In pre-game ceremonies tonight, Reds box office team member **Nicole Luca** will be recognized as the organization's **Reds Way All-Star of the Month for August**.

QUERIES ABOUT SERIES

In their **previous 8 series**, the Reds went **4-1-3** (2-1 at Mil, 2-1 vs Col, 2-1 vs Pit, 2-2 at Atl, 2-0 vs LAA, 2-2 vs Cubs, 0-3 at Wsh, 2-2 vs StL)...the **4-0-2 stretch** was the Redlegs' longest **series streak** of the season without a loss.

IMMACULATE INNING

In the ninth inning of yesterday's **5-4 loss vs StL**, RHP **Kevin Gausman** became only the fifth documented Reds pitcher to retire **all 3 batters** in an inning, **all by strikeout** and with just **9 pitches**...the 5 Reds pitchers are listed below...4 other Major League pitchers have thrown **Immaculate Innings** so far this season (**Chris Sale** twice, **Josh Hader**, **Thomas Pannone**, **Stephen Strasburg**).

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 1** of a 3-game series vs **JP Nolan's Padres** and **Game 5** (2-2) of a 7-game homestand that included a **2-2 series split** vs the first-place **Cardinals**...is **Game 14** (6-7) of a stretch in which the Reds are scheduled to play **13 of 16 games at Great American Ball Park** (2-0 vs LAA, 2-2 vs Cubs, 0-3 at Wsh, 2-2 vs StL, 0-0 vs SD)...following this series and Thu's off day the Reds will embark on their longest road trip of the season, a **3-city, 10-day, 11-game road trip to Pit's PNC Park** (3g), **Mia's Marlins Park** (4g) and **StL's Busch Stadium** (4g, day/night DH on 8/31).

SERIES NOTES: The Redlegs earned a 3-1 series win in **April at Petco Park**...haven't won a **season series vs SD** since **2012** (6-2) and since then are **18-25**, including **15-22** the last 6 years...over the last 6 seasons, Cin is **8-14 at Petco Park**.

THE PUNISHER: Rookie **Aristides Aquino** has produced **11 HR** in his **first 18 career games**, including a **3-homer game on 8/10 vs Cubs** in which he homered in **3 consecutive innings** (2nd, 3rd, 4th)...he played 1 game for the Reds last season.

- Established modern **Major League records for home runs** in a player's **first 12 career games** (8), **first 14 career games** (9), **first 16 career games** (10) and **first 17 career games** (11)...will share, at least, with **Rhys Hoskins** the modern Major League record for HR in a player's first 19 or 20 career games.
- Is the **first Major League rookie** and **first Reds player** to homer in **3 consecutive innings** (2nd-4th), tying the **Major League record** for HR in consecutive innings in a game...he was the **13th player** to do it, the second this season (**Chi's Kris Bryant**, 5/17 at Wsh, 7th-9th).
- Is the **second player** in modern Major League history with a **3-homer game** within his **first 10 career games** (**Bobby Estalella**, 10th game, 9/4/1997).
- Is the **third rookie batter** since 1900 to produce at least **10 HR** over an **11-game span** (8/6-8/17), joining LAD's **Cody Bellinger** (2017) and Det's **Rudy York** (1937).
- With **11 HR**, all in August, is **3 shy** of the club record for home runs in a calendar month...**Frank Robinson** hit **14 HR** in **August 1962**, and **Greg Vaughn** had **14 HR** in **September 1999**.

SUSPENDED: LHP **Amir Garrett** is **7 games** into an **8-game suspension**...in his absence the Reds are **2-5**, while the **bullpen's ERA** is **4.61** (27.1ip, 14er)...he cannot be replaced on the 25-man roster...**Garrett** was **1 of 9 ejected** in the **11-4 loss on 7/30 vs Pit** and, 2 days later, **1 of 8 suspended** by Major League Baseball...also suspended were manager **David Bell** (6g), RHP **Jared Hughes** (3g) and RF **Yasiel Puig** (3g) of the Reds and manager **Clint Hurdle** (2g), RHP **Keone Kela** (10g), **José Osuna** (5g) and RHP **Kyle Crick** (3g) of the Pirates...**Bell** and **Hughes** already served their suspensions.

FIRST WATCH: In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in **runs scored** (101), **HR** (37), **RBI** (98), **batting average** (.308) and **slugging percentage** (.512) while ranking second in the majors in **on-base percentage** (.367)...have outscored opponents in the first frame, **101-67**, and are **30-8** (.789) when leading after the first inning...**6 times** this season scored **at least 4 runs** in the first.

REHABBING: RHP **Tyler Mahle**, on the injured list since **7/22** with a **left hamstring strain**, on Friday began a rehabilitation assignment for Class AAA Louisville vs Rochester, started and received no decision in the 5-2 loss (.1ip, 3h, 3er, 1bb, 2k, 37 pitches)...he is expected to throw a bullpen today and pitch again for the Bats on Wed at Columbus...**C Curt Casali**, on the injured list since **7/18** with a **sprained medial collateral ligament** in his **right knee**, on **8/9** and **8/10 made 2 rehab apps** before he was shut down with soreness in his **left hamstring**...tomorrow he is expected to return to his rehab assignment with Louisville...**IF/OF Derek Dietrich**, on the injured list since **8/5** with **left shoulder inflammation**, is scheduled to begin a rehabilitation assignment with **Louisville** tonight at Columbus.

2-WAY PLAYER: RHP **Michael Lorenzen** has appeared in 77 of the Reds' 123 games so far this season, including 51 times solely as a **pitcher**, twice as a **pinch hitter/pitcher**, once solely as a pinch hitter, once as a **pitcher/LF/RF** (7/22 at Mil), once as a **pitcher/LF** (6/2 vs Wsh), twice as a **P/RF**, 4 times as a **CF**, 3 times as a **LF**, 8 times solely as a **pinch runner**, once as a **pinch runner/CF** (3/28 vs Pit, CF), once as a **pinch runner/LF** (5/9 at Oak) and once as a **pinch runner/RF** (5/24 at Chi) and once as a **CF/P** (7/17 at Chi)...**9 times** in his career, including twice this season (4/9 vs Mia, 4/15 at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch...5 times in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including twice as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...**Lorenzen** this year became the **first player in Reds history**, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in **each of the first 6 games of a season** (PR/CF, P, PR, P, PR, P)...is the first Reds player with more than 380 career innings pitched (390.1) to play center field since **Hal Jeffcoat** (474.1ip) in **1958**...**Ron Mahay** was the last Major League pitcher with at least 300 innings also to play CF...**Mahay** played in 5g in CF for the Red Sox in 1995 and then pitched his 300th inning in 2006 for the Rangers.

CATCH A BREAK: The Reds have used **5 catchers** this season, including **Tucker Barnhart**, **Curt Casali**, **Kyle Farmer**, **Juan Graterol** and **Ryan Lavarney**...the **3 catchers** on the club's **Opening Day roster - Barnhart (IL), Casali (IL) & Farmer** (concussion) - simultaneously were unable to play for **8 days** (7/18-7/25) until **Barnhart** came off the injured list prior to the game on **7/26**...**Barnhart** and **Farmer** have returned to the active roster...on **7/26**, **Barnhart** filled the roster spot vacated by **Graterol**, who went on the **7-day concussion list**...**Farmer** was reinstated from the 7-day concussion list on **7/28**...he replaced **Lavarney**, who was designated for assignment...per @EliasSports, the Reds used **6 catchers** in a season just **7 times** in their history, most recently in **1992** (**Troy Aferir**, **Scott Bradley**, **Joe Oliver**, **Jeff Reed**, **Dan Wilson**, **Rick Wrona**)...also used **6 catchers in 1963**, **1961**, **1937**, **1925** and **1895**...the **1909 Reds** used a club-record **8 catchers** (**Tommy Clarke**, **Tom Downey**, **Emil Haber**, **Mike Konnick**, **Larry McLean**, **Si Pauxtis**, **Duck Pearce**, **Frank Roth**).

Tonight's Pitcher - #27 Trevor Bauer, RHP

RED HOTS

Trevor Bauer tonight is making his fourth appearance for the Reds...at the July 31 deadline was acquired as part of a 3-team trade in which the Indians received from the Reds **OF Yasiel Puig** and **LHP Scott Moss** and from the Padres **OF Franmil Reyes**, **LHP Logan Allen** and **IF Victor Nova**, while SD received from the Reds **OF Taylor Trammell** (truh-MELL)...leads the Major Leagues **innings pitched** (172.2) and ranks fourth in the majors in **strikeouts** (204)...since the beginning of the 2018 season, among all starting pitchers with at least 300 innings ranks seventh in **strikeouts** (425), eighth in **ERA** (3.16), and 10th in **innings pitched** (348.0)...in 2018 was an American League **All-Star**, finished fifth in the **Cy Young Award** voting, ranked second in the AL in **ERA** (2.21) and allowed the fewest **HR per 9 innings** in the league (.0462)...in his 5-2 win on 8/9 vs Cubs, in his **Great American Ball Park** debut as a Red recorded **11 strikeouts**, his 26th career **10-strikeout game** and seventh of the season...his 11th strikeout was his **200th strikeout**, the second 200-strikeout season of his career (221 strikeouts in 2018).

Tomorrow's Pitcher - #54 Sonny Gray, RHP

RED HOTS

Sonny Gray is a **2019 National League All-Star**...tomorrow will make his first career appearance vs SD...in his **last 9 starts** is **5-1, 1.59** with **8 quality starts** and **3 times** was the victim of **blown saves**...in his **last 6 starts** at **Great American Ball Park** is **6-0, 2.27**...is only the second pitcher ever to **win 6 consecutive starts** at **GABP**...**Johnny Cueto** did it twice, winning **7 straight starts** from **6/6-8/18, 2012** and **6 consecutive starts** from **6/11-8/10, 2014**...will take a career-high **18-inning scoreless streak** into tomorrow's start, the longest active streak in the Major Leagues and the longest by a Reds pitcher since **Jared Hughes** led last year's staff with a career-high **19.2-inning scoreless streak** (5/4-6/17)...has 8 wins and 4 times was the victim of blown saves...began the season with 9 starts without a win, the longest such streak of his career to begin a season...was bothered in spring training by stiffness in his right elbow and made just 3 exhibition starts, but he started the Reds' second game of the season...hasn't missed a turn since.

9 JOSÉ PERAZA, inf 2nd Half: 22-79 (.278), 4 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 13rbi

- In 61 apps beginning 5/31 is hitting .277 (41-148, 8 2b, 2 3b, 1hr, 21rbi, 1sb), raising his season batting average from .199.
- Leads the team with 42 starts at 2B (last, 8/8 vs Cubs)...made 18 starts at SS, second-most on the team behind José Iglesias (104gs) and most recently in 3 straight games from 8/9-8/11 while Iglesias recovered from soreness in his right biceps.
- Made 1 start at 3B (Sat vs StL), his only career start at that position, and 10 starts in the outfield, including 8 starts in LF (last, 6/14 vs Tex) and 2 starts in CF (6/9 at Phi, 6/22 at Mil).
- Made the first 2 pitching apps of his career...with 2 outs in the ninth inning of the 11-4 loss on 7/30 vs Pit, in a game that featured 9 ejections, threw 4 pitches and induced Jacob Stallings to F8...in the 13-4 loss on 8/16 vs StL threw a scoreless ninth inning, allowed only an infield single to Kolten Wong.
- Because of Scooter Gennett's injury in spring training, spent most of this season playing primarily 2B and occasionally CF or LF, while José Iglesias has been the team's starting SS...has made 5 apps and 1 start at 3B.

15 NICK SENZEL, cf 2nd Half: 32-115 (.278), 7 2b, 2 3b, 2hr, 11rbi, 2sb

- Last name is pronounced sen-ZELL.
- Has a 3-game hitting streak (3-12, .250, solo HR, .500slg, .357obp).
- His .285 batting average through 8/2 is a season high.
- Has 3 leadoff HR (5/6 vs SF off Drew Pomeranz, 6/12 at Cle off Zach Plesac, 8/17 vs StL off Miles Mikolas)...Zack Cozart (4 in 2012) and Drew Stubbs (3 in 2009) are the only other Reds rookies with at least 3 leadoff HR in a season.
- Is the only player in franchise history, and 1 of only 21 players in Major League history, to produce 3 HR in his first 4 Major League apps.
- Began the season on Louisville's injured list with a right ankle sprain suffered on 3/25 during a spring training game in Goodyear...came off the IL on 4/23 and in 8 apps for the Bats prior to his 5/3 promotion hit .257 (1 2b, 1hr, 2rbi).

7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf 2nd Half: 35-123 (.285), 14hr, 23rbi, 1.034ops

- First name is pronounced AY-you-hay-nee-oh.
- Left Fri's game in the sixth inning with a left thumb sprain, did not play Sat vs StL, then homered off Jack Flaherty in his first plate appearance yesterday.
- Since the All-Star break ranks among the National League leaders in HR (14, T1st) and slugging percentage (.659, 5th).
- In the first inning, leads the Major Leagues in HR (12) and ranks T3rd in the majors in RBI (22) while ranking second in the National League in slugging percentage (.735) and 11th in batting average (.337).
- Beginning 6/30, homered in 16 of his last 42 apps (18hr), including a pair of 2-homer games (7/1 vs Mil, 7/22 at Mil).
- Twice this season homered in 3 consecutive plate apps (7/1-7/12, 7/22-7/23).
- Suárez and Tony Pérez are the only third basemen in franchise history with 25 HR in 3 seasons and the only third basemen in club history with 30 HR in 2 seasons.
- Received votes for National League Player of the Month for July after leading the NL in HR (12), slugging percentage (.733) and total bases (66, T1st)...also finished among the July leaders in RBI (23, 3rd), OPS (1.086, 3rd) and extra-base hits (15, 5th).

17 JOSH VANMETER, inf/of 2nd Half: 26-81 (.321), 7 2b, 4hr, 9rbi, .952ops

- With Joey Votto recovering from a low back strain, started at 1B in the Reds' last 4 games (4-13, .308, 1 2b, 1rbi, .400obp)...are his first career starts at that position.
- Started each of the Reds' last 7 games overall (2B, 2B, LF, 1B, 1B, 1B, 1B) and hit safely in 6 of those games (8-25, .320, 2 2b, 1rbi)...yesterday went 0-for-3, snapping his career-high 6-game hitting streak.
- In his fourth stint with the Reds this season, has made 29 apps and 19 starts since he was promoted from Louisville just after the All-Star break...was 1 of 7 roster moves that day (7/18).
- Has made 26 starts (13gs/24g in LF, 6gs/13g at 2B, 2gs/6g at 3B, 4gs/6g at 1B, 1gs at DH)...also made 1 appearance in RF (7/22 at Mil).
- His solo HR off RHP Jhoulys Chacín on 7/24 at Mil traveled 463 feet per Statcast, the longest by a Reds batter this season and the second-longest by any player at Miller Park in 2019 (Travis Shaw, 465 feet, 6/23 vs Cin)...was the longest home run by a visiting player at Miller Park since StL's Marcell Ozuna hit a 479-foot HR on 4/3/18.
- Is 1 of 4 Reds players to homer in at least 3 straight games (Derek Dietrich, Eugenio Suárez 3 times, Aristides Aquino 4g).
- Is a 2019 International League All-Star...in 49 apps for the Bats hit .348 (14 2b, 1 3b, 14hr, 43rbi, 8sb, 1.097ops)...started at 1B (10g), 2B (20g), 3B (10g) and LF (3g).
- In April was the organization's Minor League Player of the Month and the International League's Player of the Month (.358, 11hr, 28rbi).
- In spring training came over from minor league camp to make 10 apps for Reds (1-13).
- Is a native and resident of Ossian (AH-see-in), Indiana, a town of about 3,400 located near Fort Wayne...graduated from Norwell High School.

33 JESSE WINKER, of 2nd Half: 28-86 (.326), 5 2b, 1 3b, 3hr, 12rbi, .949ops

- Last started Wed at Wsh (CF, 1-3, 2bb).
- Because of upper back spasms didn't start any of the Reds' last 4 games, but pinch hit yesterday and walked.
- In his last 16 apps beginning 7/29 is hitting .364 (16-44, 2 2b, 2hr, 5rbi, .996ops).
- In his last 26 apps beginning 7/18 is hitting .342 (25-73, 5 2b, 3hr, 9rbi, .976ops).
- Has 4 career leadoff HR, including 3 this season (6/18 vs Hou off Justin Verlander, 7/31 vs Pit off Dario Agrazal, 8/12 at Wsh off Erick Fedde)...the leadoff HR off Fedde came on the first pitch of the game.
- Has 16 HR, a new single-season career high (7hr, 2017 & 2018)...his career high for RBI in a season is 43 (2018).
- Hit his eighth HR, his new career high, in his 28th appearance and 23rd start.
- Has made 87 starts, including a team-high 59 starts in LF (16gs in CF, 11gs in RF, 1gs at DH).
