Let's Touch Base Christian Yelich has reached base safely in 30 consecutive games, batting .316 (37-for-117) with 6 HR and 24 RBI.....during this stretch, he has a .375 OBP/.521 SLG/.896 OPS.....the streak ties his career high from 8/11-9/15, 2018 with the Brewers.

IT WON'T BE THE SAME: This season marks just the second without Bob Uecker on the radio for the Milwaukee Brewers (also 1970).....the 2003 Hall of Famer passed away at the age of 90 on January 16.

IN THE STANDINGS (130 days): The team has spent the following number of days alone or tied at each spot in the NL Central standings: FIRST: 16*, SECOND: 57, THIRD: 43, FOURTH: 11, FIFTH: 3.....the Brewers are currently in first place, leading the second-place Cubs by 1.0 game (*9 days tied for first from 3/18-3/26 before playing a game).
SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The team is 20-11-2 in series play. Game 1: 20-14, Game 2: 20-13, Game 3: 18-14, Game 4: 3-1 Sweeps (6): vs. BOS (3g, 5/26-5/28), at PHI (3g, 5/30-6/1), at MIN (3g, 6/20-6/22), vs. LAD (3g, 7/7-7/9), vs. WSH (3g, 7/11-7/13) and at LAD (3g, 7/18-7/20) Were Swept (1): at NYY (3g, 3/27-3/30)
AT HOME: The team is 33-18 at home, going 12-4-0 in series play.....are 21-9 in the last 30 home games, including 10-2 in the last 12.....had a season-high 6-game home winning streak snapped last night.
ON THE ROAD: The team is 28-24 on the road, going 8-7-2 in series play.....are 18-6 in the last 24 road games.....have had three season-high 5-game road winning streaks, coming from 5/25-6/2, 6/19-7/2 and 7/6-7/21.
MANAGER: Pat Murphy is in his second season as Brewers manager.....he was voted 2024 NL Manager of the Year after going 93-69 and winning the NL Central division championship.....he is the first manager in franchise history (in either league) to earn the honor.....Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell.....he is signed to a 3-year contract through 2026.
COACHES: Associate manager Rickie Weeks (2nd season), field coordinator Néstor Corredor (3rd season/2nd in current role), pitching coach Chris Hook (7th season), assistant pitching & strategy coach Jim Henderson (4th season/2nd in current role), bullpen coach Charlie Greene (2nd season), lead hitting coach Al LeBoeuf (1st season), hitting coach Connor Dawson (4th season), hitting coach Eric Theisen (1st season), assistant coach Daniel de Mondesert (2nd season), infield coach Matt Erickson (2nd season), first base coach Julio Borbón (1st season), third base coach Jason Lane (10th season/5th in current role).
LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The team has made 15 replay challenges this season, going 9-6.....their last challenge (won) came on 7/7 vs. Los Angeles-NL as an out call at third base involving Isaac Collins was overturned.
BREWING SUCCESS: The Brewers have made the postseason six times in the last seven seasons (2018-24) and won the NL Central in four of the last seven, three of four, and two in a row.....Milwaukee is one of five teams to make the postseason in at least six of the last seven seasons, joined by the Astros (7), Braves (7), Dodgers (7) and Yankees (6).....the team was just 2 games away from qualifying for the postseason in eight straight seasons (2017-24), missing by a single game in both 2017 and 2022.
BREWING CONSISTENCY: The Brewers, Astros and Dodgers are the only teams with 86+ wins in each of the last seven full seasons (2017-24).....this does not include 2020.....the Brewers have 727 wins since 2017 (4th in MLB/2nd in National League).

TONIGHT’S STARTER: #62 - LHP JOSÉ QUINTANA (14gs, 7-3, 3.49)

2025 Arsenal: Sinker (45.1%) - Changeup (22.1%) - Curveball (13.0%) - 4-Seam Fastball (10.7%) - Slurve (9.1%)

QUINTANA AT A GLANCE: José Quintana, 36, will make his 15th start of the season and first against the Marlins.....he last started last Sunday at Los Angeles-NL and earned a 6-5 win (6ip, 4h, 4r, 4er, 0bb, 5k, 2hr, 83 pitches).....the team is 10-4 in his starts.....he has 4 quality starts.....opponents are batting .241 (70-for-291, 9hr).....he was on the 15-day injured list from 5/14-5/31 with a left shoulder impingement, retroactive to May 11.....Quintana signed with Milwaukee as a free agent on March 5.....he is signed through the 2025 season with a mutual option for 2026.....name is pronounced “keen-TAH-nuh.”

MR. COLOMBIA: Quintana, born in Arjona, Colombia, is his country’s all-time leader in nearly every statistical category in the Major Leagues, including games (373), starts (347), wins (109), innings pitched (2047.0) and strikeouts (1,780).....he pitched for Colombia in the 2017 World Baseball Classic.

BEEN THERE, DONE THAT: Quintana has made 347 starts since 2012 - his first season - trailing only **Max Scherzer** (362).....this includes nine seasons of 30+ starts.

CAREER: Is 109-106 with a 3.73 ERA in 373 games/347 starts (2047.0ip, 849er).....is in his 14th Major League season while pitching for Chicago-AL (2012-17), Chicago-NL (2017-20), Los Angeles-AL (2021), San Francisco (2021), Pittsburgh (2022), St. Louis (2022), New York-NL (2023-24) and Milwaukee (2025).....was an All-Star in 2016 as he finished 10th in American League Cy Young Award voting.....Quintana was originally signed by the Mets as a non-drafted free agent on 4/26/06.

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 7-6 with a 4.29 ERA in 18 starts (98.2ip, 47er).....is 2-2 with a 5.12 ERA in 6 starts this season (31.2ip, 18er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 55-56 with a 3.73 ERA in 189 games/177 starts (1034.0ip, 429er).....is 5-1 with a 2.36 ERA in 8 starts this season (45.2ip, 12er).

CAREER vs. MARLINS: Is 3-1 with a 2.42 ERA in 4 starts (26ip, 21h, 7r, 7er, 6bb, 18k, 0hr).....has not faced the Marlins since 7/23/22 with the Pirates at PNC Park.
