METSLLANEANOUS: The Mets defeated the Diamondbacks, 6-2, in the desert yesterday... New York remains a season-high 4.0 games ahead in the NL East...The Mets continue a six-game road trip to Arizona (2-1) and St. Louis (three games)...Following this trip, the Mets are off on Thursday before beginning their second homestand of the season, a six-day, seven game homestand against the Phillies (three games) and Braves (four games).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY: Trevor Williams celebrates his 30th birthday today...Williams has appeared in 13 games (two starts) with the Mets and is 0-3 with a 3.75 ERA (15 earned runs/36.0 innings) with nine walks and 30 strikeouts...He was acquired from the Chicago Cubs at the trade deadline last year along with INF Javier Báez and cash for OF Pete Crow-Armstrong.

MAX EFFORT: Max Scherzer has earned the win in each of his first three starts to begin the season...He is the first Mets hurler since Jorge Sosa (2007) to start and win his first three games with New York...He 3-0 with a 2.50 ERA (five earned runs/18.0 innings) with seven walks and 23 strikeouts...It is the first time in his career that he has won each of first three starts...He is seeking to tie a Mets record of winning each of his first four appearances against St. Louis...In 1966, Bob Shaw notched victories in each of his first four career games...He won each of his first four appearances after he was acquired by the Mets from the Giants on June 10, 1966...Courtesy of Sportsradar

WIN, WIN, WIN: Scherzer has not suffered a loss in any of his last 22 starts...That is tied for the 15th-longest streak of starts without a loss in modern MLB history...Roger Clemens (30 straight) holds the all-time mark...The last pitcher before Scherzer and Logan Webb to have a streak this long was Walker Buehler, whose 23-start unbeaten streak lasted from 2019-2021.

THE SOUND OF REFRESHMENT: In seven career games at Busch Stadium, Pete Alonso is 9-24 (.375) with seven runs, a double, two home runs, three RBI and six walks...James McCann is 8-19 (.421) with two runs, three doubles, three RBI and three walks in five career games at the ballpark.

ITS IN THE CARDS: Robinson Canó is a .378 (14-37) career hitter with six runs, six doubles, a home run, two RBI and three walks in 10 career games vs. St. Louis...J.D. Davis is 9-23 (.391) with three runs, two doubles, a home run, four RBI and a walk in 10 games against St. Louis...Starling Marte has played 114 games against St. Louis and is a .292/.350/.424 hitter with 60 runs, 17 doubles, nine triples, eight home runs, 40 RBI and 24 walks.

FIRST IS THE BEST: The Mets are 10-1 when scoring first this season...That is the best mark in the majors...New York was 56-23 when scoring first last season.

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The Mets notched their fifth series victory of the season yesterday...The Mets have won each of their first five series of the season for the second time in franchise history, also in 2018...The last team to win their first six series to start the year was the 2019 Rays...They last team in the NL to win their first six series was the 2018 Arizona Diamondbacks.

MAKE IT A DOZEN: The Mets have posted a 12-5 record through the team's first 17 games...Only the 2018, 2015 and 1986 teams at 13-4 produced a better record through 17 games...The 2006 Mets also went 12-5 through the first 17 games...New York's pitching staff has struck out 170 this season...That ranks fourth in team history...The 2018 Mets (181) own the record...The team's 170 strikeouts lead the major leagues.

THIS IS 300!: Starling Marte swiped his 300th bag yesterday...He is the only active player with at least 300 steals and 100 home runs...He ranks fourth among active players with 300 steals...He is chasing Dee Strange-Gordon (333), Elvis Andrus (318) and Billy Hamilton (314).

NEED FOR SPEED: The Mets have totaled 12 stolen bases through 17 games...That is tied for third in the major leagues...The Mets did not record their 12th steal until May 19 last season in the team's 38th game...Overall, the Mets stole a total of 54 bases in 2021...Starling Marte is tied for fifth in MLB with four steals, while Francisco Lindor is tied for 10th with three.

THE CHARMING MAN: In seven games this season, Drew Smith has posted a perfect ERA, allowing only three hits and three walks while striking out eight in 7.0 innings of work...He owns a career record of 4-3 with a 2.92 ERA (27 earned runs/83.1 innings) with 27 walks and 743 strikeouts...Smith was acquired by the Mets from the Tampa Bay Rays on July 27, 2017 in exchange for Lucas Duda.

CARDS-METS NOTES: The Mets are seeking their first season series victory against the Cardinals since they went 4-3 in 2014...The Mets are 19-29 at Busch Stadium since it opened in 2006.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE: New York leads the major leagues in hits (146), is second in OBP (.343), third in runs (81), fourth in average (.256), tied for fourth in walks (64), seventh in OPS (.735), tied for ninth in home runs (16), and 10th in SLG (.393)...Through 17 games this year, the Mets have outscored their opponents 81-49.

WHEN I WAS 17: The Mets have committed just one error over their last 12 games...Overall, the Mets have committed only four errors in 17 games...That is their fewest ever through the first 17 games of any season (courtesy of Sportsradar)...That is the second-fewest in the National League and tied for the third-fewest in the majors...The Mets rank third in the majors with a .993 fielding percentage.

INVADER NIM: In 12 games this year, Brandon Nimmo is hitting .302 (13-43) with nine runs, two doubles, a triple, two home runs, three RBI and eight walks...His career .393 career on-base percentage ranks second in team history, behind only John Olerud's .425 mark (min. 1,000 plate appearances).

STARTING OFF: The Mets starting staff has gone 9-2 with a 2.46 ERA (25 earned runs/91.1 innings) with 19 walks and 96 strikeouts...The starting staff leads the majors in WHIP (0.89), innings, opponent's batting average (.190) and strikeouts and is third in the majors in ERA.

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: Francisco Lindor is batting .313 (20-64) with 12 runs, four doubles, four home runs, 12 RBI, 10 walks, three steals, a .408 OBP, a .563 SLG and a .970 OPS...He has safely reached base in 16 of the 17 games this season...He ranks fourth in the major leagues with a 1.2 fWAR this year.

DESIGNATED FOR HITTING: As a team, Mets designated hitters are batting .317 (20-63) with 13 runs, five doubles, five home runs, 15 RBI, eight walks, a .403 OBP and a .635 SLG...They rank second in average, SLG and OBP, are tied for first in home runs and tied for second in doubles.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Alonso is tied for fourth in the majors and second in the NL with 16 RBI...He is batting .254 (17-67) with nine runs, three doubles, three home runs, 16 RBI, two walks and a .433 SLG this year...He is batting .353 (6-17) with six runs, two doubles, three homes, 11 RBI with a 1.389 OPS in four games as a designated hitter this year.

MOVING ON UP: Pete Alonso's last home run with the 109th of his career...That broke a tie with José Reyes for sole possession of 13th on the team's all-time list...Ed Kranepool (118) is next, followed by Edgardo Alfonzo (120).

OUCH: The Mets have been hit by 14 pitches this year, which leads the majors...New York was plunked 94 times last year, which ranked fourth in the majors and third in the National League...Since 2018, the Mets have been hit by 321 pitches, the most in the majors...In his career, Pete Alonso has been plunked 42 times...That is the fourth-highest total in the majors since he entered the league in 2019...Teammate Mark Canha ranks second in that span with 56 HBP, while Starling Marte is fifth (41) in the last four seasons.

THAT'S SHOW BUSINESS: Buck Showalter is in his first year with the Mets...He became the first manager in Mets history to win each of his first three contests...Showalter has 20 years of managerial experience with four different teams: Yankees (1992-1995), Diamondbacks (1998-2000), Rangers (2003-2006) and Orioles (2010-2018)...A three-time AL Manager of the Year winner (1994, 2004, 2014), Showalter ranks fourth among active managers in career managerial wins.

HE'S KEITH HERNANDEZ: Earlier this year, the Mets announced that the team will retire Keith Hernandez's uniform #17 prior to the Saturday, July 9 game vs. Miami...Hernandez was elected to the Mets Hall of Fame in 1997, ranks second in team history in batting average (.297) and earned six Rawlings Gold Gloves with the Mets, the most in franchise history... Hernandez will become the fourth player to have his number retired by the Mets, joining Tom Seaver (#41), Mike Piazza (#31) and Jerry Koosman (#36). In addition, the Mets have retired #14 for Manager Gil Hodges, #37 for Manager Casey Stengel and #42 across baseball for Jackie Robinson.

SCHERZER NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Took a no-hitter into the sixth inning in his Mets home debut, April 19 vs. San Francisco...Allowed his first knock, a run-scoring single off the bat of Darin Ruf, with two outs in the sixth...Recorded his 105th career double-digit strikeout game.

MAXIMUM OVERDRIVE: Scherzer has won 14 consecutive decisions, the longest winning streak of his career (he won his first 13 decisions of his 2013 Cy Young Award-winning season with Detroit)...His teams have won each of his last 16 regular season starts...He is unbeaten in his last 22 starts (more on this below), going 14-0 since June 4, 2021 with a 2.53 ERA (36 earned runs/128.0 innings) to go along with 164 strikeouts and just 29 walks in that span.

JUST WIN, BABY: Scherzer has not suffered a loss in any of his last 22 starts... That is tied for the 12th-longest streak of starts without a loss in modern MLB history...In his last start, he defeated Logan Webb, who had a 22-start streak without a loss of his own entering that game...Tonight, he aims to tie a trio of pitchers who have had a 23-start streak...Roger Clemens (30 straight) holds the all-time mark...The last pitcher before Scherzer to have a streak this long was Walker Buehler, whose 23-start unbeaten streak lasted from 2019-2021.

TOUCHING HIS ROOTS: Scherzer was born in St. Louis and attended Parkway Central HS in nearby Chesterfield, Missouri...He has pitched well throughout his career in his hometown, owning a 1.74 ERA (nine earned runs/46.2 innings) in seven starts here, including one postseason start (Game 2 of 2019 NLCS, in which he took a no-hitter into the seventh inning)...In his last start here, he allowed just one unearned run in 8.0 innings with 13 strikeouts and no walks...He has racked up at least 11 strikeouts in each of his last four starts here, including that playoff start...He has faced his hometown team 15 times in his career overall (including postseason) and is 5-6 with a 2.53 ERA (27 earned runs/96.0 innings) in those games.

STRONG METS DEBUT: Scherzer has won each of his first three starts with the Mets...It's the first time in his career he has started out 3-0 through three games... Tonight, he aims to become the second Mets hurler ever to start and win his first four games with New York...Bob Shaw won his first four starts after coming over from the Giants in June 1966.

CLIMBING THE LEADERBOARD: Scherzer entered the 2022 season as the active leader in strikeouts...He ranks 18th on MLB's all-time strikeout list and is within striking distance of several pitchers above him this season...He needs 42 strikeouts to pass John Smoltz...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:
