METSELLANEOUS: The Mets scored five runs in the top of the ninth to earn a 5-2 victory over the Cardinals last night...New York is a season-high 4.5 games ahead in the NL East...The Mets continue a six-game road trip to Arizona (2-1) and St. Louis (1-0)...Following this trip, the Mets are off on Thursday before beginning their second homestand of the season, a six-day, seven-game homestand against the Phillies (three games) and Braves (four games)

ON THE ROAD: New York is $8-3$ on the road this year...The .727 winning percentage is tied with San Francisco (also 8-3) for the best in the majors.

LET'S GO STREAKING!: New York is seeking to match their season-high winning streak of three games...New York won three straight from April 7-9, from April 12-15 and again from April 17-19...On the other hand, the Mets have lost back-to-back games just once this season, from April 10-11.

RIGHT ON TIME: Chris Bassitt has allowed just one hit to right-handed hitters this year. He is holding righties to a . 038 (1-26) mark and allowed just one free pass... His . 038 batting average against right-handed hitters leads the major leagues...As a team, the Cardinals are batting .222/.303/.311 against right-handed pitchers...They own a OPS against righties, which is 25 th in the majors and 14 th in the National League.


MAXIMAL EFFORT, MINIMAL DAMAGE: Max Scherzer has earned three wins, whiffed 33 batters, allowed just 11 hits and pitched 25.0 innings in his first four starts as a Me making him the only pitcher ever to generate those figures through four games to begin a stint with a franchise... He is the fourth pitcher ever to produce that pitching line in his first four starts of a season (also, Carlos Rodón last year; Trevor Bauer, 2020; J.R. Richard, 1980)...Scherzer is the 28th pitcher to put up those numbers in *any* fourgame span and it's the fourth time he's done it in his career...Only Nolan Ryan and Justin Verlander (six times each) have done it more.

THE SOUND OF REFRESHMENT: In seven career games at Busch Stadium, Pete Alonso is 11-28 (.393) with seven runs, a double, two home runs, three RBI and six walks...James McCann is 8-19 (.421) with two runs, three doubles, three RBI and three walks in five career games at the ballpark.

IT'S IN THE CARDS: Robinson Canó is a . 341 (14-41) career hitter with six runs, six doubles, a home run, two RBI and three walks in 11 career games vs. St. Louis...J.D. Davis is 9-23 (.391) with three runs, two doubles, a home run, four RBI and a walk in 10 games against S Louis...Starling Marte has played 115 games against St. Louis and is a .289/.347/.419 hitte with 60 runs, 17 doubles, nine triples, eight home runs, 40 RBI and 24 walks.

EL JEFF-E: Jeff McNeil is batting 316 (18-57) with 10 runs, four doubles, a triple, a home run, seven RBI, five walks, a . 381 OBP, a .474 SLG and an .855 OPS over 16 games this season... He is on a four-game hitting streak, batting .375 (6-16) with five runs, three doubles, a triple, an RBI with a 1.063 OPS in that span...McNeil has recorded six multi-hit games, which is tied for 10 th in the majors... He has recorded 116 multi-hit games since he entered the majors on July 24, 2018...That is 48th on the team's all-time list.

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The Mets are looking for their sixth series victory of the season tonight...That would set a new franchise record...The Mets have won each of their first tong team to win their first six series to start the year was the 2019 Pays. Only three NL teams since 2012 have won each of their first six series of the year (2018 Arizona, 2012 St. Louis, 2012 Washington)

MAZEL TOV: The Mets have posted a 13-5 record through the team's first 18 games. Only the 2015 and 1986 teams at 14-4 produced a better record through 18 games. The 2018 Mets also went 13-5 through the first 18 games...New York's pitching staf has struck out 183 this season...That ranks fourth in team history through 18 games

STARTING OFF: The Mets starting staff has gone 9-2 with a 2.29 ERA ( 25 earned runs/98.1 innings) with 20 walks and 106 strikeouts...The starting staff leads the majors in WHIP (0.85), innings, opponent's batting average (.182) and strikeouts and is second in the majors in ERA.

FIRST IS THE BEST: The Mets are 10-1 when scoring first this season...That is the bes mark in the majors...New York was 56-23 when scoring first last season.

INVADER NIM: In 13 games this year, Brandon Nimmo is hitting . 292 (14-48) with 10 runs, two doubles, a triple, three home runs, five RBI and eight walks with a . 393 OBP, a .532 SLG and a . 955 OPS...His career . 393 career on-base percentage ranks second in team history, behind only John Olerud's . 425 mark (min. 1,000 plate appearances).

CARDS-METS NOTES: The Mets are seeking their first season series victory against the Cardinals since they went 4-3 in 2014...The Mets are 20-29 at Busch Stadium since it opened in 2006

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: Francisco Lindor is batting . 294 (20-68) with 12 runs, fou doubles, four home runs, 12 RBI, 10 walks, three steals, a 388 OBP, a .529 SLG and a .917 OPS...He has safely reached base in 16 of the 18 games this season...He ranks sixth in the major leagues with a 1.2 fWAR this year.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE: New York leads the major leagues in hits (155), tied for the lead in runs (86) is third in OBP (340) fourth in average (256) tied for fifth in walks (65) seventh in OPS (.732), tied for eighth in home runs (17), and 10th in SLG (.393)...Through 18 games this year, the Mets have outscored their opponents $86-51$

WIELDING AND FIELDING: The Mets have committed just two errors over their las 13 games...Overall, the Mets have committed only five errors in 18 games...That is the fourth-fewest in the National League and sixth-fewest in the majors...The Mets rank sixth in the majors with a .992 fielding percentage

THE CHARMING MAN: In seven games this season, Drew Smith has posted a perfec ERA, allowing only three hits and three walks while striking out eight in 7.0 innings of work...He owns a career record of $4-3$ with a 2.92 ERA ( 27 earned runs/83.1 innings) with 27 walks and 743 strikeouts...Smith was acquired by the Mets from the Tampa Bay Ray on July 27, 2017 in exchange for Lucas Duda.

DESIGNATED FOR HITTING: As a team, Mets designated hitters are batting . 299 (20-67) with 13 runs, five doubles, five home runs, 15 RBI, eight walks, a . 382 OBP and a .597 SLG...They rank third in average, SLG and OBP, are tied for second in home runs and tied for third in doubles.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Alonso is fourth in the majors and second in the NL with 16 RBI...He is batting .268 (19-71) with nine runs, three doubles, three home runs, 16 RBI, two walks and a .437 SLG this year... He is batting $.353(6-17)$ with six runs, two doubles, three homes, 11 RBI with a 1.389 OPS in four games as a designated hitter this year.

MOVING ON UP: Pete Alonso's last home run was the 109th of his career...That broke tie with José Reyes for sole possession of 13th on the team's all-time list....Ed Kranepoo (118) is next, followed by Edgardo Alfonzo (120)

OUCH: The Mets have been hit by 15 pitches this year, which leads the majors...New York was plunked 94 times last year, which ranked fourth in the majors and third in the National League...Since 2018, the Mets have been hit by 323 pitches, the most in the majors...In his career, Pete Alonso has been plunked 42 times...That is the fourth-highes total in the majors since he entered the league in 2019...Teammate Mark Canha ranks second in that span with 57 HBP, while Starling Marte is fifth (41) in the last four seasons

ED, EDD AND EDDY: Edwin Díaz has record 66 saves as a member of the Mets....That places him 10th on the franchise's all-time list...Next up is Neil Allen who recorded 69 as a member of the Mets... He has recorded 175 saves in his career, which places him sixth on the active list...Since arriving in New York, Diaz is $9-14$ with 66 saves, a 3.91 ERA ( 67 earned runs/154.1 innings) with 63 walks and 252 strikeouts... His 252 strikeouts as a reliever in that span is the third-highest total in the majors...Only Liam Hendriks (284) and Josh Hader (282) have struck out more...Additionally, his 252 strikeouts are the 14th most by a reliever in franchise history...Turk Wendell is 13th with 259.


LAST TIME OUT: In his last start, Bassitt faced San Francisco on April 20... He pitched 6.0 innings for his third straight start...He gave up five earned runs on eight hits, striking out six batters and walking one on 97 pitches.

VS. ST. LOUIS: Will take the mound against the St. Louis Cardinals for the second time in his career...In his first start against them on June 25, 2019, he gave up three runs on four hits in 3.1 innings of work while striking out two batters and walked four.

POBODY'S NERFECT: In 109 career games ( 96 starts), Chris Bassitt has only given up four or more earned runs in 19 starts...He has surrendered three earned runs or fewer in his remaining 90 games.

RIGHT ON TIME: Bassitt has allowed just one hit to right-handed hitters this year... He is holding righties to a $.038(1-26)$ mark and allowed just one free pass... His . 038 batting average against right-handed hitters leads the major leagues....As a team, the Cardinals are batting .222/.303/.311 against right-handed pitchers... They own a . 614 OPS against righties, which is 25 th in the majors and 14th in the National League.
ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Bassitt went 6.0 scoreless innings in his first and only road start of the season...Last season with Oakland, Bassitt posted a 3.71 ERA (36 earned runs/87.1 innings) with 90 strikeouts and 27 walks...Across his career Bassitt has a 4.25 ERA ( 135 earned runs/286.0 innings) and 19-11 record in away games...Against the NL Central, Bassitt owns a 3.54 ERA ( 11 earned runs/ 28.0 innings) with 10 walks and 28 strikeouts.

DAZZLING DEBUT: Chris Bassitt became the second Mets pitcher to debut with a line of at least 6.0 scoreless innings with eight or more strikeouts... The only other Mets debut of 6.0 or more innings, no runs and eight or more strikeouts was Collin McHugh's MLB debut in 2012.

TRIPLE THREAT TRIO: Tylor Megill, Max Scherzer, and Chris Bassitt each won their first two starts of the season... The last time a trio of Mets starting pitchers won at least their first two outings of the year was in 2015, when Bartolo Colon won his first four starts, Matt Harvey won his first five and Steven Matz won his first two...The last time three members of the Mets' Opening Day rotation accomplished the feat was in 1973 (Tom Seaver, Jerry Koosman, Harry Parker).

2021 RECAP: Last season, Chris Bassitt pitched his way into his first career AllStar game and into AL Cy Young contention, posting a 3.15 ERA (55 earned runs/157.1 innings) in 27 starts, striking out 159 batters and walking only 39 ... Was 10-2 with a 3.28 ERA ( 43 earned runs/118.0 innings) in 19 starts before the All-Star Break...Threw his first career complete game shutout, a two-hitter, on May 27 vs. the Angels...Finished the first half on a career-best 10-game winning streak.... Held or shared the AL lead in innings (118.0) and wins before the break... Had a 2.75 ERA ( 12 earned runs/39.1 innings) in eight starts after the break...On August 17 at Chicago-AL, he took a line drive to the face and suffered multiple facial fractures...Underwent surgery on August 24 and returned to the mound less than one month later on September 23 to make his final two starts of the season ( $6.1 \mathrm{IP}, 4 \mathrm{H}, 1 \mathrm{ER}, 4 \mathrm{BB}, 5 \mathrm{~K}$ )...Received two fifth-place votes for AL Cy Young and finished 10th in the balloting.

## TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CARLOS CARRASCD [1-0, 1.47$]$

LAST OUTING: On April 21, Carlos Carrasco worked 7.2 innings earning the win over San Francisco at home...He had seven strikeouts and no walks in the game giving up only four hits...Carrasco had one previous start with the Mets going 7.0 innings or more, and that came on August 26, 2021 also against the San Francisco Giants at Citi Field.

NO HITS FOR YOU: This season Carrasco has struck out 20 batters through three starts, which is the most he has had through his first three starts since 2020 when he had 23 with Cleveland...Carrasco is third in the league in opponents batting average (.141) and on-base percentage (.179).
