METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets enjoyed a day off on Monday...Today begins a stretch of 13 straight games for New York...On Sunday, the Mets fell to the Rays, 9-0...It was the first time this year the Mets were swept this year...The Mets have lost three straight after winning six straight...Today, the Mets begin a six-game road trip to Atlanta (three games) and Philadelphia (three games).

LET'S NOT GO STREAKING: The Mets were swept for the first time this season...They had not been swept in their first 22 series of the season...It was just the fifth time in franchise history the Mets have opened a season with 22 consecutive series of two or more games without being swept joining the '91 team (29), the '06 team (25), the '86 team (25) and the '82 team (22)...They were last swept by the Mariners from August 9-11, 2024 at T-Mobile Park...They had gone 36 straight series of two or more games without being swept since August 13, 2024...It was the third-longest such streak in franchise history (longest: 53, 5/15/87 - 5/11/88 and 38, 8/29/85 - 7/6/86)...The Mets have lost a season-high three straight games for just the second time this season (also: 5/18-20).

UPCOMING MILESTONES: Juan Soto is three hits away from 1,000 for his career...Francisco Lindor is two steals away from 200 career SB and one steal away from 100 as a Met...He would become the 12th Met to reach 100 stolen bases and the sixth Met to record at least 100 homers and 100 steals with the team (also: Darryl Strawberry, David Wright, Howard Johnson, Carlos Beltrán and José Reyes).

A MINOR THING: Yesterday, INF/OF Jett Williams was named the Eastern League Player of the Week and RHP Brendan Girtón was named the South Atlantic Pitcher of the Week for the week of June 9-15...Williams, who ranks as the Mets' No. 1 prospect and *MLB Pipeline's* No. 48 overall prospect, produced a .385 AVG (10-for-26), .467 OBP, .962 SLG, and 1.428 OPS in six games against the Richmond Flying Squirrels...The 21-year-old hit two home runs and recorded five runs batted in, eight runs scored, three triples, three doubles, eight extra-base hits, four walks, and a stolen base in the series...Girtón fired 5.0 perfect innings and struck out six in High-A Brooklyn's 1-0 victory over Asheville on June 14...The Mets' 10th round selection of the 2024 First Year Player Draft, Girtón has gone 3-1 with a 2.91 ERA (15 ER/46.1 IP) and 55 strikeouts over 12 outing (9 starts) with the Cyclones.

WE ARE THE CHAMPIONS: Congrats to the St. Lucie Mets who are playoff bound after they beat the Daytona Tortugas, 7-5, on Sunday evening...They clinched the Florida State League East division first half title...It's the first division title for the Mets since the first half of the 2022 season...The Mets will be one of four teams in the FSL playoffs come September and will be seeking their seventh league title...They are looking for their first title since 2022.

ON THE RECORD: The Mets own a 45-27 record this season...That is the best record in the National League...Only the Tigers have more wins in the majors...Their record through 72 games is tied for the third-best start in franchise history with the 2006 team...Only the 1986 (51-21), 2022 (46-26) and 1988 (46-26) teams had a better season-opening record.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: New York is 18-17 (.514) on the road compared to 27-10 at Citi Field in 2025...The Mets have won three straight on the road, four of their last five and six of their last eight on the road...The Mets have posted an MLB-best 3.11 ERA on the road this year.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets are 26-38 at Truist Park since the facility opened in 2017.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Over the last eight games, Brandon Nimmo is batting .353 (12-34) with seven runs, one double, three homers, seven RBI, three walks, two steals with a 1.052 OPS...He is slashing .286/355/536 (16-56) with four homers and 10 RBI in 14 games this month...In 15 games when batting in the two-spot, Nimmo is hitting .364/435/636 with three doubles, four homers, 10 RBI, six walks and two steals.

THE DAVID: In his last start, June 11 vs. Washington, David Peterson tossed a complete game shutout, the first of his career...It was the first complete game shutout by a Met since Luis Severino (8/17/24 vs. MIA) and the first such start by a Mets left-handed pitcher since Steven Matz's complete game shutout vs. Pittsburgh on July 27, 2019...The southpaw has not allowed a run over his last 13.0 innings, the longest scoreless streak of his career.

JUAN OF A KIND: In 14 games this month, Juan Soto is batting .319/508/638 with 15 runs, three doubles, four home runs, nine RBI, 17 walks and one steal...He has recorded a major league-leading 60 walks...His 60 walks through the team's first 72 games are the most in franchise history...John Olerud owns the single-season franchise record with 125 walks in 1999...Soto has recorded at least 125 walks in a season four times in his career (145 in 2021, 135 in 2022, 132 in 2023 and 129 in 2024)...The lefty is a perfect 8-8 in stolen base attempts this season...Has surpassed his total from last season (157 games).

LUCKY LINDOR: The Mets have won the last 27 games in which Francisco Lindor has homered...The streak that goes back to July 9, 2024 is the longest streak in team history...Prior to Lindor's streak, the longest was 21 straight wins when George Foster homered between July 3, 1985, and June 29, 1986...Carl Furillo (29, 1951-53) holds the record...Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Francisco Lindor has hit eight lead-off homers as a member of the Mets...That is tied with Tommie Agee and Lenny Dykstra for fourth-most in team history...Brandon Nimmo is third with 13 leadoff homers...Curtis Granderson and José Reyes are tied atop the franchise leaderboard with 21 leadoff dingers.

STEAL THIS BASE OR DON'T: Mets runners have now recorded an 86.8 (59-68) stolen base percentage this season which is the best in the majors...The Mets are one of seven teams in the majors to have four players with eight or more stolen bases this season (Lindor, Soto, Acuña, Taylor)...Mets catchers have combined to throw out 41.2% of potential base stealers this year (21-51), the best mark in the majors.

LAST TIME OUT: On June 11 vs. the Nationals, tossed a complete game shutout for the first time in his career and a complete game for the second time (also: 5.0 IP on April 18, 2023 vs. Atlanta)...He threw 106 pitches, his most in a game since September 28, 2023 vs. MIA (career-high 113 pitches)...Extended his scoreless inning streak to a career-high 13.0 IP (previous: 10.2 IP from 5/24-30/25)...Was the first Met to throw a shutout since Luis Severino on August 17, 2024 vs. MIA...He is the first franchise left-handed pitcher to throw a shutout since Steven Matz (7/27/19 vs. PIT)...Became the fourth pitcher in the majors this season to throw a 9.0+ IP complete game shutout without allowing a walk, and the first Met to do so since Jacob deGrom (4/23/21 vs. WAS)...He became the 63rd pitcher in franchise history to record a shutout without allowing a walk.

ON A ROLL: Over 13 starts this season, has gone 5-2 with a 2.49 ERA (22 ER/79.2 IP), 25 walks and 71 strikeouts...Has pitched 5.0 innings or more in 11 straight starts, the longest such streak of his career...He has allowed three earned runs or less in each of his 13 starts this season and in each of his last 14 starts dating back to September 29, 2024...His 14 such games are the longest streak of his career...Among qualified Major League pitchers this season, his 0.34 HR/9.0 IP ratio is third (first in NL), his 56.4 groundball percentage is the fourth-highest (second in NL) and his ERA is 10th-best (third in NL)...The Mets are 9-4 in his starts this season.

YEAR IN REVIEW: Since making his season debut last year on May 29, 2024, Peterson has allowed three runs or fewer in 29 of his 34 starts, going 15-5 with a 2.74 ERA (61 ER/200.2 IP), 71 walks and 172 strikeouts...20 of those outings have been quality starts...The Mets are 24-10 over that span...Since 2024, has allowed just four runs in the first inning, which is the second fewest in the majors during that span, trailing only Reese Olson's two runs (min. 30 G)...Since May 29, 2024 (min. 30 GS), he is first in HR/9.0 IP (0.54), sixth in groundball percentage (52.9, fourth in NL), seventh in opponents' SLG (third in NL), and eighth in ERA (fourth in NL).

ROAD WARRIOR: Has made five road outings this season, each being quality starts...He has combined to go 1-2 with a 2.90 ERA (10 ER/31.0 IP), 13 walks and 30 strikeouts in those four starts...In 17 road starts since his start to the 2024 season, Peterson has gone 7-3 with a 2.69 ERA (31 ER/103.2 IP), 39 walks and 80 strikeouts...He has recorded quality starts in 13 of those games, including 10 of his last 12 (since August 3, 2024)...Allowed two runs or less in 14 of those 17 road outings.

VS. BRAVES/NATIONAL LEAGUE: Will be making his 12th career appearance (11th start) against the Braves tonight and has gone 3-5 with a 5.33 ERA (30 ER/50.2 IP) and a 11.37 K/9.0 IP (64K/ 50.2 IP) in those games...Has made three appearances vs. division opponents this season, posting a 1.77 ERA (4 ER/20.1 IP)...The Mets are 3-0 when Peterson has faced an NL East team this year and are 8-2 this year when he has started against a National League team.

TO THE LEFT TO THE LEFT: This season, Peterson has held lefties to a .200 batting average (15-75)...Among qualified southpaws facing left-handed hitters this season, is third in groundball percentage (67.5, third in NL), tied for seventh in strikeouts (21, fourth in NL), eighth in opponents' SLG (.230, fifth in NL) and ninth in opponents' BA (fifth in NL) and opponents' OPS (.483, sixth in NL)...In his career, he has posted a .227 opponents' batting average against lefties (109-480).

ELECTRIC SLIDE: David Peterson has used his slider 20.7% of the time this season...Of his 71 strikeouts, 38 have come using this pitch...Has recorded a 33.9% put away rate and a 36.6% whiff rate with the pitch this season, both rates the highest among pitches in his arsenal.

QUALITY CONTROL: Has recorded eight quality starts in 13 total outings this season, including six of his last seven starts...Had four consecutive quality starts from May 6-24, which was the second-longest such streak of his career (longest: five quality starts from 8/14-9/3/24)...Peterson has recorded 20 quality starts since his start to last season (5/29/24), with 18 of them coming in his last 29 games (since July 1)...From July 1, 2024 to now, he is one of 12 pitchers (one of six in NL) to record at least 18 quality starts.

SOUTHPAW STATS: Has recorded 535 career strikeouts, the 11th-most by a left-handed pitcher in franchise history...Steven Matz is 10th on the list with 552...Reached 500.0 career innings pitched on May 18, becoming one of 18 left-handed pitchers to reach the milestone with the franchise...He also became the 13th Mets southpaw to reach 500 strikeouts on May 6 and was the first to do so since Steven Matz (recorded his 500th strikeout on 9/11/19).

APPLE PICKING: This season, Peterson has recorded a net bases prevented of five (a sum of advances prevented and outs added assigned to the pitcher) according to Baseball Savant...He is tied with teammate Griffin Canning for the most in the majors...Since his Major League debut in 2020, his 29 net bases prevented is the most among Major League pitchers...José Berríos and Griffin Canning are next on the list with

21...Peterson has recorded 16 career pickoffs (one this season), tied with Bobby Ojeda for the eighth-most by a Mets pitcher...He trails only Ron Darling (41), Jerry Koosman (36), Dwight Gooden (32), Al Leiter (28), Jon Matlack (24), Mike Scott (20), Sid Fernandez (18)...Courtesy of *OPTA*.

CAREER NOTES: Made his third career Opening Day roster (also: 2021 and 2023)...Started the 2024 season on the 60-day Injured List after undergoing left hip surgery in the offseason...With a 2.90 ERA (39 ER/121.0 IP) last season, Peterson became the 10th left-hander in franchise history to record an ERA of 3.00-or-under while making at least 20 starts and was the first to accomplish the feat since Johan Santana's 2.98 ERA (66 ER/199.0 IP) over 29 starts in 2010...Over parts of five major league seasons with the Mets, the southpaw has gone 33-26 with a 3.85 ERA (247 ER/533.2 IP), 222 walks and 535 strikeouts in 114 games (98 starts)...Was drafted by the Mets in the first round (20th overall) of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Oregon.
