ROSTER MOVES: The Mets activated RHP Taijuan Walker from the Injured List...Walker made one start, April 11 at Philadelphia...He landed on the IL on April 12 with right shoulder bursitis...To make room on the roster, New York optioned RHP Yoan López to Triple-A Syracuse.

METSSELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Phillies, 3-0, last night...The Mets are 3.0 games ahead in the division...The team continues their second homestand of the season, a six-day, seven-game homestand against the Phillies (three games) and Braves (four games).

A SHOW ABOUT NOTHING: Last night, the Mets combined to throw MLB's first no-hitter of the season...It was the second no-hitter in team history (also, Johan Santana, June 1, 2012 vs. St. Louis)...This is 17th time a team has thrown a combined no-hitter and the 10th time in the Wild Card Era (see chart below).

I SAID NO, NO, NO, NO, NO!: Five Mets pitchers combined to throw 159 pitches to complete the second no-hitter in franchise history...Prior to last night, the most pitches thrown in a no-hitter over the last 40 seasons (since 1983) was 151 by the Astros in their combined no-hitter on June 11, 2003 at Yankee Stadium...There have been only two combined no-hitters that involved more pitchers, each with six: the Astros' no-no against the Yankees on June 11, 2003, and the Mariners' no-hitter against the Dodgers on June 8, 2012 -- one week after Santana threw the first no-hitter in Mets history...Courtesy of Elias.

HIGH FIVE: Last night, Taylor Megill fired 5.0 no-hit innings, making him one of three Mets pitchers to finish an outing with at least that many hitless frames...Johan Santana threw a no-hitter on June 1, 2012...The only other time a Mets pitcher threw at least 5.0 no-hit innings and did not finish the game was May 15, 1987, when Sid Fernandez exited with a sprained left knee in a start vs. the Giants at Shea Stadium (the team no-hit bid ended the following inning).

WALKER THIS WAY: Taijuan Walker is slated to make his Citi Field debut tonight when he comes off the Injured List...He is 4-4 with a 3.27 ERA (35 earned runs/96.1 innings) with 29 walks and 92 strikeouts in 17 games (16 starts) in his career at Citi Field...Tonight will mark his second start of the year...Walker tossed 2.0 scoreless innings on April 11 at Philadelphia before he left with right shoulder bursitis.

LUCKY NUMBER 7: The Mets have struck out seven or more batters in 17 straight games...They have totaled 176 strikeouts in that span...That is tied for the longest streak in franchise history...The 2014 Mets also struck out seven or more hitters (totaling 151 strikeouts) in 17 straight games from July 6-26.

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The Mets are seeking their seventh straight series victory to begin the season...They have won six straight, surpassing the previous Mets record of five series victories to begin the year, held by the 2018 Mets...The last team to win their first seven series to begin the year was the 2018 Arizona Diamondbacks, who won each of their first nine series to begin the season...Courtesy of Elias.

APRIL COME SHE WILL: The Mets own a .714 (15-6) winning percentage this month...That is tied for the second-highest winning percentage in March/April in team history...The 1988 Mets also produced a .714 (15-6) winning percentage...Only the 1986 team at .813 (13-3) posted a better mark in March/April...The 2018 Mets set a team record with a 17 wins in March/April, finishing the month 17-9 (.654).

EL JEFF-E: Jeff McNeil is on a six-game hitting streak, batting .435 (10-23) with six runs, four doubles, a triple, three RBI with a 1.130 OPS in that span...Overall, he is batting .344 (22-64) with 11 runs, five doubles, a triple, a home run, nine RBI, five walks, a .400 OBP, a .500 SLG and a .900 OPS over 19 games this season.

BEYOND AVERAGE: McNeil owns a lifetime .301 batting average...That ranks second in franchise history amongst players with at least 1,500 plate appearances...John Olerud is the franchise leader with a .315 mark...He has recorded eight multi-hit games, which is tied for third in the majors...He has recorded 118 multi-hit games since he entered the majors on July 24, 2018...That is tied with Juan Lagares for 45th on the team's all-time list...Curtis Granderson is next with 122 multi-hit games.

STARTING OFF: The Mets starting staff has gone 11-3 with a 2.55 ERA (32 earned runs/113.0 innings) with 28 walks and 120 strikeouts this year...The starting staff leads the majors in WHIP (0.90) and opponents average (.183) and is second in the majors in strikeouts as well as ERA.

PHILS-METS NOTES: The Mets are 63-53 all-time against the Phillies at Citi Field.

LIVIN IN THE CITI: The Mets are now 6-2 at Citi Field this year...They are fourth in the majors and second in the National League with a .750 winning percentage at home...In 2021, the Mets recorded a winning season at home for the second time in the last three years (also, 2019)...The Mets have posted a 2.22 ERA (18 earned runs/73.0 innings) with 29 walks and 86 strikeouts at Citi Field this year...They are batting .270/.341/.413 at home...Their .270 batting average is second in the NL only to the Rockies and ranks third overall in the majors...The Mets have outscored opponents 36-18 this season in Flushing.

WINNING TIME: The Mets have posted a 15-6 record through the team's first 21 games...Only the 1986 Mets (17-4) posted a better record through the first 21 games of the season...The 2018 team, 2015 team, and 1988 team all went 15-6 in the first 21 games as well...New York's pitching staff has struck out 213 this season...That ranks third in team history through 21 games...The 2018 Mets (221) own the record...The team's 213 strikeouts lead the major leagues.

ZEROS: The Mets have posted five shutouts this year, including last night, which leads the majors...Five other teams are second with three...The five shutouts after the first 21 games are tied for the most in team history with the 1968 Mets.

EVERYBODY HURTS: The Mets have been hit by 19 pitches this year, which leads the majors...Since 2018, the Mets have been hit by 326 pitches, the most in the majors...In his career, Pete Alonso has been plunked 43 times...That is the fourth-highest total in the majors since he entered the league in 2019...Teammate Mark Canha ranks second in that span with 57 HBP, while Starling Marte is fifth (42) in the last four seasons.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are now 7-2 against the NL East this season...They have posted a 2.19 ERA (17 earned runs/70.0 innings) with 21 walks and 81 strikeouts against the division...Last year, the team went 39-37 against the NL East...They posted a 3.58 ERA (255 earned runs/640.1 innings) and hit .243/.314/.400 against the division.

TWO-OUT MAGIC: New York's hitters have combined for a .264/.358/.446 slashline with two outs this season...The Mets lead the majors in two-out OBP and RBI (46), are second in two-out hits (61) and third in average...In two-out RISP situations, the Mets rank third in the majors in both average (.316, 25-79) and in on-base percentage (.419).

RIGHT ON TIME: The Mets are holding right-handed hitters to a major league-leading .170 (54-318) mark this year...The team has surrendered just 19 extra-base hits to righties in 2022...Chris Bassitt has allowed just three hits to right-handed hitters this year...He is holding righties to a .077 (3-39) mark...His .077 batting average against right-handed hitters is the fifth-best in the majors and third-best in the National League...On the other side, the Mets are batting .269/.350/.412 against right-handed pitchers this year...Their .269 batting average is second in the majors and the best in the NL...Jeff McNeil is batting .385 (20-52) with five doubles, a triple, a home run, nine RBI, a .429 OBP and a .577 SLG against righties this year...His .385 average ranks fourth in the majors.

FIRST IS THE BEST: The Mets are 12-1 when scoring first this season...That is the best mark in the majors...New York was 56-23 when scoring first last season.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE: New York leads the major leagues in hits (184) and OBP (.343), are second in average (.261), tied for third in runs (97), fourth in OPS (.738), tied for eighth in walks (72), eighth in SLG (.395)...Through 21 games this year, the Mets have outscored their opponents 97-61.

WIELDING AND FIELDING: The Mets have committed only six errors in 21 games this year...That is the fewest in the National League and the third-fewest in the majors...The Mets lead the NL and third in the majors with a .992 fielding percentage.

THE CHARMING MAN: Drew Smith is one of 11 players this season to pitch at least 9.0 innings and not surrender an earned run...In nine games this season, Smith has posted a perfect ERA, allowing only four hits and four walks while striking out 13 in 9.1 innings of work...He owns a career record of 4-3 with a 2.84 ERA (27 earned runs/85.2 innings) with 28 walks and 79 strikeouts...Smith was acquired by the Mets from the Tampa Bay Rays on July 27, 2017 in exchange for Lucas Duda.

DESIGNATED FOR HITTING: As a team, Mets designated hitters are batting .299 (23-77) with 14 runs, six doubles, five home runs, 15 RBI, eight walks, a .379 OBP and a .571 SLG...They lead the majors in OBP and SLG, are third in average and tied for third with five home runs.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Alonso is tied for fifth in the majors and tied for second in the NL with 17 RBI...He is batting .259 (21-81) with 11 runs, three doubles, four home runs, 17 RBI, three walks and a .444 SLG this year...He is batting .300 (6-20) with six runs, two doubles, three homes, 11 RBI with a 1.214 OPS in five games as a designated hitter this year.

MOVING ON UP: Pete Alonso hit his 110th home run of his career last night...He is in sole possession of 13th on the team's all-time list...Ed Kranepool (118) is next, followed by Edgardo Alfonzo (120)...Alonso has socked 48 home runs at Citi Field...That is fourth in Mets history...David Wright is third with 49, followed by Michael Conforto (66) and the franchise leader, Lucas Duda (71).

ED, EDD AND EDDY: Edwin Díaz has recorded 68 saves as a member of the Mets...That places him 10th on the franchise's all-time list...Next up is Neil Allen who recorded 69 as a member of the Mets...He has recorded 177 saves in his career, which places him sixth on the active list...Since arriving in New York, Díaz is 10-14 with 68 saves, a 3.86 ERA (67 earned runs/156.1 innings) with 64 walks and 255 strikeouts...His 255 strikeouts as a reliever in that span is the third-highest total in the majors...Only Josh Hader (286) and Liam Hendriks (284) have struck out more...Additionally, his 255 strikeouts are the 14th most by a reliever in franchise history...Turk Wendell is 13th with 259.

WALKER NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Walker tonight will make his return from the Injured List...He has been out since April 12 with right shoulder bursitis...In his last start, he made his 2022 season debut on April 11 against the Phillies at Citizens Bank Park...After retiring the first six batters, Walker left the game due to right shoulder irritation... Walker recorded four strikeouts, all via the splitter.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT: In an extended spring game in Jupiter on April 20, Walker threw 3.0 scoreless innings striking out seven batters and issued one walk...On April 25, Walker threw 64 pitches in 4.0 innings in a simulated game.

VS. PHILADELPHIA: Walker has faced the Phillies seven times in his career, going 1-2 with a 3.15 ERA (12 earned runs/34.1 innings)...Six of those seven outings have come since joining the Mets, as Walker went 0-2 with a 3.76 (11 earned runs/26.1 innings) against Philadelphia in 2021 and made his season debut against the club this year...He has allowed three runs or fewer in six of his seven starts against the Phillies...His lone win against the Phillies came on September 20, 2020 at Citizens Bank Park as a member of the Blue Jays...In that start, Walker allowed one earned run on four hits in 6.0 innings and tied a season-high with eight strikeouts.

TALE OF TWO HALVES: Last season, entered the break ranked 12th in the majors and ninth in the National League with a 2.50 ERA...Walker's numbers declined in the second half after his All-Star level performance in the first half...He went 0-8 with a 7.13 ERA (51 earned runs/64.1 innings) in 13 second-half starts...Allowed 20 home runs in 64.1 innings after the break after surrendering just six in 94.2 innings before the break...Opponents had an .861 OPS against him after the All-Star game, compared to a .573 OPS against Walker in the first half.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Was selected to represent the Mets at the 2021 All-Star Game in Denver, his first All-Star game selection...Pitched 1.0 inning in last year's Midsummer Classic and allowed a solo home run to Rays C Mike Zunino...On May 6 at St. Louis, Walker threw 7.0 one-hit innings with eight strikeouts...On June 9, Walker allowed one earned run in 7.0 innings with nine strikeouts in a 14-1 win over the Orioles...His following start, June 15 against the Cubs, Walker struck out a career-high 12 batters over 7.0 innings without issuing a walk...On August 14 against the Dodgers, Walker took a no-hitter into the seventh inning before surrendering a home run to C Will Smith...It was the longest no-hit bid by a Met since Steven Matz had a no-hitter through 7.1 innings on August 14, 2016 against the Padres.

ELECTRIC SLIDE: In 2020, Walker added a slider to his pitch arsenal and has thrown the pitch just over 21% of the time in each of the last two seasons...Last season, Walker held opposing batters to a .183 batting average (24-131) against his slider and recorded 31 strikeouts with the pitch.

HOME/ROAD: In 2021, Walker went 3-7 with a 5.82 ERA (44 earned runs/68.0 innings) with 58 strikeouts in 14 road starts...The Mets have lost four of his last five away starts...At home, Walker went 4-4 with a 3.46 ERA (35 earned runs/91.0 Innings) with 88 strikeouts in 16 home games (15 starts)...New York won each of his first nine home starts, then dropped his last seven.

LIMITING LEFTIES: Last season, Walker held left-handed batters to .192 (48-250) average, tied for the fourth best total among right-handed pitchers in 2021 (min. 200 left-handed batters faced).

DEFENSE WINS CHAMPIONSHIPS: Last season, Walker tied a career-high with four pickoffs, tied for the fifth most in the majors and the most among right-handed pitchers last season...The righty also posted a career-high 33 assists which ranked second in the National League and third in the majors, as well as a career-high 16 putouts which tied for 10th in the National League.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP MAX SCHERZER [3-0, 1.80]

LAST OUTING: Threw 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits against the Cardinals on April 25 at Busch Stadium...Scherzer struck out 10 batters in a game for the 106th time, which is the fifth most in major league history... The righty did not factor in the decision in the Mets 5-2 comeback victory.

CLIMBING THE LEADERBOARD: Scherzer entered the 2022 season as the active leader in strikeouts...He ranks 18th on MLB's all-time strikeout list and is within striking distance of several pitchers above him this season...He needs 32 strikeouts to pass John Smoltz.
