AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their nine-game road trip today with the final game of a three-game set at Seattle (1-1 thus far)...were swept in a three-game set at St. Louis this weekend, the first time they were swept in a series of at least three games this season...will also play a three-game set in Boston (Fri.-Sun.).

- Are 71-40 (.640) to start the season, tied for the best record in the American League and tied for the third-best record in the Majors.
- Their 29 comeback wins are the most in the AL and the second-most in the Majors (Los Angeles-NL-32).
- Their +205 run differential is the best in the AL and second-best in the Majors (Los Angeles-NL +233).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees fell to the Mariners, 1-0, in 13 innings on Tuesday at T-Mobile Park...**RHP Gerrit Cole** (7.0IP, 4H, 0R, 0BB, 8K) started and did not record a decision despite tossing 7.0 scoreless innings...**RF Aaron Judge** (1-for-3, 2BB) reached base three times...**LF Andrew Benintendi** (1-for-5) and **DH Miguel Andújar** (1-for-5) were the only other Yankees to record a hit...**LHP Aroldis Chapman** (1.0IP), **RHP Clay Holmes** (1.0IP, 1HP), **RHP Scott Effross** (1.0IP, 1K), **LHP Wandy Peralta** (1.1IP, 1BB) and **RHP Lou Trivino** (0.2IP, 2BB, 1K) were all scoreless in relief...**RHP Jonathan Loáisiga** (0.1IP, 2H, 1R/0ER, 1BB) took the loss after surrendering a "walk-off" single to Luis Torrens in the 13th inning.

BLANK SPACE: The Yankees were shut out for the eighth time this season on Tuesday at Seattle (also 8/6 at St. Louis, 7/3 at Cleveland, 6/25 vs. Houston, Game 2 on 5/22 vs. Chicago-AL, 4/21 at Detroit, 4/17 at Baltimore and 4/11 vs. Toronto)...**including the postseason, are 17-4 after their last 21 shutouts and 18-5 in games following a shutout since 2018.**

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters lead the Majors in HR (188), runs (588) and walks (440), rank second in runs per game (.530), OBP (.331), SLG (.443) and OPS (.774), fourth in extra-base hits (358) and tied for third in stolen bases (71).

MILESTONE MAN: Manager Aaron Boone has 399 managerial wins and needs one win to reach 400...would be just the ninth Manager in Yankees history to accomplish the feat, joining Joe McCarthy (1,460-867-21), Joe Torre (1,173-767-2), Casey Stengel (1,149-696-6), Miller Huggins (1,067-719-10), Ralph Houk (944-806-7), Joe Girardi (910-710), Billy Martin (556-385) and Clark Griffith (419-370-18).

- Under his helm since 2018, the Yankees have posted the third-best record (399-258, .607) in the Majors during that span, trailing only the Los Angeles Dodgers (423-233, .645) and Houston Astros (405-252, .616).
- Boone has recorded 399 wins in 657 decisions...is seeking to become the fourth-fastest Yankees Manager to reach the milestone...according to *Elias*, Casey Stengel reached the mark in 633 decisions, Joe McCarthy did so in 635 decisions, Joe Torre accomplished the feat in 647 decisions and Ralph Houk reached the mark in 674 decisions.

SEA-ING CLEARLY: The Yankees have won their last 10 completed series at T-Mobile Park (since 9/12/11)...according to *Elias*, their streak matches the Yankees' longest road series winning streak against any opponent in franchise history...the Yankees also won 10 straight road series against the Boston Red Sox from 5/16/30-4/22/33.

- **Their 24-7 (.774) record since 2012 is the second-best by any team (min. 15G) at any stadium in that span** (Los Angeles-NL: 22-6, .786 at Citi Field).

CHAPPY DAYS: LHP Aroldis Chapman has not allowed a run in his last seven appearances since 7/26 (7.0IP, 3H, 1BB, 6K)...has held opponents to a .136 BA (3-for-22) in that span.

ON A ROLL: OF Andrew Benintendi is hitting .316/.350/.526 (6-for-19) with 3R, 4 doubles, 3RBI, 1BB and 1SB in five games on the road trip.

COLE TRAIN: RHP Gerrit Cole tossed 7.0 scoreless innings on Tuesday at Seattle...marked his sixth scoreless start of the season, tied for the third-most such starts in the Majors, trailing only Oakland's Paul Blackburn (seven) and Houston's Justin Verlander (seven)...**marked his 14th scoreless start as a Yankee, the most such starts in the AL since 2020.**

- Leads the Majors with 178K and ranks fourth with a 11.58 K/9.0IP ratio (178K/138.1IP).

NASTY NESTOR: LHP Nestor Cortes will make his 21st start of the season today...is 9-3 with a 2.57 ERA (112.0IP, 32ER) and 115K this season...ranks fifth in the AL and ninth in the Majors in both ERA and opponents' BA (.208).

- Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 17 of his 20 starts this season, 2R-or-fewer in 15 starts and 1R-or-fewer in 10 starts.
- Is 2-0 with a 1.93 ERA (23.1IP, 5ER) and 20K over his last four starts (since 7/14).
- Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 30-of-34 starts since the beginning of 2021 and 2R-or-fewer in 26 of those starts.
- In 42 appearances (34 starts) since the beginning of 2021, has gone 11-6 with a 2.72 ERA (205.0IP, 62ER), 218K and a .212 (161-for-759) opponents' BA...his 2.72 ERA in that span is the lowest in the AL and seventh-lowest in the Majors.

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge reached base three times on Tuesday at Seattle...has reached base at least three times in 28 games this season, the most such games in the AL and tied with San Diego's Juan Soto for the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Los Angeles-NL's Freddie Freeman (30).

- **Is batting .432/.553/1.027 (32-for-74) with 24R, 5 doubles, 13HR, 32RBI, 17BB, 3HP and 3SB in his last 20 games** (since 7/16).
- **Is just the second Yankee and the fourth Major League player (fifth time) to hit at least 44 home runs through his club's first 111 games of a season...** joins Barry Bonds (47HR in 2001 with SFG), Babe Ruth (46HR in 1921 with NYY) and Mark McGwire (45HR in 1998 and 44HR in 1999 with STL)...*through 112 team games*, Barry Bonds had 47HR in 2001, Babe Ruth had 46HR in 1921 and Mark McGwire had 45HR in 1998 and 44HR in 1999.
- Has 6HR in his last 11 games, 8HR in his last 14 games, 11HR in his last 17 games, 13HR in his last 20 games and 14HR in his last 22 games.
- Owns an 11-game on-base streak (since 7/28).
- Has 5RBI in his last three games, 7RBI in his last seven games, 16RBI in his last 11 games, 28RBI in his last 17 games and 32RBI in his last 20 games.
- Has 7HR in his last 15 games vs. the Mariners and 9HR in his last 23 games against Seattle...**has 6HR in his last 11 games at T-Mobile Park.**
- Since 2017, has hit .340/.439/.809 (16-for-47) with 9R, 4 doubles, 6HR, 14RBI, 8BB, 1HP, 2SB and 1SF in 12 games at T-Mobile Park.
- Is hitting .366/.486/.756 (30-for-82) with 5 doubles, 9HR, 53RBI, 22BB, 1HP and 4SF with RISP...marks the highest OPS (1.242), third-highest SLG (first in AL) and OBP (first in AL), and sixth-highest BA (third in AL) with RISP in the Majors.
- **Has reached base multiple times in 10 of his last 11 games, 18 of his last 20 games and 19 of his last 22 games.**
- Has reached base multiple times in 62 games this season, the most such games in the AL and tied with Los Angeles-NL's Freddie Freeman for the most in the Majors.
- **According to FanGraphs, his 7.1 WAR is the highest in the Majors among all players.**
- His 44HR lead the Majors...no other player has more than 34HR...also leads the Majors in runs scored (93), RBI (98), SLG (.675) and OPS (1.068), ranks second in XBH (63, first in AL), tied for second in multi-hit games (38, first in AL), tied for fourth in walks (60, tied for second in AL), ranks sixth in OBP (.393, third in AL) and 12th in BA (.303, seventh in AL).
- Has multiple hits in two of his last three games, three of his last five games, four of his last seven games, six of his last 10 games, 10 of his last 16 games and 12 of his last 20 games.

LEMACHINE: INF DJ LeMahieu had his 11-game on-base streak snapped on Tuesday at Seattle...**has still reached base in 37 of his last 39 starts** (since 6/21), batting .329/.454/.481 (52-for-158) with 36R, 6 doubles, 6HR, 16RBI, 35BB, 1HP and 3SB in that span...has reached base in 44 of his last 48 starts since 6/9.

- Since 6/21, ranks second in the Majors in OBP (.455, first in AL) and walks (36, first in AL) and ninth in BA (.329, third in AL).
- Has reached base multiple times in 22 of his last 28 starts (since 7/5).
- Has reached base multiple times in 54-of-101 games this year, tied for the third-most such games in the AL and tied for the eighth-most in the Majors.
- His 60BB this year are tied for the second-most in the AL and tied for the fourth-most in the Majors...also ranks fifth in the AL and eighth in the Majors in OBP this season (.388).

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP NESTOR CORTES (9-3, 2.57 ERA)

LHP Nestor Cortes will make his 21st start of the season in today's series finale vs. Seattle...the 27-year-old will pitch on regular four days' rest...last pitched on Friday at St. Louis, allowing 1H and 2ER over 5.1IP (4BB, 4K, 0HR)...**marked his third start this season in which he has allowed just 1H over at least 5.0IP...is just the third Yankee in franchise history to record three such starts in a season, joining David Cone (three in 1999) and Scott Sanderson (three in 1991)**...is 4-2 with a 3.81 ERA (52.0IP, 22ER) over his last 10 starts (since 6/8) after going 5-1 with a 1.50 ERA (60.0IP, 10ER) over his first 10 starts to begin the season...**has made seven starts this season with 6.0-or-more innings tossed and 1R-or-fewer allowed**...was signed by the Yankees as a minor league free agent on 12/10/20...was originally selected by the Yankees in the 36th round of the 2013 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft...was selected by the Baltimore Orioles from the Yankees in the 2017 Rule 5 Draft and returned to the Yankees on 4/13/18...was acquired by the Seattle Mariners from the Yankees in exchange for international bonus pool money on 11/25/19...over parts of five Major League seasons, has played with Baltimore (2018), the Yankees (2019, '21-22) and Seattle (2020).

LAST START: Last pitched on Friday at St. Louis, allowing 1H and 2ER over 5.1IP (4BB, 4K, 0HR)...allowed his only hit on an RBI single to Yadier Molina in the second inning...retired 11 of his final 13BF (2BB)...his 4BB matched his season and career high (also 4BB on 5/9/22 vs. Texas, 5/4/22 at Toronto and 5/30/21 at Detroit).
✦ **Marked his third start this season in which he has allowed just 1H over at least 5.0IP** (also 1H in 7.1IP on 5/9 vs. Texas and 1H in 6.1IP on 4/23 vs. Cleveland)...his three such starts are tied for the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Michael Kopech (four)...**is just the third Yankee in franchise history to record three such starts in a season, joining David Cone (three in 1999) and Scott Sanderson (three in 1991)**...Hank Borowy allowed 1H-or-fewer in three appearances of at least 5.0IP in 1942 but two of those appearances were in relief.

NASTY NESTOR: Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 17 of his 20 starts this season, including 2R-or-fewer in 15 starts, 1R-or-fewer in 10 starts and five scoreless starts...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 30-of-34 starts since the beginning of 2021 and 2R-or-fewer in 26 of those starts.
✦ In 42 appearances (34 starts) since the beginning of 2021, has gone 11-6 with a 2.72 ERA (205.0IP, 62ER), 218K and a .212 (161-for-759) opponents' BA...**his 2.72 ERA in that span is the lowest in the AL and seventh-lowest in the Majors** (min. 150.0IP)...his 1.04 WHIP in that span is the fifth-lowest in the AL and his .212 opponents' BA in that span is the seventh-lowest in the AL (min. 150.0IP).
✦ Over his last 29 starts since 8/15/21, has gone 11-5 with a 2.73 ERA (161.2IP, 49ER), 172K and a .213 (128-for-601) opponents' BA...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 26 of those 29 starts, including 2R-or-fewer in 22 of those starts...**his 2.73 ERA over that span is the fourth-lowest in the AL and the 11th-lowest in the Majors** (min. 125.0IP).

THE LONG AND WINDING ROAD: Is 2-0 with a 1.93 ERA (23.1IP, 5ER) and 20K over his last four starts (since 7/14) after going 2-2 with a 5.34 ERA (28.2IP, 17ER) and 27K in his previous six starts (6/8-7/8)...began the season 5-1 with a 1.50 ERA (60.0IP, 10ER) over his first 10 starts.

LEFT OUT TO DRY: Left-handed batters are hitting just .133/.188/.183 (8-for-60) against him this season...among left-handed pitchers this season (min. 50BF), ranks third in the Majors in opponents' OBP (third in AL) and OPS (.371, third in AL), ranks fourth in opponents' SLG (third in AL) and fifth in opponents' batting average (fifth in AL).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: In 11 road starts this season, is 5-3 with a 3.02 ERA (59.2IP, 20ER) and 57K...has allowed 1BB-or-fewer in eight of his 11 road starts this season, including OBB in six of those starts.
✦ In 18 road starts since the beginning of 2021, is 6-5 with a 2.97 ERA (97.0IP, 32ER) and 95K...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 14 of those 18 starts...has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in 10 of those starts.
✦ In 20 career road starts, has gone 6-6 with a 3.70 ERA (99.2IP, 41ER) and 98K.
✦ In 2021, went 1-2 with a 3.28 ERA (46.2IP, 17ER) and 50K in 10 road games (seven starts).

VS. SEATTLE: Has made two career appearances (one start) vs. the Mariners, posting a 4.05 ERA (6.2IP, 3ER) and 4K.
✦ Made one start vs. Seattle last season at Yankee Stadium, allowing 2ER over 5.0IP (5H, 3BB, 2K, 1HR).
✦ In his first appearance vs. the Mariners, allowed 1ER in 1.2 innings of relief on 8/26/19 at T-Mobile Park (1H, 2K, 1HR).
✦ Has made three starts vs. the AL West this season, going 1-0 with a 1.40 ERA (19.1IP, 3ER) and 25K...in 22 career games (eight starts) vs. the AL West, is 2-2 with a 5.12 ERA (63.1IP, 36ER) and 66K.

2022: Is 9-3 with a 2.57 ERA (112.0IP, 32ER), 115K and a .208 opponents' BA (86-for-414) in 20 starts this season...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 17 of his 20 starts this season, including 2R-or-fewer in 15 starts, 1R-or-fewer in 10 starts and five scoreless starts.
✦ Ranks ninth in the Majors in ERA (fifth in AL) and opponents' BA (.208, fifth in AL) and 10th in opponents' OBP (.260, fifth in AL)...also ranks fourth in the AL in WHIP (1.02) and 10th in K/BB ratio (4.11).
✦ Has seven starts this season with 6.0-or-more innings pitched and 1R-or-fewer allowed.
✦ Has recorded eight quality starts this season...has tossed at least 5.0IP in 15 of his 20 starts.
✦ Has lowered his career ERA from 4.66 (172.0IP, 89ER) entering the season to 3.83 (284.0IP, 121ER) entering today...has lowered his career ERA as a starter from 4.03 (76.0IP, 34ER) entering the season to 3.16 (188.0IP, 66ER) entering today.
✦ Was named to his first career All-Star team via the player ballot...tossed a scoreless sixth inning and retired 3-of-5BF (0H, 2K, 1BB, 1HP)...struck out Atlanta's Austin Riley and Miami's Garrett Cooper...was one of two Yankees pitchers to appear in the Midsummer Classic (also Clay Holmes - 0.2IP, 1H) and the first Yankees starting pitcher to appear in an All-Star Game since Masahiro Tanaka in 2019.
✦ Through his first 10 starts of the season from 4/12-6/2-G1, went 5-1 with a 1.50 ERA (60.0IP, 10ER) and 68K...**according to Elias, his 1.50 ERA was the ninth-lowest by a Yankees starter through their first 10 starts of a season in franchise history and the third-lowest in the last 70 seasons (since 1953)**, trailing only Phil Niekro's 1.20 ERA in 1984 and Rob Gardner's 1.32 ERA in 1972.
