The Mariners and Angels meet for second of 4 series this season...the Mariners swept the Angels in 2 games from April 29-30 in Seattle...the M's and Halos final two series will be 4-game affairs, with the next scheduled for July 24-27 in Anaheim.

TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 6-game road trip tonight with the last of 3 games at the Los Angeles Angels (0-2)...Seattle will also see the Arizona Diamondbacks for 3 games on the trip...the Mariners are coming off a 9-game homestand against the Washington Nationals (1-2), Minnesota Twins (2-1) and Baltimore Orioles (0-3)...today's game will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call and **Brad Adam** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners dropped last night's game to the Angels by a 8-6 score...Seattle has dropped a season-high 5 in a row...Seattle is 16-17 at home and 16-14 on the road this season...the Mariners are 15-8 in day games and 17-23 at night.

- **Joy Division** - Seattle is 14-10 (.583) against the American League West this season.
- **Hold 'Em** - The Mariners are 24-1 when leading after 7 innings, and 27-1 when leading after 8 innings this season.
- **What A Homer** - Seattle is 30-16 (.652) when hitting a home run this season, and 2-15 (.118) when being held without a homer.
- **Length** - The Mariners are 20-7 (.741) when their starting pitcher goes 6.0+ innings this season.
- **Strive For Five** - Seattle is 22-6 (.786) when scoring 5+ runs in a game, and 10-25 (.286) when scoring 4-or-fewer runs.
- **A Young Man's Game** - INF **Cole Young** registered his first career double, and first multi-hit game last night, going 2-for-4.

MARINERS.COM/VOTE...voting for the 95th MLB All-Star Game, set for Atlanta on July 15, is officially underway...fan voting is split into two phases with phase 1 running until June 26, with fans allowed to submit up to 5 votes per day during phase 1...after phase 1 is completed, the top 2 vote getters at each position (top 6 outfielders) will face off head-to-head in phase 2 of voting, which will determine who will start the All-Star Game, phase 2 of voting will run from June 30-July 2...the overall leading vote getter in each league will skip phase 2 and receive an automatic starting assignment...the All-Star starters will be announced on ESPN on July 2 and full rosters on July 6...vote for Mariners at **Mariners.com/Vote**.

CAL RALEIGH, YOU ARE UNBELIEVABLE...catcher **Cal Raleigh** went 2-for-5 with 2 home runs and 4 RBI last night, his 5th multi-homer game and his 25th and 26th home runs of the year, both of which lead the Majors...the 28-year-old backstop is batting .272 (63x232) with 44 runs, 11 doubles, 26 home runs, 53 RBI, 38 walks and 7 stolen bases, with a .380 on-base percentage, .655 slugging percentage and 1.035 OPS...he leads MLB catchers in virtually every offensive statistical category, and overall in the Majors ranks 1st in home runs, T-10th in walks, 2nd in slugging percentage, 2nd in OPS, 2nd in extra-base hits (37), 3rd in total bases (152), 5th in RBI, 2nd in fWAR (4.2) and 3rd in wRC+ (192)...Cal has appeared in all 63 of the Mariners games this season.

MULTI-HOMER MADNESS...Cal Raleigh recorded his 15th career multi-homer game last night and his 5th of the 2025 season...he has hit multiple homers on April 16 at CIN (one from both sides of the plate), May 2 at TEX (2 left-handed), May 27 vs. WSH (2 right-handed), May 30 vs. MIN (2 left-handed) and June 7 at LAA (2 left-handed)...Cal is tied with Alex Rodriguez for the 4th-most multi-homer games in Mariners history, trailing Ken Griffey Jr. (40), Edgar Martinez (22) and Jay Buhner (22) and is tied with Shohei Ohtani-LAA/LAD for the 3rd-most multi-homer games since 2022, trailing only Kyle Schwarber-PHI (18) and Aaron Judge-NYY (26).

JULIO: 90/90...Julio Rodriguez went 2-for-2 with a run scored and a stolen base last night, his 11th stolen base of the season...J-Rod has 90 career home runs and 97 career stolen bases since making his Major League debut in 2022...Julio is 1 of 4 players in MLB history with 90+ HR and 90+ SB through his first 4 seasons (2022-c), along with Bobby Bonds (100 HR, 135 SB) from 1968-71, Darryl Strawberry (108 HR, 100 SB) from 1983-86, and Mike Trout (98 HR, 102 SB) from 2011-14.

SEÑOR SMOKE...right-hander **Andrés Muñoz** is 2-0 with a 1.40 ERA (4 ER, 25.2 IP) with 9 walks (2 intentional), 33 strikeouts and a 0.857 WHIP, holding opponents to a .149 batting average...the March/April AL Reliever of the month set the Mariners record for most innings pitched (23.2) to begin a season without allowing an earned run...Muñoz ranks T-4th in saves (17) in MLB and T-2nd in the AL with Josh Hader-HOU, trailing only Carlos Estévez-KC (18).

PEN PALS...since being reinstated from the Injured List, **Matt Brash** also has a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 9.1 IP) with 10 strikeouts and 4 walks...left-hander **Gabe Speier** is 2-0 with a 2.22 ERA (6 ER, 24.1 IP) with 37 strikeouts and 5 walks, ranking 6th in the Majors (min. 20.0 IP) among with 13.7 K/9...righty **Eduard Bazarido**, who went 2.0 innings with 4 strikeouts and struck out the side in-order on Friday, has a 1.93 ERA (3 ER, 14.0 IP) with 15 strikeouts and 5 walks across his last 11 appearances (5/7-c).

JP3...over his last 14 games (5/23-c), shortstop **J.P. Crawford** is batting .360 (18x50) with 6 runs, 4 doubles, 1 home run, 5 RBI and 7 walks, getting on base at a .439 clip with a .939 OPS...Crawford has reached base in 8 consecutive games, and multiple times in 7 of his last 8.

#51...The Mariners announced Hall of Famer **Randy Johnson's** number 51 will be retired by the club during the 2026 season (exact date TBD)...Johnson's #51 will be the 5th number retired by the Mariners, joining **Ken Griffey Jr.** (#24), **Edgar Martinez** (#11), **Ichiro Suzuki** (#51) and Jackie Robinson (#42, retired by all MLB teams)...Johnson is the 13th player to have his number retired by multiple MLB franchises, while #51 is the eighth number to be retired by the same club for multiple players.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...Cal Raleigh has shown unprecedented power from the catcher position, leading the Majors with 26 home runs and trailing only Johnny Bench (28 HR in 1970) by a catcher before the All-Star Break, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that there have only been 3 seasons where a catcher has hit 20+ home runs and stolen at least 5 bases before the All-Star Break, with Cal having two of them?...Cal has achieved that feat in back-to-back seasons (20 HR, 5 SB in 2024) while Hall of Famer Carlton Fisk (1985) is the only other catcher in MLB history with 20+ HR and 5+ SB in the first half...Cal (26 HR, 7 SB) is already the only catcher in MLB history with 25+ home runs and 5+ SB in the first half.

ABOUT GEORGE KIRBY...

- 27-year-old right-hander is making his 4th start of the season...he is also making his 93rd career start and 9th against the Angels.
- Is in his 4th season with Seattle; selected by the Mariners in the first round (20th overall) of the 2019 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Ty Holub.
- Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2023.
- Named AL Rookie of the Month in August 2022 after posting a 2.15 ERA and 5-0 record.
- Is the highest drafted player out of Elon University.

LAST TIME OUT...L#3 on June 3 against the Baltimore Orioles in his 3rd start of the season, allowing 2 runs on 8 hits with 1 walk and 3 strikeouts across 5.0 innings pitched...has allowed 2-or-fewer walks in 67 consecutive games since April 3, 2023.

IN HIS OWN WORDS

"I feel great right now. ... Just glad I pitched a little better today," he said. "I was able to limit some of those hits early on. Heater felt good; off-speed felt great. Yeah, glad to see another day."

CALIFORNIA LOVE...owns a 3-2 record and 3.56 ERA (12 ER, 30.1 IP) across 5 career starts at Angel Stadium, allowing a combined 21 hits, 4 home runs, 5 walks, and 29 strikeouts...owns a 8-3 record with a 4.28 ERA (32 ER, 67.1 IP) across 12 career starts in California ballparks (has only pitched at Oakland Coliseum, Angel Stadium, and Petco Park).

VS. AL WEST...owns a 19-5 record and 2.73 ERA (58 ER, 191.0 IP) across 33 career starts against AL West rivals...has allowed 168 hits, 12 home runs, 24 walks and has struck out 182 batters...of pitchers with min. 30 career starts against the AL West, his 2.73 ERA ranks 6th all-time while his 24 walks are the fewest all-time, ahead of Jose Urquidy-HOU (39 BB).

LOW, LOW, LOW...among active starting pitchers with min. 500 innings pitched since 2022, Kirby leads the Majors in fewest walks allowed (68), K/BB (7.28), BB/9 (1.16), and BB% (3.2).

13 IN A ROW...has collected a decision in each of his last 13 consecutive starts (8/7/24-c), including 10 consecutive decisions to end his 2024 season...his current 13-game streak is the longest by a Mariners pitcher since **Luis Castillo** recorded 14 consecutive decisions from Sept. 7, 2023-May 12, 2024...his 10 straight decisions to end the 2024 season marked the longest streak by a Mariners pitcher at the end of a season since Charie Furbush recorded 10 in a row from Aug. 3-Sept. 25, 2011.

SUMMER IS HERE...holds a 5-6 record with a 3.35 ERA (32 ER, 86.0 IP) across 15 career starts in the month of June, allowing 90 hits, 14 home runs, and 9 walks across those starts...his 9 total walks and 8.44 SO/BB in the month of June each are franchise best marks by a pitcher (min. 15 career starts).

NO FREE PASSES HERE...has allowed 2-or-fewer walks in 90 of his 92 career starts, and has done so in all 67 starts since his 2023 season which is the longest active streak among ML starting pitchers, ahead of teammtte **Bryan Woo's** 34-game streak (5/10-24-c)...Kirby's 67 consecutive games with 2-or-fewer walks is the 3rd longest streak of all-time by a starting pithcer, behind Carlos Silva's 99-game streak from Aug. 2, 2003-May 10, 2007 and Cy Young's 85-game streak from May 17, 1904-July 2, 1906.

ROAD TO 500 K'S...is 5 strikeouts shy of 500 career strikeouts...if he collects 5 more strikeouts in his next start, he would join James Paxton (563), Félix Hernández (539), **Logan Gilbert** (526), and Erik Hanson (503) as the only pitchers in Mariners history to collect 500+ strikeouts in their first 93 career starts.

2024 TOTALS...went 14-11 with a 3.53 ERA (75 ER, 191 IP), 23 walks and 179 strikeouts last season...limited opponents to a .245 batting average with a 1.068 WHIP across a career-high 33 starts, and set career-high marks in wins (14), innings pitched (191.0) and strikeouts (179).

KING GEORGE...led the Majors in SO/BB ratio (7.78) for the 2nd straight season, becoming the 1st pitcher to do that since Cliff Lee in 2012-13...Kirby also led the Majors in fewest walks-per-9 innings (1.1) for the 2nd straight season, also the first to do that since Lee in 2012-13.

QUALITY STUFF...recorded 20 quality starts for the 2nd consecutive season, becoming 1 of 3 pitchers in MLB with 20+ starts in each of the last 2 years (also: Logan Webb-SF and Zack Wheeler-PHI)...Kirby is 1 of 8 pitchers to record multiple 20+ quality start seasons with Seattle, joining Felix Hernandez (7x), Jamie Moyer (5x), Randy Johnson (4x), Mark Langston (3x), Mike Moore (3x), Erik Hanson (2x) and Jason Vargas (2x).

MORE QUALITY STUFF...recorded 9 consecutive quality starts from June 9-July 26, 2024, marking the longest quality start streak of his career and 4th-longest in MLB...he has completed 6.0 innings in 56 of his 91 career starts and 22 games in his 33 starts in 2024...last season, the Mariners went 14-8 in games that Kirby pitched 6.0+ innings, compared to their 2-9 record when he went less than 6.0 innings.

GOING ON STRIKE...began his outing on 8/24/22 vs. Washington by throwing 24-consecutive strikes, the most to start a game since the pitch tracking era (1988-current), passing the 21 thrown by Joe Musgrove on 8/30/18 vs. STL with PIT.
