The Mariners lead the Majors in most "last at-bat" wins (14) this season... they rank just ahead of Cincinnati (11), Philadelphia (11) and Milwaukee (10).

Seattle starting pitchers have gone at least 5.0 innings in 50 games this season...the Mariners own a 33-17 record (.660) in those games.

TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners play the finale of a 10-day, 9-game homestand (7-1) with the second of 2 games vs. the Colorado Rockies...opened the homestand with a 3-game set vs. Minnesota (2-1), followed by a 4-game sweep of Tampa Bay (4-0)...following today's matinee, will embark on a 7-day, 6-game road trip vs. Chicago-AL (3 G; 6/25-6/27) and Toronto (3 G; 6/29-7/1)...today's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS**, as well as broadcast on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the **Mariners Radio Network**.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners won 2-1 last night vs. Colorado...have tied a season-high streak by winning 5 straight games, as well as 8 of their last 9 and 18 of their last 28...are 15-9 in day games and 24-27 at night...are 24-15 at T-Mobile Park and 15-21 on the road...are 32-11 when scoring at least 4 runs and 7-25 when scoring 3 or fewer runs...are 30-3 when out-hitting their opponent.

- One is Fun The Mariners improved to 17-7 in one-run games this season...their 17 wins in games decided
- by 1 run lead the Majors...their .708 winning percentage in one-run games also paces the Majors. In the Mix for Six The Mariners will aim to set a new season-high, 6-game winning streak...they previously won 5 straight this season from May 27-31...they last won 6 consecutive games from Aug. 30-Sept. 7, 2020.
- **7,000 Shed Long Jr**.'s go-ahead home run in the bottom of the 8th inning last night was Seattle's 7,000th all-time home run in franchise history.
- Double Play Matchup Seattle leads the Majors with 76 double plays turned...Colorado and Texas are tied
- Double Play Matchup Seattle leads the Majors with 76 double plays turned...Colorado and rexas are ned for 2nd with 71 double plays turned.
 MLB Debuts 7 players have made their Major League debut with the Mariners this season: OF Taylor Trammell (4/1 vs. SF), RHP Will Vest (4/1 vs. SF), RHP Wyatt Mills (5/1 vs. LAA), RHP Logan Gilbert (5/13 vs. CLE), OF Jarred Kelenic (5/13 vs. CLE), José Godoy (5/21 at SD) and OF Dillon Thomas (6/9 at DET)...RHP Vinny Nittoli will make his ML debut when he appears in a game.
 HALFWAY HOME...today marks the Mariners 40th of 81 scheduled home games this season...the Mariners are 24-15 (.615) at home this season, compared to 15-21 (.417) on the road...their 24 home wins this season are tied 7th-most in the Majors and rank 4th-most in the American League...are 7-1 during the current homestand and 12-3 in their last 15 games at T-Mobile Park...the Rockies enter today's game with

current homestand and 12-3 in their last 15 games at T-Mobile Park...the Rockies enter today's game with the worst road record in baseball with a mark of 5-28 (.152).

- Pack the Park The Mariners are 15-3 (.833) with at least 9,000 fans in attendance at T-Mobile Park...
- they are 9-12 (.429) in home games with fewer than 9,000 fans in attendance.

 Where the Heart Is Seattle has allowed 3.9 runs per game (152 runs allowed in 39 games) at T-Mobile Park this season...Seattle has allowed 5.4 runs per game (195 runs allowed in 36 games) on the road.

OH, FOR THE LONG ONE...Shed Long Jr. followed up his Sunday performance that included hitting a walk-off grand slam in the bottom of the 10th inning to complete a 4-game sweep over the Tampa Bay Rays with another game-winning home run last night...Long Jr. hit a solo blast in the bottom of the 8th last night in the 2-1 win over Colorado...he became the 5th Mariners player in team history to hit a go-ahead home run in the 8th inning or later of back-to-back games...he became the first since Nelson Cruz did it in back-to-back games on April 11-12, 2015...Seattle won that pair of games at Oakland 5-4 in 11 innings and 8-7 in 10 innings, respectively.

BAUERS POWERS HIS WAY TO 10...Jake Bauers went 1-for-3 with a double last night, extending his career-high hitting streak to 10 games...the streak also marks the Mariners first hitting streak to reach double digits this season...since making his Seattle debut on June 10, Bauers is hitting .326 (15x46) with 7 runs, 2 doubles, 1 home run and 5 RBI...he has hit safely in 11 of 12 games...Bauers is the first Seattle player with a hitting streak to reach double digits since Kyle Lewis had a 10-game hitting streak from Aug. 16-27, 2020, batting .444 (16x36) with 1 double, 3 home runs, 6 RBI and 7 walks in that stretch.

ZEROING IN...the Mariners bullpen did not allow a run in its second straight game last night...JT Chargois (0.1 IP), Paul Sewald (W-4, 1.0 IP, 1 BB, 1 SO) and Kendall Graveman (SV-6, 1.0 IP, 1 SO) allowed just 1 baserunner in Seattle's 2-1 win...Mariners relievers have not allowed a run in their last 7.0 innings...Héctor Santiago (10.0 IP), Drew Steckenrider (7.0 IP) and Sewald (5.0 IP) all carry active streaks of at least 5.0 innings without allowing a run out of the Mariners bullpen.

ALL-STAR J.P....J.P. Crawford is batting .358 (29x81) with 13 runs scored, 8 doubles, 3 home runs, 14 RBI, 8 walks and 1 stolen base in the month of June...he has reached base safely 37 times since June 1, getting on-base at a .407 clip, slugging .568 with a .974 OPS in the month.

- Lefty/Lefty He is batting .337 (33x98) with 8 doubles, 2 home runs and 15 RBI in 102 plate appearances against left-handed pitchers this season...the .337 average ranks best in the Major Leagues among left-handed hitters with at least 70 plate appearances against left-handed pitchers this season.
 First of All Crawford is batting .330 (31x94) with 14 runs scored, 8 doubles, 3 home runs, 14 RBI and 8 walks in 23 games batting leadoff this season...the .330 average ranks best in the American League among players with at least 70 plate appearances out of the leadoff spot in the order.

I'M SO FRANCE-Y...Ty France had his career-high, 9-game hitting streak snapped last night...despite the streak ending, France has reached base in 27 of his last 28 games since May 24...in that span, he is batting .314 (32x102) with 12 runs, 9 doubles, 3 home runs, 14 RBI, 6 walks and 7 hit-by-pitches...he's gotten onbase at a .388 clip, slugging .490 with an .878 OPS since he came off the Injured List on May 24...FanGraphs rates him as Seattle's most valuable player by Wins Above Replacement (1.6) this season.

LUIS LUIS...Luis Torrens is batting .438 (7x16) with 5 runs scored, 1 double, 3 home runs and 5 RBI since returning to Seattle on June 15...he has homered in 3 of his 5 games and raised his batting average by 39 points from .178 to .217 in a span of just 5 games.

ALL-STAR VOTING ENDS TOMORROW...Mariners fans can cast their all-star ballots at https://www.mlb.com/all-star/ballot until the voting period for Phase 1 concludes at 4:00 pm ET/1:00 pm PT on Thursday, June 24...on Sunday, June 27, the top three vote-getters at each position (and the top nine outfielders) in each league will be revealed at 12:00 p.m. (ET) on the 2021 Google MLB All-Star Ballot Finalists Show exclusively on MLB Network, and they will advance to the second phase of voting to determine who makes the All-Star teams and starts for each league.

AS YOU KNOW...Shed Long Jr. hit a walk-off grand slam on June 20 vs. Tampa Bay...he became the 9th Mariners player in team history to hit a game-ending grand slam, but...DID YOU KNOW?...that his home run last night made him just the 2nd player in Mariners history to hit a walk-off grand slam and also homer in his next game?...Long Jr. joins Tino Martinez, who hit his walk-off grand slam on July 17, 1995 in the bottom of the 10th in a 10-6 win over Detroit...Martinez also homered on July 18 vs. Detroit, a 3-run homer in the 6th inning of another 10-6 win over the Tigers...Tino and Shed both hit their walk-off grand slams in the Mariners 74th game of the season, and followed it up with their encore home runs in the team's 75th game of the season.

- 25-year-old left-hander is making his 13th start of the season, his 34th career Major League appearance (30th career start) and his second career start against the Colorado Rockies.
 Justus ("justice") Kane Sheffield...resides in Tullahoma, TN.
- Acquired in trade from New York-AL along with Erik Swanson (rhp) and Dom Thompson-Williams (of) in exchange for James Paxton (lhp) on Nov. 19, 2018.
- His older brother Jordan, made his Major League debut with Colorado on April 2, 2021.
- Justus made his Major League debut with the Yankees on Sept. 19, 2018 vs. Boston.
- Native of Tullahoma, TN...selected by Cleveland in the 1st round (31st overall) of the 2014 MLB Draft out of Tullahoma (TN) High School...at Tullahoma HS, was the 2014 "Gatorade National Player of the Year" after going 10-0 with a 0.43 ERA (3 ER, 61.2 IP) and 131 strikeouts in his senior season...had his number "42" retired by THS on Jan. 21, 2020.
- Began his pro career with Cleveland after being selected by the Indians with the 31st overall pick in the 2014 MLB Draft...spent parts of 3 seasons with Cleveland before being acquired by the Yankees in a 4-player deal that sent Andrew Miller (lhp) to the Indians on July 31, 2016...joined the Mariners in a 4-player deal that sent James Paxton (lhp) to the Yankees on Nov. 19, 2018.

LAST START...L#6 on June 16 vs. Minnesota...pitched 5.0 innings, allowing 7 runs on 10 hits and 2 home runs, walking 2 and striking out 4.

<u>UNEARNED</u>...Sheffield's 8 <u>unearned</u> runs allowed this season are tied for the Major League lead with 5 other hurlers...the other pitchers to surrender 8 unearned runs this season are Alex Colome-MIN, Luis Castillo-CIN, Charlie Morton-ATL, Mitch White-LAD and Ryan Yarbrough-TB.

BOUNCE BACK...Sheffield is 3-0 with a 3.88 ERA (44.1 IP, 19 ER) with 37 strikeouts 15 walks in 8 career starts following a start of 5 or more runs allowed

CENTURY MARK...Sheffield recorded his 100th career strikeout on April 19 vs. Los Angeles-NL, striking out Sheldon Neuse to end the 4th inning.

2021 DEBUT...on April 5 in first start of the season as the Mariners were shut out by the White Sox 6-0...allowed 6 runs (4 ER) on 8 hits while walking 2 and striking out 5 over 5.0 innings...allowed a solo home run to Yasmani Grandal leading off the 2nd inning followed by 3 runs in the 4th inning and 2 more in the fifth innings...it marked the 3rd time in his career to allow 6 runs in a game.

BROTHERLY LOVE...Justus' older brother Jordan made his Major League debut with the Rockies on April 2 vs. the Dodgers tossing a shutout inning...Justus and Jordan are 1 of 8 sets of siblings currently in the Major Leagues (on active roster or Injured List...they join RHP Daniel Bard (COL) and RHP Luke Bard (LAA; 60-day IL), INF Yuli Gurriel (HOU) and OF Lourdes Gurriel Jr. (TOR), IF Nick Maton (PHI) and RHP Phil Maton (CLE), C Austin Nola (SD; 10-day IL) and RHP Aaron Nola (PHI), LHP Taylor Rogers (MIN) and RHP Tyler Rogers (SF), INF **Kyle Seager** (SEA) and INF Corey Seager (LAD) and INF Luis Urias (MIL) and INF Ramon Urias (BAL).

NO HOME RUNS ALLOWED ... among pitcher who through at least 750 pitches or more during the 2020 season, Sheffield was 1 of 5 pitchers to allow 2 home runs or fewer...he joined Ian Anderson, Corbin Burnes, Brad Keller and Spencer Turnbull.

ROOKIE LEADER...in 2020, led American League rookies with 6 quality starts...among AL rookies, also ranked T2nd in starts (10), 3rd in innings pitched (55.1), 6th in strikeouts (48) and T7th in wins (4).

TRUE VALUE...posted a 1.6 fWAR, 2nd-best among all rookie pitchers in 2020, trailing only the Dodgers Tony Gonsolin (1.8)...Kyle Lewis (1.7) was the only American League rookie (position player or pitcher) to post a higher fWAR than Sheffield.

SEPTEMBER TO REMEMBER ... went 2-0 with a 2.16 ERA (6 ER, 25.0 IP) with 19 strikeouts and 8 walks in 4 starts in the month of September...his 2.16 ERA was tied for 10th-best in the Major Leagues (also: Joe Musgrove-PIT)/4th-best in the AL in September...his 2.16 ERA was 2nd-best by a Mariners rookie in the month of September in club history, behind only Rich DeLucia in 1990 (2.00/8 ER, 36.0 IP).

PICKING UP THE PACE....from Aug. 9 through the end of the 2020 season, worked at least 6.0 innings while allowing 2 or fewer runs in 6 of 8 starts over this span...during this stretch, went 4-1 with a 2.64 ERA (14 ER, 47.2 IP).

TOUGH ON LEFTIES...in 2020 allowed only 1 extra-base hit to a left-handed batter (Charlie Blackmon, 2B, 8/9 vs. COL)...limited lefties to a .154 (8x52) BAA while striking out 14 and walking 4.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW...made his Major League debut with the Yankees on Sept. 19, 2018 vs. Boston, tossing a scoreless 9th inning...made his debut at 22 years, 129 days of age...selected from Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre on Sept. 18.

CAREER...in parts of 4 Major League seasons with New York-AL (2018) and Seattle (2019-c), is 9-9 with a 4.66 ERA (79 ER, 152.2 IP) with 130 strikeouts and 65 walks in 32 games (28 starts).
