HERE'S THE RUB: The Detroit Tigers and Los Angeles Angels this afternoon play the rubber match of their three-game series at Comerica Park ... today continues a stretch of 13-straight games without a day off for the Tigers (through August 20) and wraps up a stretch of 13-out-of-16 games at home that began on July 24 ... the Tigers have gone 7-8 through the first 15 games of said stretch.

- The Tigers today take aim at their 14th series win out of 20 total sets this year at home.
- The Tigers have a 5.0-game lead in the A.L. Central over Cleveland, tied for the largest lead in any of the six divisions this year, but Detroit's edge is down from the 11.5-game lead the club held over the Twins and the 12.0-game lead on the Guardians and Royals at the All-Star Break.
- The Tigers have 20 games remaining in August, 17 of them against teams that have a record of below .500 ... the Tigers this homestand started a stretch during which they play 13-straight games against sub-.500 teams before hosting the Astros for three games from August 18-20.
- After the Tigers and Angels conclude their three-game series this afternoon, the Tigers tomorrow will start a seven-game, seven-day road trip through A.L. Central foes Chicago (three games, tomorrow-Wednesday) and Minnesota (four games, August 14-17) ... starting tomorrow, the Tigers are scheduled to play 13 of their next 19 games on the road.

HANG 10: Casey Mize last time out earned his 10th win in his 19th start of the season, surpassing the nine-career wins in 61 appearances (59 starts) that he had into this year (2020-22, 2024) . the 2025 A.L. All-Star today will match his 20 starts from last year and would surpass last season's innings total with 2.1 innings pitched today (102.1 IP last year; 100.1 IP this year).

Mize joins teammate Tarik Skubal (11-3) as double-digit winners this season, joining New York's Max Fried and Carlos Rodon; Texas' Nathan Eovaldi and Jacob deGrom; Milwaukee's Freddy Peralta and Quinn Priester: and Philadelphia's Cristopher Sanchez and Jesus Luzardo as the five sets of teammates in all of baseball with double-digit wins this season.

NOTHING TO CARP ABOUT HERE: Kerry Carpenter enters today with 20 homers this season, matching his career high from 2023, and now boasts a .590 slugging percentage vs. right-handed pitching since the start of the 2024 campaign, the third-highest mark in all of baseball behind only Shohei Ohtani (.688) and Aaron Judge (.682) ... minimum 500 plate appearances vs. righthanders.

LET THERE BE LIGHT: Today's game represents the lone day game for the Tigers and Angels during their three-game weekend series ... according to TruMedia, the Tigers are 30-18 (.625) in day games this season, trailing only the Brewers (31) and Cubs (31) for the most wins by any team in the majors during the day ... Detroit leads the A.L. with a .625 winning percentage during the day.

- Tigers pitchers have a 3.08 ERA (146 ER/427.0 IP) in day games this season, second-best in A.L. behind only Texas and its 2.51 ERA albeit in 11 fewer day games than Detroit.
- Zach McKinstry ranks fifth in baseball with a .317 batting average during the day behind Jacob Wilson (.382), Aaron Judge (.359), Paul Goldschmidt (.321) and Freddie Freeman (.319).

FEARSOME FIVESOME: Riley Greene joins Pete Alonso, Aaron Judge, Seiya Suzuki and Taylor Ward as the only five players in all of baseball to reach 23 doubles, 26 homers and 84 RBI this season ... Greene has those exact totals through 118 team games, which puts him on pace for 32 doubles, 36 homers and 115 RBI in a 162-game season, shattering previous career bests.

HOMER HAPPY: The Tigers are one of only three teams in the majors with at least nine players with nine or more homers, joining the Yankees (10 players) and the Dodgers (nine players), and are one of seven teams with seven or more players to reach double digits in homers this season.

- In 2024, the Tigers had only eight players finish the entire season with nine of more home runs while the 2023 Tigers finished the entire season with nine such players.
- The Tigers rank fifth in the A.L. with 152 homers this season, only 10 shy of their full-season total of 162 homers from 2024 ... the Tigers this year are aiming to finish in the Top 5 in the A.L. in home runs for the first time since 2014 (T4th with 155 homers) after eight-straight Bottom 5 A.L. finishes in home runs from 2017 through last season.

THIS IS SOME HIGH-END TORK: Spencer Torkelson Friday night crushed his 25th homer of the season, reaching the mark for the second time in the last three years (career-best 31 homers in 2023) ... Torkelson is the first Tiger to record a pair of 25-homer seasons in a three-year span since Miguel Cabrera and Victor Martinez both reached the mark in 2014 and 2016.

Torkelson's 25 homers are tied with Pete Alonso for the most by any player in baseball that primarily plays first base this year, while Torkelson's 48 extra-base hits are the most among first basemen in the American League, trailing only Alonso (53) for most in the majors.

WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?: The Tigers have the second-best record in the A.L. on the strength of a +73 overall run differential, trailing the Red Sox (+88) and Yankees (+87) for the best mark in the A.L. ... in the A.L. Central, the Tigers have a +90 edge on the second-place Guardians (-17), are +90 on the third-place Royals (-17) and are +99 on the fourth-place Twins (-26).

AND FINALLY: The Tigers are 48-7 (.873) when scoring five or more runs this season, the third-best record in all of baseball behind only Toronto (49-3, .942) and Milwaukee (52-6, .897).

CASEY MIZE'S HIGHS

- Earned a win with a quality start in his last outing, snapping a stretch of allowing 13 runs (11 earned) over his previous three starts.
- Named a 2025 All-Star for the first time in his career on July 11, becoming the sixth Tigers' player to be named to the team.
- Placed on the 15-day IL on May 10 (retro May 9) with a left hamstring strain...was activated and made his first start back against Cleveland on May 24.
- Became the first Tigers pitcher to win four games in April since Jordan Zimmerman won five games in 2016...went 4-1 with a 2.12 ERA (6 ER/24.1 IP) in five starts in April.
- In his first MLB action since 2022, Mize appeared in 22 games (20 starts) and posted a 2-6 record with a 4.49 ERA (51ER/102.1IP) and 78 strikeouts last season.
