**RAYS REPORT**—The Rays open their final road trip of 2025 tonight at Oriole Park, a six-game trek through Baltimore (3G) and Toronto (3G), went 3-4 on their last homestand at Steinbrenner Field against the Blue Jays (2-2) and Red Sox (1-2), are 3-2 in their last five games after dropping nine of their previous 11 contests, Sept. 5-16, which came on the heels of a season-high seven-game winning streak (Aug. 29-Sept. 4)...have gone 7-16-1 over their last 24 series since a 16-8-2 start...are fourth in the AL East for the 74th consecutive day dating back to July 11, 14.0 GB the first-place Blue Jays...have a 3.0-game lead over the fifth-place Orioles with seven games to play...including off days and the All-Star break, they have spent two days in first, 37 in second, 32 in third, 104 in fourth and four in fifth.

- ✦ The Rays played three runs in the 1st and 8th innings in their final game at Steinbrenner Field Sunday, a 7-3 win over the Red Sox...with the victory, the Rays finished with a winning record at home for the ninth consecutive season (41-40).
- ✦ It was their 41st time scoring seven runs or more, tied with the Blue Jays for third most in the AL behind the Yankees (50G) and Tigers (44G).
- ✦ The Rays 3.10 ERA (249.2IP, 86ER) in their last 28 games since Aug. 22 ranks third in the majors behind the Pirates (2.94) and Guardians (3.02)...the staff paces the AL with a 25.8 pct. strikeout rate since the All-Star break.
- ✦ With a major league-leading 188 SB, the Rays are 6 SB shy of matching the 2009 team's franchise-record 194 SB...they have a steal in six of their last eight games.
- ✦ Tampa Bay has dropped four of its last five games on the road...four of the club's last six road games have been decided by one run.

**THE GREAT YANDINO**—Yandy Diaz was named AL Player of the Week for Sept. 15-21, his first career weekly award and the second by a Ray this season along with **Junior Caminero** (May 26-June 1)...this marks the first time multiple Rays have won weekly honors in the same season since **Manuel Margot** and **Isaac Paredes** in 2022...in seven games, Diaz went 13-for-22 (.591) with 2 2B, 1 HR, 4 RBI, 9 BB and 5 R while reaching base safely in 22 of 31 PA (.710 OBP)...he paced the majors in average, on-base pct., OPS (1.528) and hits while tying for the MLB lead in walks...the 22 times on base marked the most over a homestand of eight games or fewer in franchise history, according to Stats Perform (H, BB or HBP)...Diaz has tallied a hit in 19 of his last 24 games since Aug. 25, batting .432/.519/.648 (38-for-88) with 7 2B, 4 HR, 10 RBI, 16 BB, 11 SO, 18 R and a 1.167 OPS...over that timeframe, he leads MLB in average, hits (11st) and on-base pct. and ranks third in OPS to NYY **Aaron Judge** (1.190) and NYM **Juan Soto** (1.168)...min. 90 PA, the only player in franchise history with a higher on-base pct. over any 24-game span is **Fred McGriff** in 1999 (4x, last: .528 OBP from April 29-May 25).

- ✦ He is one double away from joining **Ben Zobrist** (2011-14) as the only players in Rays history with four straight 30-double seasons...his next double will also tie **Aubrey Huff** (172 2B) for the fifth-most two-baggers in Rays history.
- ✦ Diaz, who leads the majors with 53 multi-hit games, has career highs in home runs (25), RBI (83) and games played (146)...his 173 hits match his career best from 2023, and his 55 XBH are two shy of his career high from the same season (57 XBH).
- ✦ He has an 11-game on base streak (.600 OBP) and has drawn a walk in a career-high eight straight games, the longest streak by a Ray since **Ben Zobrist** (9G) from May 10-18, 2011 and three shy of **Carlos Peña's** club-record 11-game streak (May 15-25, 2009).

**CHASING 300**—**Jake Mangum** (.298, 383AB) and **Chandler Simpson** (.299, 395AB) are attempting to become the second and third rookies in franchise history to hit .300 or better with at least 400 AB, joining **Joey Wendle** (.300, 487AB) in 2018...only five pairs of rookie teammates in MLB history have accomplished the feat, most recently PIT **Kevin Newman** (.308)/**Bryan Reynolds** (.314) in 2019...other instances involved BOS **Fred Lynn/Jim Rice** in 1975, DET **Dale Alexander/Roy Johnson** in 1929, STL **George Barclay/Homer Smoot** in 1902 and PIT **Ginger Beaumont/Jimmy Williams** in 1899.

- ✦ Between Mangum, Simpson and Yandy Diaz (.302), the Rays could have three players hit .300 or better (min. 400AB) for the first time in franchise history.
- ✦ Paired with 2023 (.330), Diaz is attempting to join **Carl Crawford** (5x) as the only players in team history with multiple qualified seasons hitting .300 or better.

**MAN OF STEAL**—**Chandler Simpson's** 43 SB are second in MLB to NYY **José Caballero** (48SB) and 10th most in a season in Rays history, 2 SB shy of joining **Carl Crawford** (6x, last: 47SB in 2010) as the only Rays to reach 45 SB...he has a chance to become the ninth rookie since 1901 to hit .300 or better with 40 SB or more and the first since LAA **Mike Trout** (.326/.495B) in 2012...the only Ray to meet those marks, regardless of rookie status, is **Carl Crawford** (5x, last: 2010 - .307/.475B)...the only two players in the majors to do so since 2022 are LAD **Shohei Ohtani** (.310/.595B) in 2024 and ATL **Ronald Acuna Jr.** (.337/.735B) in 2023...the last AL hitter was KC **Whit Merrifield** (.304/.455B) in 2018.

- ✦ Simpson is 17-for-39 (.436) with 3 2B, 3 RBI, 2 BB, 7 R and 4 SB over his last 10 games.

**DAWG POUND**—**Brandon Lowe** hit his 30th home run Sunday, his second career 30-HR campaign along with 2021 (39HR)...he joined **Evan Longoria** (4) and **Carlos Peña** (3) as the only players in franchise history with multiple 30-HR seasons and became the fourth active second baseman to turn the trick, joining ATL **Ozzie Albies** (2), HOU **Jose Altuve** (2) and AZ **Ketel Marte** (2)...Lowe and **Junior Caminero** (44HR) are the sixth set of Rays teammates to both hit 30 HR in a season, first since Lowe (39HR) and **Mike Zunino** (33HR) in 2021.

- ✦ The only second baseman with more home runs than Lowe this season is NYY **Jazz Chisholm Jr.** (31HR)...his 444 career RBI are three shy of tying **B.J. Upton** (447RBI) for sixth most in franchise history.

**THE CAMINER-SHOW**—With six games to play, **Junior Caminero** (44HR) is 2 HR shy of tying **Carlos Peña's** franchise-record 46-HR campaign in 2007...has 17 HR in 44 games since Aug. 1, tying NYM **Juan Soto** for the most in the majors...his 108 RBI are the most by a Ray since **Evan Longoria** (113RBI) in 2009 and are fourth most in Rays history (see table to the right)...his 72 XBH match **Ben Zobrist** (2011) for seventh most in a season in team history, one shy of Longoria in 2010 (73XBH) for sixth and two shy of Longoria in 2013 (74XBH) for fifth.

- ✦ Caminero is two doubles shy of becoming the first player in franchise history with a 30-double, 40-homer season.

**BIRDLAND**—The Rays and Orioles begin their fourth and final series of 2025 tonight, with the clubs splitting their first 10 matchups...the Rays need to win this series to secure their first season series win over the Orioles since 2022 (10-9)...after dropping nine of 13 games last year and eight of 13 in 2023, the Rays have lost consecutive season series to Baltimore for the first time since 2014-16...despite going 7-5 in the last 12 meetings, they are still 9-16 in their last 25 games against the Orioles and 13-22 in their last 35...of the 10 games between the clubs this season, seven have been decided by four runs or more...Tampa Bay is 1-6-1 in eight series at Oriole Park since the start of 2022 and 5-9-3 overall vs. Baltimore over that timeframe.

- ✦ The Rays are batting .301 (104-for-345) vs. Orioles pitching this season, which would be their second-highest mark in club history behind 1999 (.310).
- ✦ Excluding June 27 at BAL when the Rays yielded a season-high 20 ER, they have pitched to a 3.83 ERA (80.0IP, 34ER) in their other nine games vs. the Orioles.
- ✦ **Junior Caminero** (16-for-38/.421), **Yandy Diaz** (17-for-38/.447), **Brandon Lowe** (12-for-31/.387) and **Chandler Simpson** (8-for-23/.348) are hitting a combined .408 (53-for-130) against the Orioles this season...Diaz is 20-for-42 (.476) with 2 2B, 3 HR and 10 RBI over an 11-game hitting streak vs. Baltimore.

**DOWN ON THE FARM**—Double-A Montgomery won Game 1 of its Southern League Championship Series at Birmingham (CWS) Sunday, 2-1, thanks to 2nd-inning RBI by **3B Brayden Taylor** and LF **Noah Myers** and a six-inning effort by **RHP Ty Johnson** (W, 6.0IP, 4H, ER, BB, 5SO, HR) in his Double-A postseason debut...the Biscuits and Barons reconvene tonight for Game 2 at 7:35 p.m. at Montgomery Riverwalk Stadium, with **RHP Brody Hopkins** earning the starting nod...in the midst of their 10th consecutive postseason appearance and second straight championship series appearance, the Biscuits are one win away from their first league title since 2007 and fourth as a Rays affiliate (also: 2006, 1999).

- ✦ Four Biscuits were named SL postseason All-Stars by MiLB: Hopkins, Johnson, OF **Homeer Bush Jr.** and C **Tatem Levins**...Johnson was also tabbed as SL Pitcher of the Year, the first Biscuit to earn the honor since **Chris Mason** in 2007.

**TONIGHT'S START**—Ryan Pepiot (PEP-ee-oh) will make his career-high 31st start of the season and fourth against Baltimore this evening...marks his 74th career appearance (67th start) and his sixth start against the Orioles...the Rays have won three of four and five of his last seven starts...leads the club in wins (11), starts (T1st, 30), quality starts (14) and innings pitched (164.2) and ranks second in strikeouts (164)...acquired from the Dodgers along with **OF Jonny DeLuca** for **RHP Tyler Glasnow**, **OF Manuel Margot** and cash considerations, Dec. 16, 2023.

**LAST TIME OUT**—Suffered his 11th loss of the season on Sept. 16 vs. TOR after going 1.2 innings and allowing four runs on four hits and three walks with three strikeouts...**Addison Barger** plated a run with an RBI-single in the 1st inning before Pepiot ended the inning with a strikeout...the 2nd inning he opened with three walks before a strikeout-single-strikeout-single sequence ended his day early...it was tied for his shortest start of the season (also: June 26 at BAL) and only his second of 3.2 innings or fewer in 2025...marked the first runs he had allowed since Aug. 17 at SF, snapping a 15.0 scoreless inning streak (Aug. 24–Sept. 4).

**TAMPA BAY & OLD BAY**—Pepiot is set for his sixth career start and fourth of the season against the Orioles...marks the first time in his career he has made four starts in a single season against any single opponent...in his career, he has posted a 2-2 record, 5.00 ERA (27.0IP, 15ER) and 33 strikeouts to seven walks...this season he has gone 1-1 with a 5.74 ERA (15.2IP, 10ER) and a .254 (15-for-59) opp. average...threw a career-high 8.0 innings on June 16 at Steinbrenner and set a season-high 11 strikeouts in the effort...in two previous trips to Camden Yards, he is 1-0 with a 6.43 ERA (7.0IP, 5ER).

- ★ Pepiot is 2-9 with a 5.92 ERA (62.1IP, 41ER) in 12 starts vs. AL East opponents this season, with the Rays going 2-10 in those games, including five straight losses...in 18 starts outside the division, he has gone 9-2 with a 2.46 ERA (102.1IP, 28ER) and the Rays going 11-7.

**I WANNA FLY AWAY**—Pepiot has made 14 starts away from Steinbrenner Field this season, going 4-6 with a 4.20 ERA (75.0IP, 35ER) and a .223 (61-for-273) opp. average...the Rays lost nine straight starts from May 2–July 31, but since then have gone 3-1 in his four starts...he has made 11 starts of 5.0 innings or more away from home in 2025 and has allowed four runs or fewer in each...he has suffered six straight losing decisions across his last seven road starts against the AL East.

- ★ He has received three runs of support or fewer in nine of 14 road starts in 2025 and 20 of 30 career road starts.

**PEP IN HIS STEP**—Pepiot threw 5.0 innings or more while yielding one hit or fewer in three consecutive starts (Aug. 24–Sept. 4), tying **SD Dylan Cease** (July 13-25, 2024) for the longest streak in major league history...during that span, allowed no runs over 15.0 innings...opponents were 2-for-45 (.044) with 15 strikeouts against Pepiot during that three-start stretch...he was the fourth pitcher since 1901 to record 15.0 IP or more while allowing two hits or fewer across a three-start span, joining Cease, CWS Chris Sale (April 17–May 27, 2014) and BAL Steve Barber (Sept. 23, 1966–April 16 [G2], 1967).

- ★ During those three starts, opponents were hitless against his changeup (0-for-14) and were limited to a 2-for-22 (.090) clip against his four-seam fastball.

**IRON MAN**—Tonight's outing marks Pepiot's team-leading 31st start of the campaign, most by a Ray since **Zach Eflin** made 31 starts in 2023...he is one of 10 Rays pitcher to record a 30-start season since **Kevin Cash** took the helm in 2015, joining **Drew Rasmussen** (2025), **Shane Baz** (2025), Eflin, **Corey Kluber** (2022), **Charlie Morton** (2019), **Blake Snell** (2018), **Chris Archer** (3x, 2015-17), **Jake Odorizzi** (2016) and **Drew Smyly** (2016)...Pepiot was the fourth Rays pitcher and third traditional starter to make 20 starts before the All-Star break, joining Snell (2018, 20GS), **David Price** (2014, 20GS) and **Ryne Stanek** (2019), who started 25 games as an opener before the break.

- ★ Joined by **Drew Rasmussen** and **Shane Baz**, it marks the eighth time in club history and the first time since 2016 (**Chris Archer**, **Jake Odorizzi** and **Drew Smyly**) the Rays have three pitchers with 30 starts or more.

- ★ Pepiot was the first Rays pitcher to start on Opening Day and in the club's last game before the All-Star break since **Chris Archer** in 2017.

**REVERSE PSYCHOLOGY**—Pepiot has limited left-handed hitters to a .175 (48-for-274) average, the fourth-lowest mark among qualified major league right-handers behind **CLE Gavin Williams** (.158), **LAD Yoshinobu Yamamoto** (.173) and **TOR Kevin Gausman** (.174)...lefties are 2-for-31 (.065) against him over his last four starts and 6-for-56 (.107) across his last seven outings.

- ★ Min. 500 AB, his .188 (130-for-690) opp. average vs. LH batters ranks fourth among active MLB right-handers, trailing **SD Jason Adam** (.166), **NYM Edwin Diaz** (.170) and **HOU Craig Kimbrel** (.179).

**THINK FAST**—Min. 500 swings, Pepiot's 25.6 pct. whiff rate on his four-seam fastball ranks sixth in the AL, trailing **BOS Garrett Crochet** (30.4%), **SEA Bryan Woo** (28.8%), **MIN Joe Ryan** (26.9%), **SEA Luis Castillo** (26.9%) and **CWS Shane Smith** (25.9%)...this includes a 29.1 pct. whiff rate on the offering since the start of June, first in the AL (min. 300 swings), third in the majors over that span behind **PIT Paul Skenes** (29.8%) and **MIL Jacob Misiorowski** (32.1%).

- ★ He has generated 149 whiffs on his four-seamer, fourth most by a Rays right-handed pitcher in the pitch-tracking era (2008–pres.) behind **Jake Odorizzi** (176) in 2017, **Chris Archer** (163) in 2015 and Pepiot's 2024 campaign (155).

**GOTTA BE QUICKER THAN THAT**—Pepiot's five pickoffs are tied with three other pitchers for second most by any right-handed hurler in the majors behind **CHC Colin Rea** (6)...including southpaws, only **NYY Max Fried** (8) has more pickoffs than Pepiot among AL pitchers...it marks the most pickoffs by a Rays pitcher since **Blake Snell** had five in 2019, and the last Ray with more was **James Shields** (13) in 2011...Pepiot is one of four Rays right-handers (6x) to record four pickoffs (or more) in a season, joining Shields in 2011 and 2006 (4), **Alex Cobb** in 2017 (5) and **Gerami Gonzalez** in 2003 (5).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER: RHP SHANE BAZ (10-12, 4.99)
