AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their six-game road trip today with the second game of a three-game set at Toronto (0-1 thus far)...will also play a three-game set at Baltimore (Tues.-Thurs.)...went 5-4 on their recent nine-game homestand after going 1-2 vs. St. Louis, 2-1 vs. Atlanta and 2-1 vs. Seattle.

- **Their 68-54 (.557) record is the second-best in the American League and the sixth-best in the Majors**, trailing only Tampa Bay (74-47, .612), Milwaukee (75-48, .610), Los Angeles-NL (74-49, .602), Atlanta (73-49, .598) and Chicago-NL (72-51, .585).
- Have won four of their last seven games (since 8/7) and five of their last nine games (since 8/4)...are 14-10 in their last 24 games (since 7/19) and 18-12 in their last 30 games (since 7/9).
- Each of the Yankees' last four wins, 11 of the Yankees' last 18 wins (since 7/9), 13 of their last 22 wins (since 6/23) and 19 of their last 33 wins (since 5/31) have been comeback wins.
- **Have won three of their last four completed series (since 7/31)...have won or split eight of their last 10 completed series since 7/6 (are 6-2-2 in those series).**
- Have had 21 of their last 29 games decided by 2R-or-fewer (since 7/10), going 13-8 in those games...are 33-28 (.541) in games decided by 2R-or-fewer this season.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees fell to the Blue Jays, 3-1, in their series opener on Friday at Rogers Centre...**RHP Gerrit Cole** (6.0IP, 5H, 2R/1ER, 2BB, 5K, 0HR) suffered his sixth loss of the year despite allowing only 2R/1ER in 6.0IP...**CF Trent Grisham** (2-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI) drove in the Yankees' only run with his 16th home run of the season, a go-ahead solo shot in the sixth inning...**RHP Paul Blackburn** (1.0IP, 2H, 1K) tossed a scoreless seventh inning...**RHP Bradley Hanner** (1.0IP, 1H, 1R/ER, 2K, 1HR) made his Major League debut and allowed 1R/ER in the ninth inning.

MERRY GRISHMAS: **OF Trent Grisham** recorded two hits and hit his 16th home run of the season with a go-ahead solo shot in the sixth inning on Friday at Toronto...seven of his 16HR this year have either tied the game (four) or given the Yankees the lead (three)...as a Yankee, 31 of his 59 home runs have either tied the game (11) or given the Yankees the lead (20).

- **Has hit safely in each of his last six games (since 8/8), marking his second-longest hitting streak this season**, trailing only an eight-game streak from 6/4-7/3...**is batting .440/.440/1.080 (11-for-25) with 6R, 4 doubles, 4HR and 8RBI over his last six games.**
- 10 of his last 14 hits have been XBH (5 doubles, 5HR).
- **Has hit 4HR in his last five games (since 8/9) and 5HR in his last 10 games (since 8/3).**

FOR STARTERS: **Yankees starting pitchers have allowed 2R-or-fewer in 13 of their last 16 starts (since 7/28), including 1R-or-fewer in 11 of those starts, posting a 2.05 ERA (92.1IP, 21ER) during that span**...have allowed 2R-or-fewer in 16 of their last 21 starts and 1R-or-fewer in 14 of those starts (since 7/22-G2), posting a 2.40 ERA (116.1IP, 31ER) with 133K during that span.

- **Have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 95 starts this season, their most such starts through their first 122 games of a season in franchise history** (previous: 94GS in 2021 and 2022)...have allowed 2R-or-fewer in 71 games this season, their second-most starts through their first 122 games of a season in franchise history, trailing only their 75 starts in 2022.
- Have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 27 of their last 31 starts (since 7/8), including 2R-or-fewer in 22 of those starts, posting a 2.81 ERA (166.1IP, 52ER) during that span.
- **Rank second in the Majors this season in ERA (3.42, second in AL)**, third in strikeouts (683, first in AL), strikeout rate (25.2%, first in AL), K/9.0IP (9.38, first in AL) and opponents' SLG (.374, second in AL), fourth in opponents' OPS (.665, second in AL) and opponents' BA (.226, second in AL), fifth in HR/9.0IP (1.06, second in AL), sixth in K/BB (3.32, third in AL), opponents' OBP (.291, fourth in AL) and WHIP (1.16, fourth in AL), and eighth in BB/9.0IP (2.83, fourth in AL).

ROAD WARRIORS: The Yankees are 37-27 (.578) on the road this year, the second-best record in the AL and the third-best in the Majors...are 10-5 in their last 15 road games (since 7/9) and 23-14 in their last 37 games on the road (since 5/25).

AUSTIN POWERS: **C Austin Wells is batting .333/.419/.593 (9-for-27) with 3R, 4 doubles, 1HR, 3RBI, 3BB, 1HP and 1SB over his last 13 games (since 7/30).**

- Is hitting .302/.400/.535 (13-for-43) with 6R, 4 doubles, 2HR, 4RBI, 5BB, 2HP and 1SB over his last 19 games (since 7/20).
- Has posted a .919 OPS over his last 25 games (since 7/9).
- Eight of his last 16H since 7/9 have been XBH (4 doubles, 4HR).
- **His 2.92 catcher's ERA is the best in the Majors.**
- According to Baseball Savant, is tied for fourth in the Majors in catcher framing runs (five), tied for fifth in blocks above average (six) and ninth in shadow strike pct. (49.3%)...is tied for sixth in the Majors in DRS among catchers (eight - FanGraphs).

McMAHON OF THE HOUR: **INF Ryan McMahon** is hitting .313/.395/.469 (10-for-32) with 4R, 2 doubles, 1HR, 5RBI, 5BB and 1SF over his last 11 games (since 8/2).

GOODSCHLITT: **RHP Cam Schlittler** will make his 26th start of the season today vs. Toronto...has gone 10-6 with a 2.21 ERA (146.2IP, 36ER) and 182K in 25 starts this season, holding opponents to a .196/.247/.325 (105-for-536) slash line...**his 2.21 ERA is the 10th-lowest by a Yankees starter through their first 25 starts of a season since 1913 (when ER became an official stat) and the fifth-lowest by a Yankees starter in the Expansion Era** (since 1961), trailing only Steve Kline (1.79 ERA in 1972), Ron Guidry (1.79 ERA in 1978), Stan Bahnsen (1.98 ERA in 1968) and Whitey Ford (2.18 ERA in 1964).

- **Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 21 of his 25 starts this season**, tied for the second-most in the Majors (tied for first in AL).
- **Has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in a Major League-best 17 starts this season, including 15 of his last 21 starts (since 4/17)...his 17 starts of 1ER-or-fewer this season are tied for the seventh-most by a Yankees pitcher in a single season**, trailing only Ron Guidry (21GS in 1978), Whitey Ford (20GS in 1964), Fritz Peterson (19GS in 1969), Spud Chandler (18GS in 1943 and 1946) and Whitey Ford (18GS in 1963)...Luis Gil (2024), Luis Severino (2017), Steve Kline (1972), Mel Stottlemire (1968), Stan Bahnsen (1968) and Allie Reynolds (1952) also recorded 17 such starts in a single season.
- Has gone 8-2 with a 1.10 ERA (89.2IP, 11ER) and 107K in 14 road starts this season...has allowed one-or-zero ER in 12 starts, including 10 of his last 11 road starts (since 4/23)...according to *Elias*, **his 1.10 ERA on the road is the sixth-lowest by any Major League pitcher over his first 14 road starts of a season** (since 1913), trailing only Bob Gibson's 0.70 ERA in 1968, Walter Johnson's 0.96 ERA in 1913, Roger Clemens' 1.00 ERA in 2005, Claude Hendrix's 1.08 ERA in 1914 and Luis Tiant's lower 1.10 ERA in 1968.
- Has gone 8-3 with a 1.54 ERA (122.1IP, 21ER) and 144K in his first 20 career starts on the road...**his 1.54 career road ERA is the second-lowest by any Major League pitcher (since 1913) through their first 20 career road starts, trailing only Paul Skenes (1.30)** - credit: *Elias*.

NEW YORK 'PEN STATION: **Yankees relievers have allowed only 2R/1ER allowed in their last 17.1 innings** (since 8/9)...**have posted a Major League-best 2.50 ERA (234.0IP, 65ER) over their last 62 games (since 6/3)**, holding opponents to a .198 (167-for-842) BA during that stretch.

- **Own the second-best bullpen ERA in the Majors this season (3.05, second in AL)**...also rank second in the Majors this season in inherited runners scored percentage (22.4%, first in AL), opponents' SLG (.349, first in AL) and opponents' OPS (.650, second in AL), third in opponents' BA (.221, first in AL), fourth in opponents' OBP (.301, third in AL) and WHIP (1.20, third in AL), fifth in HR/9.0IP (0.93, second in AL) and 10th in K/BB (2.49, fifth in AL).

ON A ROLL: **RHP Paul Blackburn** tossed a scoreless seventh inning on Friday at Toronto (1.0IP, 2H, 1K)...**has not allowed an earned run in 22 of his last 24 appearances (one start) since 6/21, going 2-1 with one save, a 0.78 ERA (34.2IP, 3ER) and 30K during that stretch.**

- Has gone 4-2 with one save, a 1.87 ERA (67.1IP, 14ER) and 53K in 45 games (two starts) this season, holding opponents to a .194/.271/.291 (46-for-237) slash line.
- Has recorded at least four outs in 27 of his 43 relief appearances this season, the second-most in the Majors this season.

COLETRAIN: **RHP Gerrit Cole** allowed only 2R/1ER in 6.0 innings on Friday at Toronto (L, 5H, 2BB, 5K, 0HR)...has gone 6-6 with a 3.22 ERA (86.2IP, 31ER) and 92K in 15 starts this season...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 12 of his 15 starts, including 2R-or-fewer in 10 of those starts.

- **Has posted a 2.57 ERA (49.0IP, 14ER) over his last eight starts (since 7/3)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of those starts, including 2R-or-fewer in six starts.**
- **Has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in three of his last four starts (since 7/28), posting a 1.46 ERA (24.2IP, 4ER) with 26K in that span.**
- Struck out George Springer in the fourth inning on Friday for his 2,340th career strikeout, surpassing Early Wynn (2,339K) for 55th place on the all-time strikeout list.

PITCH PERFECT: **Yankees pitchers have posted a Major League-best 3.27 ERA (1,089.2IP, 396ER) this season** (next: Boston-3.51)...have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 14 of their last 21 games (since 7/22-G2), including 2R-or-fewer in 12 of those games, posting a 2.58 ERA (192.0IP, 55ER) during that stretch.

- Have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 19 of their last 29 games (since 7/10), posting a 2.78 ERA (265.0IP, 82ER) with 289K during that span.
- Their 459R allowed this season are their second-fewest through their first 122 games of season in the last 46 162-game seasons (since 1979), trailing only their 429R allowed in 2022 (excludes the 60-game season in 2020 and the strike-shortened 1981 season).

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP CAM SCHLITTLER (10-6, 2.21 ERA)

RHP Cam Schlittler will make his 26th start of the season today at Toronto...the 25-year-old will pitch on extended five days' rest due to Monday's team off day...made his 25th start of the season on Sunday vs. Atlanta and allowed only 1R/ER over 7.0IP in a no-decision (3H, 0BB, 11K, 1HR)...marked his third career regular season double-digit strikeout game (also 13K on 6/19 vs. Cincinnati and 12K on 7/24 at Philadelphia)...**has gone 10-6 with a 2.21 ERA (146.2IP, 105H, 43R/36ER, 31BB, 182K, 14HR) in 25 starts this season**...has also allowed 1ER-or-fewer in 17 of his starts, including 15 of his last 21 starts (since 4/17)...**his 2.21 ERA is the 10th-lowest by a Yankees starter through their first 25 starts of a season since 1913 (when ER became an official stat) and the fifth-lowest by a Yankees starter in the Expansion Era** (since 1961), trailing only Steve Kline (1.79 ERA in 1972), Ron Guidry (1.79 ERA in 1978), Stan Bahnsen (1.98 ERA in 1968) and Whitey Ford (2.18 ERA in 1964)...was named to his first All-Star team, but did not pitch...saw his first Major League action in 2025 with the Yankees, going 4-3 with a 2.96 ERA (73.0IP, 58H, 24R/ER, 31BB, 84K, 8HR) in 14 starts...in 39 career Major League starts, has gone 14-9 with a 2.46 ERA (219.2IP, 163H, 67R/60ER, 62BB, 266K, 22HR)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 33-of-39 career starts, 2R-or-fewer in 28 starts and 1R-or-fewer in 22 starts...according to *Elias*, **his 2.46 career ERA is the second-lowest by a Yankees pitcher through their first 39 career starts since 1913** (ignoring relief appearances and excluding openers), trailing only Stan Bahnsen (2.36 ERA)...**also marks the fifth-lowest ERA by any Major League pitcher whose first 39 career appearances were all starts since 1913** (when ER became an official stat), trailing only Paul Skenes (1.91 ERA), José Fernández (2.26 ERA), Dwight Gooden (2.38 ERA) and Jacob deGrom (2.44 ERA)...**his 266K through his first 39 career games are the most in franchise history** (previous: Masahiro Tanaka - 251K)...the Weymouth, Mass., native was selected by the Yankees in the seventh round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft out of Northeastern University (Mass.).

LAST TIME OUT: Made his 25th start of the season on Sunday vs. Atlanta and allowed only 1R/ER over 7.0IP in a no-decision (3H, 0BB, 11K, 1HR)...allowed his only run on a solo home run to Matt Olson in the seventh inning...marked his third career regular season double-digit strikeout game (also 13K on 6/19 vs. Cincinnati and 12K on 7/24 at Philadelphia)...also marked the third time he has recorded at least 10K and 0BB in a regular season game in his career.

- ★ **Is one of only seven pitchers in franchise history to record at least 10K and 0BB in at least three games in a season**, joining Gerrit Cole (six in 2021), Mike Mussina (four in 2001), Luis Severino (three in 2018), Masahiro Tanaka (three in 2017), David Wells (three in 1998) and David Cone (three in 1998).
- ★ Is one of only three pitchers in the Majors this season to record at least 10K and 0BB in at least three games, joining Milwaukee's Jacob Misiorowski (five) and Cleveland's Gavin Williams (three).

2026: In 25 starts this season, has gone 10-6 with a 2.21 ERA (146.2IP, 105H, 43R/36ER, 31BB, 182K, 14HR)...has held opponents to a .196/.247/.325 (105-for-536) slash line...**see Major League rankings at right**.

- ★ **His 2.21 ERA is the 10th-lowest by a Yankees starter through their first 25 starts of a season since 1913 (when ER became an official stat) and the fifth-lowest by a Yankees starter in the Expansion Era** (since 1961), trailing only Steve Kline (1.79 ERA in 1972), Ron Guidry (1.79 ERA in 1978), Stan Bahnsen (1.98 ERA in 1968) and Whitey Ford (2.18 ERA in 1964).
- ★ **His 182K are the sixth-most by a Yankees pitcher through their first 25 games of a season**, trailing only Gerrit Cole's 215K in 2021 and 189K in 2022, David Cone's 207K in 1997, Ron Guidry's 191K in 1978 and Luis Severino's 183K in 2017.
- ★ **Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 21 of his 25 starts this season, including 1R-or-fewer in 15 starts (including six scoreless starts)**...his 21 starts of 3R-or-fewer are tied for the second-most in the Majors (tied for first in AL).
- ★ **Has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in a Major League-best 17 starts this season, including 15 of his last 21 starts (since 4/17)...his 17 starts of 1ER-or-fewer this season are tied for the seventh-most by a Yankees pitcher in a single season, trailing only Ron Guidry (21GS in 1978), Whitey Ford (20GS in 1964), Fritz Peterson (19GS in 1969), Spud Chandler (18GS in 1943 and 1946) and Whitey Ford (18GS in 1964)**...Luis Gil (2024), Luis Severino (2017), Steve Kline (1972), Mel Stottlemyre (1968), Stan Bahnsen (1968) and Allie Reynolds (1952) also recorded 17 such starts in a single season.
- ★ Has recorded at least 7K in 15 of his starts, including 8K in 11 starts...has recorded at least 10K in a start three times this season (13K on 6/19 vs. Cincinnati, 12K on 7/24 at Philadelphia and 11K on 8/9 vs. Atlanta).
- ★ Has allowed 4H-or-fewer in 16 of his starts, the second-most in the Majors (first in AL).
- ★ The Yankees are 15-10 in his starts...his 15 team wins are tied for fourth-most in the AL.
- ★ Has received 2R-or-fewer of support in 15 of his starts, including one-or-zero runs in 11 starts.
- ★ Has tossed at least 6.0IP in 15 of his 25 starts this season, including 14 of his last 21 starts (since 4/17)...his 15 starts of at least 6.0IP are tied for the fourth-most in the AL...has tossed more than 6.0IP nine times this season, including at least 7.0 innings five times.
- ★ Has held right-handed batters to a .188/.232/.308 (39-for-208) slash line this season...ranks fourth in the Majors in opponents' OBP (second in AL) and opponents' BA (third in AL), and sixth in opponents' OPS (.540, fourth in AL)...has held left-handed hitters to a .201/.256/.335 (66-for-328) slash line.
