METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets were off on Monday...On Sunday, the team fell to the Brewers, 7-6, on Sunday in Milwaukee...The Mets begin a five-game homestand Braves (three games) and Mariners for two games...The Mets and Mariners will head to Williamsport, PA on Sunday for the MLB Little League Classic.

LET'S NOT GO STREAKING: The Mets have dropped seven games in a row and 11 of their last 12...New York has posted a 5.46 ERA (37 ER/61.0 IP), 19 walks and 56 strikeouts in that span...They are hitting .203/.276/.368 in that span...The seven-game losing streak is tied for the longest of the season (also: June 13-20)...The last time the Mets had a longer losing streak was an eight-game streak from May 31-June 9, 2018.

HOME, SWEET HOME: The Mets are 38-21 at home this season...Their .644 winning percentage at home is fourth in the majors and third in the National League...New York has posted a 3.41 ERA at home, which is fifth-best in the majors.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: Starting tonight, the Mets will play 16 of their next 19 games against the NL East...The Mets are 15-11 against the NL East this season, posting a 3.67 ERA, while batting .251/.315/.426.

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto has reached base safely in all nine games this month...He is batting .10-.35 (.286) with seven runs, three homers, five RBI, five walks, three steals, a .390 OBP and a .543 SLG...Soto has recorded a Major League-leading 89 walks this year...He is looking to recorded his sixth-season with 100+ walks...With 11 more works, he will become the second Mets player to break the 100 walk barrier...John Olerud recorded 125 walks during the 1999 season.

WHEN YOU WISH UPON A STARLING: In 14 games since the start of July, Starling Marte is batting .340 (16-47) with five runs, five doubles, two homers, four RBI, two walks, a steal, a .360 OBP and a .574 SLG...He has homered in back-to-back games after going 21 games without a home run.

BLADES OF STEAL: The Mets have safely stolen 34 consecutive bases, the longest active streak in the majors...It's the longest single season for the Mets since they recorded 35 straight steals from May 14-June 29, 2023...They lead the majors with a 90.3% stolen base rate...This is the highest stolen base rate in franchise history...The previous high was set in 2023 (88.7%)...They have been caught stealing only 10 times this year, which is the fewest in the majors...Juan Soto has stolen a career-high 18 bases this year...Brandon Nimmo has swiped 12 bases...His career-best is 15 which he accomplished in 2024.

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed two runs over 5.0 innings on August 5 vs. Cleveland...Surrendered three hits, issued one walk and struck out six batters...His six strikeouts were his most in a start since June 7 (also: 6)...Holmes struck out five of his first nine batters faced...Both runs he allowed came on a pair of RBI singles in the fourth...The right-hander has pitched 5.0 or more innings in seven of his last eight starts.

THE GAME OF RISP: Over his last six starts, opposing batters are 11-28 with two doubles and 14 RBI against Holmes with runners in scoring position...In his first 17 starts of the season, Holmes held opposing batters to a .111 (7-63) average with runners in scoring position...Overall, Holmes has held opposing batters to a .196 (18-92) average with runners in scoring position, tied for the ninth-best mark in the NL and tied for the 16th-best mark in the majors (min. 85 batters faced w/RISP).

HOLMES SWEET HOLMES: In 11 home starts this season, Holmes is 4-2 with a 3.50 ERA (24 ER/61.2 IP)...The righty has pitched 5.0 or more innings in each of his 10 home starts and has held opposing to a .200 (44-220) batting average at Citi Field...At home, Holmes ranks fifth in the NL and tied for eighth in the majors in opponent's batting average (min. 200 batters faced).

BRAVO!: Tonight, Holmes will face the Braves for the third time this season...Through his first two starts against the Braves this season, Holmes is 1-1 with a 3.72 ERA (4 ER/9.2 IP), 10 walks, seven strikeouts and a .194 (7-36) opponents' batting average...In 12 career outings against Atlanta, Holmes has a 2.18 ERA (5 ER/20.2 IP), a 1.11 WHIP and has held Braves batters to a .137 (10-73) average.

STAYING GROUNDED: Since 2019, Holmes' 64.3% groundball rate is the third-highest mark in the majors during that span behind Aaron Bummer's 65.5% clip and Andre Pallante's 64.6% rate (min. 1000 BF)...In each of the last four seasons, Holmes' groundball rate has ranked in the top five in the majors, including a league-leading 77.0% mark in 2022 (min. 250 BF each season)...This season, Holmes ranks sixth in the majors with a 57.2% groundball rate (min. 250 BF).

ALLOWING HOLMES RUNS: Over his last 16 starts, Holmes has allowed 12 home runs...In his first seven starts of the season, Holmes did not allow a homer and became the sixth pitcher in franchise history to not allow a home run through their first seven starts with the team...Holmes allowed two home runs in three of his four starts from May 14 - June 1 after he had never surrendered multiple home runs in his first 319 career Major League games...At the time, it was the fifth-longest active such streak by a pitcher to begin their Major League career...Among qualifiers, Holmes ranks ninth in the NL and 17th in the majors with a 0.88 HR/9 rate.

10 K CLAY: On April 8 vs. Miami, Holmes made his Mets Citi Field debut...The right-hander allowed four runs over 5.1 innings, issued three walks and struck out a career-high 10 batters...Holmes became the fifth Met all-time to record 10 or more strikeouts in their home pitching debut joining Dennis Ribant (10 K on 8/17/1964 vs. PIT), Dick Selma (13 K on 9/12/65 vs. HOU), Aaron Harang (10 K on 9/12/13 vs. WAS) and Max Scherzer (10K on 4/19/22-G2 vs. SF)...Courtesy of *Elias*...Holmes struck out five straight batters starting at his final batter of the third inning until the first batter he faced in the fifth...His 5.1 innings were the second-most he has ever thrown in an outing behind his 6.0 innings pitched in his second career big league start on July 14, 2018 with Pittsburgh.

NEW ROLE WHO DIS: In his new role as a starting pitcher, Holmes has established career highs in both innings (117.1), strikeouts (91) and wins (9)...Holmes started for the Mets on Opening Day (3/27 at HOU) in just his fifth career major league start...The first four starts of Holmes' career came in his first big league season, 2018 with Pittsburgh...Holmes is 10-8 with a 3.93 ERA (60 ER/137.1 IP) in 27 career starts...He is just the 10th pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to start Opening Day having made four or fewer career starts prior, joining Marty Pattin (4, 1969), Tom Hall, (4, 1969), Fernando Valenzuela (1981, 0), Al Holland (1982, 3), Dave Nied (1993, 2), Tanner Scheppers, (2014, 0), Dustin May (2020, 4), Garrett Crochet (2024, 0) and Sean Burke (2025, 3)...Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

LET'S TAKE A LOOK BACK AT LAST SEASON: In 2024, Holmes made 67 relief appearances with the Yankees and pitched to a 3.14 ERA (22 ER/63.0 IP)...His career-high 30 saves ranked fourth in the American League and eighth in the majors...In his final outing of 2024, September 29 vs. Pittsburgh, Holmes locked up his 74th career save and moved into a tie with John Wetteland for seventh-most in Yankees history (since saves became an official stat in 1969)...Did not allow an earned run in his first 20 games of the season from March 28 - May 19, marking the second-longest season-opening streak in franchise history, trailing only Dellin Betances' season-opening 26-game streak in 2015 (since ER became an official stat in 1913)...His 20.0IP over that span were the most by any major league reliever who had not allowed an earned run during that stretch...Also did not allow an earned run in 23 games from September 25, 2023 - May 19, 2024, the second-longest streak of his career, trailing only a 29-game stretch from April 9 - June 18, 2022...Did not allow an earned run in 29 of his first 30 appearances of the season from March 28 - June 9, going 1-1 with 19 saves and a 1.23 ERA (4 ER/29.1 IP) over that stretch...His 19 saves were tied with Cleveland's Emmanuel Clase (19) for the second-most over that span, trailing only St. Louis' Ryan Helsley (21)...Allowed 14 runs (10 ER) in 14 games from June 13 - July 30...Was named to his second career All-Star team (also: 2022)...Over his final 22 appearances of the year, held opponents to a .188 (12-64) average and was unscored upon in 17 of those appearances...Appeared in 13 Postseason games and went 3-1 with a 2.25 ERA (3 ER/12.0 IP) and 12 strikeouts...Pitched in the Yankees first eight Postseason games...Became the fifth pitcher in major league history to appear in each of their club's first eight postseason games, joining Tyler Matzek (2021 with Atlanta), Greg Holland (2014 with Kansas City), Wade Davis (2014 with Kansas City) and Jesse Orosco (1996 with Baltimore)...Became the 11th relief pitcher in major league history with three or more wins in a single Postseason and the third Yankee to accomplish the feat (also: Sparky Lyle, 1977 and Mike Stanton, 2000).

REELIN' IN THE YEARS: Holmes was selected by Pittsburgh in the ninth round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of Slocomb High School (AL)...He was signed by Pirates scout Darren Mazeroski, the son of Hall of Famer Bill Mazeroski...The 6-5, 245-pounder made his major league debut on April 6, 2018 with Pittsburgh vs. Cincinnati and appeared in 91 career games with the Pirates from 2018-2021...Was acquired by the Yankees on June 26, 2021, in exchange for INF Hoy Park and INF Diego Castillo...Established career highs in games (69), innings (70.0 IP), wins (8) and strikeouts (77) during the 2021 season...Became the Yankees closer in 2022 and recorded 74 saves from 2022-2024, the third-most in the AL and the 11th-most in the majors during that span...Earned a career-high 30 saves in 2024 and became the 11th pitcher in Yankees franchise history to record 30+ saves in a season...Is a two-time American League All-Star (2022, 2024) and was twice named American League Relief Pitcher of the Month (May 2022, Sept./Oct. 2023)...Over 16 career Postseason appearances, is 3-1 with a 1.35 ERA (3 ER/20.0 IP), a 0.90 WHIP and a .172 (11-64) batting average.
