METS NOTES



Mets: Earned their third walk-off win of the season, tied for the most in the majors...Overcame a four-run deficit for their largest comeback win of the season...Are above the .500 mark for the first time since April 25 (9-8)...Have won three consecutive games and five of their last seven overall...Improved to 2-1 in extra-inning games.

· Held the D-backs to one hit in 16 at-bats with runners in scoring position.

Patrick Mazeika (0-1, RBI): Drove in the game-winning run with a pinch-hit fielder's choice in the 10th...Was his first career RBI...The last player whose first career RBI was a game-winner was Will Smith of the Dodgers (June 1, 2019)...The last Met whose first career RBI was of the walk-off variety was Esix Snead (September 21, 2002 vs. Montreal).

Francisco Lindor (2-5, HR, 2 RBI, 2 R): Hit his first career home run at Citi Field, a game-tying two-run shot in the seventh inning...It was his first home run since April 21 at Wrigley Field.

· Was his third career game-tying home run in the seventh inning or later.

Michael Conforto (1-4, RBI, BB): Put the Mets on the board with an RBI single in the third inning...Has a hit in each of his last four at-bats with runners in scoring position...This stretch follows an 0-14 slide in those situations.

Bullpen: Mets relievers threw 8.1 innings and allowed one earned run tonight, lowering their season ERA to 3.22 (31 ER/86.2 IP)...The bullpen has a 1.73 ERA (10 ER/52.0 IP) since April 22.

- Robert Gsellman (2.1 IP, 3 H, ER, BB) has allowed two runs over 8.2 innings in his last five appearances.
- Tommy Hunter (2.0 IP, 2 H) threw 2.0 scoreless innings in his Mets debut.
- Jacob Barnes (1.0 IP, H, 2 K) has thrown 7.0 consecutive scoreless innings.
- Miguel Castro (1.0 IP, BB, K) has not allowed a run in seven of his last eight games.
- · Edwin Díaz (1.0 IP, H, K) fired a scoreless ninth inning.
- Aaron Loup (1.0 IP, K) picked up his first win...He has not allowed an earned run

Jonathan Villar (2-3, RBI, 2 BB): Reached four times and drove in a run...Has four RBI in his last three games...Had three RBI in his previous 20 games.

David Peterson (1.2 IP, 3 H, 3 ER, 3 BB, 3 K): Pitched the shortest outing of his career...All three of his runs allowed came on either bases-loaded walks or a bases-loaded hit-by-pitch.



D-BACKS NOTES



D-backs: Suffered their second walk-off loss of the season...Have lost four consecutive games...Fell to 3-2 in extra-inning affairs.

Three-Run Rally: Arizona scored three runs in the second inning in a sequence that included no hits...After the bases were loaded, Tim Locastro was plunked, followed by back-to-back bases-loaded walks by Carson Kelly and Christian Walker...Arizona now has seven bases-loaded walks this season, one off the major league lead (Milwaukee has eight).

Zac Gallen (6.0 IP, 4 H, 2 R/1 ER, 4 BB, 5 K): Tossed his 11th quality start in 17 outings since the start of last season...Through 32 career starts, owns a 2.82 ERA, sixth-best in the majors since his debut.

Also drove in a run, his second career RBI.

Josh Rojas (3-5, R): Extended his hitting streak to seven games (.429, 12-28).
