## SNAKEBITES

**THE NL CHAMPS:** Last season, the D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23).

**LAST GAME:** The D-backs won, 6-4, vs. Tigers.

- ◆ **Jordan Montgomery** did not figure in the win, working 6.0 frames and allowing 4 runs (5 H, 2 BB, 3 K).
- ◆ **Joc Pederson** went 3-for-3 with 2 RBI on a first-inning RBI double and second-inning RBI single.
- ◆ **Ketel Marte** had 2 singles and a walk.
- ◆ **Christian Walker** had 2 RBI on a pair of sac flies.
- ◆ **Ryan Thompson** allowed an inherited runner, the game-tying run, to score but got the win with 2.0 scoreless innings (3 H, 3 K).
- ◆ **Paul Sewald** got his third save with a perfect ninth.

**SOLID CROWDS:** Saturday's crowd of 35,826 fans for Mexican Heritage Night highlighted the 87,859 fans during the Tigers series and the 6-game homestand's 142,770 fans, an average of 23,795 per game, for the Reds & Tigers series.

◆ The D-backs, who are averaging 30,315 per home game, are 1 of 13 teams averaging 30,000+ at home.

**JOE GETS THE NOD:** **Joe Mantiplly** is making his fourth career "opener" start...in 3 such starts last season - Aug. 15 @ Rockies, Aug. 21 vs. Rangers and Sept. 10 @ Cubs - had a 3.00 ERA (1 ER in 3.0 IP) and .240 opponent average (3-for-12) with 0 walks and 0 strikeouts.

◆ Has held the Dodgers scoreless in 16 of his last 18 games, since June 20, 2021, for a 1.26 ERA (2 ER in 14.1 IP)...included a 16-game scoreless streak June 20, 2021-August 8, 2023...has held the Dodgers scoreless in 18 of 23 career games.

**NO LONGBALLS FOR JOE:** **Joe Mantiplly's** 38.2-inning homerless streak, since August 8, 2023 (Top 5), is the sixth-longest active streak in the Majors...Reese Olson/DET has the longest active streak (53.0 IP).

◆ Has held his last 159 batters faced homerless (41 G, 3 GS) since August 8 last season...is 1 of 2 pitchers (min. 30 G, max. 5 GS) during that stretch to not allow a home run along with Cionel Pérez (103 BF/33 G/0 GS).

**18 & COUNTING FOR EL PIKE:** **Ketel Marte's** career-best 18-game hitting streak (previous was 16 games) is the longest active streak in the Majors and tied for the longest streak this season with Alec Bohm/PHI (18)...last season, there were 6 streaks of 18+ games, including a season-high 25-gamer by Marcus Semien/TEX.

• His streak is 1 of 11 by a D-back of 18+ games...his 18-gamer is tied for sixth-longest in club history with Ender Inciarte (2014), Miguel Montero (2011), Justin Upton (2009), Junior Spivey (2002) and Mark Grace (2001)...next up at 19 is Matt Williams (1999), 21 is Danny Bautista (2004), 24 is Tony Womack (2000), 26 is Paul Goldschmidt (2013) and 30 is Luis Gonzalez (1999).

**VS. DODGERS:** **Christian Walker** has reached base safely in 6 straight vs. Dodgers and 17 of his last 21 games.

◆ **Ketel Marte** has reached base safely in 11 of his last 12 games vs. Dodgers since April 2, 2023.

**THREE-BAGGERS:** **Ketel Marte's** sixth-inning triple on Saturday vs. Tigers was his 38th triple as a D-back to give him sole possession of third place in franchise history, passing Tony Womack (37) and trailing only Stephen Drew (52) and David Peralta (46).

**STARTERS STALLING OPPONENTS:** D-backs starting pitchers have allowed 3 or fewer runs in 9 of their last 12 starts, since May 7...of the 36 runs allowed during this stretch, 14 came in 2 outings while the other 10 games have totaled 22 runs.

• When D-backs starters allow 3 or fewer runs, the team is 19-15.

**bWAR(e) OF KETEL:** **Ketel Marte's** 2.6 bWAR is eighth among all players [pitcher or position]...the Top 3 are Mookie Betts/LAD (3.4), Bobby Witt Jr./KC (3.1) and Shohei Ohtani/LAD (3.0).

◆ Marte's 0.9 defensive bWAR is seventh in the Majors...the leaders are Marcus Semien/TEX (1.4) and Daulton Varsho/TOR (1.4).

**THOMPSON KEEPING OPPONENTS QUIET:** **Ryan Thompson** has held opponents scoreless in his last 9 games, spanning 10.1 innings (has allowed 3 of 6 inherited runners to score) and 17 of 19 games overall, allowing 2 runs in 20.0 innings (has allowed 4 of 7 inherited runners to score).

◆ Since his D-backs debut on August 27, 2023, has held opponent scoreless in 29 of 32 games with a 0.82 ERA (3 ER in 33.0 IP), .177 opponent average (20-for-113), 0.70 WHIP, 3 walks and 25 strikeouts...has allowed 6 of 15 inherited runners to score.

• In 13 road games, 11 scoreless, has a 1.32 ERA (2 ER in 13.2 IP), .149 opponent average (7-for-47), 0.59 WHIP, 1 walk and 11 strikeouts...has allowed 2 of 6 inherited runners to score.

**DEFENSE RULES:** The D-backs are 1 of 2 teams with the Cardinals to feature multiple players in the Top 10 among outs above average (OAA) leaders: **Christian Walker** (T-4th, 7) and **Ketel Marte** (T-6th, 6).

◆ Marte (8 DRS) and Walker (7 DRS) are tied for fourth and sixth, respectively, in defensive runs saved (DRS).

◆ The D-backs' 11 DRS are fourth in the NL, behind the Dodgers (35), Braves (16) and Cardinals (16).

## NEXT STARTER: RHP BRANDON PFAADT (1-3, 4.17)

◆ Has 3 straight quality starts, including a 2-1 win most recently on May 15 vs. Reds, allowing 1 run on 2 hits and 2 walks with 9 strikeouts over 7.0 innings.

◆ In his last 6 starts, 5 quality, has a 3.13 ERA (13 ER in 37.1 IP), .213 opponent average (30-for-141), 0.99 WHIP, 7 walks and 34 strikeouts.

◆ Third career start vs. Dodgers, second @ Dodger Stadium (August 30, 2023).

**WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW:** Is making his fourth career start...the D-backs are 2-1 in Mantipty's 3 career starts.

- Made his first Major League start on Aug. 15, 2023 @ Rockies (0 ER in 1.0 IP).
- In 3 starts in 2023, went 0-1 with a 3.00 ERA (1 ER in 3.0 IP) and 1.00 WHIP.

**VS. DODGERS:** First career start vs. Dodgers.

- Has 23 career relief appearances vs. Dodgers, allowing 10 runs (9 earned) in 16.1 innings (23 H, 8 BB, 16 K).
- Owned a 16-game scoreless streak from June 20, 2021-Aug. 8, 2023 (46 BF in 11.0 IP).
- Has not allowed a home run in his last 18 outings (59 BF in 14.1 IP).
- Has walked 2 or fewer batters in his 23 outings, including 6 games with 1 walk and 16 games with 0 walks.

**NO LONGBALLS FOR JOE:** His 38.2-inning homerless streak, since August 8, 2023 (Top 5), is the seventh-longest active streak in the Majors...Reese Olson/DET has the longest active streak (53.0 IP).

- Has held 159 batters faced homerless in 41 games (3 starts) since August 8 last season...is 1 of 3 pitchers (min. 30 G, max. 5 GS) during that stretch to not allow a home run along with Jake Diekman/NYM (143 BF/37 G/0 GS) and Cionel Pérez (99 BF/33 G/0 GS).

**VS. RIGHTIES:** Limiting right-handed hitters to a .229 avg. (8-for-35) with 7 strikeouts.

**2023 RECAP:** In his fourth season with the D-backs, went 2-2 with a 4.62 ERA (20 ER in 39.0 IP), 1.13 WHIP and .236 opponent average over 35 games (3 starts).

- Began the season on the 15-day injured list (left shoulder inflammation)... made his season debut on April 18 @ Cardinals.
- In 32 relief appearances, went 2-1 with a 4.75 ERA (19 ER in 36.0 IP), 1.14 WHIP and .235 opponent average.
- Posted a career-best .236 opponent average.
- Held lefties to a .185 average (12-for-65) and .209 OBP with 15 strikeouts, no homers and just 2 walks.
- Opponents hit .167 (6-for-36) off his curve and .178 (8-for-45) off his changeup, with both over a 30.0 whiff pct...allowed only 3 extra-base hits (no homers) off both pitches.
- Retired 18 of his 22 inherited runners over 32 games with a .235 opponent average and 28 strikeouts.
- In 11 games (1 start) with Triple-A Reno, went 1-0 with a 7.30 ERA (10 ER in 12.1 IP) and 11 strikeouts.

**2023 POSTSEASON HIGHLIGHTS:** Went 2-1 with a 4.70 ERA (4 ER in 7.2 IP) and 6 strikeouts in 9 games.

- Made 2 starts and was 0-1 (1 ER in 2.1 IP) with a 3.86 ERA.
- In 7 relief appearances, went 2-0 with a 5.06 ERA (3 ER in 5.1 IP) and 4 strikeouts.
