METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Rangers, 8-3, last night...The Mets are in a stretch of 10 straight games (1-7) and in 16 games in 17 days (1-7)...The Mets are in the midst of their final homestand of the regular season, a 10-day, nine-game (0-1) stand against the Rangers (0-1), Padres (three games) and Nationals (three games).

LET'S NOT GO STREAKING: The Mets have dropped seven straight games and eight of their lastnine...The team has posted a 6.95 ERA (44 ER/57.0 IP) over that seven game span, while batting .196/.250/.326...New York has been outscored 44-18 over the seven game losing streak...Their longest streak this season was seven games, which they did twice (June 13-20 and August 3-10)... This is the first time since 1980 that the Mets have had three separate seven-game losing streaks.

RETURN OF THE MARK: In 42 games following the All-Star Game, Mark Vientos is batting .270/.323/.553 with 21 runs, 10 doubles, 11 homers, 10 walks and an .876 OPS...This compares to a .223/.280/.361 slashline with six homers in 66 games before the break.

THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE: This year marked the first time in franchise history that the Mets opened their home and road schedule against an Interleague Opponent...The Mets are 23-23 in Interleague Play this season...The team went 24-22 in Interleague Play last year.

INTERGALACTIC: Pete Alonso has hit a franchise-record 67 home runs in Interleague Play...His 67 home runs are the fourth-most all-time...It is third-most among active players...Only Aaron Judge (82) and Kyle Schwarber (78) have hit more.

30/30: Juan Soto became the first player in 2025 to record 30 home runs and 30 steals in a single season...He became the fifth Mets player in franchise history to record a 30/30 season and the first since Francisco Lindor in 2023...Howard Johnson (36 HR/32 SB) and Darryl Strawberry (39 HR/36 SB) in 1987 are the only pair of Mets teammates to have a 30/30 season...Along with the 1987 Mets, the 1996 Rockies are the only other team that featured two players with a 30/30 season - Dante Bichette (31 HR/31 SB) and Ellis Burks (40 HR/32 SB).

AND I WOULD WALK 100 MILES: Juan Soto has recorded a Major League-leading 118 walks this year...He recorded his sixth season with 100+ walks and became the second Mets player to break the 100 walk barrier...John Olerud recorded 125 walks during the 1999 season.

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto has on-base streak snapped at 20 games last night...He batted .370 (27-73) in that span with 22 runs, two doubles, one triple, eight homers, 23 RBI, 20 walks, 12 steals, a .511 OBP and an .753 SLG during that span...He has safely reached base in 37 of his last 39 games, batting .301/.436/.622 in that span with 37 runs, two doubles, one triple, 14 homers, 33 RBI, 34 walks, 17 steals and a 1.059 OPS.

DEBUT NOTES: Allowed three runs over 6.0 innings, allowed three hits, issued four walks and struck out seven in his Major League debut on September 7 vs. Cincinnati...Sproat joined Matt Harvey (11), Collin McHugh (9), Bill Denehy (8), Nolan McLean (8), Tom Seaver (8), Kodai Senga (8), Brent Strom, Randy Tate, Zack Wheeler and Masato Yoshii as the only pitchers in franchise history to record seven or more strikeouts in their Major League debut...Additionally, Sproat joined McHugh, Yoshii, Strom, Denehy Dillon Gee, Brian Bannister and Jason Isringhausen as the only pitchers in franchise history to record a quality start and allow three or fewer hits in their Major League debut...The right-hander did not allow a hit through his first 5.1 innings of work.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: Brandon Sproat became the eighth Met (seventh pitcher) to make their debut this season, joining Hayden Senger, Justin Hagenman, Blade Tidwell, Jonathan Pintaro, Alex Carrillo, Nolan McLean and Jonah Tong...The Mets have had four different pitchers make their debut this season as a starter (also: Tidwell, McLean and Tong) which is the most in a single season in franchise history and the most by a team this season...The previous most was when the Mets had three players make their debut as a starter in 1967, 1982 and 2006...He became the 45th pitcher to make an appearance for the club, tying a Major League record (also: 2024 Miami Marlins)...With McLean and Tong, it was the first time in franchise history the Mets have had three pitchers debut as a starter in a 21-game span...The last team to do so were the 2023 Cleveland Guardians (Peyton Battenfield, Logan Allen and Tanner Bibee)...Courtesy of *Elias*.

SMETS: Spent the entire season with the Syracuse Mets, combining to go 8-6 with a 4.24 ERA (57 ER/121.0 IP), 53 walks and 113 strikeouts over 26 games (25 starts)...Made his last start with the team on August 30 at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre and earned the win after tossing 7.0 scoreless innings (3 H, 2 BB, 9 K)...His nine strikeouts tied a season high (also: July 19 and July 31) and it was the second time this season he has tossed 7.0 scoreless innings (also: July 10)...Among qualified Triple-A pitchers this season, was first in opponents' BA (.218), tied for third in games started, fourth in WHIP (1.24), and eighth in ERA...In 11 appearances (10 starts) since June 28 (G1), he has gone 5-1 with a 2.44 ERA (16 ER/59.0 IP), 21 walks and 70 strikeouts...Over that span, his .163 opponents' BA is the best in Triple-A, his strikeouts and WHIP (0.93) are both second, and his 2.44 ERA (in 11 appearances) is the fourth-best...In 10 starts in that span, he posted a 1.79 ERA (11 ER/55.1 IP)...Sproat has pitched at least 5.0 innings with three earned runs or fewer in nine of those starts...He was named the International League Pitcher of the Year for the month of July after going 2-0 with a 0.67 ERA (2 ER/27.0 IP), eight walks and 33 strikeouts...He pitched 5.0 innings in all five July starts, completing seven innings in one of those outings.

RIISING THROUGH THE RANKS: Sproat is currently the Mets' No. 5 prospect and the No. 3 pitching prospect behind teammates Nolan McLean and Jonah Tong...He was the No. 13 Mets prospect in 2024, starting the season with High-A Brooklyn...He made five appearances (four starts) with the Cyclones before being promoted to Double-A Binghamton on May 13, 2024...Sproat made 11 appearances with the Rumble Ponies and was then promoted again to Triple-A Syracuse on August 5...In his first professional season, combined across High-A, Double-A and Triple-A to go 7-4 with a 3.40 ERA (44 ER/116.1 IP), 42 walks and 131 strikeouts in 24 appearances (23 starts)...After the season, he was named the Eastern League Pitcher of the Year and a Postseason All-Star...He was also named to the 2024 MLB All-Star Futures Game roster.

DRAFT DAY x3: Was originally drafted by the Texas Rangers in the seventh round of the 2019 First-Year Player Draft out of Pace High School in Pace, Florida but did not sign...Was then drafted by the Mets in the third round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Florida...Forwent signing with the Mets to play in his senior year at UF where he pitched in the 2023 NCAA Men's College World Series Finals...Was drafted again by the Mets in the second round of the 2023 First-Year Player Draft...Sproat has since spent parts of two seasons (2024-25) in the Mets organization, combining to go 15-10 with a 3.83 ERA (101 ER/237.1 IP), 95 walks and 244 strikeouts.

- Threw a scoreless eighth inning on September 11 at Philadelphia (1.0 IP, K)...Five of his last six outings have been scoreless.
- In 183 career appearances at Citi Field, he has posted a 2.08 ERA (43 ER/186.0 IP) with 81 saves...This season he has a 1.89 ERA (7 ER/33.1 IP) with 15 saves over 32 appearances at home.
- In 60 Interleague games since joining the Mets in 2019, he has posted a 6-1 record with 30 saves while having a 1.74 ERA (12 ER/62.0 IP) and he has recorded 109 strikeouts during that span for a 15.82 K/9.
- Recorded his 26th save of the season on September 5 at Cincinnati (1.0 IP, H, 2 K, 2 BB)...He threw 30 pitches which is tied for his second-most in an outing this season.
- Earned his 250th career save after recording the final four outs on September 1 vs. Detroit (1.1 IP, 2 K)...He is the 39th pitcher in Major League history to reach the milestone and he is only one of four active relievers who have reached the milestone (also: Kenley Jansen, Craig Kimbrel, Aroldis Chapman).
- Allowed multiple earned runs in an outing for just the third time this season on August 30 vs. Miami (1.0 IP, 3 H, 2 ER, 3 K, BB)...Was the first time he's allowed multiple runs in an outing since April 11 at the Athletics...He has recorded multiple strikeouts in six of his last eight games.
- Earned his career-high-tying sixth win of the season after getting the final five outs against Philadelphia on August 26 (1.2 IP, 4 K)...Struck out a season high four of the five batters he faced...His four strikeouts were his most in a game since September 22, 2024 vs. Philadelphia.
- Earned his 24th save of the season after tossing 2.0 innings on August 16 vs. Seattle (2 H, ER, 2 K, HR)...It was his fourth career six-out save and second of the season (also: July 12 at KC)...Has allowed two home runs over his last five outings after going 34 consecutive games without allowing a home run (from 4/23-8/4)...The homer marked the first home run he had given up to a right-hander in 160 at-bats.
- Has allowed just five earned runs over his last 43 games, posting a 0.99 ERA (5 ER/45.1 IP) with 14 walks and 69 strikeouts since April 23...During that span, his 0.99 ERA is the second-best in the majors, and his .159 opponents' BA is the fifth best (min. 40.0 IP).
- Among qualified relievers this season, is fourth in ERA (1.80, second in NL), fifth in K/9.0 IP (13.75, first in NL), 10th in opponents' BA (.168, third in NL), and 11th in saves (26, fourth in NL)...Among qualified NL relievers is fourth in opponents' SLG (.258), fifth in opponents' OPS (.527), and tied for seventh in wins (6)...Among pitchers who have thrown at least 40.0 innings this season, his 40.9 swing and miss percentage is the best in the National Leagues and fifth best in the majors.
- Over 53 games this season, has gone 6-2 with 26 saves, a 1.80 ERA (11 ER/55.0 IP), 20 walks and 84 strikeouts...The Mets are 40-13 in games that Díaz has pitched in...Hitters have posted a .168 (32-190) average against Díaz this season...He has recorded six saves this season of four outs or more, which are the most such games in the majors this season...His six saves this season with three-plus

strikeouts are tied with Mason Miller and Jeff Hoffman for the most such games in the majors...He has 57 career saves with three or more strikeouts are the most since his debut in 2016...Josh Hader is second with 44.

- On August 4, was named as the NL Reliever of the Month for July after going 2-0 with seven saves and a 0.00 ERA (11.0 IP) over 10 appearances...His 10 Reliever of the Month Awards (five as a Met) are the most by any player since the honor was established in 2005...Was also named the NL Reliever of the Month for May...He is the only pitcher to win a monthly award multiple times this year.
- Among relievers in franchise history, he ranks second in strikeouts (524), third in saves (142), eighth in appearances (324) and tied for seventh in wins (24).
- Became the 11th pitcher in Major League history to record at least 20 saves in at least seven of their first nine seasons (since saves became an official stat in 1969), joining Craig Kimbrel, Jonathan Papelbon, Troy Percival, Trevor Hoffman, Bruce Sutter, Aroldis Chapman, Kenley Jansen, Huston Street, Mariano Rivera and Robb Nen.
- Was named to the 2025 National League All-Star team after going 3-0, 15-for-16 in save opportunities with a 2.22 ERA (7 ER/28.1 IP) in 28 first half appearances...It marks the third time in his career he's gone to the Midsummer classic and the second time as a member of the Mets (also 2022)...Named the Trevor Hoffman NL Reliever of the Year in 2022...Finished ninth in the NL Cy Young Award balloting.
