**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees continue their six-game homestand tonight with the final game of a three-game set vs. the White Sox (2-0 thus far)...will also face the Reds in a three-game series this weekend (Fri.-Sun.).

- ▶ **Their 45-27 (.625) record is the best in the American League and the fourth-best record in the Majors.**
- ▶ **Have won each of their last four games (since 6/13), eight of their last nine games (since 6/7) and nine of their last 11 games (since 6/4)...are 15-5 in their last 20 games (since 5/24), 17-8 in their last 25 games (since 5/18) and 37-20 in their last 57 games (since 4/13).**
- ▶ Are a season-high 18G over .500.
- ▶ The Yankees' +122 run differential this season is the best in the AL and the second-best in the Majors...have outscored their opponents, 128-71, over their last 20 games (since 5/24).

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees clinched a series win after defeating the White Sox, 10-5, on Wednesday at Yankee Stadium...**LHP Carlos Rodón** (5.0IP, 7H, 3R/ER, 1BB, 7K, 1HR) started and earned his third win of the season...**Yankees batters** scored double-digit runs for their second straight game and ninth time this season...**CF Cody Bellinger** (3-for-4, 2R, 1 double, 1HR, 2RBI, 1BB) reached base a season-high-tying four times and hit his 11th home run of the year with a go-ahead two-run shot in the first inning...**SS Anthony Volpe** (1-for-3, 2R, 1 triple, 1RBI, 1BB) hit an RBI triple in the second inning...**C Ali Sánchez** (2-for-4, 1R, 1RBI) recorded his second straight multi-hit game and hit an RBI single in the second inning...**LF José Caballero** (1-for-3, 1R, 2RBI) hit a two-run single in the fifth inning...**1B Paul Goldschmidt** (2-for-5, 1R, 1HR, 3RBI) hit his 11th home run of the season with a three-run shot in the fifth inning...**2B Jazz Chisholm Jr.** (1-for-5, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI) hit his 10th home run of the season with a solo shot in the seventh inning.

**RICE RICE BABY: C/INF Ben Rice** reached base twice on Wednesday vs. Chicago-AL...has hit .291/.390/.611 (72-for-247) with 53R, 15 doubles, 2 triples, 20HR, 49RBI, 39BB/31BB, 2HP, 2SF and 25B in 67 games this season...has reached base safely in 52-of-63 starts.

- ▶ 37 of his 72H this year have been XBH (15 doubles, 2 triples, 20HR).

**GOOD AS GOLD: INF Paul Goldschmidt** hit his 11th home run of the season with a three-run shot in the fifth inning on Wednesday vs. Chicago-AL...has homered in back-to-back games for the first time this season and second time as a Yankee (also 4/30-5/2/25)...his 11HR in 47 games this year have surpassed his 2025 season total (10HR in 146 games).

- ▶ Has hit 3HR in his last four games (since 6/13) and 6HR in his last 16 games (since 5/29).
- ▶ **Owns a season-high-tying nine-game hitting streak** (since 6/7), hitting .410/.429/.718 (16-for-39) with 4R, 4HR, 13RBI, 2BB and 1SF over that stretch...also posted a nine-game streak from 5/25-6/4...his last longer streak was an 11-game streak from 8/24-9/4/24 with St. Louis.
- ▶ **Has hit safety in 18 of his last 19 games (since 5/25), batting .354/.379/.610 (29-for-82) with 11R, 3 doubles, 6HR, 22RBI, 4BB, 1SF and 15B over that span.**
- ▶ Has recorded 13RBI in his last nine games (since 6/7) and 22RBI in his last 17 games (since 5/27).

**BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters** scored double-digit runs for their second straight game and ninth time this season on Wednesday vs. Chicago-AL.

- ▶ With **INF Jazz Chisholm Jr.** hitting his 10th home run on Wednesday, the Yankees have five players with at least 10HR this season, tied with the Athletics for the most in the Majors (Ben Rice-20HR, Aaron Judge 17HR, Cody Bellinger-11HR, Paul Goldschmidt-11HR and Jazz Chisholm Jr.-10HR).

**ALL THAT JAZZ: INF Jazz Chisholm Jr.** hit his 10th home run of the season with a solo shot in the seventh inning on Wednesday vs. Chicago-AL...has recorded 4HR and 10RBI in his last 12 games (since 6/3) and 5HR and 11RBI in his last 16 games (since 5/26).

**2026 HOPE WEEK:** This week, the Yankees are celebrating the 17th edition of **HOPE Week (Helping Others Persevere & Excel)**, an ambitious, week-long, multifaceted community outreach program undertaken by players, coaches and employees within the organization...the initiative is rooted in the belief that acts of goodwill provide hope and encouragement to more than just the recipient of the gesture...over each of the five days of HOPE Week, the Yankees will reach out to an individual, family or organization worthy of recognition and support, providing honorees with a day celebrating their accomplishments...this year's outreach will take place in the community and at Yankee Stadium.

- ▶ During today's HOPE Week event, the Yankees celebrated **Brian Schwartz** and his nonprofit "I Want To Mow Your Lawn," which provides older adults, veterans, and neighbors facing physical or financial hardship with free, temporary lawn care relief provided by generous volunteers...the acts of help originated during the isolation of the pandemic and became a national movement that continues to this day...earlier today, Yankees **Senior Vice President & General Manager Brian Cashman, Yankees players Fernando Cruz, Jasson Domínguez, Amed Rosario, Camilo Doval and Ali Sánchez** along with **Third Base Coach Luis Rojas, Hitting Coach James Rowson, First Base Coach Dan Fiorito, Major League Information Coordinator Ryan McLaughlin and Yankee Stadium Head Groundskeeper Danny Cunningham**, joined Schwartz in surprising a family at a residential home in Leonia, N.J. with free lawn maintenance...the group also assisted CLC Landscape Design with landscaping and gardening activities around the property...Schwartz and his family will be guests of the Yankees for batting practice and the team's 7:05 p.m. game vs. the White Sox.
- ▶ Since the start of HOPE Week in 2009, the Yankees have gone 46-28 (.622) during the event...the Yankees have gone .500-or-better in 11 of their first 16 years of HOPE Week and have gone undefeated during HOPE Week four times (5-0 in 2009, 4-0 in 2014, 5-0 in 2016 and 5-0 in 2019)...are 33-20 in their last 53 HOPE Week games (since 7/10/13).

**MATCHING UP:** The Yankees are 13-2 in their last 15G vs. the White Sox (since 2024) and 15-4 in their last 19G (since 6/8/23-G2).

**SAVED BY THE BELL: INF/OF Cody Bellinger** reached base a season-high-tying four times (fifth time) and recorded at least 3H for his second straight game on Wednesday vs. Chicago-AL...hit his 11th home run of the year with a go-ahead two-run shot in the first inning...**his 15 go-ahead RBI are the most in the Majors and his nine game-winning RBI are tied for the second-most in the Majors (tied for first in AL).**

- ▶ Has recorded 17RBI over his last 19 games (since 5/25).
- ▶ Is hitting .304/.388/.553 (49-for-161) with 27R, 12 doubles, 2 triples, 8HR, 35RBI, 24BB, 5SB and 3SF over his last 43 games (since 4/28)
- ▶ Is batting .317/.377/.492 (20-for-63) with 4 doubles, 2 triples, 1HR, 32RBI, 9BB and 5SF with RISP this season.
- ▶ Has hit safely in 27-of-32 home games this year, batting .386/.464/.737 (44-for-114) with 24R, 12 doubles, 2 triples, 8HR, 31RBI, 20BB, 4SF and 3SB.
- ▶ According to FanGraphs, leads all Major Leaguers with 16 DRS.

**HIP HIP JOSÉ: INF/OF José Caballero** hit a two-run single in the fifth inning on Wednesday vs. Chicago-AL...has 7RBI over his last three games and 9RBI over his last six games (since 6/10)...is batting .333/.404/.487 (13-for-39) with 3 doubles, 1HR, 18RBI, 6BB and 2SF with RISP this year.

- ▶ Is hitting .294/.349/.484 (45-for-153) with 25R, 8 doubles, 7HR, 21RBI, 10BB, 4HP, 2SF and 10SB over his last 47 games (since 4/13).

**HIGH VOLPGE: INF Anthony Volpe** hit an RBI triple in the second inning on Wednesday vs. Chicago-AL...is batting .333/.462/.333 (7-for-21) with 9RBI and 5BB with RISP this year.

- ▶ Has hit .438/.500/.625 (7-for-16) with 5R, 1 double, 1 triple, 4RBI and 2BB over his last five games (since 6/10).

**FOR STARTERS: Yankees starters** have posted a 3.30 ERA (395.0IP, 145ER) and 383K in 72 starts this season...have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 59 starts this season, the most in the AL and tied for the most in the Majors (also Los Angeles-NL and Milwaukee)...marks their third-most in franchise history through their first 72 games of a season, trailing only their 61 starts in 2024 and 60 starts in 2022.

- ▶ Lead the Majors in opponents' SLG (.345), rank second in ERA (3.30, first in AL), opponents' OPS (.633, first in AL), third in HR/9.0IP (0.93, second in AL) and opponents' BA (.218, first in AL), fourth in WHIP (1.14, second in AL), and opponents' OBP (.288, third in AL), seventh in strikeout rate (23.6%, third in AL), and eighth in K/BB (2.90, fourth in AL) and K/9.0IP (8.73, fourth in AL).

**TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY**  
**June 18, 2005:** Derek Jeter hits his first (and only) career grand slam off the Cubs' Joe Borowski and adds a solo homer in an 8-1 Yankees victory. Jeter had hit 156 career homers prior to the slam, the most by any active player and any Yankee before hitting a grand slam.
