BASH BROTHERS — Brandon Lowe launched his 29th home run of the season last night, tying NYV Jazz Chisholm Jr. for the most among major league second basemen...he is one long ball shy of becoming the second Ray to reach 30 HR along with Junior Caminero (44HR)...the Rays would be the seventh team in the majors with multiple 30-HR hitters and the fifth AL club, joining the Angels (Adell/Ward), Athletics (Kurtz/Langeliers), Mariners (Raleigh/Rodriguez) and Yankees (Grisham/Judge)...they would become the sixth set of Rays teammates to both hit 30 HR in a season...first since Lowe (39HR) and Mike Zunino (33HR) in 2021...Lowe would also become the third active second baseman with multiple 30-HR seasons, joining ATL Ozzie Albies (2), HOU Jose Altuve (2) and AZ Ketel Marte (2)...he would also join Evan Longoria (4) and Carlos Peña (3) as the only players in franchise history with multiple 30-HR campaigns. * With Yandy Diaz's (24HR) next long ball, he, Caminero and Lowe will become the third trio of Rays teammates to each hit 25 HR, joining 2021 (Lowe/Zunino/ Austin Meadows), 2017 (Corey Dickerson / Logan Morrison / Steven Souza Jr.) and 2009 (Longoria/Peña/ Ben Zobrist). * Rays infielders have launched an AL-leading 99 HR, third in MLB behind the Diamondbacks (104HR) and Mets (102HR) and tied with 2017 for fourth most in team history behind 2016 (111HR), 2023 (109HR) and 2009 (108HR). THE GREAT YANDINO — Yandy Diaz collected the 871st and 872nd hits of his Rays career last night, surpassing Aubrey Huff (870H) for fifth most in franchise history... B.J. Upton (910H) is fourth on the list...he reached base safely in nine straight plate appearances before grounding out in the 7th inning last night, one shy of the longest streak in franchise history, a mark shared by Randy Arozarena (2022), Diaz (2020) and Ji-Man Choi (2019)...Diaz is 8-for-16 (.500) with 1 2B, 1 HR and 2 RBI during a four-game hitting streak and has reached base safely in nine of 11 and 11 of his last 16 PA...he has tallied a hit in 15 of his last 19 games dating back to Aug. 25, batting an MLB-best .411 (30-for-73) with 6 2B, 3 HR, 7 RBI, 10 BB, 10 SO, 14 R and a 1.098 OPS in that span. * He has already set career highs in home runs (24) and RBI (80) and is approaching career bests in games played (145G in 2024; currently 141G), hits (173H in 2023; currently 165H) and extra-base hits (57XBH in 2023; currently 53XBH). * With 28 doubles, he is a pair of two-baggers away from joining Ben Zobrist (2011-14) as the only players in Rays history with four straight 30-double seasons...he has 170 doubles with Tampa Bay, two shy of matching Huff (172 2B) for fifth in team history. * His next extra-base hit will mark his 273rd with the Rays, tying Kevin Kiermaier for eighth most in team history...his next home run will be the 100th of his career and his 99th with Tampa Bay, which would tie Fred McGriff for eighth most in club history.	THE GREAT YANDINO — Yandy Diaz collected the 871st and 872nd hits of his Rays career last night, surpassing Aubrey Huff (870H) for fifth most in franchise history... B.J. CATCH HIM IF YOU CHAN — Chandler Simpson's 42 SB are tied for 10th most in a season in franchise history...he is 3 SB shy of joining Carl Crawford (6x, last: 47SB in 2010) as the only Rays with 45 SB in a season...with a .291 average on the year, Simpson is attempting to become the 24th MLB rookie since 1901 to steal 40 bases or more while batting .290 or better and the second since 2007 along with LAA Mike Trout (.326/.49SB) in 2012. * Simpson is 9-for-22 (.409) with 5 R, 2 BB and 3 SB over his last six games.	CATCH HIM IF YOU CHAN — Chandler Simpson's 42 SB are tied for 10th most in a season in franchise history...he is 3 SB shy of joining Carl Crawford (6x, last: 47SB in 2010) as the only Rays with 45 SB in a season...with a .291 average on the year, Simpson is attempting to become the 24th MLB rookie since 1901 to steal 40 bases or more while batting .290 or better and the second since 2007 along with LAA Mike Trout (.326/.49SB) in 2012. * Simpson is 9-for-22 (.409) with 5 R, 2 BB and 3 SB over his last six games.
THE CAMINER SHOW —With 11 games remaining, Junior Caminero (44HR) is two homers shy of tying Carlos Peña's franchise-record 46-HR campaign in 2007...he has gone deep an MLB-leading 17 times in his last 41 games since the calendar flipped to August, and his 44 HR this season are second most in major league history in an age-21-or-younger season (age as of June 30), trailing the Milwaukee Braves Eddie Mathews (47) in 1953...his 108 RBI are tied for second most in the AL and are fourth most in a season in Rays history (see table to the right)...his 72 XBH, which are tied for third most in the AL, match Ben Zobrist (2011) for seventh most in a season in team history, one shy of sixth-ranked Evan Longoria in 2010 (73) and two shy of Longoria in 2013 (74) for fifth. * He has six doubles in his last 15 games compared to three doubles in his previous 49 games (July 4-Aug. 31)...Caminero is two doubles shy of becoming the first player in franchise history with a 30-double, 40-homer season. * He has tallied 22 HR at Steinbrenner Field, tied with Brad Miller (2016) for the second-most long balls at home in franchise history behind Peña (23HR) in 2007. * Caminero is batting .311 (19-for-61) with 6 2B, 5 HR and 14 RBI over 15 games in September—the 11 XBH are tied for second most in MLB behind SEA Jorge Polanco (13).	THE CAMINER SHOW —With 11 games remaining, Junior Caminero (44HR) is two homers shy of tying Carlos Peña's franchise-record 46-HR campaign in 2007...he has gone deep an MLB-leading 17 times in his last 41 games since the calendar flipped to August, and his 44 HR this season are second most in major league history in an age-21-or-younger season (age as of June 30), trailing the Milwaukee Braves Eddie Mathews (47) in 1953...his 108 RBI are tied for second most in the AL and are fourth most in a season in Rays history (see table to the right)...his 72 XBH, which are tied for third most in the AL, match Ben Zobrist (2011) for seventh most in a season in team history, one shy of sixth-ranked Evan Longoria in 2010 (73) and two shy of Longoria in 2013 (74) for fifth. * He has six doubles in his last 15 games compared to three doubles in his previous 49 games (July 4-Aug. 31)...Caminero is two doubles shy of becoming the first player in franchise history with a 30-double, 40-homer season. * He has tallied 22 HR at Steinbrenner Field, tied with Brad Miller (2016) for the second-most long balls at home in franchise history behind Peña (23HR) in 2007. * Caminero is batting .311 (19-for-61) with 6 2B, 5 HR and 14 RBI over 15 games in September—the 11 XBH are tied for second most in MLB behind SEA Jorge Polanco (13).
JAYS IN THE BAY —The Rays and Blue Jays will wrap up a 13-game season series with seven meetings over a two-week timeframe to close the season (Sept. 15-28)...this comes after the clubs met six times in a 13-day span from May 13-25...that stretch included a three-game sweep from May 23-25 at Steinbrenner Field—the Rays remain one of only four teams to sweep the Blue Jays this season, joining the Astros, Mets and Phillies...the Rays have won four of six and nine of the last 12 games with Toronto dating back to July 25, 2024 and have won 14 of 21 matchups since the start of last season...they need to go 2-3 or better over their final five meetings to secure an eighth straight season series win and 10th in 11 seasons under Kevin Cash (2015-pres). * Brandon Lowe is 14-for-34 (.412) with 2 2B, 5 HR, 14 RBI and five multi-RBI efforts in eight games vs. the Blue Jays this season...min. 25 PA, his .912 SLG vs. Toronto this season is the highest in the majors...he has 11 XBH (4 2B, 7HR) in his last 12 games against Toronto dating back to July 25, 2024, producing a 1.334 OPS in those contests.	JAYS IN THE BAY —The Rays and Blue Jays will wrap up a 13-game season series with seven meetings over a two-week timeframe to close the season (Sept. 15-28)...this comes after the clubs met six times in a 13-day span from May 13-25...that stretch included a three-game sweep from May 23-25 at Steinbrenner Field—the Rays remain one of only four teams to sweep the Blue Jays this season, joining the Astros, Mets and Phillies...the Rays have won four of six and nine of the last 12 games with Toronto dating back to July 25, 2024 and have won 14 of 21 matchups since the start of last season...they need to go 2-3 or better over their final five meetings to secure an eighth straight season series win and 10th in 11 seasons under Kevin Cash (2015-pres). * Brandon Lowe is 14-for-34 (.412) with 2 2B, 5 HR, 14 RBI and five multi-RBI efforts in eight games vs. the Blue Jays this season...min. 25 PA, his .912 SLG vs. Toronto this season is the highest in the majors...he has 11 XBH (4 2B, 7HR) in his last 12 games against Toronto dating back to July 25, 2024, producing a 1.334 OPS in those contests.

LB Will Simpson went 3-for-4 with 1 HR and RHP Brody Hopkins earned the win after firing five scoreless innings (W, 5.0IP, 3H, OR, 2BB, 7SO)...the Biscuits and Shuckers reconvene for Game 2 Thursday night in Biloxi, with Montgomery needing to win one of the next two games to advance to its second consecutive SL Championship Series and third in the last five seasons. TONIGHT’S START—Ian Seymour will make his 17th appearance and fourth start of his career tonight...marks his first career appearance against Toronto...was recalled from Triple-A Durham on July 31 for his third major league stint, joining June 8-10 and July 8-30...selected by the Rays in the second round of the 2020 First-Year Player Draft out of Virginia Tech.

LAST TIME OUT—Made his third major league start on Sept. 11 at CWS and went 5.1 innings and allowed three runs (2ER) on four hits and two walks with five strikeouts in a losing decision...set career highs in innings pitched and pitches thrown (90)...marked his first losing decision as a starting pitcher and his second in as many outings...in the 1st inning, an error-double-groundout-single sequence led to two runs scoring (1ER), before he settled in and retired eight of the next nine and 12 of the next 14 batters to come to the plate...he exited in the 6th inning with a runner on first base that later came around to score, being charged to him.

★ He became the fifth pitcher in Rays history to go 5.0 innings or more and allow two earned runs or fewer in each of his first three career road starts and the first to do so since **Taj Bradley** (April 18–June 4, 2023).

LIGHTNING & LEAFS—Seymour is set to make his first career start opposite the Blue Jays...he has made zero career starts against the AL East in his career, with five relief appearances...in those relief appearance, he is 1-0 with a 5.40 ERA (10.OIP, 6ER) and a .237 (9-for-38) opp. average...all six earned runs he has allowed came in his relief appearance against New York-AL on Aug. 19 at Steinbrenner Field.

BACK IN THE BAY—Seymour is set to make his first career start at Steinbrenner Field tonight...in five previous relief appearances at home, he is 0-1 with a 4.97 ERA (12.2IP, 7ER) and 15 strikeouts...all seven earned runs have come in his last two home outings, including six in his relief appearance against the Yankees on Aug. 19 over 3.0 innings of work.

SETTING LIMITATIONS—In his first three career starts, he has gone 5.0 innings or more and allowed two earned runs or fewer in each...that three game streak is tied for the longest such streak to begin a career in club history with **Jake Faria** (June 7–18, 2017) and **Jeremy Hellickson** (Aug. 2–15, 2010)...only 46 southpaws since 1901 have previously gone four straight starts or more to begin their career with 5.0 innings or more and two earned runs or fewer, including only four since 2019 (**Noah Cameron** - April 30–June 5[G1], 2025, **Jordan Wicks** - Aug. 26–Sept. 11, 2023, **JP Sears** - May 25–Aug. 21, 2022 & **MacKenzie Gore** - April 15–May 4[G2], 2022).

KEEP THE CHANGE—Across his last 10 appearances, Seymour has held opponents to a 8-for-52 (.154) clip on his changeup with 23 SO and a 38.7 pct. whiff rate...min. 50 AB, it marks the fifth-lowest average on any pitcher’s changeup in the majors in that timeframe (July 27–pres)...Seymour has permitted just two extra-base hits (2 2B) on the pitch this season.

THIS AND THAT—If he were qualified, Seymour’s 6.4 pct. barrel rate would be tied for eighth in the majors, and his 29.2 pct. strikeout rate would rank eighth...opposing hitters are 6-for-47 (.128) against him with two outs, including 4-for-19 (.211) with RISP and two outs...opponents are 5-for-17 (.294) against Seymour on the first pitch, but just 28-for-145 (.193) on the second pitch or later, including an 11-for-98 (.112) clip in two-strike counts.

NEW IN NEW ENGLAND—Seymour made his major league debut on June 9 at BOS, earning the win after throwing the 10th and 11th innings...he allowed one unearned run with two walks (1IBB) and two strikeouts...he was the fourth Ray to earn the win in relief in his major league debut, joining **Seth McClung** (March 31, 2003 vs. BOS), **Doug Waechter** (Aug. 27, 2003 at SEA) and **Andrew Bellatti** (May 9, 2015 vs. TEX).

★ Born in Madison, Conn., he became the third pitcher in major league history from New England (Conn., Maine, Mass., N.H., R.I., Vt.) to earn the win at Fenway Park in his major league debut, joining BOS **Kevin Morton** (Conn. - July 5, 1991 vs. DET) and NYY **Charlie Devens** (Mass. - Sept. 24, 1932).

YOU’VE GOT TO EARN IT—Across his first 10 career appearances (June 9–Aug. 9) he was 1-0 with a 1.06 ERA (17.OIP, 2ER) with a 0.88 WHIP and a .164 (10-for-61) opp. average...min. 15.0 IP, his 1.06 ERA was the lowest by any pitcher in franchise history through their first 10 career outings...he is one of 12 pitchers to have a 1.06 ERA or lower through their first 10 games since 2000 and one of four in 2025 (also: MIA **Cade Gibson** - 1.06, CWS **Mike Vasil** - 0.92, LAD **Jack Dreyer** - 0.66).

★ Seymour was the first Ray to open his career with four straight multi-inning relief outings with 0 ER...was one of 19 MLB left-handed relievers to accomplish the feat since 1901 and the first since KC **Austin Cox** from May 4–Aug. 16 2023.

FEED ME, SEYMOURS—Three of the five players with the last name “Seymour” in MLB history appeared on Aug. 15 at SF: **LHP Ian Seymour** and **INF Bob Seymour** (MLB debut) for the Rays, and **RHP Carson Seymour** for the Giants...the only other two Seymours in MLB history are **Cy Seymour** (1886–1913) and **Jake Seymour** (1882).

★ All three current Seymours are rookies born between October and December 1998 and of no relation...Bob and Carson were teammates with the Cape Cod League’s Harwich Mariners in 2019 and the Northwoods League’s Rockford Rivets in 2020...Ian (Dec. 13) and Carson (Dec. 16) were born three days apart.

BULL FROM DURHAM—In 16 games (15GS) this season with Triple-A Durham, he was 9-3 with a 2.62 ERA (86.OIP, 25ER) and 104 strikeouts to 20 walks...between June 3 and July 3, he made five starts and earned the win while yielding three runs or fewer in each outing...in 28 career games (27GS) with Durham, he went 14-4 with a 2.34 ERA (150.OIP, 39ER) and a .221 (125-for-565) opp. average.
