TODAY'S GAME: The Braves and Blue Jays today conclude a three-game midweek series with the last of three games between the clubs this season...This is their only scheduled meeting this year.

A Atlanta beat Toronto yesterday, 7-3, to clinch this series...LHP Patrick Corbin lost his 12th consecutive decision against the Braves, now tied for the longest losing streak against the club in the modern era.

A The Braves dropped last season's series to the Blue Jays in Canada, 2-1...Since 2021, Atlanta's .294 winning percentage (5-12) against Toronto is its worst against any single opponent.

A The Braves endured a nine-game losing streak against the Blue Jays from 2021-2023...Atlanta was outscored 57-27 (-30) during that stretch, wherein its pitching staff logged a 5.94 ERA (51 ER/77.1 IP).

A Despite that period, the Braves have only lost one series to the Blue Jays here at Truist Park since the venue opened in 2017, playing to a 4-1-2 series record.

A LH Mason Fluharty is set to make the 88th appearance of his MLB career, but just his third start...The left-handed native of Lewes (LOO-iss), DE has pitched to a 3-0 record and a 3.97 ERA (10 ER/22.2 IP) this season...Despite being tied for the MLB lead with 32 games pitched, has only covered 22.2 innings...Fluharty owns an 8-2 record and a 4.30 ERA (36 ER/75.1 IP).

CHRIS SALE: Is tied for second in MLB with eight wins as he makes his 12th start of the season...The 6-foot-6 southpaw hailing from Lakeland, FL, has pitched to an 8-3 record and a 2.01 ERA (15 ER/67.0 IP), while striking out 80 and walking 17.

A He also ranks among MLB's leaders in ERA (4th, 2.01), WHIP (4th, 0.94) and opponent batting average (5th, .192).

A Sale earned the win in his last outing after holding his former Boston club to two runs across 5.0 innings while striking out eight.

A Since 1968, only three pitchers have maintained a sub-3.00 career ERA while making at least 300 starts: Pedro Martínez (2.93 ERA, 409 starts), Clayton Kershaw (2.53 ERA, 451 starts) and Chris Sale (2.98 ERA, 323 starts).

A Has won eight of his first 11 starts for the second time as a Brave (also 2024)...The last player to do so in franchise history was Warren Spahn, who did so three times (1947, 1953 and 1958).

A Has faced two generations of Guerreros in his career...He faced Hall of Famer Vladimir Guerrero in 2011 as a Chicago-AL reliever, during the elder Guerrero's final season with Baltimore...Has since held his on Vladimir Guerrero Jr. to a .182 average (2-for-11) with a home run, three walks and four strikeouts over 14 plate appearances dating to 2019.

SERIES PLAY: With last night's with, Atlanta clinched this set with Toronto...Since dropping a three-game series to Washington here at Truist Park from May 22-24, the Braves have won three straight sets while playing to a 6-2 record.

A Atlanta has lost only two series this season: the aforementioned to Washington and a three-game series at Seattle from May 4-6...The club split a four-game series in Arizona, translating to a 17-2-1 series record.

A The Braves' 17 series wins through 62 games are the most since the 2001 Mariners matched that mark...That Seattle club finished 116-46...Seventeen series victories at this juncture are also tied for the most by Atlanta in the modern era, in lockstep with the 1953 club.

A Every other team in MLB has dropped at least twice as many series as Atlanta...The New York Yankees and Milwaukee Brewers are tied for the second-fewest series losses with five apiece.

OZZIE ALBIES: Belted a three-run home run last night as part of 2-for-4 night at the dish, also doubling and scoring a pair of runs...In his last nine games, he's slashing .389/.410/.639 (14-for-36) with five extra-base hits and seven RBI...That batting average ranks sixth in MLB dating to May 24.

A The effort improved his batting average with runners in scoring position to .358 (19-for-53), good for fifth in the NL and eighth in MLB.

A The switch-hitting second baseman is pacing for 105 runs, 55 extra-base hits, 26 home runs and 88 RBI...Has 1.8 fWAR, the sixth most in MLB.

DUBÓN IN THE CLUTCH: Mauricio Dubón yesterday hit a two-out, three-run, go-ahead home run to give Atlanta the lead, 4-2...The utility player now has 20 two-out RBI this season.

A His 20 two-out RBI lead the National League and are the fourth most in MLB, only behind Christian Walker (HOU, 25), Dillon Dingler (DET, 25) and Cody Bellinger (NYY, 24).

A Dubón is batting .440 (11-for-25) with two outs and runners in scoring position, the best batting average with RISP in Major League Baseball (min. 20 PA with RISP).

PITCHING AT HOME: Braves pitchers held the Blue Jays to three runs last night, all earned...Atlanta has held its opponents to three earned runs or fewer in each of its last 11 home games, tied for the longest streak in MLB this season.

A The Braves last fashioned such a streak from August 30-October 2, 2022, when it strung together 15 such games.

A Atlanta hasn't ceded more than three earned runs in more than a month, last doing so on April 30 versus Detroit in a loss, 5-2.

Today's Game

⚡ Makes his 12th start of the season in the finale of a three-game series against Toronto at Truist Park...Pitches for the first time since defeating Boston on May 28, working 5.0 innings on 96 pitches in Atlanta's 10-2 win at Fenway Park.

⚡ Owns an 8-5 record with a 2.71 ERA (36 ER/119.2 IP) and 146 strikeouts in 21 career appearances (18 starts) against Toronto, the bulk of them logged before he reached the National League...Last defeated the Blue Jays on July 18, 2019 with Boston, allowing two hits over 6.0 scoreless innings with 12 strikeouts in a 5-0 win.

⚡ Has faced two generations of Guerreros in his career...Drew Hall of Famer Vladimir Guerrero in 2011 as a Chicago (AL) reliever, during the elder Guerrero's final season with Baltimore, and has since held son Vladimir Guerrero Jr. to a .182 average (2-for-11) with a home run, three walks and four strikeouts over 14 plate appearances in five starts dating to 2019.

⚡ Is 8-3 with a 2.01 ERA (15 ER/67.0 IP) and 80 strikeouts across his first 11 starts.

⚡ Won eight of his first 11 starts to open the season (8-3)...Has now done so twice as a Brave, also going 8-1 over his first 11 in 2024, and is the only pitcher to win at least eight of his first 11 games to begin a season multiple times in the Atlanta era (since 1966)...Warren Spahn did so three times for the franchise (1947, 1953 and 1958), all in its Boston and Milwaukee years...Per Stathead.

⚡ Ranks fourth among qualified major league pitchers with a 2.01 ERA, trailing only Philadelphia's Cristopher Sánchez (1.46), Milwaukee's Jacob Misiorowski (1.65) and New York's (AL) Cam Schiltler (1.89).

⚡ His nine quality starts are tied for the second-most in the majors, behind only Sánchez (10) and even with Kansas City's Michael Wacha and teammate Bryce Elder...Has turned in a quality start in nine of his 11 outings, the exceptions coming April 6 at Los Angeles (AL) and May 28 at Boston.

⚡ Has held opponents to a .192 average, the lowest mark among qualified major league left-handers and the fifth-lowest among all qualifiers.

⚡ His 37.1% chase rate is the second-highest among MLB qualifiers, behind only Sánchez (37.4%).

⚡ His eight wins are tied for the second-most among major league starters, behind only Cleveland's Gavin Williams (9).

⚡ Owns a 2.38 ERA (98 ER/370.1 IP) since joining the Braves in 2024, third among qualified MLB starters over that span, trailing only Pittsburgh's Paul Skenes (2.17) and Detroit's Tarik Skubal (2.34)...Has compiled 470 strikeouts in 61 appearances (60 starts) in an Atlanta uniform.

⚡ Since joining Atlanta in 2024, has gone 10-2 with a 1.12 ERA (12 ER/96.1 IP) and 127 strikeouts over 15 starts in the month of May...Has worked a quality start in 12 of those 15 outings with a 0.93 WHIP and just three home runs allowed.

⚡ His 2.30 ERA in the month of May is the lowest by any pitcher in the Live-Ball Era (since 1920) with at least 300.0 innings in the month, ahead of Hall of Famers Pedro Martínez (2.36) and Hoyt Wilhelm (2.39).

⚡ Owns a 4-1 record with a 0.60 ERA (2 ER/30.0 IP) over five home starts in 2026, compared to 4-2 with a 3.16 ERA (13 ER/37.0 IP) over six road outings.

⚡ Is 4-0 with a 1.57 ERA (4 ER/23.0 IP) in four series-deciding starts this season.

⚡ His 11.13 strikeouts per 9.0 innings (2,659 SO/2,151.0 IP) are the most in MLB history (since 1901) among pitchers with at least 1,500.0 career innings.

⚡ Since 1968, three pitchers have maintained a sub-3.00 career ERA while making at least 300 starts: Pedro Martínez (2.93 ERA, 409 starts), Clayton Kershaw (2.53 ERA, 451 starts) and Sale (2.97 ERA, 323 starts).

⚡ His 404 career appearances are the third-most among active starting pitchers (min. 60% starts), trailing only Detroit's Justin Verlander (556) and Toronto's Max Scherzer (488).

⚡ Earned his eighth victory May 28 at Boston, allowing two runs on six hits over 5.0 innings with three walks and eight strikeouts on 96 pitches in the 10-2 win at Fenway Park...Atlanta took the series 2-1.

⚡ Recorded his seventh victory May 20 at loanDepot park, allowing one run on four hits over 7.0 innings with no walks and eight strikeouts on 96 pitches in the 9-1 win...Notched his first career win against Miami after entering 0-2 in three prior starts.

⚡ Reached 150 career wins April 26 against Philadelphia, becoming the 265th pitcher in MLB history to do so...Allowed one hit over 6.0 scoreless innings with nine strikeouts in the 6-2 victory...Passed Chuck Finley (2,610) for 28th on the all-time strikeout list and seventh among left-handers.

⚡ Passed Tom Glavine (2,607) for 29th on the all-time strikeout list April 18 at Philadelphia.

⚡ Reached 400 career strikeouts with Atlanta on April 6, the 13th pitcher in franchise history to reach the mark.

⚡ Won his seventh career Opening Day start March 27, holding Kansas City to three hits over 6.0 scoreless innings with six strikeouts in the 6-0 win...Became the first Atlanta starter to throw 6.0-or-more innings on Opening Day since Michael Soroka (July 24, 2020).

⚡ **Awards:** NL Cy Young (2024), Rawlings Gold Glove (2024), NL Comeback Player of the Year (2024), AL All-Star (7x, 2012-18), NL All-Star (2024-25), and World Series Champion (2018).

⚡ In his 16th major league season, Sale was selected to seven consecutive AL All-Star teams from 2012-2018, was selected to the NL All-Star team in 2024 & 2025, and has eight career Top 10 finishes in Cy Young voting, winning the award with Atlanta in 2024.

⚡ In his first year with Atlanta and 14th major league season, Sale was named the National League Cy Young Award winner, a Rawlings Gold Glove Award recipient, a National League All-Star, a First-Team All-MLB Nomination and the National League Comeback Player of the Year, going 18-3 with a 2.38 ERA (47 ER/177.2 IP) and 225 strikeouts.

⚡ Led the National League in wins, strikeouts and ERA...Became the first pitcher in Braves franchise history to win the triple crown and first in the National League since Clayton Kershaw with Los Angeles in 2011.
