METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Cardinals, 5-4, yesterday at Citi field...The victory snapped a two-game skid...The Mets are 8-5 over their last 13 games and 20-17 over their last 37 games...The team is in the midst of a six-game homestand (1-2) against the Cardinals (1-2) and Braves (three games)...Following this series, the team hits the road for a six-game, seven-day road trip against the Reds (three games) and Phillies (three games).

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets are 64-83 all-time against the Braves at Citi Field.

THE BIG APPLE TV+: Tonight's game against the Atlanta Braves will be aired exclusively on Apple TV...Fans can access the game by using the Apple TV app or by visiting tv.apple.com.

THE TONIGHT SHOW: In 37 games since the start of May, Carson Benge is batting .303/.361/.469 with 26 runs, seven doubles, one triple, five homers, 20 RBI, 10 walks and an .830 OPS...His .303 average is 12th in the NL in that span, while his 44 hits are tied for the fourth-most...Over his last 13 games, Benge is batting .321 (17-53) with 10 runs, two doubles, one triple, four homers, eight RBI, three walks and one steal with a .357 OBP and a .623 SLG.

STORM THE FIRST PITCH: Following its historic run to the NCAA Tournament Super Regionals, the St. John's baseball team will be honored by the New York Mets at Citi Field on Friday evening...Redshirt senior Dylan Johnson will throw out a first pitch to teammate Adam Agresti...The Johnnies swept the Tallahassee Regional, defeating No. 10 national seed Florida State twice and Northern Illinois to punch their ticket to the program's second ever Super Regional appearance and first since 2012...Agresti was voted the Most Outstanding Player of the Tallahassee Regional...Citi Field was opened by the Red Storm on March 29, 2009, as the Johnnies took on Georgetown in the first-ever game at the ballpark prior to the 2009 MLB season.

A.J. STYLES: A.J. Ewing has reached base safely in each of his last eight games, batting .357 (10-28) with four runs, three doubles, three walks and three steals...In 28 games so far into his Major League career, Ewing is batting .263 (25-95) with 11 runs, three doubles, one triple, one home run, six RBI, 12 walks, seven steals and a .343 OBP...Mookie Wilson (1981) owns the Mets rookie record for most steals with 24...Lee Mazilli (1977) is second on the list with 22, and Gree Jefferies (1989) is third with 21.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE: Yesterday, the Mets hit multiple home runs in an inning for the fourth time this season and did so in the first inning for the first time since August 29, 2025 vs. Miami...They have hit multiple home runs 20 times this season and are 15-5 in those games...The team recorded double-digit hits for the 20th time this season...Improved to 15-5 in those games and are now 7-12 in one-run games this season.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets will play nine of their next 17 games against the division including the Braves (three games) and Phillies (six games)...The Mets are 6-7 against the NL East this season...They have posted a 4.33 ERA against the division, while batting .236/.302/.401.

DREAM WEAVER: Luke Weaver has not allowed a run over his last 16 appearances...He has tossed 18.0 scoreless innings, allowing 10 hits, four walks and has struck out 19 in that span...He is now 2-1 with a 2.40 ERA (8 ER/30.0 IP) this season with eight walks and 27 strikeouts in 27 appearances...He has recorded six appearances of at least four outs this season and each of those appearances have been scoreless.

IN THE CITI: Yesterday, the Mets snapped a two-game losing streak at Citi Field...They have won 10 of their last 15 at Citi Field and are now 16-17 at home this season...The team has posted a 4.35 ERA, while batting .233/.300/.371 at Citi Field.

FOREVER YOUNG: Jared Young has appeared in 14 games since returning from the IL...He is hitting .261 (12-46) with seven runs, two doubles, four homers, seven RBI, five walks, a .346 OBP, a .565 SLG and a .911 OPS in that span...In 25 games in 2026, Young is hitting .288/.360/.530 with eight extra-base hits and seven RBI...Young is hitting .310 (18-58) with four doubles, four homers and six walks against right-handed pitching.

POWER OF THE PEN: The Mets bullpen has posted a 3.31 ERA (109 ER/296.0 IP) as a group...That ranks sixth in the majors and third in the National League...They have struck out 298 this season, the most in the NL and the second-most in The Show...RHP Huascar Brazobán (1.38) ranks sixth, while LHP Brooks Raley (1.42) ranks seventh in the NL amongst relievers.

THIS DAY IN 1986: The Mets enjoyed a day off on this day in 1986... This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 title on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins... Additional information for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration is available at Mets.com/1986.

STRIKE THAT: Mets pitchers have tallied 617 strikeouts this season, that is tied for the fourth-most in the National League and tied for the fifth-most in the majors...Their 617 punchouts are the fifth-most in franchise history through the team's first 68 games of a season.

TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME: In addition to this weekend's games, the USTA will host watch parties for the 2026 FIFA World Cup...The Mets are encouraging fans to utilize mass transportation, the fastest and easiest way to get to Citi Field.

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto has 258 career home runs...That is the 11th-most in Major League history prior to turning 28 (next: Frank Robinson, 262)...His 258 homers are 24th among active players...It is 21st all-time amongst players born in the Dominican Republic... George Bell is next with 265.

LAST TIME OUT: Fired 6.0 innings and allowed one earned run on three hits and three walks, while striking out five on June 6 at San Diego (6.0 IP, 3 H, ER, 3 BB, 5 K)...Has allowed one run in back-to-back starts after allowing 6+ earned runs in the two starts prior (5/19 at WSH and 5/25 vs. CIN)...Marked his 15th career start through 21 career games, where he has allowed two or fewer earned runs, which is tied for the third-most starts by a Mets starter in franchise history through 21 career starts...He trails Matt Harvey's 17 and Steven Matz's 16 and he is tied with Dwight Gooden.

AHEAD OF THE PACK: This season, he is 3-4 with a 3.98 ERA (32 ER/72.1 IP) with 82 strikeouts and is holding opposing batters to a .202 batting average (53-262)...Among qualified NL pitchers, he is fifth in opposing batting average, ninth in strikeouts and 14th in WHIP (1.11)...Among all qualified rookies in the majors, he ranks first in batting average against, tied for first in strikeouts, third in innings pitched, fifth in WHIP, and ninth in ERA.

SPIN THAT THING: This season, he has thrown his curveball 11.4% of the time and he is generating an average of 3,279 RPM on the pitch...That is the highest average RPM on any qualified pitch in the majors this season...He is posting a 40.3% whiff rate on his curveball...Batters are hitting just .083 (3-36) in at-bats ending with his curveball, which is the fifth-lowest opponents' batting average in at-bats ending with a curveball in the majors (min. 100 pitches)...Over his first 21 career starts, opposing batters are hitting .079 (5-63) in at-bats ending with McLean's curveball, and he has recorded a career 45.2% whiff rate on the pitch.

AGAINST ATLANTA: Has faced the Braves once in his career...His only start against Atlanta came on August 22, 2025 at Atlanta and he went 7.0 innings and allowed two runs while striking out seven (7.0 IP, 4 H, 2 ER, 7 K, HR, HBP)...Has made six career starts against division rivals and he is 3-2 with a 2.75 ERA (11 ER/36.0 IP) and 31 strikeouts in those contests.

SINK SINK BABY: McLean has thrown his sinker 35.0% of the time this season, up from 27.9% last season...His sinker has produced a 11-run value, which is tied for the fifth-highest run value on any pitch in the Majors this season and is tied for the highest mark on any sinker this season...Batters are hitting just .183 (20-109) in at-bats ending with his sinker.

RECORD BOOKS: Through 21 career starts, McLean is 8-5 with a 3.22 ERA (43 ER/120.1 IP) and 139 strikeouts...His 139 strikeouts are the fourth-most in franchise history through a pitcher's first 21 career starts, only trailing Dwight Gooden's 165, Matt Harvey's 154, and Kodai Senga's 142...Per *Elias*...He is one of eight pitchers in Major League history to strikeout 139+ batters and allow 43 or fewer earned runs through their first 21 starts.

IN THE CITI: Over 11 starts at Citi Field he has posted a 2.87 ERA (20 ER/62.2 IP)...He has struck out at least six batters in 10 of his 11 home starts, and he is only the second player in Major League history to accomplish the feat through each of their first 10 career home starts (also: Kerry Wood, 6 K's in each of his first 11 career home starts in 1998 with CHC)...His first three home starts were scoreless and he became the first Met pitcher to not allow a run in their first three career starts at home and the seventh pitcher in Major League history not to allow a run in each of their first three home starts (min. 15.0 IP)...His 19.1 inning scoreless streak at home is the longest to start a career since Robert Suarez didn't allow a run through all 24.0 innings he threw at home during the 2022 season...Per *Elias*.

PERFECT FIVE: He has retired each of his first 15 batters faced twice this season (4/21 vs. MIN and 4/3 at SF) ...He is the third pitcher in franchise history to be perfect through 5.0 innings multiple times in a season (also: Steve Trachsel, 2002 and Rick Reed, 1998)...His is the first pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to retire each of his first 15 batters multiple times in his first 13 career starts...Per *Elias*...When he was perfect through 5.0 innings on April 3 he became the first Mets pitcher to retire each of their first 15 batters faced since Sean Manaea retired each of the first 17 batters he faced on August 21, 2024, vs. Baltimore.

ROOKIE SENSATION: McLean was called up to the Majors on August 16, 2025, and he finished the season with the big-league club...Last season he made eight starts for the Mets, and he finished 5-1 with a 2.06 ERA (11 ER/48.0 IP) and 57 strikeouts...The Mets went 6-2 as a team in games started by McLean...His ERA is the third-best in franchise history through a player's first eight career starts, only trailing Terry Leach's 1.68 ERA and Rick Aguilera's 1.92 ERA...His 57 strikeouts are the third-most in franchise history through a pitcher's first eight career games, only trailing Nolan Ryan's 64 and Dwight Gooden's 59...He became the first pitcher in Major League history to throw at least 5.0 innings, strikeout five or more, and allow two or fewer earned runs in each of his first seven career starts...He is one of four players in Major League history to record 57 or more strikeouts and allow 11 or fewer earned runs through their first eight career games...He joins Nolan Ryan, Stephen Strasburg, and Paul Skenes as the only other pitchers to do so...Because McLean threw less than 50.0 innings last season, he is still considered a rookie under MLB's eligibility criteria...He entered the season as the No. 6 prospect in all of baseball, the No. 1 pitching prospect in baseball, and the No. 1 prospect in the Mets system according to *MLBPipeline.com*.

MC-USA: He represented the USA in the WBC...He made two starts and he finished with a 5.87 ERA (5 ER/7.2 IP) with eight strikeouts...He held opposing batters to a .222 (6-27) batting average during the event....He got the ball in the championship game vs. Venezuela on March 17 and he tossed 4.2 innings and allowed two earned runs while striking out four.

DAZZLING DEBUT: Made his Major League debut on August 16, 2025 vs. Seattle...Earned his first Major League win after tossing 5.1 scoreless innings and striking out eight...He joined Matt Harvey as the only pitchers in Mets history to earn a win, strike out eight or more batters, and allow zero runs in their Major League Debut...His eight strikeouts are tied for the third-most by a Met in their Major League debut (also: Tom Seaver, Bill Denehy, and Kodai Senga)...The only Mets who have recorded more strikeouts in their Major League debut are Harvey (11) and Collin McHugh (9)...Became the second pitcher in franchise history to throw at least 5.0 scoreless innings, allow two or fewer hits and strike out eight or more batters in their Major League debut (also: McHugh).

MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: Last season, he appeared in 21 games between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse and posted a 2.45 ERA (31 ER/113.2 IP)...He recorded 127 strikeouts over those 113.2 innings, good for a K/9 of 10.06...His 127 strikeouts were the second-most among Mets minor leaguers and the 18th among all minor leaguers at the time of his callup...He only surrendered two or more earned runs in one of his last 14 appearances prior to being called up...Overall from 2023-2025, he made 48 minor league appearances (44 starts) and finished 12-15 with a 3.10 ERA (78 ER/226.2 IP) and 245 strikeouts.

TWO-WAY COWBOY: The Willow Spring, North Carolina native, was a two-way player during his time at Oklahoma State and during the beginning of his professional career...During his final collegiate season he pitched in 14 games and posted a 3.30 ERA (11 ER/30.0 IP) while batting .250 (31-124) and having a .911 OPS...Overall he finished his career at Oklahoma State with a career .957 OPS and 36 home runs...Was originally drafted by Baltimore in the third round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft but decided to return to school and was drafted by the Mets in the third round of the 2023 First-Year Player Draft...He hit in his first two professional seasons and overall he finished as a .185 (27-146) hitter with nine home runs and 24 RBI.
