**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets completed a three-game sweep of the Phillies on Thursday, beating Philadelphia, 4-2...The Mets are coming off their eighth series win of the season and their fifth series win at home...New York continues a six-game homestand (3-0) against Philadelphia (3-0) and Toronto (three games)...New York is off on Monday before the start of a six-game road trip to Atlanta (three games) and Pittsburgh (three games).

**BASEBALL IS THE BEST:** Tonight, the New York Mets will host Lou Gehrig Day at Citi Field...New York City native Sarah Langs, who shared her ALS diagnosis last year, will participate in a special pre-game ceremony. During the ceremony, the Amazin' Mets Foundation will present Project ALS with a \$10,000 grant for research in honor of Langs...Langs, raised on the Upper East Side, grew up attending Mets games with her family at Shea Stadium... In addition, each broadcast booth across the league will hang an illuminated star named "A Langs Star," courtesy of Project ALS. Fans will also be able to purchase A Langs Star for \$50 at starsforsarah.org.

**COUNTDOWN TO THE HOF:** Infielder Howard Johnson, LHP Al Leiter and broadcasters Gary Cohen and Howie Rose will be inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame tomorrow, Saturday, June 3 in a pre-game ceremony prior to the 4:10 p.m. game vs. the Blue Jays at Citi Field...The four new additions will bring the total membership of the Mets Hall of Fame to 34...Jay Horwitz will also be honored with the Mets Hall of Fame Achievement Award for his contributions to the organization...A collection on the Mets Virtual Vault highlighting this year's Mets Hall of Fame 2023 inductees and Mets Hall of Fame Achievement Award recipient is now live at metsheritage.com.

**THEY'RE OUT OF MY LEAGUE:** The new schedule format has New York playing a total of 43 Interleague games in 2023, more than double their previous high for a single season (20)...The Mets are 8-4 against the American League this year...Overall, New York owns a 243-231 record in Interleague play...The team's .513 winning percentage is the second-best among National League clubs.

**INTERSTELLAR:** Jeff McNeil owns a .333/.382/.454 slashline with 41 runs, 14 doubles, seven home runs and 36 RBI in 79 Interleague games, while Starling Marte has slashed .326/.388/.542 with 118 runs, 45 doubles, 11 triples, 28 home runs and 88 RBI in 181 Interleague games...They rank first and third in average among active players in Interleague play (min. 250 PA)...McNeil's .333 clip is the highest all-time by a Met.

**INTERLEAGUE PETE:** Pete Alonso has hit 35 home runs in Interleague Play since the 2019 season...His 35 home runs against the American League is a franchise record, and the most among any player since 2019...Mike Piazza was the previous record holder with 28 Interleague home runs.

**CANHA GET AN AMEN?:** Over the last 14 games, Mark Canha is 12-36 (.333) with seven runs, two doubles, two home runs, eight RBI, five walks with a .442 OBP, .556 SLG and a .997 OPS...He has safely reached base in each of his last nine games with a plate appearance, batting .348 (8-23) with five runs, two home runs, six RBI, five walks with a 1.091 OPS in that span.

**BROOKS WAS HERE:** Brooks Raley allowed four earned runs in one inning of work on April 4 in Milwaukee...Since then he has pitched to a 1.08 ERA (2 ER/16.2 IP) with six walks and 19 strikeouts...Since returning from the IL, the southpaw has not allowed a run in any of his last nine games, striking out 11 over those 7.2 innings.

**HOMER HAPPY:** After the Mets went five straight games without a home run, the Mets have homered in season-high 15 straight contests, hitting 24 home runs in that span...It is the longest active streak in the majors...The Mets are 25-13 when hitting a home run this season and 9-7 when hitting multiple homers...The 15-game homer streak is the second-longest in franchise history.

**IF YOU START ME OFF:** The Mets are 16-0 this season when their starter goes at least 6.0 innings and 6-0 when the starter goes at least 7.0 innings...The Mets 16-0 record is the best in the majors...New York's 16 straight such team wins is the longest single-season streak since the Astros went 17 straight in 2021...Courtesy of Elias.

**EIGHT DAYS A WEEK:** The Mets have won eight straight home games, the longest streak since winning nine consecutive from May 18-June 14, 2022...New York has pitched to a 2.80 ERA (23 ER/74.0 IP) in that span with 16 walks and 71 strikeouts and has hit .243/.323/.414...The Mets have outscored opponents 38-26 in the streak...The Mets have played 24 games at Citi Field, the fewest home games in the majors this season...The team is 15-9 at Citi Field this year...The team won 54 games at home last year.

**EIGHT IS GREAT:** The Mets are 27-0 when leading after eight innings this season...The last time the Mets lost a game when they were ahead after eight innings was on September 6, 2021 at Washington...The Mets were up 3-2 and lost 4-3 in the bottom of the ninth...Since then the Mets have won their last 122 games when ahead after eight, the longest active streak in MLB...It's the longest streak in franchise history, surpassing the previous high of 117 consecutive games.

**FOR PETE'S SAKE:** Pete Alonso has hit 20 home runs this year, which leads the majors leagues...His 46 RBI are fourth in The Show and lead the National League...Alonso ranks 12th in franchise history with 426 career RBI...Next up is Kevin McReynolds (456) and Keith Hernandez (468)...Alonso has appeared in all 56 of the Mets games this year.

**THE YOUNG AND THE RESTLESS:** Francisco Alvarez has hit eight home runs this season...That puts him tied for the fourth-most by a rookie in the majors and third in the National League...Only two rookie catchers in Mets history have had more homers in a season...Travis d'Arnaud (13) holds the club mark for home runs by a rookie catcher in 2014...Jason Phillips hit 11 as a rookie in 2003...Alvarez's nine career homers (one last year) before turning 22 years old are the most by a catcher since Iván Rodríguez had 21 from 1991-1993.

**STEAL THIS BASE:** The Mets are second in the major leagues with an 86.7% stolen base success rate this season...Starling Marte has swiped 16 bags this year, tied for fifth in the majors and tied for second in the National League...His 330 career stolen bases rank second among active players...Elvis Andrus is the active leader with 340 steals.

**D-FENCE:** The Mets have committed 19 errors in 57 games this year, the fewest errors in the majors...New York owns a .990 fielding percentage...Their .990 fielding percentage also leads the major leagues.

**COOKIE'S KIDS:** As part of the Cookie's Kids Program, Mets pitcher Carlos Carrasco is partnering with Northwell Health to host pediatric cancer patients from Cohen Children's Medical Center at Citi Field and share his inspiring story with patients and their families...Before tonight's game, Carrasco hosted patients at Citi Field for the first visit of the season...The children toured the stadium, enjoyed lunch with Carlos, received Mets-branded gifts and tickets to a future game.

### VERLANDER NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Allowed a season-high-tying six run over 5.0 innings on nine hits, one walk and two strikeouts May 27 at Colorado...Was the second time in his last three starts allowing six runs.

**INCREDIBLE IN INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** In 58 career Interleague starts, Verlander is 39-10 with a 2.67 ERA (113 ER/380.1 IP)...In Interleague play history, Verlander has the most wins, the second-most strikeouts (420) trailing only Max Scherzer (452) and the third-lowest ERA among qualifiers...In his last Interleague start, May 21 vs. Cleveland, Verlander earned his 42nd career Interleague quality start, tied with Zack Greinke for the most quality starts in Interleague play history.

**BLANKING THE BLUE JAYS:** Two of Justin Verlander's three no-hitters have come against the Blue Jays at Rogers Centre...Verlander is the only pitcher in major league history to throw multiple no-hitters at a single road venue and is one of three pitchers all-time to throw multiple no-hitters against a single opponent joining Addie Joss vs. Chicago-AL (1908, 1910) and Tim Lincecum vs. San Diego (2013, 2014).

**30 FOR 30:** With a win on May 10th against the Reds, Verlander became the 21st pitcher in major league history to have at least one win against all 30 current major league teams...He joined Gerrit Cole, Zack Greinke and teammate Max Scherzer as the only active pitchers to have at least one win against all 30 current major league teams...Courtesy of Elias.

**3K AND COUNTING:** Entering the 2023 season, Verlander was 12th on the all-time strikeout list with 3,198 strikeouts, five ahead of teammate Max Scherzer...Scherzer has since passed Verlander, but the pair remain close, with just 21 separating the two...Entering last season, Verlander ranked 19th on the all-time with 3,013 career strikeouts, seven behind Scherzer...During the 2022 season, Verlander passed all-time greats John Smoltz, C.C. Sabathia, Curt Schilling, Bob Gibson, Pedro Martinez and Fergie Jenkins...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

**A TRUE COMEBACK STORY:** In 2022, Verlander returned to the mound for the first time since July 24, 2020 and had a tremendous season after fully recovering from Tommy John Surgery...Verlander went 18-4 with a 1.75 ERA (34 ER/175.0 IP) in 28 starts with the Astros last season in route to his third career Cy Young Award and American League Comeback Player of the Year...His ERA was the lowest by an American League pitcher in a full season since Pedro Martinez had a 1.74 ERA (42 ER/217.0 IP) in 2000...It was the third-lowest ERA by an AL pitcher and the ninth-lowest in the majors in a single season in the Divisional ERA (1969)...Verlander led the AL in ERA, wins, WHIP (0.83), opponent OPS (.497), opponent average (.186), opponent slugging percentage (.297) and hits per nine innings (5.97)...At 39 years and 227 days, Verlander became the fourth oldest Cy Young Award winner in major league history behind Roger Clemens (2004, 42 years, 60 days), Gaylord Perry (1978, 40 years, 17 days) and Early Wynn (1959, 39 years, 267 days).

**LIKE A FINE WINE:** Verlander's ERA last season was the second-best in major league history by a pitcher age 39 or older behind Cy Young's 1.26 ERA in 1908 during his age 41 season (Min. 20 starts)...His 0.83 WHIP last season was the highest mark by a pitcher age 39 or above in major league history (Min. 20 starts)...Verlander's 185 strikeouts last season were the most by a pitcher in a season age 39 or older since John Smoltz struck out 197 batters in his age 40 season in 2007...His 18 wins at 39 were the most at the age since Mike Mussina won 20 games in his age 39 season in 2008.

**THE RÉSUMÉ SPEAKS FOR ITSELF:** Verlander is one of 11 pitchers with at least three Cy Young Awards...In 2011, Verlander took both the AL Cy Young and the AL MVP after winning the AL pitching triple crown after leading the league in after leading the league in wins (24), strikeouts (250) and ERA (2.40)...He is one of 11 pitchers to win both a Cy Young and MVP in the same season...Verlander and Don Newcombe are the only pitchers in major league history to have won Rookie of the Year, Cy Young and MVP...A nine-time All-Star, Verlander is tied with Clayton Kershaw for the most All-Star game appearances by an active pitcher...Verlander has started two Mid-Summer classics (2012 and 2019) and is one of 12 pitchers in major league history to start the All-Star game with two different clubs.

### TUESDAY'S STARTER: RHP TYLOR MEGILL (5-3, 4.67)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Allowed a season-high-tying six runs (four earned) for the second straight start on May 28 at Colorado...Surrendered 10 hits, issued two walks and struck out three batters.

**AMAZING AGAINST THE AL:** In five career outings (four starts) against American League opponents, Megill is 3-0 with a 2.38 ERA (6 ER/22.2 IP)...All three wins in Interleague play for Megill have come against AL East opponents and all have been quality starts...This season, Megill allowed two runs over 6.0 innings on May 18 vs. Tampa Bay at Citi Field.
