TONIGHT'S GAME:

- Is Game 2 (1-0) of a 3-game series vs **Noah Scott's Angels** and the second game (1-0) of a 10-day, 9-game road trip that includes upcoming series at **AZ** (Fri-Sun) and **LAD** (8/25-8/27).
- Is the first of 2 consecutive trips out west (at **SD**, **A's** and **StL** next month).
- The Reds enter this road trip having lost 8 of their last 14 road series.
- The Redlegs are coming off a 3-3 homestand vs **Phi** (2-1) and **Mil** (1-2).
- Return home for a 10-day, 9-game homestand 8/29-9/7 (3g vs **StL**, 3g vs **Tor**, 3g vs **NYM**).

NO ROOM FOR THE BROOM: The Reds have not been swept in any of their 42 series dating back to last year and including all 41 series this year, including this one vs **LAA** (1-0).

- Haven't been swept in a series of at least 2 games since 9/24-9/25, 2024 at **Cle** (2g), a span of 42 straight series...per *Elias*, that ranks as the fourth-longest streak of sweepless series in team history (see below).
- This 41-series, *in-season* streak without being swept is the longest run in club history, eclipsing the 1970 National League championship team, which opened its season with 32 straight series without getting swept.
- Cin is the only Major League team not to have been swept this season.
- On 7 occasions during this streak, avoided being swept with a win in the final game of a series (4/23 at **Mia**, 5/15 vs **CWS**, 6/22 at **StL**, 7/2 at **Bos**, 7/23 at **Wsh**, 7/30 vs **LAD**), 8/17 vs **Mil**.

SEVEN OVER?: The Reds tonight have a chance to go 7 games over .500 for the first time this season and for the first time since entering the 8/4/23 game vs **Wsh** at 59-52...Cin is 0-3 this season when attempting to reach 7 over.

WELL ISN'T THAT ODD?: Despite a winning record (66-60) and having not been swept in a series this season, the Reds have lost more series this year than they've won (17-20-3)...no team has ever finished a season with a winning record, lost more series than they won, and avoided being swept (*Elias*).

WREAKING HAVOC IN THE FIRST: The Reds rank seventh in the majors with 80 runs in the 1st inning this season.

- Cin has outscored opponents 80-52 in the 1st inning and are slashing .272/.339/.402 with 13 home runs.
- Have plated multiple runs in the opening frame of a game 21 times this season, including last night at **LAA** (2r)...those 21-such instances are tied with the **Angels** and **Tigers** for fifth-most among all Major League teams, behind the **Athletics** (24g), **Dodgers** (23g), **Yankees** (23g), and **Red Sox** (23g).

SERIES NOTES:

- The Redlegs are 13-10 all-time vs the **Angels**, including 8-3 at **Great American Ball Park** and 5-7 here at **Angel Stadium of Anaheim**.
- The Reds have won 9 straight games vs **LAA** dating back to 8/5/19, matching their longest winning streak ever vs an AL opponent (vs **Hou**).
- In 2013 the Reds and **Angels** played the first interleague **Opening Day** game in Major League history, a 3-1 Angels win in 13 innings in which the teams established the modern Major League record for strikeouts by both teams in a season-opener (Cin pitchers 17, **LAA** pitchers 13).
- OF Mike Trout** led off the 2015 All-Star Game at **GABP** with a home run off **RHP Zack Greinke** and became the first player ever to win the ASG's MVP award in consecutive years.

TOUGH ROAD AHEAD: Following the All-Star break, the Reds have played/will play **35** of their final **65** games against opponents with records at or above .500 (2-1 at **NYM**, 3-0 vs **TB**, 1-2 vs **LAD**, 2-1 at **Chc**, 2-1 vs **Phi**, 1-2 vs **Mil**, 3g at **LAD**, 3g vs **Tor**, 3g vs **NYM**, 3g at **SD**, 4g at **Chc**, 3g at **Mil**).

- As of today, the Reds have the second-toughest remaining schedule in the majors, based on opponents' winning percentage (.522; **AZ** .538).
- NYM** has the 13th-toughest remaining schedule (.507) while **Chc** (.476), **LAD** (.466) and **SD** (.464) have the easiest remaining schedules.

NOELVI'S JUST RIGHT: RF **Noelvi Marte** made his first 2 apps in RF on 7/20 & 7/22 and has played exclusively at that position beginning 7/29 (18g, 16gs) .

- In 18 games beginning 7/29, is slashing .343/.343/.557 with 3 HR, 6 2B, 10 RBI and 24 times on base.
- Has hit safely in each of his last 9 games (17-for-39, .436, 2hr, 9rbi).
- His .591 slugging pct. vs right-handed pitching this season ranks third among right-handed hitters (min. 100ab vs RHP)...only **NYY's Aaron Judge** (.659) and **Giancarlo Stanton** (.614) have higher marks.
- From 8/9-8/13 collected 5 doubles over 5 games to become the fifth Reds batter since 1900 to produce at least 5 doubles over any 5-game span at age 23 or younger...he joined **George Foster** (1971), **Bobby Tolan** (1969), **Vada Pinson** (several times from 1959-60), and **Frank Robinson** (1956) as the only Cin batters to accomplish that feat before turning 24 (*courtesy Elias*).

TRIPLE SHOT: **Austin Hays**, **Elly De La Cruz**, and **Ke'Bryan Hayes** last night combined to give the Reds 3 triples in a game for the first time since 7/13/19 when the team produced 5 triples in its 17-9 win at **Col** (**Nick Senzel** 2, **Phillip Ervin**, **José Peraza**, **Eugenio Suárez**).

LOS ANGELES NATIVE: The Los Angeles native tonight is making his first career appearance vs the Angels.

- LAST TIME OUT:** Was activated from the injured list on 8/13 and that night made his first app since 6/3...earned the 8-0 win vs Phi (6.Oip, 3h, 0r, 6k, 85TP).
- Was his sixth quality start of the season, the 35th of his career.
 - Became just the second Reds pitcher over the last 125 years with as many as 79 strikeouts and 14 walks or fewer through his first 12 starts of a season (also: Johnny Cueto, 82k, 14bb in 2015).
 - Was the third time this season he allowed as few as 3 baserunners in an appearance (also: 5/7 at Atl, 2 baserunners & 4/13 vs Pit, 3 baserunners).

- INJURED LIST:** Was placed on the 15-day IL on 6/4 with a right groin strain...activated on 8/13.
- Made 4 rehabilitation appearances with R-ACL Reds (1g, 2ip) and AAA-Louisville (3g, 11ip) where he pitched to a 6.23 ERA over 13.0 innings (10h, 11r/9er, 5bb, 24k, 4hr).

- JUNE 3 vs MIL - INJURED:** Did not factor in the 4-2 win vs Mil on 6/3 (5.0ip, 5h, 2r/2er, 3bb, 7k, 1hr, 85TP)...in the 5th inning felt discomfort in his right groin area and didn't return in the 6th after 85 total pitches...was placed on the 15-day injured list the following day (right groin strain)...was the same injury that landed him on the IL from 5/8-5/23 and caused him to miss 2 starts.
- Threw first-pitch strikes to all 23 batters he faced...was the first time in his career that he produced an outing with a 100% first-pitch strike pct...was the first Major League pitcher to face at least 23 batters and throw first-pitch strikes to all of them since Det's Michael Fulmer on 4/12/17 vs Min (also 23-for-23).
 - Allowed 2 runs or fewer for the fifth straight start, and for the ninth time over his previous 11 starts.

- LAST TIME OUT:** Did not factor in the decision in the 10-8 loss vs Mil on 8/15 (2.2ip, 9h, 6r/5er, 0bb, 1k, 2hr, 63TP).
- Was his shortest start since 6/19 vs Min (2.2ip).
 - Was staked to an 8-1 lead...gave up 5 runs in the 3rd inning before he was replaced by Brent Suter.

- AUGUST 9:** Earned the 2-1 win at Pit on 8/9 (7.0ip, 4h, 1r/1er, 2bb, 4k, 94TP).
- Was his 10th quality start of the season, the 48th of his career.
 - Reached 7.0 innings pitched for the fourth time this season, the first since his no-hit bid on 6/27 vs SD (8.0ip).

- AUGUST 4:** Relieved Nick Lodolo in the 3-2 win on 8/4 at Chc (2.1ip, 2h, 2r/2er, 1hr, 33TP).
- Was his third relief appearance of the season, his first since 6/23 vs NYY...was his first relief app since moving to the bullpen following the acquisition of starter Zack Littell at the trade deadline.
 - Was his longest relief outing since 7/30/24 vs Chc (4.0ip).
