quintana signed a two-year contract with New York on December 9, 2022...The southpaw began the season on the IL due to a stress fracture in his rib cage...Underwent surgery on March 17.

LAST TIME OUT: Quintana made his 12th start of the season on September 23 against the Phillies at Citi Field...He threw 6.0 innings and allowed five runs and no walks while striking out a season-high 10 batters...Marked his first doubledigit strikeout game since striking out a career-high 14 batters at Philadelphia on August 13, 2019 with Chicago-NL.

300 CLUB: Today, Quintana will make his 302 nd career major league start...In his start on 9/11/23, Quintana became the 11th active pitcher to reach 300 career starts and joined Clayton Kershaw, Madison Bumgarner and Wade Miley as the only active left-handed ptichers with 300 or more career starts.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT RECAP: Made five appearances across St. Lucie (A), Binghamton (AA) and Syracuse (AAA) as part of his rehab assignment after being placed on the 60-day IL with a left rib fracture...Threw 15.2 innings in five games, four of which were starts, pitching to a 4.60 ERA (8 ER/15.2 IP) while tallying 16 strikeouts compared to eight walks.

PHILADELPHIA FREEDOM: Tonight, Quintana will make his ninth start against the Phillies...Quintana last faced Philadelphia in his most recent start on September 23, 2023 at Citizens Bank Park.

HOT STREAK: Quintana's homerless inning streak came to an end at 97.1 innings in his start on August 12 at St. Louis after allowing a solo homer to Tyler O'Neill to lead off the bottom of the seventh inning...The last pitcher before Quintana to reach 90.0+ homerless innings was Tyson Ross (100.0 IP) in 2015...Courtesy of Elias...Last season Quintana owned the lowest ERA (0.89) in Major League Baseball during the month of September last year and is the lowest ERA in any month in his career.
