JUSTIN TIME, ONE MORE TIME: Justin Verlander this afternoon makes the 557th and final start of his storied Hall of Fame career as he leads the Detroit Tigers into the middle game of their three-game set against the Pittsburgh Pirates at Comerica Park ... the Tigers organization salutes Justin and his 20-plus seasons of excellence on the mound and in the community.

WELCOME HOME: Justin Verlander today makes his first start at home in a Tigers uniform since August 20, 2017, a span of nine years and 37 days ... the last pitcher with a span that long between home starts for a team in a venue?: Kansas City's Zack Greinke, who went 11 years, 189 days between home starts at Kauffman Stadium from September 30, 2010 to April 7, 2022.

- Verlander makes his 193rd and final career start at Comerica Park, the most regular season starts in any single ballpark by any pitcher active today ... Philadelphia's Aaron Nola is a distant second with 156 starts at Citizens Bank Park followed by Colorado's Kyle Freeland and his 129 starts at Coors Field ... thanks to Elias for its research assistance.

BACK AT IT: Justin Verlander makes his second start of the season, his first since March 30 at Arizona ... he was placed on the injured list five days later ... his 2026 season debut came a mere 3,135 days since his previous regular season start in a Detroit uniform, which was on August 30, 2017 ... Verlander made the first 380 starts of his career with Detroit before being traded to Houston at the end of August of 2017, where we went on to help that club win a World Championship that year.

- The three-time A.L. Cy Young Award Winner, 10-time A.L. All-Star, 2006 A.L. Rookie of the Year and 2011 A.L. Most Valuable Player, Cy Young and Triple Crown winner rejoined the Tigers after spending the first 12-plus years (2005-17) of his major league career in Detroit ... he was a dominant force during the club's most-successful stretch of the past 40 years, helping lead the club to a pair of World Series appearances (in 2006 and 2012) and four-straight playoff appearances from 2011-14, the only time such a post-season run has occurred in club history.
- Verlander is Major League Baseball's active leader with 266 wins, 3,571.1 innings pitched, 556 starts and 3,554 strikeouts, the eighth-most punchouts in major league history.

RARE AIR: Verlander this season became only the second pitcher in major league history to make at least his first 380 starts with his original team, go on to make at least 175 starts elsewhere and then return to make another start with his first club ... Verlander joined Hall of Famer Don Sutton in achieving this feat, as Sutton made his first 517 starts with the Los Angeles Dodgers between 1966-80 and then made 223 starts elsewhere before returning to the Dodgers in 1988.

- Two other Hall of Fame pitchers came close to this milestone ... Tom Seaver made his first 361 starts with the New York Mets, then made his next 158 starts elsewhere and then returned to the Mets ... Tom Glavine made his first 505 starts with the Braves, then made his next 164 starts elsewhere before returning to Atlanta ... thanks to Elias.

IT'S GOOD FOR SOMETHING: Kevin McGonigle has a strong bWAR and fWAR lead on his fellow A.L. rookies this season, as his 6.9 bWAR into Friday was more than half a point better than his next closest competitor, Parker Messick and his 6.2 bWAR, and is more than three to four points better than the next closest batch of position players ... Kevin's 5.2 fWAR also leads every A.L. rookie.

- Kevin should get MVP consideration as well as his 6.9 bWAR was the best mark by any position player in the A.L. and third best by any position player in baseball alongside Pete Crow-Armstrong (9.9) and Bryce Turang (7.0) ... the next best position players in the A.L. behind Kevin: Bobby Witt Jr (6.7), Yordan Alvarez (6.6), Wilyer Abreu (5.8) and Cedanne Rafael (5.7).
- McGonigle is one of only two rookies in baseball history to post a versatile, all-around rookie campaign with at least 96 runs, 28 doubles, 17 home runs, 70 RBI and 95 walks, joining the Greatest Hitter of All-Time, Ted Williams (1939).

THIS IS SOME HIGH-END TORK: Spencer Torkelson hit his 26th home run last night to go along with his 28 doubles and 77 RBI ... he now has at least 26 HR/27 2B/77 RBI in three of his last four seasons starting in 2023, only the second Tiger to produce three such seasons in a four-year span since Comerica Park opened in 2000, joining Miguel Cabrera who did so five years in a row from 2008-12.

LET'S GET ON WITH IT: Since the Rookie of the Year Award was first handed out in 1947, Kevin McGonigle is only the 13th rookie in all of baseball to reach base safely at least 263 times in a single season ... in the last 50 years, every player on this list has won Rookie of the Year honors except for Kevin Seitzer in 1987, who lost out to Mark McGwire and his then-rookie record 49 home runs.

- McGonigle is just the sixth rookie to reach base safely at least 263 times in a season in the last 60 years, joining Kevin Seitzer (289 in 1987), Aaron Judge (286 in 2017), Ichiro Suzuki (280 in 2001), Albert Pujols (272 in 2001) and Alvin Davis (265 in 1984).

AND FINALLY: Take a moment to travel back in time to 2004 and consider this series of two-month intervals: Justin Verlander was drafted by the Tigers on June 7 ... Kevin McGonigle was born on August 18 ... Justin Verlander then signed his first pro contract with the Tigers on October 25 ... and then Max Clark was born on December 21 ... thanks, JV, for providing two decades of memories to Tigers and baseball fans everywhere and for your positive influence on our next generation.

- Making the 557th and final start of his illustrious and decorated career today, his first start at home in a Tigers uniform since August 20, 2017, a span of nine years and 37 days...the last pitcher with a span that long between home starts for a team in a venue was Kansas City's Zack Greinke, who went 11 years, 189 days between home starts at Kauffman Stadium.
- Allowed five earned runs on six hits (one home run), two walks and a strikeout in his lone start this year back on March 30 at Arizona...was his first regular season start with the Tigers in 3,135 days, first since Aug. 30, 2017...made the first 380 starts of his career with Detroit before being traded to Houston at the end of August of 2017, where he went on to help that club win a World Championship that year.
- Returns to the Tigers as Major League Baseball's active leader with 266 wins, 3,571.1 innings pitched, 556 starts and 3,554 strikeouts, the eighth-most punchouts in major league history.
- Last season with the Giants, started in 29 games with a 3.85 ERA (65ER/152.0IP) with 137 strikeouts...ended season with 3,553 K's in his career...enters the 2026 season with the eighth-most strikeouts all-time according to Elias...he'll need 21 strikeouts to tie Don Sutton for seventh-most
- Verlander had four wins in 2025 but was in line for seven others upon leaving the mound in 2025 only to see them fall by the wayside...he now has 266 wins in his career, tied for 34th-most all-time with Eppa Rixey and Bob Feller according to Elias...the Giants were 10-19 in the 29 games Verlander started.
- In the second half of the 2025 season, he posted a 2.60 ERA (21ER/72.2IP) over his last 13 starts dating to July 23, eighth-best in the Majors (fourth-best in the NL) in that time (min. 60.0IP)...he allowed one earned run or fewer in eight of those 13 outings...had a 3.39 FIP in this stretch, eighth-best in the NL...he was even better over his last six starts of the season, owning a 1.78 ERA (7ER, 35.1IP) with 33 strikeouts and an opponent's average against of .206.
- Had a four-start stretch from Aug. 31-Sept. 17 where he allowed one or zero runs...the only other pitcher age 42 or older to do that in a four-start span in the last 125 seasons was Roger Clemens in 2005.
- Struck out 10 Orioles hitters over 5.0 innings on Aug. 31, 2025, in a 13-2 Giants win...it was his first double-digit strikeout game since Oct. 4, 2022, with Houston versus Philadelphia (also 10 strikeouts)...the last pitcher older than Verlander to spin 5.0 scoreless innings and record a double-digit strikeout game was Roger Clemens, who did so on July 22, 2005, with Houston (6.0IP, 10K).
- Verlander joined the 3,500+ strikeout club as its 10th member on Aug. 10, 2025, vs. Washington when he struck out Nathaniel Lowe to end the 1st inning.

- Worked around a hit to throw a scoreless frame on Sept. 22, pitching in back-to-back games.
- Threw a scoreless ninth inning with a strikeout to secure Detroit's 9-2 win over Washington on Sept. 21.
- Entered the game in the first inning, allowing two earned runs on five hits with four strikeouts in 2.1 frames on Sept. 18.
- Delivered 2.0 scoreless innings with two strikeouts on Sept. 14 in Toronto...was called upon with the bases loaded in the third inning and got out of the jam.
- Optioned to Toledo on July 18, allowed 11 earned runs on 15 hits (six home runs) while walking eight and striking out 20 in 18.0 innings (13 games) from July 21-Aug. 29 with the Mud Hens...recalled and joined Detroit on Sept. 1.
- Closed out a Tigers win with 2.0 scoreless innings July 10 against PHI...allowed one hit while striking out one.
- Optioned to Triple-A Toledo on June 12 and recalled on July 1, replacing an injured Will Vest...allowed just one earned run over five games (6.1 innings) with the Mud Hens over that span...did not allow a hit in his last 3.2 frames.
- Saw his first major league action of the season on May 30 against Chicago-AL, allowing three earned runs on three hits (two home runs) and striking out three.
- Began the season on the 60-day injured list with a left adductor strain...rehabbed with Lakeland and Toledo in May.
- Made his first career Opening Day roster in 2025...pitched in 22 games (one start) to a 1-3 record and a 6.55 ERA.
- Pitched 46 games (12 starts) for Detroit in 2024, ending with a 4-5 record, 3.59 ERA (27ER/67.2IP) and 69 strikeouts.
- Started on Sept. 13 and 14 vs. Baltimore in 2024, becoming the first Tigers pitcher to start back-to-back team games, which were on consecutive days, since George Uhle on Aug. 4-5, 1929.
- Made postseason debut Oct. 1, 2024, at Houston, walking one in a scoreless 0.2 innings to pick up the save...according to Elias, he became the first pitcher in franchise history to record a save in his first career playoff game.
- Started his postseason career with 5.1 no-hit innings with two walks and six strikeouts in his first four outings.

- Allowed a hit and two walks on Sept. 20 at Chicago...has a 1.75 ERA (9ER/46.1 IP) in his last 43 outings since May 31.
- Back-to-back scoreless outings against the Rays on Aug. 24-25...two hits and a strikeout over 2.0 combined innings.
- From July 4-Aug. 15, allowed two earned runs in 15 games (17.1 IP)...allowed three earned runs on three hits and two walks in 1.0 inning on Aug. 16 against the White Sox.
- Threw a perfect 10th inning to secure his second save of the season on Aug. 9 against San Francisco, striking out the side on just 12 pitches.
